

**WILTSHIRE COUNTY CRICKET.**

**TALL SCORING AT THE OVAL IN  
OPENING MATCH.**

Wiltshire opened its season in County cricket at the Oval on Saturday and Monday, when it met Surrey second, and lost by eight wickets. The Wiltshiremen had a fairly good team out, including a very useful addition in the person of Captain L. F. Marson, of Salisbury. The team as a whole batted well, but were up against strong opposition, two of their first three men making over a century each in the initial innings, though one of them had a let off early in his batting. The bowling honours were shared by Lock, who took six of the Wiltshire wickets for 59 in the first innings, and two for 38 in the second; and Lloyd, who was credited with five of the Surrey wickets for 21. The band of the 1st Battalion Wilts Regiment played a selection of music during the afternoon, and at the tea interval the guests were received in the members' enclosure by Mrs. Dansey. Unfortunately a prior engagement prevented the Mayor (Mr. J. Brothers) from being present, and the Deputy-Mayor (Mr. R. Bousie) was accompanied by Messrs. J. S. Rambridge, A. Salisbury-Jones, E. J. Case, and T. G. Moore. Many members of the Club were also present, and the pleasant, informal eve it was one of the many enjoyable features associated with the week.

### "THE MAN FROM TORONTO."

#### Performances by South Wilts Players.

In connection with Salisbury Cricket Week, and in aid of the Wilts County Cricket Club and the South Wilts Cricket Club, Beaminster, the South Wilts players presented "The Man From Toronto," a comedy in three acts, by Douglas Murray, at the Victoria Hall, Salisbury, on Friday, Monday, Wednesday, and last nights.

Telhamouth is the scene of the comedy. Here Mrs. Calthorpe (Mrs. L. F. Marson), an attractive young widow, entertains her big, lothario cousin, Robert Gilmore (Major C. T. Ellison), whose education had cost £2000, and whom she describes as a "harmless lunatic." The serenity of the Devonshire home is ruffled by the appearance of Mr. Pitcaithley (Mr. F. S. Elgar), the widow's solicitor, who informs her that a wealthy old Canadian gentleman, whose offer of marriage she had previously rejected, had died, and had stipulated in his will that nearly the whole of his vast fortune should go to his nephew, Fergus Winbush, of Toronto (Captain L. F. Marson), subject to his marrying Mrs. Calthorpe. "The Man From Toronto" visits the widow's house, but is told she has been called away unexpectedly to a sick friend. This tale is only a ruse of the widow, for she acts as her own parlourmaid in order to learn more about her Colonial suitor. The other characters in the story are interested in the financial part of the love pact, and are dreadfully alarmed when the Canadian falls madly in love with the "parlourmaid." Only when she has won the Canadian's love as a servant does Mrs. Calthorpe disclose her real identity, and everything ends happily.

As the two leading characters, Captain and Mrs. Marson acted with conspicuous success. The humorous element was introduced by Major Ellison, who was particularly good in the last act. The mannerisms of Mrs. C. T. Ellison and Miss Jane Fisher (representing the eccentric Mrs. Hubbard and her equally eccentric daughter) added to the general hilarity. The virtues and vices of the legal profession were exhibited with commendable skill by Mr. Elgar in the role of the widow's solicitor, and Mrs. Ellison appeared in another difficult role as the Canadian's older sister, who hoped to share the fortune. As the dashing younger sister of the Canadian, Miss Jane Fisher displayed vivacity; whilst the trustworthy servant Martha was efficiently represented by Miss Campbell.

### WILTSHIRE CAPTAIN'S SATISFACTION.

At the Victoria Hall, on Wednesday evening, before the play, "The Man From Toronto," was commenced, Mr. A. E. Allin introduced Lieutenant-Colonel R. W. Awdry, and said he was captain of the County Club, and had been treasurer and secretary. He believed he was also the oldest playing member of the Club. For many years he had been the mainstay of the Club, which would have been non-existent had it not been for his efforts in the past. (Applause.)

