

TYNESIDE SENIOR LEAGUE CHARITY CUP.—1st Round. AN EXTRAORDINARY INNINGS. First Five Batsmen Fall to Score.

An extraordinary occurrence was associated with the meeting of North Durham and Benwell Hill at Prince Consort Road, Gateshead, last night, in the first round of the Tyneside Senior League Charity Competition. North Durham batted first, and were all dismissed for 106. Benwell made a disastrous start, losing Curry with the first ball sent up. Worse, however, was to follow, for before the over was finished another batsman had been sent back, and not a run had been signalled. Then came what is, perhaps, almost without precedent in Tyneside League cricket. When the 13th delivery had been served, five Hill batsmen had been dismissed, and still not a run had been scored. ALNWICK LEAGUE BEAT NORTHUMBERLAND II.

Despite D. Stokoe's Fine Bowling. Having rather the better of the weather conditions, but at the same time thoroughly deserving their success, the Alnwick and District League XI, beat Northumberland II. at the County Ground, Jesmond, yesterday, in a single innings match, by 44 runs.

The Alnwick side batted first, and their opening pair, Stanley Anderson and E. Carae, put on 64 in fifty minutes before the latter was bowled by D. Stokoe, the Armstrong-Whitworth player, who subsequently achieved remarkable success with the ball. Anderson was stumped in Stokoe's next over for a hard hit 40, which included three 4's and two 3's, and only Pyburn of the other batsmen stayed any length of time, the innings closing at 117, made in 112 minutes.

Stokoe, a slow to medium bowler, kept an excellent length, and well supported in the field and behind the wicket, came out with the splendid analysis of eight for 36 in 15 overs, after having had 16 hit off him before he got a wicket.

Northumberland II. soon met with disaster on going in to bat, and only J. D. Ord reached double figures, scoring 41 out of 73 (in which were 12 extras) in 84 minutes. The innings only lasted for 90 minutes, and the bowling honours were shared by four good men. Scores:

STRUGGLE FOR RUNS AT JESMOND.

Durham's Narrow First Innings' Lead.

MAURICE NICHOL'S DISTINGUISHED BATTING.

The visit of the Minor County champions to Jesmond, yesterday, did not produce particularly exhilarating cricket. Indeed for the most part it was a dour affair, with interest centring chiefly on the fight for the first innings lead. This Durham secured by two runs in quite dramatic fashion, a dropped catch actually leading up to the dismissal of the last Northumberland batsman from the same delivery.

Durham made such good use of the 65 minutes remaining for play when they entered upon their second innings, that at the close they were 99 runs to the good with seven wickets standing, a position which indicates a fairly full day's play to-day.

In addition to being without C. J. Adamson, one of their most dependable batsmen, Durham had to take the field minus A. K. Dobson, injured in a League game on Saturday. Ralph Nichol the Eppleton left-hander, filled the vacancy, but, as it happened, was not called upon to bowl. His batting, however, came in useful.

Beautiful Wrist Work.

Durham opened on a wicket favourable to run getting, but they took 168 minutes to make 130. Only four batsmen reached double figures, and Maurice Nichol alone displayed form worthy of the occasion. This young batsman, now qualifying for Worcestershire came in when the first wicket fell with but a single on the board and made 45 out of 59 scored while he was at wicket in a little under an hour. He had seven 4's in his total, one the outcome of a beautiful piece of wrist work which sent the ball spinning to the square leg boundary, two from drives to the off and the remainder with leg shots. He placed the ball nicely, and was never subdued.

Hubert Broos rendered his side excellent service by staying while 41 runs were added in 45 minutes, the Durham's captain shares of 29 including a couple of 4's and a 3. Almost without exception he got his runs on the leg side.

Labouring Batting.

Weight and Ferens generally open out well for Durham, but yesterday morning the City man fell early on, a quick pick-up by Maconachie at square leg and smart work by Craig, defeating the efforts of the first wicket pair to steal a run which was not worth the trying for. Weight was at the wicket six minutes under the hour for 12, and Kelsall occupied 27 minutes for eight. Carr's dismissal at the wicket gave rise to much discussion, and it was felt that the Chester-le-Street man was unlucky to be given out. He managed to get a couple of 4's, one from a lucky snick, and the other a sweep round to leg.

Gibbon was very smartly stumped by Craig after occupying 43 minutes over five singles, while the wicketkeeper performed a juggling feat before taking a catch to dispose of Alderson. A brilliant piece of work by Towler got rid of Howell.

Respect for Milne.

Milne gave ample demonstration of the fact that he can still puzzle the batsmen by bowling eleven maiden overs in his first 10, and having but six runs hit from him. He only got one wicket, but was treated with great respect, the batsmen making their difficulties appear worse by ultra-cautiousness. Towler had nine runs hit from him before he got a wicket, but he took three for other 27, while Hetherington had an excellent bowling spell after lunch, and Maconachie troubled the batsmen considerably. The Northumberland fielding was maintained at a high level.

Mackay opened Northumberland's innings with Bruce in confident style, and made 16 in fourteen minutes before he met his partner. With Broadbent, Mackay took the score to 40, and was then palpably leg before to Cook, after making

24 in half-an-hour. He hooked the ball twice to the boundary, square cut another four, and glided a fourth. Broadbent chopped the ball into Maurice Nichol's hands at 56, and Stanger-Leathes was beaten by Carr 13 runs later, while half the side were out for 75 when Dyar pulled right into Ralph Nichol's hands. Cook was the bowler, and he claimed Towler's wicket with his very next ball.

Only Two Runs in It.

Hetherington livened up matters by driving twice to the boundary and glancing another four, but the score was only 104 when Milne joined Arkwright for the last wicket. There were visions of a first innings lead when Arkwright got three 4's and Milne a couple, but then at 128 the innings closed in curious fashion. Cook dropped a catch from Milne at slip, a run was started—and stopped—and the ball went back to the bowler (Howell), who whipped the bails off ere Arkwright could regain his crease. The Northumberland captain made his 23 by hard driving, and would have scored more if he had got more of the bowling.

Durham only tried three bowlers and Carr had the best figures, although Cook bowled well. Carr dropped a catch and Howell, too, was remiss off the last ball before tea, but he made amends by taking a wicket with his first delivery following the interval.

Out First Ball.

Milne caused a sensation by bowling Weight first ball in the Durham second innings, but Ferens and Gibbon sent the 50 up in 25 minutes without further loss. Three runs later, however, Gibbon was bowled after driving well to claim five 4's in his 27. Ferens left at 63 after making his 35 runs in as many minutes and hitting five boundaries, hooks, and powerful off side shots.

Kelsall and Ralph Nichol played out time in steady style and took the score to 97 made in 65 minutes.

There was an extraordinary happening early in the innings. When Gibbon was seven, a risky call for a run left the Eppleton man at the mercy of Milne who, two feet from the wickets, tried to throw them down square on and missed completely. Scores:

HOWELL THE MATCH WINNER.

Durham's Sensational Success "HAT TRICK" WRECKS NORTHUMBERLAND'S HOPES.

Albert Howell, the South Shields fast bowler, and brother of the former Warwickshire and England player, may well be described as a match winner. At the August Bank Holiday match between Northumberland and Durham at Jesmond last year he won the game for the subsequent Minor County Champions with a wonderful spell of bowling; last evening he again brought about Northumberland's downfall in an inspired attacking period, in which he captured three wickets with successive deliveries—a "hat trick" feat which is still a rare occurrence in representative cricket.

The fortunes of the game fluctuated in wonderful fashion, and interest was maintained right up to 20 minutes past six, when Northumberland's last wicket fell, and Durham were the winners by 35 runs.

The Rain and the Pitch.

