A CHECK FOR ST. GEORGE'S.

SUNDERLAND'S BRILLIANT COUNTY PAIR.

SPECIAL FEATURES OF SATURDAY'S PLAY.

Quite a feature of Saturday's local cricket was the excellent performances of members of the respective sides selected to represent Northumberland and Durham in the opening match of the Minor Counties Championship tourney at Osborne Avenue, Newcastle, this forenoon.

The Sunderland pair, H. Brooks and E. L. Sqaunce, gave a spirited exhibition of forceful batting at Ashbrooke, where the Weariders defeated the Senior League Champions. Despite the consistently fine bowling of Jeffries, the Strangers compiled the useful total of 170, but this proved to be quite insufficient. In the two hours remaining for play at the end of the visitors' innings Brooks, Sqaunce and the other County representative, F. R. Bell, put together 165, and this, together with seven from Russell and the extras brought the total up to 176, an average of three runs for every two minutes.

Denis Hendren had a very successful day with the ball against Philadelphia, taking six wickets for 22, while Weight, who assists Durham to-day, knocked up 68 for the Seaside against Whitburn, whose chief contributors were A. P. Ashley with 68 and T. Shiel with 61.

The Durham captain, T. Kinch, compiled a fine 57 for West Hartlepool against Darlington R.A., who, thanks to a brilliant 101 not out made by Turner, secured the decision. A. Goodrick followed up his recent successes by taking four Normanby wickets for 14 runs, so that Northumbria's visitors appear to have plenty of bowling resource.

Benwell Hill, with the assistance of unplayable deliveries from T. G. Welton and George Milne, who secured six and four wickets respectively at a trifling cost, defeated Tynemouth by 30 runs, while the other Benwell side gave their best exhibition of the season in accounting for Gateshead Fell. William Armstrong and John Scott made 65 runs between them, and it is to be hoped that they will do even better for their county at Jesmond.

The County club's win over St. George's was quite the surprise of the day, and again W. Spiller gave a fine bowling exhibition, backed up by Hardeu, who revealed better form with the ball than he has done for some considerable time. Northumberland's captain, C. F. Stanger-Leathes, and G. L. Hunting, who stayed at the wicket, although injured, were the outstanding batsmen. J. L. Towler came back to his usual standard of play against Elswick, and made a splendid score of 61 not out, while in the same match W. A. Taylor's deliveries caused the downfall of the Works' batsmen. He secured six wickets for 22, and at one period in the game had four wickets to his credit for six runs.

Ryton had precisely the same experience as that of last week, when they lost by a single run. Against Wallsend on Saturday they made 126, and when the home side had lost nine men for 93 the result seemed a foregone conclusion. A bright partnership for the last wicket, however, between T. Graham and S. Baggaley produced just enough runs to make their side's total one more than Ryton's, and so the latter had to admit their third successive defeat.

HOME COUNTY'S FIRST INNINGS LEAD.

HUNTING HITS OUT.

Commenced at Newcastle yesterday. DURHAM.—1st Innings, 128; 2nd Innings, 18 (for 1).

In the corresponding game of last season Durham won by five wickets.

Northumberland and Durham resumed their rivalry in the Minor Counties' Tournament yesterday at the County Ground, Osborne Road, Newcastle. The weather was ideal, and, as anticipated, the game was witnessed by a very large crowd. Northumberland introduced two newcomers to county cricket in W. G. Armstrong and A. E. Veitch, both of the Benwell Club, whilst the side also included G. L. Hunting, the County Club batsman, who was unable to take part in Northumberland's minor county matches last season. There were no new county caps on the Durham side, but Hendren, the Hendon professional, having returned to the Sunderland district, was again in the side.

The feature of the day's play was undoubtedly the great stand by G. L. Hunting and J. L. Towler for the seventh wicket of the home county's innings. At a period when it appeared doubtful if Northumberland would gain any considerable advantage in the first innings, the pair settled down to rapid scoring. Prior to this the keen fielding, which had been most creditable in both innings, had necessitated the utmost caution on the part of the batsmen, and the rate of scoring was by no means up to normal standards. Many good drives were smartly stopped, and it was not until Hunting and Towler became associated that boundary hits were made with any frequency. The partnership added 116 to Northumberland's total at a critical period of the game, and was certainly responsible for putting the home side in what would appear to be a winning position.

