

## CONSETT IMPRESS AT HEAD-QUARTERS.

### Benwell's Encouraging Display.

Consett consolidated their position in the Tyneside Senior League, election to which they had justified prior to Saturday's game, when they defeated the champions, the County Club, by seven wickets. They owed their success primarily to the bowling triumph of Coulson, their professional successor—from Craighead—to Whetton; but the whole team impressed with their smart work in the field, and the opening batsmen, in the business-like way which they set about the task of getting the 80 runs needed to top the County total. The visitors lost only two wickets while getting them in 68 minutes, while Harry Foggson made 48, out of the 80 runs actually scored with the bat in 76 minutes. Foggson, a stylist with the left-hander's usual strong off-side scoring strokes, helped the Consett captain, Oliver—whose square cutting was quite a feature—to put on 51 for the opening wicket.

#### Coulson's Wickets.

The County did not open too badly, with 41 on for two wickets, but subsequently the batsmen were unable to time Coulson correctly or score freely from the other Consett bowlers, so that the last eight wickets produced but 41 runs, five falling at one period to Coulson for a couple of runs. It looked as if Coulson would claim all ten wickets clean bowled until Henry Dyson claimed his first wicket of the season to close the innings. Coulson made the ball come very fast off the pitch to get his first three wickets, but afterwards he beat the batsmen with a ball which seemed to hang before turning from leg to the off stump. Only Pritchard was able to counter the break, and he played well on top of the ball throughout.

Close House just failed to repeat their triumphs of the past two weeks when entertaining Tynedale, for whom Leslie Allan bowled well in the first half of the home innings and Hetherington in the second. The Close House varied attack looked like getting rid of Tynedale for under 71 until Allan and W. G. Thompson turned the tables in an invaluable stand. Tulip was not so successful this time with the ball.

#### North Durham's Fall.

North Durham had a big fall at Backworth after their Osborne Avenue victory, and H. Fenwick, the County practice bowler, was chiefly responsible by taking seven wickets for eight runs—five clean bowled and two leg before. North Durham's total of 32 is the smallest to date this season, but the fact that Backworth could only make 55 indicates that the wicket was difficult. W. G. Mackay enjoyed the unique distinction of being the sole batsman on either side to reach double figures. Stanley Dickinson had an excellent bowling return.

Gateshead Fell atoned for previous batting failures by scoring 158 against Green-side, who totalled 100. Temple and Adamson could not get going, but Towler, A. B. Westcott, L. Handy, and N. Clark made useful scores, the second-named tapping the half-century in 45 minutes. Towler again claimed cheap wickets, while G. Charlton took three at an opportune time.

Benwell Hill lost after an exciting home match to Morpeth by five runs, a fine second wicket stand by R. Richardson and J. Carse being of considerable help, though all the batsmen got runs, and the last pair stood firm. J. McKinnell and P. Baxter likewise did well for the Hill, and it was anybody's game to the very end. C. H. Sanders had rather superior bowling figures to S. Crozier.

#### "South Win."

South Northumberland gained an excellent all-round win over Ryton, for whose batsmen the bowling of W. A. Taylor, Gordon Dixon, and J. D. Thompson proved so troublesome that only two recorded double figures. "South" were assured of success before their second wicket fell, F. T. Broadbent and A. M. Steele both batting well. Ryton, who were still without Moran tried eight bowlers.

Blyth came to grief at Fenham, where Benwell gained a decisive victory. T. Walton was always difficult to play, and

seven Blyth victims cost him only 27 runs. Benwell opened poorly with the bat, but John Scott and F. S. Taylor won the match in a sound second wicket partnership. It was a good win against such a strong bowling side.

Ashington's run of success was checked at Wallsend but they were only beaten by seven runs. The home club owed their success in no small measure to the resistance offered by G. L. Hammond, who was top scorer in the match with 30. He partnered Allen when eight wickets were down for 51 and levelled the scores before Allen was l.b.w. A boundary hit from Hammond made the issue safe.