Durham's second innings realized 228, and Northumberland were thus set to get 331 runs to win, with a possible four and a half hours in which to get them, counting the extra half-hour which could be claimed to force a decision. Rain, however, curtailed this playing period by fifty-five minutes. The rain undoubtedly damaged the pitch, and the sun after tea probably helped Howell to get some assistance from the wicket for his sensational bowling spell at six o'clock, but even then it was astounding that six wickets should produce only 20 runs, and the last five but eight runs. Indeed, as in the first innings, there was a decided and disquieting evidence of collapse.

Mackay and Bruce, in the course of a partnership which was four times interrupted by rain, gave Northumberland an excellent start by scoring 56 in fifty minutes before Mackay was taken by Ferens standing back to Carr. Then Bruce and Stanger-Leathes carried the total to 91, the last-named losing his wicket to Howell, while Bruce and Arkwright added 33 for the third wicket, 100 minutes having produced 124 runs.

Visions of Victory.

When Arkwright and Broadbelt remained together until the total was taken to 176, Northumberland seemed to have victory within their grasp, but Cook started a sensational "rot" by bowling Dyer, who was too late for a ball that came off the pitch quickly. Howell had come on to bowl again at the Avenue end, and he soon got Arkwright caught behind the wicket immediately following the completion of a fine half-century by the Northumberland captain.

A minute or two afterwards Howell commenced his "hat trick" performance. He got Towler caught at slip by Cook, made a wonderful mid-wicket running catch to dispose of Craig, and then completed the sequence by dismissing Hetherton, who cocked the ball up to Brooks.

Brooks's Hand-shake.

The fact that Howell had taken three wickets in three balls did not appear to be realized, at the moment, by the onlookers, but there was a loud cheer when the Durham captain walked over to the bowler and shook his hand.

Durham were now right on top, of course—they had been in fact since Arkwright's dismissal—and although Maconachie and Milne stayed a little while, the end was inevitable, and it came when Cook bowled Milne.

Howell's figures for the innings were five for 59, and in the match eight for 110. In his deadly spell last night he claimed four wickets in six balls officially, but seven actually, for he got Towler under the seventh ball of the over.

The success of the Minor Counties Champions was certainly achieved quite unexpectedly, but a cricket game, like any other, is never won until it is lost, and Durham's men well deserved the applause they gained on returning to the pavilion.

"North" Batting Features.

It was most disappointing to Northumberland that defeat should be met with after the fine batting of the first five men. The task of getting the runs was no light

one, and it was gratifying to see how courageously it was tackled. Arkwright's innings was a really splendid one. He made his 50 out of 103 in 90 minutes, and hit four 4's and three 2's, chiefly with drives and an occasionally hook. He cocked a ball dangerously near square leg at 43, but otherwise batted in confident style against a varied attack.

Other pleasing features of the innings were the displays of Bruce, Mackay and Broadbelt. Bruce was third out at 124, after making 43 in 100 minutes, and cutting and driving in sound fashion. NORTHUMBERLAND'S CENTURY MEN.

Yorkshire Colts in Trouble.

A GREAT PARTNERSHIP.

Northumberland wound up the first day of their match with Yorkshire II. at Jesmond last night in a very strong position, one indeed which presages a comfortable win for them if the weather continues favourable.

They dismissed Yorkshire II. in 87 minutes for 60, and then in three hours and a half put together a total of 317, while in the last 35 minutes they got one wicket down in the visitors' second innings for 57. Yorkshire thus require 200 to-day to avert a single innings defeat.

It was a day of individual triumphs. Northumberland owed almost everything to W. G. Mackay and H. B. Pritchard for their big score, and were indebted to Hetherton chiefly for the fact that they got rid of the Yorkshiremen so cheaply.

First County Centuries.

Both Mackay and Pritchard had the satisfaction of making a century for the first time in Minor County cricket, and also of taking part in a stand which must almost be a record for Northumberland.

Coming together at the fall of the third wicket with 54 on the board, Mackay and Pritchard added 242 in two hours and five minutes. They sent up the hundred as a result of 73 minutes' play, added a second hundred in a little over 47 minutes, and were not separated until the total had reached 296. Frequent bowling changes were tried but the batsmen were rarely in difficulties, playing fast, medium, and slow deliveries in confident style and keeping up a regular scoring pace.

Mackay's Best Innings.

Mackay was first to leave, bowled by T. A. Jacques, the first team amateur, at 296. Mackay made his 138 runs out of that total in two hours and 51 minutes, and gave but one clear chance, a catch which Grimshaw dropped when the Backworth man was 86. Mackay made his first 50 out of 102 in 73 minutes, reached his hundred out of 221 in ten minutes over two hours, and altogether hit 21 4's, two 3's, and five 2's. His offside driving was very fine, no fewer than 53 runs coming in this way. His forcing shots generally were splendidly executed and his innings was perhaps the most varied and delightful that he has ever played.

There were only five streaky strokes in his effort, and he did well to chop a ball off his stump in his opening over. Leg shots as a rule bring Mackay most of his runs, but yesterday he cut with fine power and precision, getting eight of his boundaries in this manner. The bowling was chiefly on the offside, but he had three fine hooks to the boundary in addition to a big pull. It was indeed an innings of which to be proud.

Pritchard's Forcing Shots.

Pritchard was seventh out at 300, having made his 119 runs out of 246 in a little under two hours and a half. His chief hits were one 6, a big off drive, sixteen 4's, and two 3's. If not so varied an innings as Mackay's, it was featured by splendid shots in front of the wicket, his forcing work being extremely good and quite in accordance with the natural aptitude of a bold and vigorous batsman. Off-driving and hard cutting brought him most of his runs, in addition to 13 accruing from fine, straight driving. Pritchard had a few shots which went dangerously near to hand, a single at 43 being chopped just wide of point, but he had few streaky shots behind the wicket. One occasion he had four successive scoring strokes for 4—three hard cuts and a hook.

He made his 50 in an hour, and occupied a like period over his second half century. He was 96 when he went in to tea, but soon settled down after the interval to complete the century.

The opening partnership in the home innings must not be overlooked. It produced 42 in twenty-eight minutes, and Bruce, with three 4's and two 3's for chief figures, claimed 24, almost wholly made by forcing-off shots.

Bowling Triumphs.

There was a sad collapse after Mackay departed, six wickets going down in 29 minutes for 23 runs. T. A. Jacques was responsible chiefly for this, getting four wickets for one run, with 16 balls in his third spell. Douglas also improved his analysis by taking three of the last four wickets.

The bowling of Hetherton was the feature in the morning, the Tynedale man puzzling the Yorkshiremen so much as to get seven for 33 (the first five for 25). Towler also got three very cheap wickets, while the work of Peacock, the new stumper, was quite satisfactory. He made a fine catch on the leg side to dismiss Mollalien, and stumped Grimshaw in brilliant style.

Turner was the only Yorkshire batsman to offer any defence, and, coming in at the fall of the second wicket, carried out his bat for 27, made out of 36 in 67 minutes. There were three 4's in his innings.

In the last thirty-five minutes Barber and Mollalien hit well in the visitors' second innings, after the captain had left at 4, and so far have made 53. Scores:—

NORTHUMBERLAND'S BIG WIN.

Wind Plays Tricks in Jesmond Game.

FINE BATTING FEATURES AND 13 WICKETS FOR HETHERTON.

The advantage which Northumberland gained over Yorkshire II. on Monday in the match at Jesmond was expected to be consolidated yesterday into a decisive victory for the home county. As it happened, Northumberland won by ten wickets but they had quite a hard struggle — both against the gale of wind and their opponents — before they accomplished their task at a quarter past five.

Collapse Coincidence.