Durham won the toss, and Kinch decided to bat first, sending in H. Brooks and Weight to face the bowling of Milne and Towler. The wicket appeared to be quite good, and little the worse for Saturday's heavy rain. There was certainly a possibility of its improving during the afternoon, but not to such an extent as to warrant Kinch sending in Northumberland to take first "knock."

Hetherton's Deadly Bowling.

Throughout the whole of the innings the Durham batsmen rarely appeared comfortable. The pitch helped the bowlers sufficiently to make scoring very slow at times. Brooks was smartly stumped by Wilkinson off Towler with the total at 16, but Weight remained in for 85 minutes, batting very carefully and scoring 22. Kinch and Weight took the score to 50, the half century being reached in 40 minutes, but immediately afterwards the Durham captain was out leg before to Hetherton. A further 20 minutes elapsed before Weight and Pape, the next man in, increased the total by 14, and then in his next four balls Hetherton disposed of Pape, Scott-Page and Hendren, the last-named two failing to open their account.

At this stage the chief contribution to the score was that of the "extras," which amounted to 21. When the score was 81 Weight, who had been previously dropped by Wilkinson, E. L. Squance and F. R. Bell added 34 for the seventh wicket, both leaving with the total at 115. The last two wickets—those of Milam and Goodrick—fell for a further 13 runs, and the whole side was out in two hours and five minutes for 128—a very disappointing aggregate. Hetherton had the best figures in the bowling, his five wickets costing 31 runs, whilst Milne claimed three for 35.

Stanger-Leathes and Mackay gave the home side an excellent start, putting on 65 for the first wicket. Both scored with freedom despite good bowling and keen fielding, the half-century being registered in 38 minutes. After the home captain's departure, however, things became much slower. J. S. Nesbitt was

clean bowled at 69 without opening his account, and Armstrong was out for four eleven runs later, but Mackay batted steadily and reached his 50 in 70 minutes. He stayed on for another 20 minutes, but only added four to his half-century. Half the side was out for 104, and the sixth wicket fell at 106.

A Prolific Partnership.

At this stage the bowling appeared to be causing considerable trouble, but the association of G. L. Hunting and J. L. Towler put a very different aspect on affairs. Hunting batted with all his old grace and power, and was ably supported by Towler. Very early the County Club man lifted a ball clean into Osborne Avenue and also put two into the Cemetery. Runs came so freely that when Towler was caught by Bell, the partnership had produced 116 runs in an hour, and had given Northumberland a comfortable lead. Hunting was out 15 runs later when within six off his century, Kinch catching him well out in long field. He batted 65 minutes for his 94, and his hits included four sixes and 14 fours. The innings finished in good style, Milne and Wilkinson putting on 26 for the last wicket. The total was 265, scored in three hours and five minutes, Northumberland finishing up with a lead of 137 on the first innings. Milam was easily the best of the Durham bowlers, capturing 7 wickets at an average cost of 12 runs.

Durham had 20 minutes' batting before the close of play and scored 17 runs for the loss of Common's wicket. They are still 119 runs in arrears and have nine wickets in hand. The attendance up to 4 o'clock was returned at 3,816, as compared with 5,606 on Whit Monday of last year. The receipts amounted to £389.

NORTHUMBRIANS WIN BY NINE WICKETS.

DURHAM'S FINE LAST WICKET STAND.

Commenced at Newcastle on Monday. DURHAM.—1st Innings, 123; 2nd Innings, 180. NORTHUMBERLAND.—1st Innings, 265; 2nd Innings, 53 (for 1).

In the corresponding game of last season Durham won by five wickets.

Northumberland gained an easy victory over their neighbours, Durham, on the Osborne Avenue ground, Newcastle, yesterday, the Minor Counties match concluding at three o'clock with nine wickets in their favour. The overnight position gave a strong indication of the way matters were likely to go, and indeed at one period of the Durham innings there seemed a possibility of an innings victory for the Northumbrians. The Durham batsmen had been ultra-cautious, and their lack of enterprise did not help them in the least to improve their position. A bright partnership by Scott-Page and Goodrick for the last wicket, however, saved the situation to a large extent, and when the innings finally closed the home county was left with 52 runs to get to win.