#### Lee and McCreadie.

The feature of the Tynemouth and Armstrong Whitworth match was perhaps another useful batting display by Horace Lee and McCreadie, for Tynemouth, the same batsmen who did most to deprive Wallsend of victory the previous week. Armstrong Whitworth batted first upon a first class pitch, but did badly, the early batsmen being got out cheaply. Five wickets were down for 34 runs. After that there was a slight improvement in the scoring but the only partnership of note was that of A. G. Grundy and T. Kent for the eighth wicket which yielded 41 runs. Tynemouth lost F. Haswell, S. Shipman and R. R. Rhind, for 24 runs. Lee and McCreadie then came together and had carried the total to 88 before the professional was dismissed for 41. Lee went steadily on and the visitors' score was passed without further loss.

Durham, one may assume, will enforce the follow-on this morning, in which event Northumberland have a difficult task to save the match.

In the first place, Durham had the good fortune to win the toss, a considerable advantage on such a perfect wicket as at Chester-le-Street, and on a sweltering hot day. Their total of 219 was not an extraordinary one, having regard to the favours gained by batting first, but it was a formidable enough one for Northumberland to face with the wicket likely to wear. Northumberland, as it happened, never really recovered from a disastrous start, and Durham rammed home their initial advantage by dismissing the visitors for 89.

#### MAURICE NICHOL.

Outstanding amongst the batting of the day was the display given by Maurice Nichol, the Eppleton player who is qualifying with Worcestershire. Nichol's batting was superior to that of any other, in point of style and execution. He was always on top of the bowling and rarely missed an opportunity to punish a delivery that had a suspicion of looseness about it. His footwork and timing made run-getting seem an easy matter, his driving in particular being exceptionally good. Nichol's placing, too, on the leg side, showed how much he has benefited as a result of expert and regular coaching.

Coming in at the fall of the first Durham wicket, with the score standing at 44, Nichol was sixth to leave, at 170, having scored 88 out of 126 in 93 minutes. He was out in attempting a full-blooded drive with Maconachie bowling fast.

In all, Nichol had 14 4's and three 3's. Nine of his boundaries came from powerful drives. He pulled four, and cut the other dangerously between slip and third man when 51, completed in as many minutes. His two best shots were a straight drive early in his innings and a beautiful pull when 82. His first mistimed shot was the one he cut back to the boundary, and as near as possible his display was otherwise unblemished.

#### LET OFF.

H. C. Ferens, yorked in the first ball of Maconachie's fourth over, made 23 out of 44 put on by the first wicket in sixty-four minutes. He was all but bowled by the first ball of Milne's fourth over, and might have been bowled or stumped with a bailer from Hetherington when the total was 16, while very shortly afterwards he should have been run out. There were other close calls for him and Askew (who survived a confident appeal for a catch at the wicket when 10). Ferens scored neatly all round the wicket, and Askew, who played over a ball from Maconachie at 51, had some nice leg shots.

Misunderstanding between Gibbon and Nichol caused the former to be run out at 91, when the third partnership had produced 40 in twenty-eight minutes, while soon after lunch Dobson played on a avingeer from Milne, and Cook, obviously dissatisfied with the decision, was given out l.b.w. to Maconachie.

Half the side were then out for 119, but Hubert Brooks helped Nichol to take the score to 170 before Maconachie bowled the last named. Of the later batsmen, Carr, quite restrained, made 11, and Sadler, who "went" for the bowling right away, hit a six and a couple of 4's while putting on 16.

The Northumberland captain tried numerous bowling changes with an attack limited to four by reason of an injury which young Lee met with to his hand in stopping a shot early in the game. Lee returned to field after having his hand bandaged, but evidently could not bowl with a finger fork split. Maconachie, indelicately nursed by the skipper, came out with splendid bowling figures, but Milne was often troublesome, and he was only hit for 13 runs in his first 12 overs.

