

## MONMOUTHSHIRE AT THE OVAL.

### SURREY SECONDS LEAD WITH FIVE WICKETS IN HAND.

Surrey Seconds enjoyed the best of a thoroughly interesting day's cricket at Kensington Oval on Wednesday, and when stumps were drawn held a lead of six, with five wickets outstanding. Up to a point the batting of Monmouthshire proved very disappointing, and at one period six wickets had fallen for only 92, but a brilliant and plucky effort by J. F. Rust brought a welcome change in the visitors' fortunes. Assisted by his captain—who was twice missed—he added an invaluable 53 for the seventh wicket partnership in just over half an hour, Phillips driving skilfully. Harris and Wilcox also proved useful helpmates, and when Rust was caught last man out off Baldwin at first slip the total had been taken to 243, the result of altogether three hours and ten minutes' batting.

Despite previous batting failures, Rust showed splendid confidence from the start, and during his hour and forty-five minutes' stay gave no obvious chance. He employed every kind of stroke to advantage, but revealed special preference for the leg side, making several delightful on drives. Rust's chief scoring strokes were fourteen 4's and he was extremely unlucky not to reach three figures.

The outstanding feature of the Surrey innings was the batting of Cook, who put together 108 out of 216 in two hours and a quarter. Cook played some good length bowling with great skill, making the majority of ten 4's by well-timed drives and cuts. In partnership with Daily 85 runs were added for the first wicket, but afterwards the Monmouthshire bowlers met with more success, Harris especially mixing his deliveries cleverly and maintaining a splendid length.

Unfortunately, the fielding of the visitors was not up to its usual standard, although an exception must be made in the case of Wilcox, who, although giving away 30 extras, proved extremely smart behind the stumps. Scores:—

## MONMOUTHSHIRE LOSE AT THE OVAL.

### SURREY SECONDS WIN BY AN INNINGS AND 16 RUNS.

Monmouthshire were not seen to very great advantage when heavily beaten by an innings and 16 runs by Surrey II. at the Oval on Thursday. They were all out a second time at half-past four after an uneven batting display, and only at one stage—when Williams and Abraham engaged in a splendid first wicket partnership—did the side appear likely to make a prolonged fight.

The advantage on resuming lay with Surrey, who, with only half a side out, were 6 runs ahead and before the innings was completed 190 runs were added in two hours. As the rate of scoring suggested, the outstanding batsmen forced the pace with a large measure of success, but it must be admitted that luck in the way of missed catches in the out-field attended their efforts. ## IN SOUTH WALES.

### CARDIFF OVERWHELMED BY SWANSEA.

#### TAIT AND BELL SCORE MORE THAN THE HOME SIDE.

When clubs of the standing of Cardiff are so badly lacking in young players of real promise, can anyone wonder that county cricket in Glamorgan has touched such a low level. With the facilities available for coaching and practice, Cardiff should be one of the strongest club sides in South Wales—instead they are one of the weakest. Swansea, who were the visitors to Cardiff Arms Park on Saturday, took the fullest advantage of the home club's deficiencies in bowling, batting, and fielding, and gained an overwhelming and thoroughly deserved victory by ten wickets.

It was the veteran, Harry Creber, who, I contend, is the brainiest bowler in the county, who paved the way for this success by taking seven wickets for 80 runs. Creber is a big-hearted fellow, and does not mind tossing up a loose one to encourage the batsmen to hit. He is old enough and wise enough to know that if he fails to get a batsman out the player will eventually get himself out. As we saw him during the Cardiff batsmen into making all manner of bad strokes we could not help comparing him for a moment with Ryan. What a great bowler the last-named would be if only he would take a leaf out of Creber's book. Creber was well supported by W. P. Morgan, a young bowler of considerable promise, and Hinwood, and the Cardiff innings—a most featureless exhibition lasting two hours and forty minutes—closed for 115.

J. R. Tait and Bell, Swansea's opening pair, made so light of Cardiff's bowling that in just over an hour the home total was passed, and when stumps were drawn twenty minutes later they were still together with 135 runs on the boards. In his own particular style J. R. Tait played a great innings and completely overshadowed Bell, as will be seen from a glance at the score. Tait is the sort of player who does not believe in fluttering bowlers, and if his form at Cardiff is a reliable guide then a place should be found for him in the county team forthwith. I am told that the Swansea amateur is anxious to assist the county.