The Yorkshiremen, (thanks entirely to their first four batsmen, carried their overnight score of 57 for one to 335 in seven minutes under four hours, the innings occupying altogether four hours and 38 minutes. They had 294 for four on the board at one period, but then ensued a collapse very much like that which occurred in Northumberland's first innings, and six wickets went down for 41 in half an hour.

Hetherton again had a big hand in the dismissal of the Yorkshire side, taking six wickets for 73 and bringing his analysis for the match up to:

Ten Wickets Down.

Northumberland were left to get 79 runs to win, and with a possible two hours and 25 minutes left for play there was little likelihood, failing a remarkable collapse against T. A. Jacques and Douglas, Yorkshire's only effective bowling pair, of the match being lost, even with W. G. Mackay nursing an injured leg and an improbable starter except in a grave emergency.

Far from any collapse ensuing, however, J. B. Bruce and F. T. Broadbelt, Northumberland's first wicket pair, scored 80 runs between them in forty minutes, 31 coming in a quarter of an hour before tea. Bruce actually scored 53 of 68 runs made with the bat, a fine performance. He had seven 4's and a 3 in his innings, and if he had a measure of good fortune he deserved it if only for his enterprising batting methods. His cutting and off driving was quite the feature of his forty minutes' stay. He might have been caught off his glove when 10, and gave two other sharp chances.

The effect of the wind on the play and players is described in our general columns, but it may be said that balls were dispensed with in the last 100 minutes of play, and that small intervals of inactivity were necessitated by frequent bail replacement and gusts which unbalanced batsmen and bowlers.

Yorkshire's Young Batsmen.

Yorkshire's young batsmen showed that they could bat, and in so doing dissipated the unfavourable impression they had created on Monday when they resumed yesterday morning. Barber and Mallalieu had scored 53 in 40 minutes overnight, and they proceeded to take the total to 121, the result altogether of 90 minutes' batting, before Mallalieu was beaten by a ball from Towler which broke back very sharply.

Scoring 56 out of the 117 added for the second wicket in 85 minutes, Mallalieu did well to get his runs in such attractive style considering that he was suffering from a poisoned hand, which will prevent him playing against Durham to-day. Mallalieu kept the ball down in the approved style, and excelled with beautifully timed off-drives. He gave a sharp chance to slip on Monday night, but that was his only mistake.

Grimshaw joined Barber in a partnership for the third wicket, which realized 67 in forty-three minutes, Barber getting to within five of his century ere making the first bad stroke in his stay of two hours and twenty minutes. He attempted to pull Hetherton, and, mis-

timing the pace of the ball off the pitch gave shortleg an easy catch. Barber's innings, one of the best seen at Jesmond for some time, was made up of correct shots all round the wicket. He exploited every stroke with almost equal facility, and did not give a chance, rarely lifting the ball and placing nicely on the leg side. He had 11 4's.

A Promising 17-Year-Old.

Turner and Grimshaw were next associated, and they made 106 together in an hour and 45 minutes actual stay at the wickets, although the playing period was shortened by frequent bail adjustments. Grimshaw was the batsman to leave at 291, having scored 89 in two hours and a half out of 173. He made several uppish strokes early in his innings, one shot at 31 going close to point, and should have been stumped at 40, but his batting showed him to be a player of much promise. He is only 17, but he knows how to drive, and had three fine 4's from hooks. Altogether he had nine 4's and three 3's in his best score in representative cricket so far.

Turner left ten runs later, and only Heyhurst showed ability to hit of the remainder. Turner was at the wickets five minutes under two hours for his 45, which included five 4's. Scores:—

NEW ZEALANDERS DO NOT DISAPPOINT.

Record Scores at Jesmond.

ROGER BLUNT WITHIN FIVE OF DOUBLE CENTURY.

The spectators who visited the County Ground at Jesmond yesterday in the expectation of seeing the New Zealanders playing up to their reputation as a quick scoring attractive batting side were not disappointed. The tourists had the advantage of batting first on a fine wicket, and kept Northumberland in the field until 25 minutes to five, scoring 476 in the four hours and 15 minutes they were at the wicket. They exposed the weakness in the home attack—lack of variety—and while only in isolated instances did the New Zealand batsmen go all out for the bowling, they scored from it with unflinching regularity.

Northumberland went in at five o'clock, and after losing W. G. Mackay at 31, scored 19 more without further loss until rain put a stop to play at 5.44.

Thus to-day Northumberland will resume in arrears of 426 with nine wickets to fall.

The feature of yesterday's cricket was the innings of Roger Blunt, the Durham-born New Zealander, who made the highest individual score in the tour so far—195—thus beating the 178 made by C. S. Dempster against Durham at Chester-le-Street on Saturday; and the batting of T. C. Lowry, the Tourists' skipper.

On Getting Runs.

Opening the innings with Dempster, Blunt made his runs out of 338 in exactly three hours, a little over a run a minute, being third to leave at that total. While his display was not without blemish, it furnished a lesson to the young cricketer in the art of getting runs with the minimum amount of effort with accurate placing and correct timing.

Blunt scored his first 50 out of 110 in sixty-five minutes, reached a hundred (including seventeen 4's) out of 170 in ninety minutes, and sent his 151 up out of 251 in two hours and twenty minutes with a straight drive off Hetherington into Osborne Avenue. His last 41 runs came in forty minutes, and when finally dismissed, was caught by Bruce in attempting to off-drive Maconachie.

So far as can be recollected, Blunt's score is a record for a representative match at Jesmond, while the New Zealanders' total can hardly have been exceeded.

Thirty-three Boundaries.

Blunt rarely attempted to over-hit the ball, but just waited for the right one to drive, and placed the others with an accuracy which indicated that he knew to a nicety the disposition of the field. He had in addition to his six, 33 4's (one all run), scoring well with powerful off driving, shots through the covers, and hard cuts. He also pulled well to reach the boundary four times. A few of his shots were lofted and went dangerously near to hand, and some nicked, but for the most part he played the ball truly and kept it on the ground.

He should have been caught by Pritchard, off Towler, at 53, gave a sharp chance at 67 to slip, which ended in a boundary, and was dropped by Bruce at square leg at 166. Blunt opened with two singles and then made seven 4's from successive scoring strokes, while on two other occasions he hit three successive boundaries in an over.

The Captain's Innings.

Lowry's crouching stance, combined with the careful way in which he watched the ball, made him appear a much slower and laboured batsman than he actually is, for he made his 95 runs in an hour and three-quarters out of 207.

He only had one stroking stroke in seventeen minutes before lunch, a straight drive past the bowler, but he scored quite freely after the interval, reaching the boundary thirteen times in all. He got nearly 30 runs by beautiful straight driving, and most of the remainder by forcing shots to the off, in addition to several smartly-run singles. His leg shots were infrequent, but he rarely allowed the ball to beat the bat, playing right on top of the bowling.

The first partnership, between Blunt and Dempster, produced 62, the latter getting 29 of the runs with a six (into Osborne Avenue), five 4's, and three singles in half an hour. He took risks, however, when driving with rife power, and was dropped at 10.

Prolific Partnerships.

The second wicket pair, Blunt and M. L. Page, put on 122 in 65 minutes before the last-named was splendidly caught low down by Maconachie at slip. He had three straight drives to the boundary, and got other two 4's with well-placed leg shots.

The most prolific stand of the day, however, was that between Blunt and Lowry, who added 134 in 77 minutes. Oliver did not stay long, and Lowry left at 391 after helping to add 34 for the fifth wicket, while the next four wickets fell for 33 runs. Merritt and Henderson, however, actually scored 42 in the last partnership in a little over a quarter of an hour, Merritt being not out 33. This youngster came in at the fall of the fifth wicket, and made his runs out of 85. He started off with eight singles, but later drove powerfully to claim five 4's.

Century Time Table.

