NORFOLK v SUFFOLK

LAKENHAM

1911 AUG 11, 12

SUFFOLK v. NORFOLK. AN EVEN GAME.

The return match between these counties commenced on Friday on the Lakenham ground, Norwich. In the first match at Bury honours rested with Suffolk - Norfolk, by the way, have not won a match this season and they were hoping that the present occasion would see the turn of the tide Suffolk, too, have lost two matches this week, so on form there was not much to choose between the sides. Norfolk had first knock, and ran up a total of 225. Suffolk made a bad start, but recovered themselves, and at the close of the day's play had scored 164 for six wickets.

Norfolk won the toss, and M. Falcon and C. B. Smith opened to the bowling of Penfold and Trudgett. Runs came slowly, and ten appeared after seventeen minutes' play. Falcon then began to let out, and he gave one difficult chance which Waters was unable to accept. Twenty runs took 27 minutes to get, and the batsmen played warily and not troubling to run when smartness would have been productive. Thirty runs was the score after half-an-hour's batting. When the score was 33 Smith was caught at the wicket by Lang, having made 11. G. A. Stevens joined Falcon, and shortly afterwards Raynor relieved Trudgett. His second ball was nicked by Stevens for four, and the fourth the same. Fifty was signalled after three-quarters of an hour's batting. Stevens put the ball prettily through the slips several times, but his balls were scattered by Raynor after he had made 23 in fifteen minutes. Two wickets for 64. The Norfolk captain was the newcomer, but his partnership with Falcon did not last long, the latter being bowled by Penfold. He had made

30 (including four 4's) in an hour. Three wickets for 74. M. H. Thursby became associated with Birkbeck, and they played steady cricket, one hundred being over an hour, and twenty minutes' play. Waters relieved Penfold, and his first over was a maiden. Trudgett also took Raynor's place, but these changes did not affect the rate of scoring, and some nice shots were witnessed. The fielding was good, but no chances were given. The Suffolk bowlers were changed again, but without result, and at the luncheon interval the score was 126.

When the total had reached 137 Thursby was caught at the wicket. Trudgett made 19 in ten minutes. Treglown joined Birkbeck, and the former exercised great judgment in the placing of his shots. One hundred and fifty appeared after two hours and ten minutes' play. Seven runs later Treglown got his leg fairly in front of the wicket, and the appeal by Trudgett was successful. He had made only five runs in twenty minutes. Five wickets for 157. E. Lee joined Birkbeck, but with only one run to his credit, he was splendidly caught in the long field by Bennett. Thurgar's stay was short, being bowled by Trudgett with the second ball of his first over. Seven for 160, of which the outgoing batsman had made 2. The left-handed Allsopp was the new comer, and he got a splendid 6 off Trudgett, amid applause. He gave a difficult chance in the slips which Waters was unable to accept. Birkbeck also gave a problematical chance in the slips. Phillips just touching the ball. However, it was not long before the partnership was broken, Allsopp being cleverly caught low down by Watson at cover. His 19 included one 6, and two 4's. Eight wickets had fallen for 194, compiled in two hours and fifty minutes. E. Lee joined Birkbeck, but was bowled for a duck by Penfold, the score being 195. Watson was the last batsman. Two hundred went up after three hours and ten minutes' play. The last wicket was productive, and Raynor relieved Trudgett. Runs came fairly fast, and the partnership was an interesting feature of the match. Watson played on to his wicket when he had made 14. The innings produced 225, and took three hours and twenty-five minutes. Birkbeck carried out his last over making a career 80, which included eleven 4's and six 2's.