Bell was much more polished in his style, and his play must have gladdened the hearts of all lovers of the game. It is true he offered a hard chance in the slips when he had scored only three and another to the wicket keeper when he had made 34, but we saw sufficient of him to be convinced that he is a fine first-wicket batsman, who should be a tremendous asset to Glamorgan when he qualifies.

## MONMOUTHSHIRE LUCKY 104 RUNS REQUIRED AND ONLY TWO WICKETS TO FALL.

When stumps were drawn at Newport on Saturday Monmouthshire, with only two wickets in hand, were 103 runs behind. They started the day in a favourable position, for, with seven wickets still to fall, they required only 94 to win on the first innings. However, the Surrey bowlers found the wicket more responsive to their wiles than on the previous day, and a series of cheap dismissals put a different complexion on the game. He, however, was fortunate to stay so long, for he was badly missed in the slips before he had scored.

With the score at 90, play was again stopped through bad light. On resumption, Hullen very carefully played himself in. Light coaxed him in all ways, but the young batsman refused to be drawn, and a maiden resulted. Harry was appealed against for leg before, but it was not allowed. Hullen fell to Amory in the next over, clean bowled, without breaking his "duck." At 110 Harry gave a difficult chance to slip, and two balls later stumper took him cleverly for a delightfully played 39, and the score stood at 114 for seven. With the first ball Wilcox was caught at first slip, and the score was the same for eight.

Play was resumed at 11.30 on Saturday, Harris (the Abercarn pro) did not reappear as he was suffering from a strain. The remainder of the side were soon out, but not before H. G. Spary had knocked up a bright 14, his first stroke being a six boundary. Monmouth were all out for 131, and being over one hundred behind, it was incumbent upon them to follow on.

This return game followed closely upon the heels of the first, which was played at Barry on Thursday, when Pontypool were fairly easily accounted for. Barry came with an excellent side, including W. Eppler, Hills and Lawson. The over-night rain had not considerably affected the wicket from the batting standpoint, as Spiller and Hills soon demonstrated. E. Martin opened the attack, and Spiller put it away for 6, following with a 4. Thirteen runs were registered with lightning rapidity, when Spiller fell to a brilliant one-handed catch by Martin at third man off Snell's first over. Hills went on to score at a fast rate, hitting all round the wicket, and the crowd applauded him vociferously. Lawson, too, made many delightful strokes. Hills gave one chance when he had scored about 30, George Lewis missing him off Poulson. Hills was the only player to pass the half-century, but the side amassed the extremely useful total of 181. Weyer was particularly successful with the ball.

There was a mild surprise when Spary came to the wicket with Fawdry, the reason for this being that the genial captain desired to be released as soon as possible. He at once made his presence felt, and, curiously enough, reached the same total as Spiller in almost as quick a time. Poulson joined Fawdry, and the pair were getting nicely settled when, within a matter of a few minutes, both men were out to catches. Poulson was the first to go, Weyer, who followed, made some pretty strokes to the off and on, and his forward strokes were exhilarating, eliciting loud applause from a well pleased crowd. Unfortunately for Pontypool, the plucky Fawdry was dismissed by a provoking but none the less clever catch, and Ben Evans joined Weyer. Twice the new batsman was missed before the over had finished, and these "lives" resulted in his making the best score of the side. Weyer treated the bowling at each end with scant courtesy. He pulled a pretty 2 to leg, drove through cover for 3, and opened his shoulders for a lovely forward stroke in an apparently unattended portion of the field. Hills ran in at such a speed that, after a brilliant sprint of some dozen yards, he took the "crimson rambler" low down and in full stride to magnificently dismiss the local pro. for a well played 14. The Barry total in the meantime seemed so far away as to be almost unattainable. Still, George Lewis and Ben Evans under ordinary circumstances were capable of a "stand." The old Talywain boy settled down and collected 3 useful runs to then return a simple catch to the bowler, Spiller, and the telegraph read 66-5-3. T. Winsor joined Evans and was twice missed—at square leg and second slip. Both batsmen displayed some pretty late cuts, and in a short space of time Pontypool had climbed to the 80 mark. A change of bowling was tried, but the batsmen kept cool, and the century was within a span when Winsor appeared to step in front for a leg stroke, and a confident appeal sent him back to the pavilion. This was the beginning of the end, for Jim Evans was stumped before he had scored. W. Price was caught by White off Osborne, and the third successive ball from Osborne saw E. Martin—in a manful effort to break the chain of fate—fall to a beautiful one-handed catch on the deep leg boundary by Scrivens. Osborne received quite an ovation from the crowd and players upon his unique "hat trick." W. Harris was last man in, and Evans and he succeeded in topping the century, although the last man in was almost run out in the effort. Harris scored 1, and Evans played forward instead of back to a "teaser" from Osborne, and James, the "stumper," very deliberately and cleverly removed his bails. The game was bright and pretty, and most thoroughly enjoyable. Pontypool scored their 100 in about an hour and a quarter, the same time, by the way, as it took Monmouthshire—against Devon—to score 40. Scores:—