The rate of scoring in the New Zealand innings will illustrate how the batsmen retained their command of the situation from the start:

1st 100 in 60 minutes.
2nd 100 in 20 minutes.
3rd 100 in 50 minutes.
4th 100 in 20 minutes.
5th 100 in 35 minutes.

Rain was falling when Northumberland went into bat, but the players kept in the field until conditions became too bad. Bruce opened in confident style against Oliver and Page, scoring 19 before Mackay opened his account. The Backworth player had only scored two boundaries and a single when he was well caught by Blunt at slip low down with one hand. Stanger-Leather afterwards helped to carry the total to 50, of which Bruce claimed 37, including five 4's, made with pulls, a straight drive, and a square cut.

The Northumberland ground holding was quite good, many boundaries being saved by smart running, but the catching was poor, while Merritt, in addition to escaping stumping, should have been run out. Scores:

SPORTING NOTES.

Jesmond Tourist Recollections.

The present visit of the New Zealanders to the Jesmond County Cricket Ground recalls other occasions when touring teams from overseas have opposed Northumberland, notably the All-Indian side in 1911. The home eleven gained a win by one wicket in this match, despite the fact that there were two century-makers in the All-Indian first innings. They were B. P. Meherhomji (117) and J. S. Warden (116), and the total was 352. The late C. M. Skinner had seven wickets for 120, and followed up this fine performance by taking six for 46 in the second innings, the tourists being dismissed for 102. Northumberland made 290 in their first innings, J. Gilman and Stanley Anderson each scoring over 80, and in the second venture a poor start was retrieved by good batting on the part of the late George Wigham, Anderson, W. W. Meldon, and C. M. Skinner.

It was a three days' match, and in a similar game played at Durham, the Tourists defeated the County by eight wickets after Durham had led by five runs on the first innings. The Durham team on that occasion included H. Brooks, Hugh Dales, Percy Ashley, Thackeray, and J. Turnbull. In the Northumberland side, it is interesting to recall, was Hardisty, who once made 177 at Jesmond on Yorkhiro's behalf, an individual record which, if memory serves one aright, was only broken yesterday by Roger Blunt, on behalf of the New Zealanders, with 195.

NEW ZEALAND WIN BY AN INNINGS.

Pritchard's Second Century in Four Days.

MILNE AND HETHERTON IN A BOLD STAND.

Although H. B. Pritchard made a century against the New Zealanders at Jesmond yesterday, and despite a free hitting display by Hetherton and Milne in the last eighteen minutes—when 47 runs were actually added—Northumberland could not force their visitors to go in again, the Tourists winning an interesting game by an innings and 3 runs at twenty minutes to six.

Pritchard, who had the satisfaction of aggregating 139 runs during the day's play for once out is only the tenth batsman to reach treble figures against the New Zealanders in the present tour. His display was an excellent one, and together with Stanger-Leathes played the bowling of Merritt and Blunt better than any other pair that the Tourists have encountered so far.

Not Out Century Innings.

Coming in at the fall of the second wicket at 70, Pritchard stayed right through the innings, making his not out 103 out of 202 runs added in two hours and 12 minutes. He cut a ball from Henderson just over Blunt's head when in the twenties, but made very few other strokes which went near to hand. He reached his first 50 in an hour, making them out of 95 and the 100 out of 200 in 130 minutes, completing it after lunch when he made 11 runs in all.

He cut hard to reach the boundary five times, made five more 4's with off drives, and had a couple each of well-timed square and late cuts. Seventeen times in all he made boundary hits, and played all the bowling very confidently, except early in his innings, and just prior to reaching a hundred. It was his second century in representative cricket in four days, and in that respect a very rare performance in this district, since the war at any rate. His average for the week's cricket incidentally is 129 runs per innings.

Play was resumed yesterday morning with Northumberland's total at 50 for one, and Bruce and Stanger-Leathes carried it to 70 before Bruce was caught by Oliver after making 43 in 55 minutes with six 4's as his chief strokes in an innings distinguished by forcing shots.

The Best Partnership.

Stanger-Leathes found a fine partner in Pritchard, the pair taking part in the best stand of the day, which realized 100 in 66 minutes. Both played the New Zealand slow bowlers well, and Stanger-Leathes had made 51 out of 139 in one hour and 43 minutes.

There was an interesting race for the individual half-century between the pair, Pritchard reaching it first with a hard cut for four. Bowled at 47 by Merritt from a no-ball and dismissed soon afterwards with a Blunt speciality break, Stanger-Leathes had six 4's in his score, chiefly with shots placed through the covers and an occasional leg glide.

Captain Arkwright was an early victim of Merritt's googly ball, and Broadbelt had only made nine when he mistimed in trying to pull Blunt, and was caught off a skier by the wicket-keeper. Towler fell to Merritt, and the latter also got rid of Maconachie, anticipating a return off his own bowling, and diving wide for the catch.

Peacock pulled a few shots before Merritt got him caught, the eighth wicket adding 21, and when the ninth went down six minutes later, Pritchard appeared unlikely to get his century, but Milne stayed to make 23 of the 36 added for the last wicket in fifteen minutes, driving well to claim four 4's.

To Save the Innings' Defeat.

Northumberland entered upon their second innings in arrears of 204, and chief interest centred upon their ability to save the innings' defeat and do as well as their Durham neighbours in the corresponding game. Pritchard, promoted in the batting order, scored freely at the start, and 16 runs came in ten minutes before Mackay was caught at slip off the last ball before rain came on to cause an interruption of twenty-five minutes.

Pritchard and Bruce were associated on play resuming and they carried the score to 70 in forty minutes, Pritchard being caught at mid-off for a nicely compiled 36, which included seven 4's, four coming from forcing shots in front of the wicket and another a hook from a fast rising ball. Bruce left at 81, also with 36 to his credit. He was caught at the wicket, but did not appear to be satisfied despite the confident appeal of the field. He had four 4's and also excelled with forcing shots.

How the Wickets Fell.

Arkwright stayed with Stanger-Leathes to add 36 for the fourth wicket in 25 minutes, opening with three singles and then off-driving to get four boundaries before being taken high up with a running catch near square leg boundary.

Stanger-Leathes gave a catch to mid-off at 125, having made 24 out of 55 added in as many minutes, and Broadbelt repeated his first innings shot to be caught off a skier at 129. Blunt soon claimed Towler, and Peacock was caught at long on after hitting a couple of 4's and a two, while Maconachie was bowled at 154.

Then came the last wicket stand of Milne and Hetherton, who drove splendidly and showed that the slow bowlers could be hit by those who took courage in both hands. Hetherton had two straight drives for six, a four, two 2's, and seven singles before he was caught low down on the boundary by Lowry, while Milne hit a six, a four, two 2's, and four singles, having 41 in the match for once out.

The New Zealand ground fielding was very good, Dempster and Oliver excelling, while Blunt and Merritt bowled their slows and googlies in great variety. Scores:

Visitors' Lack at Thornaby.

YORKSHIRE II. GET A QUICK REVENGE.

(By Our Own Representative.)

Yorkshire II. avenged their Race Week defeat at Jesmond when they won their match over Northumberland at Thornaby, yesterday, by 76 runs on a wicket which favoured the bowlers practically the whole match.

NORTHUMBERLAND LEAD LANCASHIRE II.

Fourteen Wickets Fall at Jesmond.

Although Northumberland secured a lead of 100 runs in the first innings over Lancashire II., in the Minor Counties Championship match which commenced yesterday at Jesmond, Captain C. G. Arkwright did not enforce the follow-on.

