SUFFOLK v. HERTS.

FINE CENTURY BY C. H. TITCHMARSH.

Thanks to some fine bowling by Coleman and Burton, and splendid batting by C. H. Titchmarsh and Golding, Herts established a strong position on Wednesday in this game at Ipswich. Winning the toss, Suffolk opened with W. Catchpole and C. M. Phillips, to the bowling Coleman and Burton, but the innings was completed before lunch for the small total of 98, F. L. Titchmarsh and C. H. Blount being the only players to play the bowling with any confidence. After the luncheon interval Herts commenced with R. C. Grellet and Golding, Penfold and the Rev. Fenn bowling. Runs came with some freedom, the 20 being hoisted after 15 minutes' play. With 50 up a double bowling change was made, E. D. Inskip and Trudgett going on, and immediate success followed, as Trudgett bowled Grellet with his first ball. C. H. Titchmarsh, the new-comer, commenced to score freely. Inskip, who had proved rather expensive, was relieved by Penfold, but the home county's total was passed for the loss of only one wicket. At 120, Inskip resumed at the other end, but Titchmarsh completed his 50, and Fenn bowled vice Penfold, H. L. Wilson at the same time taking the ball from Inskip. The rate of scoring was not diminished, however, and, despite further bowling changes, the second hundred was hoisted without a separation being effected both batsmen displaying complete mastery over the attack. With the total at 212, Golding was bowled by Trudgett, he having made 80 by sound all-round cricket, his score including eight 4's. With J. O. Anderson in, Titchmarsh reached his century. Anderson had only made 10 when he succumbed to a good one from Trudgett, and after tea had been taken the same bowler also got A. F. Leighton caught in the slips without scoring. The remaining wickets gave little trouble, and the innings closed for 233, Titchmarsh being not out with 138 to his credit, made by most attractive cricket. His leg play was particularly effective.

In the closing 40 mins. of the day, Suffolk scored 67 for the loss of two wickets.

On Thursday, the Suffolk batsmen, with the exception of F. L. Titchmarsh, batted very feebly, and, in the end, Hertfordshire won by an innings and 77 runs.

week, Hayes and Bush being unchanged whilst more than 170 runs were added. It made me more sad than angry. It was not cricket as it should be played. Did the batsmen like it? Perhaps they regarded it as the reverse of a compliment. One shudders to think of the greeting the captain would have received from old Mr. Grimston on his return to the pavilion: it would not have lacked force, you may be sure. "The rigour of the game," Mrs. Battle's motto in whist, should always be our watchword in cricket. Slackness is to be avoided as a pestilential thing.

A word in the ear of all captains. Whenever a youngster is played for his bowling, be sure never to toss him the ball until the batsmen have got thoroughly set. For then his bowling will be hit all over the field, and so all conceit will be knocked out of him. Never, under any circumstances, depute him to bowl to a new batsman, especially if he can bowl a fast yorker; for if you do he may get a wicket in his first over, and that may encourage him to think that he can bowl a bit. "It was the misfortune of the colt Skinner to bowl to W.G. when he was well set." (See Wisden's report of the M.C.C. v. Surrey match at Lord's in 1871.) W.G. scored 181 in that innings. Poor colt!

Several batsmen are finishing very strong; Warner, for instance, as in last season; so too are Tarrant, Seymour, Sharp and Rhodes, all of whom have been in harness all the season through. Rhodes' two centuries against the M.C.C. a week since put the seal on his reputation as a great batsman.

A novel coincidence. In the Notts v. Derbyshire match at Blackwell, both Wass and Morton dismissed nine batsmen in one innings for their respective sides. Have two bowlers ever been credited with this feat in one and the same Championship match before?