## MONMOUTHSHIRE LOSE THEIR GRIP.

### ONE-ARMED DORSET MAN'S GREAT BOWLING.

By "NOMAD."

Monmouthshire lost a glorious opportunity of building up an impregnable position against Dorset at Ebbw Vale on Friday. By dint of excellent bowling, and fielding that was equally impressive, the home county dismissed Dorset on a good wicket in just over an hour and a half for only 88 runs, and at one period actually had 80 runs on the telegraph themselves for the loss of only two wickets. Here was Monmouthshire's chance, but the remaining batsmen failed so badly that the innings closed for 134—the last four wickets all falling at the same total.

When Dorset opened their second innings, only 48 runs behind, Chadwick and Knight treated the bowling with such scant respect that they put on 171 runs for the first wicket before Chadwick, who required only 12 to complete his century, was adjudged leg-before. This was the only success Monmouthshire's bowlers met with, and Dorset, at the close, were in a strong position, being 141 runs ahead with nine wickets to fall.

It was a remarkably fine achievement on the part of Monmouthshire to dispose of Dorset in their first innings so cheaply as they lacked the services of two of their regular bowlers—Kenneth Raikes and Harris. Spary and T. J. Lloyd, whose bowling provided a splendid contrast, had all the visiting batsmen in difficulties, and not a stand of real note was made.

When Monmouthshire went in they lost G. Williams with only 17 runs scored, but S. Arthur helped N. Abraham in a bright second wicket partnership which raised the score to 76 before the first-named, who five times found the boundary with beautifully-timed drives, was bowled. From then onward, however, Dorset met with astonishing success, two wickets falling at 81, two more at 122, and the last four at 134.

Abraham, who was fifth to leave, was batting two hours for his 57, which under the circumstances was a magnificent effort. At first he was inclined to flatter the bowlers, but afterwards he drove with power and certainty, and hit six 4's.

The remarkable collapse of Monmouthshire was brought about by A. M. Harrison, a rare cricket personality, for his left hand is completely withered and useless. Even when batting he only uses one hand. But Harrison is a cricketer of more than average ability. He started his destructive work by dismissing Arthur and Phillips in the same over, and continued it by getting the wickets of Dolman and Wilcox with successive balls. Altogether he took eight wickets for less than 4 runs each.

Not only did Monmouthshire's bowling lack the sting and accuracy that characterised it in the morning when Dorset went in to bat a second time, but the fielding was also below par. R. M. Chadwick and Knight took full advantage, the amateur being in such an aggressive mood that he actually scored 50 out of 70 in half an hour. Forcing the pace as he was, it was natural that his innings was not free from fault, and off successive balls he offered chances to Walters and Charles when he had scored 57. Lloyd was the bowler to suffer on each occasion. The Ebbw Vale man also failed to hold a red-hot return by Knight. He, however, made a gallant attempt to do so, and so badly damaged his hand that he had to retire. Scores:—

## MONMOUTHSHIRE LOSE BY 312 RUNS.

### ONE-HANDED DORSET MAN AGAIN IN FORM.

On a pitch which earlier in the day had proved a batsman's paradise, and which always played fast and easy, Monmouthshire gave a feeble batting display against Dorset at Ebbw Vale on Saturday, and were defeated by the overwhelming margin of 312 runs. When it is remembered that Monmouthshire obtained a lead of 46 runs on the first innings it will be readily realised how completely they lost their grip of the game.

The home county's second innings realised only 59 runs, and the abject failure was due not so much to brilliant bowling as to the complete lack of confidence which the Monmouthshire players displayed. Instead of treating the bowling on its merits and punishing the loose balls, everyone with the exception of Waters regarded the brothers Harrison, who bowled unchanged, as though they were super-men. It was bad tactics on the part of Abraham and Siddall to allow the attack to gain the upper hand from the start by flattery and making every ball appear difficult. In playing seven consecutive maidens they courted disaster.