The Northumberland captain could hardly be influenced by the fact that his bowlers were tired, for the Lancashire innings only lasted a hundred minutes; but his expectation probably was that Northumberland's early batsmen would score well when the wicket had been rolled, and that Lancashire would have to get a big score to-day on a worn wicket. As the Northumbrians made 72 in their second venture for the loss of four batsmen, and thus left off 172 ahead with six wickets in hand, they may be considered in a fairly strong position, but nevertheless it is a golden rule to make the most of the advantage of winning the toss and being in a position to enforce a follow-on.

Winning the Toss.

Winning the toss for the first time this season and the second time in all 13 games, Captain Arkwright decided, of course, to bat on a wicket which looked like becoming difficult after lunch, and Northumberland made 206 in three hours and 20 minutes, thanks almost entirely to three individual scores and the ability of Mackay to make runs quickly while the wicket was comparatively easy paced. Lancashire II. batted 100 minutes to make 106, and play being extended until seven o'clock to suit the convenience of the visiting team, Northumberland had five minutes short of an hour available at night.

Mackay's Fine Batting.

Mackay's batting was quite the best of the day. Opening with Bruce, the Backwood man actually made his 71 runs out of 104 (including extras) in 91 minutes. His innings was flawless until he had passed the half century, and then he gave a hard chance behind the wicket and to slip at 55, and another to mid-off, T. A. Higson only pushing over his head a drive lofted with some power. He reached 51 out of 73 in an hour, and hit a six and 12 4's (54 with boundary shots). He pulled one ball for six and got three boundaries in like manner, while well-timed cuts brought him 22 of his runs. He did not drive much, but otherwise scored in facile fashion by accurate placing and timing.

Craig's Boundaries.

The other two innings of note in the Northumberland innings were those of Stanger-Leathes and Craig. The latter watched the ball carefully in his first ten minutes' stay or so, but once he got his eye in he hit in the way he has done in past seasons, driving and pulling to such purpose as to make 33 out of the 48 added with Stanger-Leathes for the eighth wicket in half-an-hour. Craig's first seven scoring strokes produced boundaries, a single followed, and another four wound up an invaluable innings. On one occasion he straight drove, pulled, and off-drove to get three 4's in five balls.

Stanger-Leathes came in at the fall of the third wicket at 82, and carried out his bat for 47, made out of 124 during a stay of a trifle over two hours. He only made 11 before lunch in forty minutes, but he kept his wicket up while some of his colleagues were finding the bowling difficult on a wicket of changed pace. Stanger-Leathes made 25 of his runs on the leg side, turning the ball very nicely, and three of his five 4's came in this way, the others being from straight drives. Milne had a couple of off-drives to the boundary while helping to add 20 for the last wicket.

Bruce, who was caught and bowled in each innings, helped Mackay to put on 29 for the first wicket, and Whitfield was with Mackay while 53 were added for the second in forty minutes.

Booth, a fast to medium right-arm bowler on the ground staff at Old Trafford (like the rest of the Lancashire professionals in the side), came out with five wickets, costing eight runs each. Both he and Woolley had their figures spoiled somewhat after good starts, while Holroyd, who bowled the longest, was punished at times.

Hetherton's Six Wickets.

Until the effect of the roller had worn off, the Lancashire opening batsmen scored fairly freely, but with the exception of Paynter none of the succeeding men shaped with confidence. Halliday left at 13, and Booth (who had two lives early on) 11 runs later, but Paynter helped Houseman to take the score to 70 before the latter was caught by Stanger-Leathes running round the bowler from mid-off. Houseman was at the wickets 50 minutes for his 27, and got most of his runs on the leg side.

Towler came on at 79 (for Milne), and got Paynter with his first ball, the left-hander being caught in attempting an off-drive. Paynter was in 40 minutes, and made his 80 runs out of 55, driving and pulling well and having five 4's and a three. The last six wickets fell for 27 runs, Hetherton getting four of them, and maintaining the hundred runs lead by bowling Holroyd.

Hetherton's six wickets cost him only 55 runs, while Towler had two for 10 (including two 4's) in seven overs. One or two changes might have been made use of by the fielding side, but the ground work of both sides was good.

Mackay had a couple of boundaries in his 15, and Bruce three, while Pritchard, not out 25, has so far hit four, one dangerously near to slip. Scores:—

The Sum Total.

The Lancastrians were in the North-East for four cricket days, and out of that period they got six hours and five minutes' batting, and ten hours and 20 minutes' play in all.

NORTHUMBERLAND'S STRONG POSITION.

Seventh Wicket Pair Change Fortunes of Game.

Durham, although losing the toss at Chester-le-Street yesterday, had so much the better of the opening play in the first day of their return match with Northumberland, that at one time they looked like getting rid of their old rivals quite cheaply. But, thanks in the main to free scoring by Stanger-Leathes and Maconachie in the seventh wicket partnership, the visitors were not dismissed until they had totalled 237 in three hours and twelve minutes.

Northumberland finished the day in quite an excellent position, dismissing six Durham batsmen for 139, but they would have been much better placed for enforcing a possible follow-on if all the chances offered in the field had been accepted.

Early Disasters.

The wicket in the morning looked good for a lot of runs, and Mackay soon made a dozen, including boundaries with a nice square cut and a beautiful leg shot, but he should have been caught at point by Brooks when seven. The miss, however, did not prove expensive, for Howell batted brilliantly behind the wicket, Howgate standing right up to take the ball on the offside. A minute later Cook beat Hutchinson, and then Stanger-Leathes came in to stiffen the batting. The next two wickets added 59, but still half the side were out for 76.

Stanger-Leathes and Towler were together at lunch with exactly a hundred scored, but Howell claimed Towler as his third victim five minutes after the resumption. It was at this stage that the fortunes of the game definitely changed in Northumberland's favour. The Northumberland captain had been batting well, and he found in Maconachie a congenial partner.

Maconachie attacked the bowling from the start, and, with Stanger-Leathes also scoring well in front of the wicket, 50 runs were added in under half an hour, and a second 50 forthcoming in twenty-five minutes, while altogether the stand realized 111 in fifty-five minutes—a rate of scoring which illustrates the attractive character of their batting.

Four Short of a Century.

Stanger-Leathes was first to go, and everyone was disappointed that he failed by only four runs to reach the century. He scored his 96 out of 202 in two hours and twenty minutes, and his only real mistake was when he mistimed Howell and was bowled. He scored his first 50 out of 100 in 94 minutes, and his best hits were 12 4's, three 3's, and seven 2's. In all over from Howell he made 16 runs, 11 of boundaries and two 2's.

His work on the offside was particularly good, while he straight drove a couple of boundaries and turned the ball neatly. His innings was a most invaluable one, and a crowd of some 5,000 spectators were not slow to show their appreciation.

Craig made another good partner for Maconachie, and it was not until the total had reached 256 that the last-named was bowled by Carr. Confident and venturesome, Maconachie did not always get the ball away with the middle of the bat as had done his skipper, but his innings of 79 justified the risks he took.

Maconachie's Quick Scoring.

He might have been caught at slip, rather high and wide, at 16, but did not give another definite chance although lofting the ball occasionally close to fieldsmen, and he actually made his runs in eight minutes over the hour out of the 148 scored while he was at the wicket, hitting a 6 (a big pull off Brooks) and eleven 4's. He hit Brooks for 12 in the Durham captain's first over, and this materially helped him to make 34 in 20 minutes and reach 50 in a fewer number of minutes. His leg shots were comparatively few, but his cutting, square and late, was very well timed, and it is not too much to say that he made his runs with a greater variety of strokes than he has before exhibited.

Northumberland had still some more run-getters, for the last two wickets added 41 in 25 minutes, Craig claiming a not-out 24 of that figure with four boundaries for chief hits. The last four wickets actually produced 191 in something like a hundred minutes, and of course completely altered the course of the game. Howell had easily the best bowling figures, for Cook could not pin the batsmen down in his customary style.

