Surrey response was poor being bowled out for 83 with S.F.Barnes picking up another 4 wickets. Staffordshire didn't enforce the follow-on instead batting on to drive home the tremendous advantage. B. Meakin kept up his good form by scoring 133 to leave Surrey the gargantuan task of making 462 in the fourth innings to win. Barnes completed the rout by taking another 6 wickets and ending up with matche figures of 10-73.