The overnight rain, followed by bright sunshine and a drying wind, made the pitch none too good for Durham, who resumed with the score at 18 and nine wickets in hand. Only one run was added before Brooks was caught by Milne off Towler, and at 25 Weight played on to his wicket from the same bowler. Pape and Kinch took the total to 55, at which point the former was out, having batted patiently for an hour for his 15. Bell, who followed, was clean bowled by Milne at 68, and five runs later Kinch was out to a brilliant catch by Mackay at mid-on. Hendren and Squance then became associated, and the total was advanced to 91 before the Sunderland amateur was bowled by Hetherton.

AN UNFORTUNATE ACCIDENT.

Shortly after Scott-Page joined Hendren, J. Straker Nesbitt, fielding at mid-on for Northumberland, was unfortunately badly hurt whilst attempting to field a fast ball from Hendren. The ball struck him with great force on the body, and he dropped to the ground, being picked up in an unconscious condition and carried off the field. After attention in the pavilion, he was taken home by motor, and later reports of his condition were more reassuring. Kinch, the Durham captain, acted as deputy in the field, and within a few minutes caught out Hendren, who skied a delivery from Milne. At this point eight wickets had fallen for 103, and Durham still needed 34 to avoid an innings defeat.

The last two partnerships, however, displayed plenty of enterprise. Scott-Page and Milam hit out with more confidence than had previously been shown, the total being increased by 22 before the Durham City player was splendidly caught near the boundary by Scott. Goodrick then joined Scott-Page, and in the 35 minutes that the partnership lasted the pair put on 63. They batted in free style, and both hit a 6, taking the total to 168 and setting Northumberland to get 52 to win.

NORTHUMBERLAND SUPERIOR.

The home county again opened their innings with Stanger-Leathes and Mackay, but so good was the bowling of Milam and Weight that in the first 25 minutes only 10 runs were scored. After half-an-hour's play, with the total at 14, Mackay was caught at the wicket off Weight. Armstrong then joined his captain, but there was no appreciable increase in the rate of scoring. At the end of fifty minutes 31 runs had been recorded, and at this juncture Stanger-Leathes returned a ball hard to the bowler, Weight, who held it, but fell over on the ground. A confident appeal for a catch was made, but neither umpire was able to see exactly what transpired, and no decision was given. Immediately afterwards both Stanger-Leathes and Armstrong hit out to such purpose that in a further ten minutes the requisite runs for victory were gained.

Northumberland had much the better team, and both in batting and bowling excelled the Durhambians. There was more confidence about the Northumbrian players, though it must be stated that in both days of the match Durham had the worst of the wicket. Both teams shone in the field, where all displayed the utmost keenness. A special word is, however, due to Mackay, the Backworth amateur, who at mid-on fielded brilliantly during the entire match. SMART DISPLAY BY HOME SIDE.

HUNTING AND TOWLER IN FORM.

Commenced at Newcastle yesterday. As the result of the first day's play in the Minor Counties Championship match with Yorkshire II., Northumberland, at the County ground, Osborne Avenue, Newcastle, yesterday, placed themselves in a very strong position. Excellent progress was made, and before the stumps were drawn for the day no fewer than 26 wickets had fallen, Northumberland, with four of their second innings wickets in hand, being 246 runs ahead.

The Northumbrians proved themselves to be the superiors of the Yorkshiremen, both in batting and in the field, and their lead, which presages a comfortable victory, was worthily earned. Nevertheless, their score of 190 in the first innings was due in the main to two partnerships, that of Stanger-Leathes and Couves for the first wicket, which made 47, and that of Armstrong and Towler for the fifth, which yielded 89. The batting honours went to Towler and Couves, and though the former was favoured by several chances, his display was attractive, and he was always forcing. All the best batting was seen prior to the luncheon interval, at which stage the score was 159 for five wickets, and in half an hour after the resumption the rest of the batsmen were disposed of for the addition of 39 runs.