#### ONE FOR ONE.

A risky run, and a smart piece of fielding by Nichol, cost Mackay his wicket with only one run scored. Pritchard hoped to take the score to 36 by useful cutting and a couple of leg hits, and then followed a deary period in which Tuck stayed with Bruce while 17 runs were added in 35 minutes. Tuck played cricket of a purely defensive type, and his footwork was not of the kind which helps to make runs behind the wicket. Ultimately he was out to a splendid catch, off a Brooks "googly," by Sadler, running back from mid-off.

Lee next joined Bruce, and soon turned a couple neatly for 2's, besides on-driving for 4. Then Bruce was out in most unlucky fashion. Howell, brought back vice Sadler, had a ball spiked back by Bruce just wide on the off-side. Ferens dived for the ball, held it with the right hand in the act of falling, and then dropped it. The umpire did not see the ball drop, and Bruce did not demur. It was doubtful, in any case, if the ball was held long enough to constitute a catch. Bruce might have been caught and bowled by Brooks when 22, otherwise he batted with judgment for 90 minutes, and had three 4's in his 29.

#### BOWLERS ON TOP.

Lee, quite a stylish young bat, was well beaten by Dobson, half the side being out for 71, and the next five wickets produced only 18 runs, Maconachie being beaten by a ball from Carr that whipped back, and Howell clean bowled. Howell's bowling in the first two hours and twenty minutes against Durham's three hours and twenty-five minutes at the wicket and there was little suggestion of increased batting power. League cricket is evidently an easier proposition than county play for some of the Northumbrians.

The Durham bowling figures explain themselves, but it must be said that Sadler deserved a wicket, and that Dobson used his fighting skill to good purpose. Howell proved most successful in his last spell.

## DURHAM WIN BY AN INNINGS.

### Northumbrians in Trouble From the Start.

The position overnight at Chester-le-Street suggested that yesterday's play in the Durham and Northumberland match would centre upon the efforts of the visitors to save an innings defeat. And so it proved, with the result that Northumberland failed by 18 runs to compel Durham to bat again, and so lost by that margin, plus an innings.

Durham have now defeated Northumberland in five successive matches.

#### CAPTAIN'S ILL-LUCK.

In the morning Brooks, as expected, enforced the follow-on, and set Northumberland to get 130 on a wicket which was still good for twice that number of runs. But against Durham's powerful bowling array the task of getting 130 runs was no light one, and the match was virtually lost when the three first wickets fell for 11 runs. There was, however, still a fair likelihood of Northumberland getting the runs when Pritchard and Lee and Pritchard and Stanger-Leathes were together in subsequent successive partnerships; but a piece of bad luck which befell the Northumbrian skipper, who broke his wicket when, turning back to check an almost "dead" ball from Cook, quite sealed the visitors' fate.

#### TWO FAST BOWLERS.

The Durham attack was again well handled and it was pleasing to see that Brooks was not averse to having both his fast bowlers, Howell and Sadler, on at either end.

Durham have high hopes of winning the championship again after losing it for a season, and with a batting change they should almost succeed in their endeavours, for their bowling is varied and skilful enough to go through the best of sides.

Sadler should prove an acquisition, with his fast bowling and aggressive batting style, but one hesitates, as yet, to express an opinion as to the possibilities of Askew.

#### AGAINST THE COLLAR.

Northumberland, without any encouragement from a good start, were fighting against the collar all the time, and certain patent batting weaknesses, exposed in the first innings, gave little hope of recovery yesterday. Lee, who has the temperament, is undoubtedly a promising boy; but an average of nine runs per wicket for the team is not sufficient to win matches.

Maconachie did as well as any of the fast bowlers, but it was a pity that Lee was prevented from having a turn with the ball. Pritchard was the most consistent batsman.

