

WILTSHIRE COUNTY CRICKET.

**TALL SCORING AT THE OVAL IN
OPENING MATCH.**

Wiltshire opened its season in County cricket at the Oval on Saturday and Monday, when it met Surrey second, and lost by eight wickets. The Wiltshiresmen had a fairly good team out, including a very useful addition in the person of Captain L. F. Marson, of Salisbury. The team as a whole batted well, but were up against strong opposition, two of their best three men making over a century each in the initial innings, though one of them had a let off early in his batting. The bowling honours were shared by Lock, who took six of the Wiltshire wickets for 59 in the first innings, and two for 38 in the second; and Lloyd, who was credited with five of the Surrey wickets for 21. As the two leading characters, Captain and Mrs. Marson acted with conspicuous success. The humorous element was introduced by Major Ellison, who was particularly good in the last act. The mannerisms of Mrs. C. T. Ellison and Miss Jane Fisher (representing the eccentric Mrs. Hubbard and her equally eccentric daughter) added to the general hilarity. The virtues and vices of the legal profession were exhibited with commendable skill by Mr. Elgar in the role of the widow's solicitor, and Mrs. Ellison appeared in another difficult role as the Canadian's elder sister, who hoped to share the fortune. As the dashing younger sister of the Canadian, Miss Jane Fisher displayed vivacity; whilst the trustworthy servant Martha was efficiently represented by Miss Campbell.

WILTSHIRE CAPTAIN'S SATISFACTION.

At the Victoria Hall, on Wednesday evening, before the play, "The Man From Toronto," was commenced, Mr. A. E. ALLIN introduced Lieutenant-Colonel R. W. Awdry, and said he was captain of the County Club, and had been treasurer and secretary. He believed he was also the oldest playing member of the Club. If people would not ask "What is the matter with cricket?" but would ask "What is the matter with first-class cricket?" they would talk sense. They had seen at Bemerton the efforts of people who did not profess to be first class. He returned to think, however, that they had seen cricket absolutely at its very best. He could not remember any occasion when he had tried to win matches with unimpaired taking cricket as they had seen during the past few days (applause).

SALISBURY AND DISTRICT LEAGUE FINAL.

ST. MARTIN'S v. EXPERIMENTAL STATION, PORTON.

In contrast to the experiences of several seasons past, the Salisbury and District Cricket League final was played on Saturday under ideal weather conditions. The contestants for the championship were St. Martin's and the Experimental Station, Porton, and the game was played on the pitch of the Chafyn Grove School, London-road, Salisbury, lent by Mr. H. C. Whytehead (headmaster). St. Martin's were well represented; and the Experimental Station were able to field their regular side with the exception of Sapper Jackson and Captain Decker. Staff-Sergeant H. H. Rowland and Mr. A. Mitchell carried out the duties of umpires. Among a fair number of spectators were the Rev. I. G. Cameron, the Rev. and Mrs. A. W. Reeves, Mr. H. C. Whytehead, Mr. F. Baker, Mr. J. Drake (League chairman), Mr. F. J. Hart (Gordon secretary), and representatives of the Choberton, St. Mark's, Harnham, Alderbury, Winterbourne, and other clubs. On a soft wicket, Read and Rattue opened the batting for St. Martin's to the bowling of Sergeant Harris and Williams. The game started in an interesting manner, for Rattue knocked the first ball from Harris to the boundary, but two balls later he was clean bowled. Searle filled the vacancy, but before the over was complete he was sent back to the pavilion without having made any addition to the score. Crook and Read were settling down when the latter was bowled, and when Carpenter went out both batsmen wisely adopted safety tactics. Together they raised the score to 23, but Crook was then beaten by a ball from Lieutenant Miller, who had replaced Williams. One more run was scored, and then Cutler lost his wicket to Harris, and the score then stood at the none too healthy position of 24 for six. Woodland, Brown, and Hill batted carefully, and their scores of 12, 15, and 15 respectively made matters a little more hopeful, but the remaining batsman was an easy prey to Harris, and the team was all out for 73. The Experimental Station made a shaky start. Lieutenant Johnstone and Morish opened the innings, but with only two runs scored the former was caught by Cutler off Searle's bowling, and in the next over the same bowler took Pearson's wicket after he had made two. The batsmen took no unnecessary chances, and runs came rather slowly. Corporal Pearson's 24 was the highest individual effort of the match, and the School was out for 67 runs. In St. Martin's second innings there were no extras, and all the batsmen were clean bowled, the total runs being 55 runs.—At the conclusion of the match, Mr. Whytehead made the presentations to the teams. He was unable to make the presentation of the ball, as a game was being played that afternoon which would determine the issue.—Mr. J. Drake, on behalf of the

League, thanked Mr. Whytehead for granting permission to play on his beautiful ground, and for making the presentations. He regretted the absence of their President, Mr. Nash, who had generously given the bat and the ball for the winners of the batting and bowling averages respectively. He praised both teams on the splendid fight they had put up that day, and during the season.
