JUBILEE GRICKET SENSATION.

A LANGASHIRE XI DISMISSED FOR 25

BOWLERS ON TOP AT THE 4 PARK.

There was some sensational cricket at the l'ark yesterday on the occasion of the clicketing event of the Jubilee week, the meeting of Birkenhead Park-the oldest club in the district, founded long before incorportion-and a Lancashire XI.