#### THREE FOR 11.

Howell, who more than once has been a thorn in the side of Northumberland, claimed a wicket in his first over yesterday morning, the fifth ball he sent down bowling Mackay middle stump without a run scored. This was a disastrous enough start, but even worse was to follow. Bruce, with the total at 4, spooned up a ball from Cook to Alderson at square leg, and seven runs later Howell bowled Tuck with a ball, breaking in from the off, which the batsman attempted to turn to leg.

Lee then joined Pritchard and quickly opened his score with a leg glide for a single, a four through cover, and another boundary with a neatly turned ball. But with the total at 36 Lee, playing back to an extra fast one from Sadler, had his off stump bowled down. The Tynemouth youngster had kept the ball well down, and looked good for a useful score.

#### PRITCHARD'S INNINGS.

Pritchard continued to cut and drive in good style and Stanger-Leathes was not long in scoring; but the latter was let off by Cook (Carr bowling) at short leg when only five. However, the fifth wicket pair took the score to 65, an addition of 29 in 37 minutes, before the captain (19) was out in the manner described above. His only boundary hit came from a fine off-drive.

Before lunch Durham got rid of Pritchard, whose off stump Sadler knocked back with the total at 81. Pritchard was batting just over an hour and three-quarters for his 38 runs, and had four boundaries, one a snick behind the wicket, the second a square cut, the third hooked, and the fourth from an off drive. All but two of his runs were made from shots in front of the wicket.

After lunch, with the score at 98, Towler—dissatisfied with the decision, apparently—was caught behind the wicket, off almost a full-pitched ball, after making 12. Maconachie was taken low down at second slip by Sadler with one hand a run later, and eventually the innings, which lasted two hours and 35 minutes, closed for 112.

### TO-DAY'S GAME.

The West Indies cricketers at present touring Great Britain are visiting the North-East for five days, and they open their programme at Jesmond this morning, when they enter upon a two days' match with Northumberland, play commencing at 11.30 to-day and 11.0 to-morrow. On Friday (two o'clock start) and Saturday they oppose Durham County at Ashbrooke, Sunderland.

**Unbeaten to Date.**  
So far the Tourists, who have Test match engagements in June, July, and August, have not met with defeat, and it will be a feather in the North-Easterners' cap if either of the Minor county sides

gives their distinguished visitors a really close game. Rain has interfered with play in several of the West Indies' matches since they opened their tour at the beginning of May, but they have shown fine all-round form, and proved attractive to watch.

#### The 1923 Matches.

A West Indies team played at Jesmond in June of 1924, and defeated Northumberland by an innings and nine runs, the scores being: West Indies, 286; Northumberland, 118 and 159. Previously they had defeated Durham by 180 runs at Darlington, the scores in that game being: West Indies, 125 and 192; Durham, 63 and 74.

In the Jesmond match seven of the present touring side appeared, namely, Nunes, Challoner, Fernandes, Small, Constantine, Browne, and Francis; and some of these players will be taking part in the current game. ## WEST INDIES AT JESMOND.

### Challoner's Century Score. MORE WICKETS FOR MACONACHIE.

The West Indies cricketers found the weather conditions eminently suitable yesterday for the opening of their two days' match at Jesmond with Northumberland, and, winning the toss, were given an ideal opportunity of showing their batting ability. Some of it was uneven, and there were only three really good scores in the innings, but they totalled 342 in four hours and 20 minutes—their second highest innings—and so set Northumberland a difficult task to save the follow on.

Northumberland's first innings response, in the last hour of play, was in the shape of 44 runs for the loss of two wickets—the second lost to the last ball of the day—so that they wound up 298 runs in arrears and requiring 199 to avert following on, with eight wickets to fall.

#### THE FEATURES.

There were four outstanding features in the day's play—the century by Challoner, the respective innings of Hill and Browne, and the bowling of Maconachie.