Howgate "kept" splendidly, standing close up to all the bowling, and showing keen anticipation.

Durham being without Fereus, Weight was accompanied to the wicket by Moloney, and no doubt to the surprise—amusement perhaps—of the crowd, Maconachie and Hetherington opened the attack, but Milne was soon called into service, and it was he who bowled Moloney, first ball, at 27. Both Weight and Moloney should have been run out early in the innings, Bruce, at cover, being at fault in throwing in and Craig failing to gather the ball properly on the second occasion.

Blunders in the Field.

Towler came on for Hetherington at 44, but not another wicket fell until the Tynedale man's return at 78. Then Hetherington, off his first ball, had Maurice Nichol brilliantly caught at the wicket for an innings which produced 23 in 43 minutes and included but two of the Worcestershire batsmen's characteristic off boundary shots. At 83, Milne caught Weight at slip off Hetherington after the batsmen had occupied 78 minutes over 32 in which was but one boundary, and Brooks should have been got rid of before he scored, Mackay at short-leg drooping an easy catch. Adamson was with Brooks at this time, and both played with excessive caution. When Hetherington did induce Adamson to hit, Pritchard dropped the catch at mid-off, and the same fieldsmen dropped the City batsman at five 1's when he was 20.

Lack of Enterprise.

Hetherington had compensation for his bad luck when he bowled Brooks at 109 after the Durham captain had been in half-an-hour, but Adamson was not got rid of until Towler, coming on again, bowled him. Adamson had a six, a four, and a three, in his 26, singles making up the rest, and he was at the wicket 65 minutes, playing purely defensive cricket for the most part.

Carr hit a beautiful boundary to free leg to start with, but in having a "go" at a ball from Towler, was well caught at the wicket. Alderson and Cook then played out time the former having been batting for 47 minutes. Northumberland's bowling was undoubtedly maintained at a good standard, but Durham sadly lacked an enterprising batsman.

DURHAM'S FINE WIN. Carr Bowls His Best on Home Ground.

FORTUNES CHANGE IN CURIOUS FASHION.

Durham on Monday night, at the conclusion of the first day's play in the match with Northumberland at Chester-le-Street, were in danger of being made to follow-on, but thanks to Cook and Howell, who had all the luck that was going, yesterday, this was averted, and Northumberland finally possessed a lead of only 51. Still, it was a useful one, seeing that Durham had to bat first, but the advantage was neutralized by the fact that Northumberland only made 116 at their second venture. Carr coming right into his own on familiar ground, and actually assisting in the dismissal of the last nine batsmen, six of whom he claimed as victims of his own bowling.

Instead of having to fight to avoid a defeat, Durham thus found themselves in a position to force a victory, requiring 171 to win, with a possible two hours and three-quarters in which to get them.

Still Unbeaten.

Durham did not find this task beyond accomplishment. In fact they won by six wickets with 40 minutes to spare.



Howell, with a ball glanced to the leg boundary finishing off the match at 6.20. Durham thus gained their second win of the season over their local rivals, and fourth in succession, and maintained their unbeaten record for the season, their record to date

The Minor County Champions can thus finish up, providing they beat Cheshire at West Hartlepool next week, with an average 77.14, and therefore cannot yet be entirely ruled out of challenge match considerations.

The Turning Point.

Northumberland's misfortunes in the field, which marked Monday's play, were continued yesterday. They started as a matter of fact first thing in the morning, Alderson being let off by Milne at slip in Hetherton's first over. The West Hartlepool amateur, who was in partnership with his professional club colleague, Cook, did not profit much by his escape, but the 23 which the pair added yesterday morning were invaluable under the circumstances. Alderson spent 65 minutes in making 24, and his one really good shot was a full-blooded drive to the off boundary.

Howell joined Cook, and in his first over appeared to give a catch to Towler, which the latter readily accepted. He made a belated appeal, however, evidently thinking that there was no doubt in the matter, and the umpire turned it down.

This proved the turning point in Durham's favour in the struggle to force the follow-on, for although Howell was nearly bowled by Hetherton at 191, the 200 was reached in 208 minutes, and the batsmen went on to 319 before Cook was caught at the wicket after making 44 out of 84 in 90 minutes. He batted well on the leg side, but only had a couple of 4's, and while his innings was a valuable one, it was spoilt by two sharp chances and streaky back shots, Stanger-Leathes bringing in Mackay to make three slips in the hope of getting rid of Cook.

Howell scored freely in a last partnership of 24 runs, and was not out 30, made in 75 minutes, chiefly in front of the wicket, and including six 4's. Hetherton, despite shocking bad luck, three definite chances and a fourth difficult one being missed off his bowling, came out with very good analysis.

The bowling, indeed, was quite good all round throughout the match, but all the performances were eclipsed by that of Carr's.

Carr's Inspired Spell.

Coming on at 36, when a double bowling change was tried with two Northumberland wickets down, Carr bowled Stanger-Leathes with the first ball of his second over, caught and bowled Pritchard with the last, bowled Towler with the sixth ball of his third over, and claimed his fourth victim, at a cost of 8 runs, when he caught and bowled Whitfield with the 33rd ball he sent down. Subsequently Maconachie punished him, but he finished up with six for 32, his best performance for a good while.

Bowling with greater pace than usual, Carr made the ball come very quickly off the pitch, and it was this that caused the batsmen to mistime frequently. His was a brilliant catch—with the left hand—which dismissed Pritchard, while he made two catches from short leg and a third from slip off other bowling. Nichol was responsible for the other catch, and juggled with the ball in the air at cover-point ere finally holding it at the fifth attempt to dismiss Mackay.

Maconachie's Batting.

Hutchinson was unfortunate to have his hand badly bruised by a fast ball from Howell, but he returned at the fall of the fifth wicket to make other five runs. Maconachie was again in confident form, and with a not out 30 brought his aggregate for the match up to 109 for once out, a performance which compensated for his lack of success with the ball. His score occupied 40 minutes and included four 4's and a 3, the result of hard and well-timed hitting in front of the wicket. Stanger-Leathes had a beautiful straight drive for 6 and a lotted drive to the on boundary.

Durham only had to score at an ordinary pace to get the necessary runs, even against a keen attack and on a somewhat worn wicket, and Weight and Moloney gave them a useful start by scoring 17 in 51 minutes before Towler got Weight leg-before. Then Moloney and Maurice Nichol practically decided the issue by adding 59 in 40 minutes for the second wicket, Nichol's share being 35, and including five 4's, three drives, a hook, and a square cut.

The Winning Partnership.

Northumberland's hopes were revived when Moloney and Carr were dismissed for 19 more runs, but Brooks and Howell, waiting for the right ball, hit off the remaining 47 runs in twenty minutes, the last-named having a straight drive for six and two 4's. Carr had earlier on made 15 in ten minutes, getting three boundaries with leg hits.

Moloney created a favourable impression as a youthful opening batsman in making his 43 out of 121 in an hour and 41 minutes, but he had a big slice of luck giving a chance at the wicket when two, a catch to slip when 13, and another to A. B. Westcott, fielding substitute for Hutchinson at cover-point, at 91. Towler being the bowler in each case. Brilliantly caught with one hand at backward point by Bruce, Moloney had six 4's and scored in neat style on the leg side. Scores:

CHESHIRE WIN ON FIRST INNINGS.

Bowling Spasms by W. E. Jones.

With the whole of the first day ruined by rain there was little possibility of a definite decision being arrived at in the Northumberland and Cheshire match at Jesmond yesterday; but there was almost a full day's play, and quite an exciting finish, W. E. Jones getting rid of the last two home batsmen with following balls just before a rainstorm came on and when Northumberland still wanted 11 runs to gain the lead on the first innings. Cheshire thus took three points and Northumberland one.