Had this pair shown a little enterprise they might have given their side a good start, and the final score would have reached more respectable dimensions. Unfortunately, the policy pursued at the start was continued throughout the innings, which was one of the most inglorious affairs it is possible to imagine. Praise, of course, must be given to the two Harrisons—Wilfred and "A. M."—for the manner in which they took advantage of their "spineless" opponents. W. Harrison had no fewer than a dozen maidens in his twenty overs and captured six wickets for 26 runs, whilst A. M. Harrison, who took eight for 23 in Monmouthshire's first innings, brought his bag of victims for the match up to twelve for 61.

That the wicket was in excellent condition and that Monmouthshire's bowling possessed little guile was strikingly emphasised by Dorset earlier in the day, when they carried their overnight score of 187 for one to 417 for eight before declaring. Knight, who had scored 72 when stumps were drawn on Friday, punished the bowling so mercilessly that he added another 78 in less than an hour before he was bowled by a delivery which kept very low. Driving with tremendous power, he obtained no fewer than 72 runs from boundary hits, and except for a very hard chance which he offered Lloyd off his own bowling before he had scored 50, and another to Abraham immediately before he was bowled, his innings was faultless.

A. M. Harrison, Dorset's one-handed player, and Elderton put on 47 runs in about twenty-five minutes. Harrison's form was positively amazing, and the crowd cheered him unstintingly when he carried his bat for 33. The manner in which he drove the fairly fast bowling of Spary, whom he hit for two 4's and three 2's in one over, was a revelation, whilst he was equally brilliant in his timing on the leg side. He must be one of the most accomplished all-round cricketers playing in minor county cricket, and was certainly the outstanding personality in this game. Scores:—

## WALES AND IRELAND AT LLANDUDNO.

N. V. H. RICHES AND MERCER IN SPLENDID FORM.

LLANDUDNO, Saturday.

Glorious weather prevailed on Saturday at Llandudno when Wales and Ireland met in the first international match to reckon as first class, as well as the first played in North Wales.

Ireland won the toss, and elected to play on what was expected to prove a tricky wicket later. Play up to lunch was fairly quiet, only 60 runs being scored in the first hour, and at lunch the total was 80 for three.

A magnificent spell of bowling by Mercer put Wales in a strong position, as in nine overs after lunch he dismissed seven batsmen for eleven runs. He made the ball rise quickly off the pitch and kept a beautiful length. He was given an ovation on returning to the pavilion, in which both teams joined. Prior to lunch he had been hit for 25 runs without taking a wicket.

Ireland's first four batsmen were the only ones to trouble the bowlers, Walton and Kelly making their runs with freedom. Kelly hit a 6 and five 4's. He went in at the fall of the second wicket, and was ninth out. Walton hit seven 4's and was out to a brilliant catch by Ryan, who held a hard return. Walton had just previously been missed in the slips by Ryan, so that player atoned for his mistake.

In all the Irishmen batted two-and-a-half hours. The Welsh fielding was keen, and very few mistakes were made.

MERCER JUST MISSES HIT TRICK.

The first wicket fell at 43, Ganly being well taken on the leg side by Sullivan on the first ball sent down by Clay, who had relieved Raikes, who had opened with Mercer, and Walton and Parry added 41 before the former was dismissed by Ryan. Parry was bowled by the same bowler at 89, and lunch was taken. Power was bowled at 98, and byes sent up the 100.

Lambert and Ashton were bowled with successive balls by Mercer. Jackson, the next man in, hit the first ball for a couple, missed the next, and was bowled by the fifth ball of the over. Douglas and Kelly took the score to 130 before the former was bowled. The ninth wicket added twenty, Kelly being dismissed by Mercer, who bowled Allen with the first ball of his next over.

FINE INNINGS BY RICHES.

Wales started batting with Riches and Bell, who played steadily from the outset. With the score at 42 Bell was out to a belated appeal—a decision which was not relished. With Mallalieu in the scoring slowed down, and at the tea interval the total was 68 without further loss.

After tea both players gave brilliant displays of hitting, and, despite frequent changes of the bowling, the score mounted rapidly. Riches completed 50 out of 110 after batting 100 minutes. Lambert, after bowling 22 overs for 31 runs, retired in favour of Walton. Riches hit the new bowler for six and four off successive balls, and in the next over knocked Parry for successive fours.

Mallalieu completed his 50 after ninety minutes' batting, and was eventually bowled with the third ball of the last over of the day. He hit nine 4's.