Challoner, who scored 105 against Northumberland at Jesmond five years ago, yesterday made 146 out of 300 in three hours and 40 minutes, the highest individual score in the tour so far. First in and eighth to leave, he commenced sedately, but subsequently reached 60 out of 97 in 85 minutes. After that he was very restrained, and scored chiefly with singles before reaching 75.

#### MERRY WIND UP.

Later on he began to hit with more power until reaching 99, at which figure he stayed for quite a while before reaching his century out of 217 in three hours and ten minutes with a leg glide. Then he proceeded to hit out with a vengeance, his next following hits being: 6 6 1 4 6 1 2 1 1 4 6 1 4 2. In all Challoner hit four 6's and 14 4's, having seven boundary hits in his first 50 and four in his second 50.

While he gave no actual chance to hand the West Indies top scorer almost played on at 51, from Milne, poked a ball just wide of the wicket-keeper's outstretched hand at 72 and had an anxious time at 99 when Hetherington beat him without hitting the stumps.

#### FOOTWORK AND TIMING.

Challoner's placing was delightful to watch, and the effortless style in which he scored impressed everyone. His footwork was so correct that he seemed to have plenty of time in which to play the ball to the right place, and he showed that he could drive after passing the hundred. Leg shots and balls placed to the off gave him most of his runs, though he straight drove with power late in the innings and also used the draw with effect on occasion.

#### BRIGHTER BATTING.

From the spectator's point of view the brightest batting was in the afternoon, when Browne, wonderfully keen and virile, helped Challoner to add 96 in 45 minutes. Out of that total Browne scored 62, hitting two 6's and nine 4's before falling to a catch by Craig, standing back to Maconachie. Browne attacked the bowling as soon as he came in, and with hard hitting in front of the wickets and big pulls reached 50 in 40 minutes. He mis-hit one or two shots, but one expects a quick scorer to take risks.

Early in the day, after the Tourists had lost their first wicket at 5, Hill stayed with Challoner while 87 runs were added in 69 minutes. Hill claimed 40 of those runs and hit six 4's, but he gave a chance to point at 31 before falling to an identical catch later on. His pulls produced four boundaries, and he also placed the ball well.

Of the other batsmen, Neblett, a left-hander with a free style, and the ninth wicket pair showed to best advantage. Most of them kept the ball down, but all were not happy against the home attack.

#### BOWLING AND FIELDING.

Tan Maconachie, who opened the Northumberland attack in impressive style, followed up his Chester-le-Street bowling success by taking five wickets for 68, four of them clean bowled. Lang also bowled well at periods. The fielding was slack occasionally, but Tuck kept up a good standard on the boundary and saved quite a number of runs.

#### THE LAST BALL.

Northumberland had an hour in which to bat, and Mackay and Bruce, against the attack of Francis and Griffith, both fast right armed but with differing actions, put on 30 in half an hour; but Griffith bowled Bruce at 35, and the same bowler dismissed Mackay with the last ball of the day. The position is interesting enough, but it would have been more so if Northumberland had been able to resume this morning with all ten wickets in hand. Scores:—

## WEST INDIES WIN BY AN INNINGS.

### Few Northumbrian Batting Features.

The position overnight in the match at Jesmond between Northumberland and the West Indies tourists suggested that the County would find it a difficult matter to avoid an innings defeat. As a matter of fact, there was a distinct possibility at one time yesterday of Northumberland being dismissed twice for less than a 200 runs aggregate, but they managed to keep the game alive until 5.20, by which time the West Indies had won by an innings and 45 runs. In 1923 their victory over Northumberland by an innings and 9 runs, curiously enough, was also achieved by the same time.

#### MILNE'S SIX SCORING SHOTS.

The Northumberland batsmen were helped in the afternoon by a persistent drizzle which kept the ball wet for the bowlers, and reduced considerably the pace of Griffith's deliveries and the effectiveness of Scott's slow breaks. At the same time there was some sound batting by the opening pair at the second attempt, an invaluable innings by Bruce, others by Lang and Stanger-Leathes, and a delightfully characteristic effort from George Milne, who in ten minutes scored 24 by means of six successive boundaries.