In the visitors' innings Bell alone made any impression upon a well-sustained attack by the home side. His 42 was easily the best score, and even then he gave two chances. Holdsworth, the Yorkshire captain, coming in at the fall of the sixth wicket when Bell was beaten by a fine ball from Hetherton, with the score at 72, attempted to force the pace, but after scoring 13 he succumbed to a brilliant catch by Towler, and the innings finally closed for 102. The Northumberland fielding was excellent, and frequently brilliant, whilst both Milne and Hetherton met with considerable success with the ball. The former had four wickets for 46, and the latter the same number for 29.

Before the close of play Northumberland had an hour and a half's batting in their second innings, and scored 158 for the loss of six wickets. Hunting, who had failed to open his account in the first innings, soon found his best form. Going in second wicket down, he was undefeated at the close with 84 to his credit. Couves again batted stylishly, and Skinner and Milne gave Hunting excellent support. Play will be resumed at 11 o'clock this forenoon.

NORTHUMBERLAND v. YORKSHIRE II.

VISITORS DECISIVELY BEATEN. CENTURY FOR HUNTING.

Commenced at Newcastle on Monday. Northumberland secured a decisive victory—their second this season under championship auspices—at the expense of the Yorkshire Colts XI., at the County ground, Osborne Avenue, yesterday, by 154 runs.

Overnight, with their second innings total at 158 for six, they held a lead of 246, Hunting having 88 to his credit not out. On resuming the remaining four wickets only produced 25 runs, and of these Hunting secured 14, completing his century in 25 minutes. Milne fell to a catch by the captain off Bayes' bowling, and Veitch was soon disposed of, being clean bowled by the same bowler with 2 runs to his account.

Hetherton was the next to go, giving a low return to Bayes, which the latter ran in to catch. The Tynedale professional had only scored 1. G. E. Wilkinson offered some resistance, but at 11.35 the whole side were out for 183.

Hunting batted altogether for 90 minutes in delightfully easy style. He gave two chances, and his score of 102 included two 6's and seventeen 4's. His contribution gave the Northumbrians a commanding lead, and with the previous performance of the visiting batsmen in view, the task of getting 272 to win appeared a well nigh hopeless one, although they had plenty of time to get them in.

The Yorkshiremen commenced their second venture at 11.45, and with 11 on the board, Brooke was smartly stumped by Wilkinson off Milne's bowling.

J. Pye-Smith and Bell offered some resistance at the second partnership, but with 21 up, the second-named gave an easy catch to Stanger-Leathes at square leg, of which the captain took full advantage.

Pye-Smith, the next to go, skied a ball from Milne, and Hetherton ran in to catch. Then followed the only real stand of the innings when Taylor and W. M. Wilson, the 17-year-old Skipton School player, came together at the fall of the third wicket. These pair showed much restraint when Milne and Hetherton were bowling, but directly Veitch came on for the latter, Taylor drove to the boundary twice in the Benwell amateur's first over.

Skinner relieved Milne at the other end, but it was not until 53 runs had been added that the partnership was broken up, Taylor being stumped off the St. George's bowler for an excellent 39. Wilson and Smeeth were together only a short time before the latter was caught from the last ball of the over before lunch off Hetherton, who had resumed vice Veitch.

With the return of Milne after lunch a different complexion was put on the game, the last five wickets falling in about a quarter of an hour for 9 runs, Milne taking four in that period for a little over a run apiece.

Altogether the Hill professional captured six for 29, while Hetherton took three for 27. Bayes and Holdsworth each took five wickets in the Northumberland second innings at a cost of 64 and 62 runs respectively. Towler was unable to bowl yesterday owing to an injured leg.

The home side's fielding again reached a high standard, and during the day only two possible chances were not made use of.

DURHAM v. LANCASHIRE II.
MAGNIFICENT DISPLAY BY SCOTT-PAGE.

DUNELMIANS HOLD WINNING ADVANTAGE.

Commenced at Blackhill yesterday. Though Durham opened very badly in the match against Lancashire II. at Blackhill yesterday—losing three of their best batsmen for one run—they finished their first innings with the magnificent total of 277, chiefly through the efforts of G. Scott-Page and T. Kinch, the captain of the side, who, in partnership, earned the score from one to 220, the former scoring 178 before being caught by the wicket-keeper when the board showed 302 for six wickets. He gave a fine display, driving and cutting with great skill and judgment. In one over sent up by Tyldesley he increased his total by 24, hitting three 6's—right out of the ground—one 4 and a 2. He had altogether four 6's and twenty-two 4's. Kinch also acquitted himself admirably at the most critical part of the game. His 89 included one 6 and eleven 4's. At the outset he scored more rapidly than his partner, completing the half-century just before lunch. Scott-Page had then only 23 to his credit, but subsequently materially increased his total almost every over and reached the century before Kinch left him.