## WALES WIN EASILY.

DEADLY BOWLING BY RAIKES AGAINST IRELAND.

LLANDUDNO, Monday.

As seemed probable after Saturday's play Wales gained an easy victory over Ireland to-day by an innings and 36 runs.

When the match was continued glorious weather prevailed, and there was a good crowd. Wales' remaining batsmen added 98 runs, thus giving them a lead of 136—a total which proved too much for the Irishmen, and the match was over shortly after four o'clock.

By a singular coincidence Ireland collapsed after lunch, as they had done on Saturday, and their downfall was due to some excellent bowling by Raikes, who in the course of eleven overs dismissed seven batsmen for 12 runs up to the fall of eight wickets, when the total was only 40. Jackson and Aston "stopped the rot," adding 59 runs for the ninth wicket, but their plucky stand was of no avail. Jackson hit six 4's and he scored 11 off Raikes' last over, thus spoiling that bowler's fine figure, but his record was a fine testimony.

RICHES TOPS THE CENTURY.

Interest before lunch centred upon whether N. V. H. Riches would obtain the coveted century. He went to the wickets accompanied by Davies, who was missed before scoring, but was quickly bowled. Riches, when 98, was caught off a no-ball at square-leg, but with Symonds in he completed the century, with a smartly run single, out of 210, after batting three hours.

He was eventually brilliantly caught in driving Parry, the bowler holding a "hot" return with one hand near the ground, the score then being 253. Riches' best hits were a 6 and ten 4's.

Clay was smartly stumped 7 runs later, and Rowland was dismissed at 270 after being struck in the face by a rising ball. The rest did little, Mercer being missed three times, once by Ganly, who had to retire with a split finger caused by attempting the catch.

Ireland had a few minutes' batting before lunch, and Walton was bowled by Mercer with only 4 runs scored, lunch being then taken. On resuming, only 13 runs were added when a smart catch by Mallalieu in the slips sent back Sugden. The professional opened confidently, hitting hard from the outset, but failing to time properly was well caught by Luther Davies off Evan Davies. Thomas played cautiously after this, but stepped across to square out the slow bowler and got under the ball, and Dick Davies made a safe catch at point. The crowd, seeing the departure of two crack batsmen thus early, were highly enthusiastic. Further excitement was theirs, however, when the Abercarnald bowler clean bowled Harry Tomlinson.

Came now Billie Davies, another Glamorgan player, and, as is his wont, started hitting hard. The home fielding, however, was brilliant, and the score rose slowly. Then a sensational catch was made, for Davies hit a ball from Evan Davies with terrific force towards the pavilion. Few thought that a catch would be made, but Harry Ford, with a superhuman effort, jumping high, held the ball with one hand. Deafening applause followed. Grave doubts were cast on the decision, for it was stoutly held that in making the catch Ford had stepped back over the boundary line.

The rest of the Town team presented moderate opposition, and one of the strongest run-getting sides in Wales fell for 45 runs. Great praise is, of course, due to the Plymouth bowlers, Rees Williams, Dick Thomas and Evan Davies, for all bowled remarkably well. A word must be given to the home wicket-keeper, Dick Williams. Every ball was safely held, and "Mr. Extras" had nothing standing against his name.

Plymouth opened with Rees Williams and Dick Davies, but so good was the Town bowling, and so keen and deadly their fielding, that runs were exceedingly difficult to obtain. Only two batsmen reached double figures—Rees Williams and Will Thomas. The latter did very well, and one perfectly-timed ball hit into the gardens was loudly applauded. Williams, however, was the hero, and his magnificent fighting innings will long be remembered. Many times has he scored more runs, but, perhaps, never has he played so finely. The Perry attack was (throughout the innings) truly effective and in deadly earnest. The whole team was on its toes, but "Reesie" was simply impregnable. All the "shots" of the cricketer are at his command, he watches every ball with the trained eye of the expert; he is seemingly untroubled with nerves, and lastly he is courageous. He stayed from first to last, and was given out for obstruction, a much-resented decision. When the last wicket fell, the crowd ran to the entrance and gave "Reesie" an unusually warm ovation, which he thoroughly deserved.

This fine win should do Plymouth a great deal of good. It is apparent that although the local team is made up of players drawn from this district only, it is one of the strongest combinations in Wales. Only once has the side met with defeat this season!

Arnott, nevertheless, is a very useful batsman, and as he is still very young it is reasonable to expect that he will improve.
