Durham County opened their home programme yesterday with a visit from the Cheshire eleven, the game being played on the Wearmouth Club's ground, Carley Hill, Southwick, Sunderland. On both sides there were players new to County honours for the present fixtures those on the Durham team being R. Healey and W. Curry (Bishop Auckland), Lees Ratcliffe (South Moor), and J. Graham (Seston Carew). Owing to showery and thundery weather the match did not start until 2.35, Cheshire opening play with first innings, having won the toss. Two of the visitors' wickets were secured before there was a stoppage 35 minutes later owing to rain. J. C. Fallows, the captain, was smartly caught at second slip by Hendren, and S. E. Rigg got in front of the next delivery from Harrison and had to retire. On the completion of the over the players were driven back to shelter by the rain, the score at that time standing at 29 for two wickets.

The game re-started at half-past four. This spell of play lasted an hour and five minutes. Buxton was caught in the slips by Healey, while K. Riggby was given out lbw to Harrison. The remainder of the day's play was occupied by F. C. Wild and A. S. Turner, who added 68 to the score, and were still together when rain stopped the game, the total then being 94 for four wickets. Turner had been rather badly missed in the long field by Curry when he had scored one. A change in the attack had been tried, Morris and Harrison being relieved by Bewick and Hendren, but the alteration had not the desired effect. Score:—

Durham beat Cheshire, yesterday, at Carley Hill, Sunderland, by an innings and 17 runs. The weather was fine, and a full day's play was possible.

On the previous day, owing to interruptions by rain, Cheshire had only put up 94 for four wickets, and their not-outs, F. C. Wild (39) and A. S. Turner (27), resumed batting against the bowling of Morris and Harrison. Wild batted freely, and though his partner left and also F. C. Hunter, he continued playing admirable cricket. When the score was 114, Harrison gave place to J. Bewick, and from the latter's fourth delivery Wild was caught behind the wicket. His 68 included nine 4's, and he had been one of the first pair in, and was the seventh man out. The Cheshire innings ended at noon for 146, and had occupied two hours and forty minutes in all.

Durham's opening was marred by disaster; the first ball from Buxton, a fast one, bowling Hendren. The batsmen were now W. Curry and T. A. Bradford, and they played careful cricket for half an hour, when Bradford was stumped. Both bowlers—Hewitson and Buxton—proved troublesome, the latter being especially dead on the wicket. Harrison and A. P. Ashley ran the score up from 34 to 110, and then a grand display was made by the two county novices, R. E. Healey and A. J. Graham, who made a long and productive stand, despite changes in the bowling. Healey played steady cricket, but Graham hit out freely, and the two carried the score from 118 to 230, and at 233 the Durham captain declared, leaving two hours in which to dispose of Cheshire's second innings.

This action of the Durham captain was fully justified. Morris bowled with deadly effect, and the whole of the visitors were dismissed in an hour and a quarter for 70 runs. Morris accounted for eight wickets for 29 runs. It was a victory won by good generalship aided by a magnificent bowling feat. Score:—