In five hours and twenty-five minutes' actual play only 236 runs were scored yesterday, the bowling being good in most cases and batsmen finding it a difficult matter to score freely against the combination of a good length attack and a holding outfield. Few of the batsmen were inclined to take risks, and brisk batting was confined to the periods when Beech, Stanger-Leathes, Maconachie, and Craig were at the wicket.

Milne's Memorable Over.

Cheshire won the toss in the morning, and Donald Bounphrey and H. W. Hodgson made 34 for the opening wicket in fifty minutes. Milne and Hetherington bowling so well after Maconachie had had 11 hit from his first six overs, two of which were maidens, that Bounphrey occupied ten minutes under the hour in scoring 14, which included two boundaries. Hodgson was also extremely pamtalking, batting for 67 minutes to make 22 before Milne bowled him at 40. Hopwood, the young professional who has played for the Lancashire senior side, fell a victim to Milne in the same over, and W. E. Jones should have been dismissed two runs later, Bruce missing a catch at backward point. Milne would thus have taken three for none in a maiden over if the chance had been accepted.

Beech, one of the nine amateurs in the Cheshire team, scored at a relatively fast rate, when he made 25 in 32 minutes, and he hit so well in front of the wickets, in addition to placing the ball nicely on the leg side, as to claim six 4's, or more boundaries than any other player in the match. W. E. Jones and L. N. Jones and Woodcock were disposed of before lunch, which arrived with six wickets down for 101.

Hetherington and Milne pinned Parker and Wilson down for quite a time after the interval, and when the seventh partnership was broken at 121, Wilson had only scored two singles in 22 minutes. Parker showed useful form, but was almost out to a good one-handed catch by Towler when 15, while Wilson gave a stumped and caught chance behind the wicket off Milne's bowling very early in his innings.

Milne only had 34 runs hit from his first 20 overs for three wickets, while after lunch he had four maidens and a wicket in eight overs at a cost of nine runs. Hetherington had a couple of wickets after lunch for 12 runs in eight overs (four maidens).

Northumberland's Poor Opening.

Northumberland opened their innings on a wicket that was still wet in disastrous style, Wilson bowling Mackay with the second ball of his first over and getting Pritchard caught off his own bowling at the opening of the second. Bruce batted quite nicely for 14, hitting one four to leg, pulling another, and getting a third with a fine back cut. He also deserved a four for a pull, but the heavy outfield held the ball up. He was third to leave at 28, Beech bringing off a splendid catch at slip with one hand after the wicket-keeper had diverted the ball.

Ord, who played the ball for the most part with the middle of the bat, was caught after surviving a confident appeal for stumping, and at 41 Stanger-Leathes was out leg before to a ball which he seemed to play. The skipper had a couple of straight drives for 4s off Hop-

wood and infused some life into the batting during his stay of a quarter of an hour.

Then came the best stand of the match and also the best individual score. Whitfield and Maconachie stayed together 47 minutes to make 39, and Maconachie claimed 27 of that figure as his share, hitting three 4's—a straight drive, an off drive, and a back cut—and being sixth to leave, at 80, to a beautiful length ball from W. E. Jones, who had just taken over from Hodgson. Jones got another wicket almost directly afterwards, his namesake making a fine catch with one hand low down at slip to dispose of Whitfield, who turned the ball neatly.

Excitement in the End.

Towler and Craig carried the total to 110 before the first-named ran himself out, Dutton hitting the stumps with a left-hand throw from mid-wicket after running in from square leg. There was a good chance of Northumberland getting the first innings' points before this partnership was dissolved, but afterwards there was not a great deal to hope for. Hetherington quickly made 9 before Hodgson judged a difficult ball well to take a catch at long-off to dispose of Hetherington, and then Craig was brilliantly taken with one hand by the same fieldman off the next ball from W. E. Jones, who came out with good figures, but did not of course bowl so well as Wilson, whose length made him difficult to score from.

And so the innings and the match closed after Craig had made 19 runs and hit a four to the leg boundary.

Wind Up to Minor County Season.

DURHAM'S DIMINISHED HOPES.

The visit of Cheshire to the North-East did not prove of much value to either Northumberland or Durham, for the weather spoilt the "gates"—Durham were certainly more fortunate than the other county—in that respect—and only two points were won from the Cestrians. Northumberland were beaten on the first innings after a rather disappointing batting display (difficult wicket thrown in), and Durham narrowly escaped total defeat.

Durham's hopes of retaining their County title have faded almost to vanishing point, but they will certainly be in the first five. Northumberland can improve a dismal record this coming week at Werneth and Crewe, but better batting will have to be done by the earlier men to achieve tangible results. The same team as opposed Cheshire play on tour against Lancashire II. and Cheshire, and J. D. Ord will thus get his County "cap." Robert Hutchinson is almost fit again, but it was considered risky to play him on tour with the possibility of a knock on the thumb early in the week spoiling his batting.

Ord for South Africa?

Ord played a useful innings against Cheshire, but his strokes are restricted as yet, and his best shot is the push one to the on. It is possible that he will be lost to Northumberland cricket after this season, as it is understood he contains plates going to South Africa to work.

Northumberland's trouble approximates to that of Yorkshire this season—anno domini—while Durham's comparative lack of success can be ascribed to bad luck in the matter of winning the toss and bad weather, together with the fact that Cook has not been able to get wickets, although keeping the scoring down on many occasions. Durham had all their good fortune in the two engagements with Northumberland.

Matches on "Outside" Grounds?

It has been suggested that county matches should be played occasionally on grounds other than that at Osborne Avenue. The idea is quite a sound one from the viewpoint of popularity, but it is doubtful if there is a wicket on any of the club grounds capable of standing the wear and tear of a county match without a deal of preparation. That in itself is not an insurmountable barrier, however, and if the financial guarantee was forthcoming the "outside" clubs might accommodate a county game.

The Northumberland team of this season is very much the same as that which did so well two or three years ago, and it would be idle to deny that the powers of some of those players are waning. Next season may see some experiments tried, but they will be fruitless unless proper encouragement is given to newcomers. The captaincy fortunately is always in safe hands, while C. F. Stanger-Leathes—still to be numbered among the best batsmen in the North—is skipper.

In Brief.

Leslie Allan, the Tynedale bowler, seems to have lost some of his attacking power; perhaps he was discouraged, when playing against Lancashire II., by not getting a turn with the ball.

C. H. Saunders, the Benwell Hill fast bowler, has improved a great deal since the opening of the season, and would do even better if he would not sacrifice accuracy of length to pace.

J. Heap, the North Durham professional, takes his benefit to-day at the Prince Consort Road ground, where Blyth are the visitors. Another to take a benefit to-day is James Thackeray, the old Chester-le-Street and Durham County bowler, now with Leslie's.

Ashington have three useful bowlers in Shell, Swann and Brown to back up Milne's attack. Brown has been able to secure 13 wickets in his last three games for 114 runs.

L. McKinnell, the Benwell Hill youngster, on Saturday last failed for the first time this season to get a wicket when called upon. Prior to Saturday he had taken 14 wickets at ten runs each. McKinnell is also a useful batsman.

I. C. Maconache is probably the most improved batsman in the Tyneside Senior League, and on present form is worthy of inclusion in the Northumberland XI. for that consideration alone. One wonders how Northumberland would fare if the team were made up of all-rounders—and there are eleven capable men who could be so described.

CRICKET CELEBRITIES.

Stanley Crozier.

The name of Crozier is a well known and respected one in Tyneside cricket circles; and though the association of the brothers Stanley and Fred with Ryton has been broken, it was chiefly as members of that team that they achieved distinction. Stanley Crozier was professional for some time at Ryton before he joined Morpeth in the same capacity, while Fred Crozier captained Ryton when they won the



Tyneside Senior League Championship in 1925. The Ryton side that season was almost a family one, the Croziers, Arklés and Smiles all being related.