Milam rendered noteworthy assistance, playing freely and hitting hard. In one over—the bowler being Howarth—he made 21, including two 6's (out of the ground). His score was 58 when he skied a ball from Howarth and was easily caught by the bowler. He hit eight 4's.

Lancashire did very badly. They seemed always in trouble with Spiller, who secured seven wickets at the cost of only 41 runs. With the third ball of his first over he clean bowled Neal. Only four runs had then been registered, and after the addition of a single Goodrick beat Minshull, Leach and Rogerson had increased the score by six when the last-named was easily taken in the slips off Spiller. Watson joined Leach and got in front of one of Spiller's deliveries when he had made seven. Four wickets had gone at the cost of 31 runs.

Shortly afterwards, Common took Horridge very smartly at the wicket, and half the side were out for 37. Tyldesley helped Leach to complete the half century in an hour. At this point, Leach was missed in the slips and Goodrick gave way to Milam at the west end. Spiller bowled Tyldesley with a ball the batsman tried to pull.

The Lancashire aggregate for six was then 59, and it had not been altered when Scott-Page caught Leach, who had put 31 together in admirable style. At 63 Spiller bowled Howarth, and at 69 Milam clean bowled Hollins, the visiting captain. Common brought off another smart catch at the wickets, and the innings closed for 70.

NORTHUMBERLAND V. LANCASHIRE II.

VISITORS' IMPREGNABLE POSITION. BRILLIANT FIRST-WICKET PARTNERSHIP.

Commenced at Osborne Avenue yesterday.

Lancashire II. secured a commanding lead over Northumberland at the County ground yesterday, being 159 runs ahead with five wickets in hand at the close.

A brilliant first-wicket partnership by G. Rogerson and K. P. Neall for the Lancastrians produced 132, or 14 short of the Northumberland total. The home batsmen gave a very poor exhibition, and with the exception of the captain, J. P. Middleton and E. Wood never appeared likely to make a stand. Stanger-Leathes and Middleton, the latter of whom was making his debut in County cricket, contributed 62 for the ninth wicket in 35 minutes.

There were two stoppages before noon of ten and fifteen minutes owing to rain, but later the weather cleared somewhat and conditions were fairly good.

Northumberland commenced their first innings disastrously, Couves being leg before to Threlfall in the latter's second over with 12 on the board, while Mackay was caught behind the wicket off the next ball. E. Wood, the new cap, helped to raise the total to 44 before being clean bowled by Threlfall. The Backworth player showed excellent judgment in contributing 19 runs.

Unfortunately, the other batsmen could render but little assistance to the captain, and five more wickets fell for 30 runs, Whitfield, Skinner, Milne, Veitch and Hetherington making seven between them.

Then came the brightest part of the innings, when Middleton, who was playing in place of J. L. Towler, injured in the match against Yorkshire, partnered Stanger-Leathes. Showing excellent restraint at first, the Bowwell amateur enabled his captain to score with some rapidity, the latter reaching his half-century in slightly over a couple of hours.

With five added to his 50, the captain mistimed a yorker from Howarth, who had taken over from Threlfall, and gave an easy catch to H. Tyldesley. Eighth out at 135, Stanger-Leathes hit eight fours and gave only one chance in a stay of two hours and ten minutes, and that to Whewell at the wicket.

Wilkinson stayed for ten minutes while eight were put on, when Middleton was caught by Tyldesley after making a splendid 42. Two hours and a half batting had produced 146 runs.

Lancashire's first wicket produced 132, Rogerson and Neall withstanding the attack of Milne, Hetherington, Skinner, Middleton and Veitch for 70 minutes, when the latter was clean bowled by Skinner. Neall's 65 included five 4's. He gave a chance to Whitfield off Middleton's first ball, but the former dropped the ball when rolling over.

