NOTES ON CRICKET,

Newport Suffer Defeat. LLANTARNAM IN GOOD FORM.

The Newport Cricket team is failing rather badly this season, and so far has displayed no ability to uphold the traditions of the Club. On Saturday they entertained Chepstow on a wicket which was certainly a trifle difficult, and they lost by 8 runs—60–52. Although the scores did not reach very high totals the play was for the most part interesting, and was chiefly characterised by good bowling on either side. The batsmen failed lamentably to reproduce anything like form. T. C. Clay, Chepstow, was top scorer in the match with 30—he was the only visitor to reach double figures, while M. Braddon (26), shared similar honours on the Newport side. T. C. Clay also did well with the ball, taking six wickets for 17 runs, while M. Holly had three for 23. For Newport L. Jones took five for 19, and Bryn Phillips five for 31.

Panteg Win Well.

Panteg gave a severe trouncing to Newport Seconds, winning by 56 runs—105–49. On a drying wicket and with a strong wind blowing they failed absolutely to settle down against the bowling of G. Rowlands and C. Williams. H. N. King was the most successful batsman, hitting out with confidence until Rowlands displaced his wicket after he had scored 26. A. C. Jones and E. S. Martin each scored 27 for Panteg, and J. H. Evans, the old Pontypool and Welsh International Rugby threecorner, secured 15. Ample time allowed, and the Seconds faced the bowlers for the second time, and they atoned to an extent for their earlier failure by aggregating 107 for six wickets.

Interesting Displays.

Llantarnam defeated Malpas by 32 runs. The winners had the assistance of C. Tucker, who played the best innings of the game for his 37 not out—quite a careful back-to-the-wall game. A. Thomas (17) and J. De Rees (21) were also good scorers. The total compiled was 96. Malpas are still weak in their attack. The best averages were Wyn Jones 3 for 11 and P. Clarke 3 for 10. Malpas mustered in reply only 66. H. White (17), A. Workman (11 not out), and Mr. Extras (10) were the only players to reach double figures. A. Thomas bowled exceedingly well for Llantarnam, taking six wickets for 23. Malpas Seconds tried conclusions with the rejuvenated All Saints, and the result shows that the "Saints" are worthily carrying the mantle of their predecessors. They won the game by a margin of 53 runs. The chief point in the match was the remarkable innings of T. Mason, who hit up 75 after a couple of Malpas players had dropped a couple of wickets. His innings was the backbone of their score of 111. C. Jones (21) helped him in a useful way. The only batsman on the Malpas side to face the bowling was W. Tucker, who made a well hit 43.

Usk had hard lins in not being proclaimed winners against Abercarn. Thanks to the strenuous batting display by Trevor Lucas and E. G. Makepeace, Usk topped the century, and totalled 115. The former contributed 28 and the latter 39. B. Thomas bowled well for the visitors, and claimed 5 wickets for 17 runs, and M. Bray took 2 for 26. E. G. Makepeace and E. J. Whittington disposed of nine of the batsmen of the visiting team for 49 runs when stumps were drawn, Abercarn being 65 runs behind.

CRICKET IN THE VALLEYS.

Panteg's Enthusiasm. AN ACCOMPLISHED PRO.

Panteg is experiencing a great revival in enthusiasm for cricket at a time which coincides with the arrival in the district of Mr. H. H. Spawton, more familiarly known among his friends—and it is surprising how many friends he has made since he has been at Panteg—as "Harry." He came to Panteg from London with the definite object of raising the standard of the Panteg team to the highest possible level—and he is rapidly achieving his purpose.

No team can play a good, consistent game on a bad ground—that was the axiom upon which he started—and in order to remedy this trouble he at once put his back into the work. He did not have an eight hour nor a twelve hour day; to him the work was a hobby, and many days for 16 hours he was "slogging away" to get the ground in better condition. His labours have been rewarded, for Panteg now possesses one of the finest grounds in the county. His Oliver Twist like nature will not, however, allow him to be satisfied, and with the assistance of either man or horse he is to be seen day after day cutting the grass, rolling the pitches, etc.

Spawton commenced his cricket career at a Board School at Leicester, where, under the direction of Mr. J. C. Cooper, of the English Rugby Union, he was probably one of the first schoolboys to score a century in school games. Later he played for Victoria-road, Leicester, and then took up his first professional appointment at Gainsborough. During his first season there he scored two centuries. He went back, however, to Leicester, and for two seasons played for the County second team, while he was on the County ground staff. Thence he went to Sto wond District, Norfolk, having the misfortune in his first match to have his teeth knocked out, but even this did not prevent him scoring 103—one of five centuries scored by him during that season. He next went to St. Helen's Town for two seasons, and for the next four seasons he was at Shepherd's Bush. There he registered four centuries, and had an average of 60 wickets each season. In the winter he turned his attention to football, and played successively for Gainsborough Trinity, Lincoln City, and Leicester Forest.

Since he has been at Panteg he has scored three centuries, against Lyngton, Cwmbran, and Croesyceiliog. His highest score was against the last-named, when he registered 117 not out.

What are the future prospects of the team? A few facts make the situation seem exceedingly rosy. With Jack Evans, the ex-Welsh international, as captain, it is only to be expected that the team is one happy family, the players knowing full well that his one object is the good of the club. Ernie Phillips is doing remarkably well. George Rowlands has taken nearly 0 wickets this season, and Charlie Williams about 35. Another player, who though young shows much promise, is Rupert Bennett, who now always accompanies Spawton to the wickets. It was while at the West Monmouthshire School that Rupert first took a keen interest in sport, and though several years the junior of many of the students there, he soon gained his place in the premier team, and on one occasion was successful in carrying off the bat for the best batting average during the season. Two years after the outbreak of the war he obtained a commission, and played for the battalion cricket and football teams, and on returning to civil life the members of the Panteg team, realising his worth, gave him a trial. Since he has become a regular player. With such players as these and others who have done so well this season, the Committee may look forward to the future with confidence, as the club is almost bound to make even greater strides than in the past. If players continue to rally around their new pro. as they have done, then the great cricket enthusiasm which has been revived will become a permanency, and great benefit will be derived by the individuals in particular and sport in general. We wish the club every success.