Lieutenant-Colonel Awdry said he assumed he was talking to people who were keen about cricket in Wiltshire and were especially interested in the South Wilts Club and the County Club. He wanted, on behalf of the County Club, to thank everyone who had taken any part in the organisation and running of the Cricket Week. For many years they had tried to run cricket and make it a success in the county, but they had had very little success with which to make their bricks. However, it had occurred to certain energetic members in South Wilts to see whether they could not do something to make it a big thing, and he was glad to say that they had set their ambition to rival the Canterbury Week. It was a small beginning, but a very successful one, and he thought they would all agree that the outdoor game accompanied with that evening's entertainment was the finest line that could be taken. The speaker proceeded to thank the officials connected with the Cricket Week especially the groundsmen, including the cast of the play, Major-General Sir Henry Everett, K.C.M.G., C.B., and Mr. A. E. Allin, for their work in connection with the play; Wing-Commander Barrett, R.A.F., Old Sarum, who allowed the band to play at the performances of the play; Major Ellison, the secretary of the South Wilts Club (Mr. Oakley Hill),

and the secretary of the County Club (Captain Page). He also thanked the citizens of Salisbury who had attended the matches and who had behaved in the way they would have them behave. Every time that a player did anything meritorious the crowd had whole-heartedly applauded, whoever it might have been. It was not so at all matches in other parts of the country. ## A WONDERFUL HITTER.

Alan Sawyer's 84 from Three Overs.

Alan Sawyer, a Wiltshire County batsman, playing for Melksham against Swindon Victoria, scored at a remarkable rate in making 151 not out. ## SALISBURY CRICKET WEEK.

Successful Venture.

Salisbury Cricket Week extended from the preceding Friday to Friday in last week, and during this period Wiltshire played three two-day matches at Bemerton, on the ground of the South Wiltshire Club, on Saturday afternoon official recognition was given the Cricket Week, when members of the Town Council accepted an invitation to a reception by Colonel and Mrs. Dansey. The Band of the 1st Battalion Royal Regiment played a selection of music during the afternoon, and at the tea interval the guests were received in the members' enclosure by Mrs. Dansey.

In connection with the Salisbury Cricket Week, and in aid of the Wiltshire County Cricket Club and the South Wiltshire Cricket Club, Bemerton, the South Wiltshire Players presented "The Man From Toronto," comedy in three acts, by Douglas Murray, at the Victoria Hall, Salisbury, on Friday, Monday, Wednesday and Thursday nights.

At the Victoria Hall on Wednesday evening, before the play commenced, Mr. A. E. Allin introduced Lieutenant-Colonel R. W. Awdry, and said he was captain of the County Club, and had been treasurer and secretary. He believed he was also the oldest playing member of the Club. For many years he had been the mainstay of the Club, which would have been nonexistent had it not been for his efforts in its past (applause).

Lieut-Col. Awdry said he wanted, on behalf of the County Club, to thank everyone who had taken any part in the organisation and running of the Cricket Week. For many years they had tried to run cricket and make it a success in the county, but they had had very little straw with which to make their bricks. However, it had occurred to certain energetic members in both Wiltshire to see whether they could not do something to make it a big thing, and he was glad to say that they had set their ambition to rival the Canterbury Week. It was a small beginning, but a very successful one. He thanked the citizens of Salisbury who had attended the matches, and who had behaved in the way they would have had them behave. Every time that a player did anything meritorious the crowd had whole-heartedly applauded, whatever it might have been. It was not in all matches in other parts of the country. If people would not ask "What is the matter with cricket?" but would ask "What is the matter with first-class cricket?" they would talk sense. They had seen at Bemerton the efforts of people who did not profess to be first class. He returned to think, however, that they had seen cricket absolutely at its very best. He could not remember any occasion when club sides had tried to win matches with such risk-taking cricket as they had seen during the past few days (applause).

Crook and Read were settling down when the latter was bowled, and when Carpenter went out both batsmen wisely adopted safety tactics. Together they raised the score to 23, but Crook was then beaten by a ball from Lieutenant Miller, who had replaced Williams. One more run was scored, and then Cutler lost his wicket to Harris, and the score then stood at the none too healthy position of 24 for five. Woodland, Brooks, and Hill batted carefully, and their scores of 12, 15, and 18 respectively made matters a little more hopeful, but the remaining batsman was an easy prey to Harris, and the team was all out for 73. The Experimental School made a shaky start. Lieutenant Johnstone and Morris opened the innings, but with only two runs scored the former was caught by Cutler off Sargeant's bowling, and in the next over the same bowler took Pearson's wicket after he had made two. The batsmen took no unnecessary chances, and runs came rather slowly. Corporal Spilsbury's 24 was the highest individual effort of the match, and the School were out for 67 runs. In St. Martin's second innings there were no extras, and all the batsmen were clean bowled, the total score being 56 runs.—At the conclusion of the match, Mr. Whytehead made the presentations to the teams. In handing the cup to Adlam, on behalf of St. Martin's, he congratulated the team on winning the championship, and commented on the sporting manner in which the match was contested. He paid a high tribute to the excellent work the League was doing in its efforts to promote a high standard of cricket. He praised both teams on the splendid fight they had put up that day, and during the season.