At 138 Rogerson was clean bowled by Hetherington, who had resumed for Middleton. Batting for an hour and 25 minutes the Lancastrian hit seven 4's and five 3's, and did not give the semblance of a chance. Leach, the next man in, helped to add 56 for the third wicket before falling to a brilliant catch by Whitfield in the long field.

The fourth wicket partnership between Watson and Horridge added 27 before the latter was bowled by Hetherington, and 33 runs later Watson was well beaten by a ball from Milne. Watson displayed fine driving power and hit seven 4's. With Howarth and Minshull together the total was carried to 305, when stumps were drawn, the third hundred going up in three hours and ten minutes.

Hetherington and Milne bore the brunt of the bowling, the latter in particular tiring perceptibly after bowling 33 overs. The Northumbrian captain had not much bowling material to play with, but he could have taken the Tynedale professional off sooner. Threlfall and Watson bowled very well, and the former had five for 66.

Skinner then came in, but with 14 runs added, he was beaten by Threlfall, and this brought Veitch and Whitfield together in a partnership which added 33 for the sixth wicket, Whitfield being caught off Watson with 23 to his credit—the highest score of the innings.

Hetherington did not stay with Veitch long, being bowled by Howarth with 11 runs added. Veitch was next to go, and was soon followed by Wilkinson, who, together with Middleton, had put on 16 for the ninth wicket.

The innings closed at 1.33 for 130, Middleton being not out 17.

FEEBLE RESISTANCE TO VISITORS' ATTACK.

In their match with Yorkshire II, which commenced at Westoe, yesterday, Durham gave a very disappointing batting display in their first innings.

Durham's first batsmen were Weight and J. J. Common, and the opening was disastrous. Then Bayes, who bowled from the other end, got Weight, who played a ball into the slips where he was taken by Brooks. The first three wickets thus did not produce a single run. H. Scott-Page (who made 178 against Lancashire II, only a couple of days before) was the next victim, being caught by Fawcett, off Bayes, without scoring. There were nine extras, and the innings closed after about an hour and a quarter's play for the meagre total of 46. Sargent and Bayes took the whole of the wickets, the former getting six for 21 runs and the latter four for 16.

Bell and Brooks opened the Yorkshire innings, and had put together 34 before Brooks was clean bowled by Spiller for 17. He was succeeded by E. J. Pye-Smith, and four more runs were added before lunch, the visiting team being then only eight runs behind the Durham total. On resuming the pair remained together and withstood the bowling of Spiller and Weight for a considerable time. With the score at 71 Pye-Smith, who made 18, succumbed to a fast delivery from Spiller, and Taylor, who succeeded him, was dismissed by the same bowler without opening his account.

Ten minutes later Spiller got rid of Bell, who had been at the wickets 45 minutes, during which he compiled 54 in nice style, never giving a chance. His hits included seven 4's. Run getting became somewhat slow after this, the only other Yorkshire batsman to give something like liveliness to the game being E. M. Smeeth, who hit out in good style and made a useful contribution of 34. The innings was not by any means a great one, the total reaching 164. Nor would this total have been quite attained but for faulty fielding by one or two of the Durham players.

STEADY BATTING IN NEWCASTLE MATCH.

HETHERTON'S FINE BOWLING.

Commenced in Newcastle yesterday.

The first day's play in the match between Northumberland and Cheshire at the County ground, Osborne Avenue, Newcastle, yesterday, was productive of some very even play, and at the close of the day the honours appeared to be equally divided. Both sides had strong teams in the field, and Cheshire, winning the toss, had first use of a wicket upon which the rain had had little effect except to make the ball greasy for the bowlers.

Cheshire gave a sound, all-round display in their first innings, which yielded 247 runs. Chief honours fell to H. W. Hodgson, who went in first with W. E. Jones, and was fifth out at 166, having scored thirteen 4's in the course of his 85. His batting was always bright, though he gave a chance when just over 30 and should have been stumped shortly after reaching his 50. With W. E. Jones he put on 42 for the first wicket, and he and L. N. Jones added 40 for the third. Although the bowling of Milne and Hetherton always commanded respect, the score steadily rose, and at 133 Hope, who helped Hodgson to add 45 for the fourth partnership, was stumped by Craig.

NINTH WICKET STAND.