Good All-Rounder.

Stanley Crozier is a consistent fast bowler, and claims a good number of wickets, especially when he is well supported in the field. He is also a more than useful batsman, and specializes in hard, clean driving, so that most of his runs are scored in front of the wicket with the middle of the bat. He has played for Northumberland as an amateur, and generally is regarded as a good all-rounder.

In addition to the two Crozier brothers mentioned, a third, W. N. Crozier, umpires in the Tyneside Senior League, although he has not acted in his official capacity for some time owing to a family bereavement.

COUNTY HEADING FOR LEAGUE HONOURS.

Greenside and the Fell Come to Grief.

NORTH DURHAM'S FINE WIN.

The County Club are now assured to all intents and purposes of the Tyneside Senior League Championship for the first time in the history of the competition. They gained a handsome win at Osborne Avenue on Saturday over Benwell, while Greenside failed against Wallsend. Tyneside managed to beat Gateshead Fell at Hexham and so assume the second position in the table.

Benwell's batsmen for the most part found the County attack, even with Ian Macdonachie away, too strong for them, and only A. E. Veitch reached double figures. Galley and Elliott got cheap wickets, the last named bringing off his best performance for some time in claiming five wickets for under six runs apiece. W. R. King's return behind the wickets coincided with the dismissal of four men from this position.

The County passed the Benwell total in seventy minutes for the loss of four wickets, and Stanger-Leathes went on to complete his second century of the season. He scored his 107 runs out of 155 in seventy odd minutes, and drove with rare power, besides cutting hard square and late. His best hits were one six and thirteen 4's.

Grundy's Great Work.

Armstrong-Whitworth were all round superior to Morpeth at Old Benwell, declaring at 200 for six and dismissing Morpeth for 90. Bruce kept up his record for consistency for batting in league games by making 78, which included six 4's; while Stokoe again did well with a not out 50. Morpeth never recovered from a bad start, losing their first six wickets for 32, and only the seventh pair, G. Welsh and a newcomer, W. Wilson, offered real resistance. Grundy, in claiming five of the first six wickets for eight runs, performed the "hat trick" in dismissing S. Wood, J. Carse, and E. Wood. Splendidly supported in the field, he finished up with seven wickets for 32.

Tynemouth Surprised.

Tynemouth's batting at Ashington, if a trifle uneven, was good enough to produce 218 runs; but this total was actually exceeded by the home side for the loss of six wickets. Milne celebrated his benefit by taking seven wickets, five clean bowled, exceeding his half century of captures for the season, and making the winning hit. The batting honours in the match were carried off by Charles Rhind and T. Houston respectively. Rhind occupied an hour and a quarter over 73, which included a six and five 4's, while Houston, missed behind the wicket before he had scored, claimed 65, and hit a 6 and six 4's. Ashington were fortunate in some measure to win, but Houston certainly made the most of his "life."

In the Balance.

Backworth's only batsmen of note against Benwell Hill were Mackay and Fenwick, who between them made 78 of 134 runs actually scored with the bat for the Percy. The Hill were set to get 142 to win, and to the fact that they succeeded by two wickets, they owed much to L. McKinnell and Currie in the first instance, and afterwards to Welton, Rowell, and the ninth wicket pair. Saunders again bowled well for the Hill, as did Davey for the losers. It was really anybody's game to the very end.

Blyth's batting broke down badly at Prince Consort Road, Heap getting five cheap wickets, and North Durham won with rather more ease than the five wickets' margin in their favour would suggest. Wade again proved himself the batsman for an emergency, while Harris, the old Tynemouth player, gave valuable support.

Wallsend's varied attack is probably as good as any in the North-East, and much better than most. It was handled nicely on Saturday, and Ryton could only total

117 against the five bowlers employed. Wallsend had previously made 181, thanks chiefly to those five bowlers, and Laing wound up a good batting display by taking six wickets very cheaply. Borrow also proved himself a useful all-rounder for Ryton.

Taylor and Hetherton.

Fred Broadbent made a welcome return to the South Northumberland side at Gosforth against Greenside, and scored 25. This was not the best effort in the innings, however, for Hopper and Harbottle made a good stand, and the "South" captain carried out his bat for 64. The nominal "tail" also waggled to some purpose, and Greenside were set to get 215. What they did do was to fall one short of the first century, Taylor at last receiving adequate support from the other bowlers, and showing quite his best form. Tait had to pay dearly for his two wickets, but he was top scorer for Greenside, with the old South Northumbrian, A. S. Barlow, second in that respect.

Gateshead Fell could do little against Hetherton and Thompson at Hexham and, generally considered a strong batting side, were dismissed for the remarkably small total of 67. Adamson, Craig, and Laurence Handy alone reaching double figures. There were five "blobs" in the Fell innings. Tyneside opened fairly well, but, a collapse ensuing, had seven men out for 59. As Edgar Temple was bowling well there was a chance of the visitors snatching a sensational win, but Watson, the Acomb farmer, found in Thompson a "staying" partner, and the pair made certain of victory in the eighth partnership.

Hetherton came very near to Grundy in the matter of performing the "hat trick," for he took three wickets with four balls, a difficult catch in the slips just beating him for the straight four.

NORTHUMBERLAND FARE BADLY IN SECOND VENTURE.

(By Our Own Representatives.)

CREWE, Wednesday.

There was a full and most interesting day's cricket here to-day in the opening stage of the return game between Cheshire and Northumberland. Actually 23 wickets fell for 300 runs, and the position at the close gave promise of an exciting finish to-morrow.

Northumberland batted first, and made 168 in 195 minutes. Cheshire could only respond with 128, over which they only occupied 115 minutes, but Northumberland almost lost what advantage they had gained on the first innings by losing three wickets for four runs in the last 20 minutes' play. Thus Northumberland wound up 41 ahead with seven wickets to fall.

If there is no rain to-night queer things may happen in the morning, for the wicket is extremely tricky.

A Good Start.

Winning the toss this morning Northumberland opened on an easy paced wicket with Mackay and Bruce, the latter of whom got the ball twice to the leg boundary in the third over. Mackay helped himself to a boundary in the following one, and the pair forced a bowling change at 26, Hopwood coming on. The scoring continued brisk until at 38 Bruce edged one to second slip after batting confidently and hitting four 4's.

Pritchard joined Mackay, and the 50 went up in fifty-five minutes. Bowling changes were tried, but the batsmen continued to exploit the cut shot with effect, until, with the total at 81, Mackay was caught at the wicket after batting eighty minutes for 34, which included five 4's.

The ball was getting up nastily at times now, and Ord was in fifteen minutes before he scored with a shot to the boundary through third man. This sent the 100 up after 105 minutes' play, and at lunch the score was 105 for three, Ord being bowled one run earlier.

Two Useful Innings.

Pritchard, not out 22 on resuming, cut the first ball for 3, but was cleverly caught and bowled at 116 after a very useful innings. Whitfield was out first ball, and Maconachie was none too comfortable when he filled the vacancy. L. N. Jones missed Stanger-Leathes from a skier off his own bowling, and then Wilson got rid of Maconachie at 151, while Towler was out seven runs later. The Northumberland skipper hit a fine 6, but was caught two balls later in attempting another big hit. His innings was a good one without being one of his best, and extended over 80 minutes. Hetherton made a quick 16 when going in last.

Cheshire opened with Boumpfrey and W. E. Jones, and this pair put on 34 in twenty minutes before the first-named was bowled by Hetherton, who got Battersby caught at short leg at 38. Towler came on for Milne at 50, and Whitfield missed Hopwood in the new bowler's second over.