Suffolk started their innings at 4.15. Watson and Phillips meeting the bowling of Falcon and Gibson. The start was disastrous. Phillips was leg before wicket to the last ball of Gibson's first over. He had made one, and the score was two. In Gibson's second over, Watson was leg before wicket, the score being 3, of which he had made 2. The early capture of the wickets of two of Suffolk's best batsmen greatly pleased the spectators, and certainly the visitors' prospects of obtaining a lead on the first innings had undergone a great change for the worse. S. Hill-Wood and S. G. Bennett took up the attack and the former was badly missed in the slips by Gibson when the score was 17. Twenty were scored in 16 minutes. Hill-Wood sprang his bat, and had to change it. With the score at 56, the last-named was nicely caught in the slips by Treglown. The bowler was Gibson, whose analysis was three wickets for 4 runs. R. Lee was the new comer, and the 50 went up after 35 minutes' play. The batsmen played forceful cricket for some time, when Lee was caught in the slips by Watson. It was a marvellous catch, Watson falling but keeping the ball off the ground. Lee had made 22, and the score was 70 for four wickets. Bennett was joined by Raynor, and the two made a welcome stand. Bennett made his 60 after 40 minutes' play, and some of his strokes were very pretty. The 100 went up after an hour and a quarter's play. Fulcher and Allsopp went on, and there was a slackening somewhat in the rate of scoring. Bennett and Raynor added 71 for the fifth wicket in 66 minutes, when Raynor was out to a wonderful catch by Falcon at fine-leg. Raynor turning round and hitting a slow leg ball with great power. Bennett, who was bowled just before half-past six, made many brilliant shots during his two hours' stay - one 5 and ten 4's - and gave no chance. Playing on till 20 minutes to seven, Suffolk got within 61 of Norfolk's total, and have four wickets in hand.

SUFFOLK GET 3 POINTS IN DRAWN MATCH. FIERCE HITTING BY M. FALCON.

The Suffolk eleven accomplished a good performance in getting three points at the expense of Norfolk in a drawn match at Norwich on Saturday. The position of the game overnight pointed to a keen struggle for first innings lead, Suffolk having four wickets in hand and wanting 62 runs. M. H. Wilson and A. H. Lang took the score from 164 to 178, and then Falcon bowled Lang. Seven runs later Penfold was caught at the wicket, but Trudgett came to the assistance of his captain, and both men hit courageously, and well. Wilson especially made some fine drives, and at one time he hit six 4's in succession. Trudgett put three boundaries to his credit, and was caught at deep point when the total was within two of the Norfolk score. Trudgett would have been richer by 10c. if he had been in the other end when Wilson made his next fourer, and Trudgett afterwards explained that when he let out he was under the impression that Suffolk were actually six from. As it was Wilson had the ball when Waters went in, and he promptly put Suffolk ahead. They ultimately gained a lead of 18. It might have been much nearer, as setting the Wilson-Trudgett partnership the batsmen were both at once out, but for a water return one of them would have been out. Suffolk returned one of Wilson's knock. He scored 47 out of 92 in seventy-nine minutes, and after scoring ten singles his strokes were 3444444144. Gibson's six for 61 was the best thing in the bowling department for two hours. Going in a second time at 12.25, M. Falcon and C. B. Smith offered a fine resistance to the Suffolk attack. Falcon hit very freely, and after a miss at the wicket off Penfold he reached 60 out of 76 in fifty-five minutes, and was 57 at lunch, when the score was 92. After the interval Falcon drove with increased power, and in seventeen minutes he scored 47 out of 60. Penfold bowled him when the partnership had yielded 143 in eighty-three minutes. Falcon hitting four 6's and twelve 4's in his brilliant 104. Smith stayed two hours for his 41, and although Birkbeck got rid of Stevens quickly, Birkbeck for the second time in the match, and Thurgar gave a lot of trouble, and the pair added 109 for the fourth wicket in fifty-five minutes. Penfold had just been relieved offered a long spell of bowling when he badly damaged his left thumb in scooping a ball. Birkbeck hit without being out, and scored 164 in the match for four wickets six minutes under three hours, and the captain declared at eight minutes past four, leaving Suffolk just over two hours to get 259. With three points in hand Suffolk did not consider it wise to make the effort, although Lang and Phillips scored 87 in the first hour. Lang made some brilliant shots, and hit very hard. He scored 60 out of 100 in sixty-eight minutes, hitting nine 4's. Bennett and Lee stayed together for twenty minutes, and then at five minutes to the stumps were pulled up. Suffolk having batted 4 hours Norfolk have so far not won a match this season. The Norwich week begins to-day, and the Rev. G. B. Eslake will captain the side in the match against Northumberland, and Bedfordshire.