Hodgson himself followed at 166; but the remainder of the team proved equal to getting runs, and a particularly good effort was that of J. P. Hodgson and Clifton, who put on 31 for the ninth wicket. The entire side was out for 247, put together in three hours and ten minutes. Scoring was frequently slow, this being due to the excellent bowling of Milne and Hetherton and the good field work of the Northumbrian side. The two professionals did practically all the bowling, but, whilst Milne had little luck with his deliveries, Hetherton claimed no fewer than nine wickets at an average cost of ten runs. He displaced Towler when the score was 30, and bowled continuously for the remainder of the Cheshire innings.

GOOD BATTING BY COUVES AND HUNTING.

Northumberland made a very poor start. Stanger-Leathes left at 12, and Broadbelt at 17. A fine partnership by Couves and Hunting put a different complexion on things, however. The St. George's man gave a very stylish display of batting, and had accounted for 45 out of 88 when he was out to a brilliant catch by Clarke behind the wicket. Hunting continued to bat confidently, and, aided by Whitfield, took the score to 116 before the latter put up a return to Cook. The Cheshire bowling permitted no liberties, and Hunting was unusually restrained in his innings. Neither Towler nor Armstrong made a long stay, the latter being bowled by a fine ball from Clifton; but Milne showed plenty of confidence by scoring 29 out of 49 added by the seventh partnership. At 180 Hetherton joined Hunting, and the pair took the score to 206 when play ceased for the day. The Tynedale professional played generally on the defensive, and left the scoring to Hunting, who had 89 to his credit at the close. The game will be resumed at eleven o'clock this forenoon.

NORTHUMBERLAND V. CHESHIRE.

EASY VICTORY FOR THE CESTRIANS.

NORTHERNERS' SECOND INNINGS COLLAPSE.

Commenced in Newcastle on Monday. At one period of the game at the County ground, Osborne Avenue, Newcastle, yesterday, there was a prospect of a very close finish if not a Northumbrian victory, but faulty fielding in one part of the Cheshire innings, and unenterprising batting in the home side's second venture resulted in the match ending shortly before six o'clock in a comfortable win for the Cestrians by 114 runs.

Thirty-five minutes in the forenoon sufficed to finish off the Northumberland innings. Hunting added only two runs to his overnight 89 and then played a weak stroke which resulted in his being easily caught in the slips. He had batted about two and a half hours, and his hits included one six and 14 fours. Hetherton and Craig added 21 for the ninth wicket, but the former was caught in the slips and four runs later Craig fell to a good ball from Cook. The innings lasted three hours and five minutes. Cook was the best of the Cheshire bowlers, his six wickets costing 79 runs.

MISSED CATCHES.

Cheshire did not do so well in the opening of their second venture. Only 32 runs were recorded when the first wicket fell, and four good batsmen were out for 71. The association of J. P. Hodgson and Hope, the visiting captain, was expensive for the home county, for the total was raised to 139 before a separation was effected. Hodgson survived an appeal for leg before from his first ball, and at 15 gave a hard chance to Armstrong. In the course of his innings of 42 he had two other lives, one of them an easy catch. Hope, too, was lucky, for he was left off at 29, and stayed to put on 43. Both men, however, were out at 139, but Morris and Astle added 47 for the next wicket, the former ultimately carrying out his bat for a well played 42. The later batsmen all helped on the total, and the innings closed for 215.

The Northumberland field work was not nearly so good as in the first innings, and in addition to a number of missed catches, there were two occasions when batsmen escaped being run out through the ball being returned to the wrong end. Hetherton again took the bowling honours, claiming six wickets for 93 runs. He therefore, in the course of the match, was responsible for 15 of the Cheshire wickets. Milne had three wickets for 84 runs, and Towler the other for 27.

DEFENSIVE BATTING.

Northumberland were set to get 226 to win, and as they had agreed to extend play until 7 o'clock if necessary, they had about three hours and 20 minutes in which to accomplish their task. It was very soon obvious, however, that it would be impossible to stave off defeat. From the first the Cheshire bowlers established the mastery and with rare exceptions the batsmen were forced on the defensive. Couves left with the score at seven, and the next two wickets fell at the same total, 23. The third wicket, that of Hunting, who failed to score, was a heavy blow to the home side. Stanger-Leathes and Whitfield took the

score to 40 when the home captain was bowled in trying to drive Cook. He was at the wicket an hour, but so cautiously was he compelled to bat that he only scored nine. Of the remainder of the side few showed any liking for the Cestrian attack. Milne hit out brightly for 20 minutes to score 17, and Craig was loudly cheered when he lifted Clifton into the Cemetery for 6. He was, however, bowled by W. E. Jones immediately afterwards. The total reached 111, and Hetherton followed up his good bowling by carrying out his bat for 21.

EXHILARATING BATTING AT JESMOND.

HETHERTON'S REPUTATION ENHANCED.

SPECIAL FEATURES OF SATURDAY'S PLAY.

The absence of Capt. W. P. Rushbrooke and W. Spiller was very much felt at Osborne Avenue on Saturday, where St. George's made the highest score of the season at the expense of the County club. Indeed, the spectators were treated to a brilliant display of vigorous batting by C. P. Stanger-Leathes and J. H. C. Lindsay. The latter in particular hit in quite hurricane fashion, his 73 not out including three powerful drives for 6 and ten 4's. Lindsay and the captain added no fewer than 133 runs in 34 minutes. An average of approximately four a minute.

In making his initial century of the season, Stanger-Leathes made only one mistake in a stay of two hours and 27 minutes, and that a chance in the slips when 29. He made his runs by a variety of strokes all round the wicket, and the only ball he mistimed was the one which gave Farquharson a catch in the country. His chief hits were a couple of 6's and 16 4's. Idle and Skinner also batted well, and when the total was declared at 283 there was little possibility of the club avoiding defeat. As events turned out, Archbold was in great form with the ball, and dismissed six County batsmen for 32, Dickinson and Hunting alone showing any confidence, so that the whole side were out for 105.

Bowlers Supreme at Gosforth.

In capturing six South Northumberland wickets for 17 at Roseworth Terrace, on Saturday, Walter Hetherton brought his total for the season up to 61, for an average cost of 5.68 runs per wicket. Providing he has an ordinary share of luck, he should gain the distinction of securing 100 wickets this season. So deadly was the bowling of the Tynedale professional and Harry Arkie that not one of the South Northumbrians reached double figures, the amateur securing four wickets for 12 runs. The visitors, who batted first, made 149 in an hour and three-quarters, the best display being that of C. E. B. Girling, who had six 4's in a total of 59.

Some timely hitting by Harrison, T. E. Thompson and Lambert enabled Elswick Works to effect a recovery from a moderate start at the Henry Street ground on Saturday against Benwell, and 218 were put on before the last wicket fell. In responding to this score the visitors fared badly, W. G. Armstrong, the County player, alone offering any sustained resistance, and the home side won easily by 119 runs. E. Davis, a new-comer to the Works side, was in particularly fine bowling form and took five wickets at a cost of 4.5 runs a-piece.

Both W. Dover and B. H. Surry bowled extremely well at Dryden Road for their respective clubs, Gateshead Fell and Wallsend, and, in consequence, the scoring was only of a moderate order. Wallsend had the first knock and found Dover difficult to play; but subsequently Surry and Hanson livened matters up. The former was at the wicket only five minutes, but in that period scored no fewer than 20 runs, including three 6's. Dover took seven for 34 and brought his total for the season to 55 for 480—an average of 8.7 per wicket. The Fell did worse than their opponents, and their total fell 35 runs short of the visiting total. Surry's six wickets cost him 42 runs.

Stanley Crozier's Distinction.

Old Novocastrians fared very badly at Ryton, where, thanks to Stanley Crozier's excellent bowling, the visitors were all out for 56. This figure the home side passed for the loss of three wickets, and subsequently went on to score 95 for seven. In taking six for 36, the Ryton professional made his total "bag" for the season one of 54 wickets—each at a cost of 10 runs.

The match between Tynemouth and Backworth Percy for the benefit of the Preston Avenue groundsmen, T. C. Goulden, provided the Seaside with an opportunity of inflicting still another defeat on the champions, whose displays of late

have been much below the usual high standard of the Percy Club. Tynemouth went in first and scored 160, the chief contributors being the captain, W. R. Davies, who hit two balls out of the ground for 6, and scored 45 for the second time this season: Hutchinson, Walter and G. T. James, and J. C. Yeoman.