The West Indies attack lacked G. N. Francis, who has a chill and could not play yesterday, but in the morning there was no need for another fast bowler, so successful did Griffith prove. Scott's glows proved equally troublesome, and Northumberland's first innings closed by 12 o'clock for 81, made in an hour and 55 minutes. The last eight wickets yesterday morning produced only 37 in 55 minutes, Griffith's analysis in that period being

while Scott secured wickets in his third, fifth (two), and eighth overs.

#### PROSPECTIVE TEST BOWLER.

Griffith, who had 12 runs scored from him before he got a wicket, bowled very fast yesterday morning. Not only did he put on plenty of pace, but also managed to do something with the ball, which "dipped" awkwardly for the batsman first before pitching. He bowled a splendid length, and would have troubled the best of batsmen with his pace off the ground. Originally he was regarded as reserve fast bowler to Francis or Constantine, but now it is fairly certain that he will be in the side for the first Test, together with the other fast bowlers. His rather low flight of ball made timing a matter of difficulty yesterday morning when the light was none too good. Scott mixed them rather cleverly and had three clean bowled.

In the second innings Griffith did not keep up his pre-lunch pace, and though never bowling loosely, could be scored from. Scott was not put on straightaway in the second innings, and he seemed affected by the dew-sodden grass. Neblett, the easy style left-arm bowler, captured two of the best wickets. Browne, who turned the ball, had fair figures until Milne punished him for 24 in an over.

The fielding, despite the cold and drizzle, was very good all day, the picking up being particularly clean. The placing of the field always offered an interesting study, and it was significant that Griffith often had but one fieldsmen, short leg, on the offside, and a slip ring.

#### SECOND INNINGS RECOVERY.

Pritchard and Hetherington alone reached double figures in the concluding portion of the first Northumberland innings, the first-named, second in and eighth to leave, being caught off his glove by Fernandes standing back to Griffith after staying in 50 minutes. The total only reached 81, so that the County followed on at 12.20 in arrears of 261.

Mackay stayed with Bruce while 24 runs were added, being then stumped very neatly; but Pritchard was bowled and Tuck well taken at square leg with only 32 on the board. Then, however, Stanger-Leathes helped Bruce to put a brake on the Tourists' success. This fourth wicket partnership produced 69 in as many minutes, the home skipper mak-

ing 27 before most unluckily playing on off his boot. He had a very fine straight drive for six—the only one in either Northumberland innings—and a fine back cut to the boundary.

#### BRUCE'S HALF-CENTURY.

Lang proved another useful partner, but Bruce himself was beaten by a break ball from Neblett when he had made 54 out of 127 in two hours and twenty-five minutes. Bruce only made four boundaries, but his innings was a fine one in the circumstances, and gave a much better colour to the Northumberland response. Bruce watched the ball carefully, and gave only one chance—a difficult one—from a lofted straight drive, which Roach (fielding substitute for Francis) just failed to hold after running in from the boundary. Most of his runs came from in front of the wicket, but he also placed neatly on the leg side for four 2's.

#### 30 FOR LAST WICKET.

In addition to Lang, who justified his inclusion in the side by making 37 (not out) out of 115 in an hour and a half, Macconnachie had a few good hits and Hetherington brought his contribution for the match up to 23, while Milne gave the fixture a happy wind up by scoring 24 of the 30 runs added for the last wicket. He cut the first ball he received just over the cover point's head, turned the next to the boundary, pulled the third for four and cut and straight drove the following two to secure 20 off the over. His next stroke was also a boundary, but Neblett beat him three balls later. Lang, who hit three 4's, scored chiefly with cuts. The innings lasted four hours and a quarter. Scores:—

## Northumberland Team Problems.

### LOOKING AHEAD.

The usual "inquest" no doubt will be held over the Northumberland team displays in the Durham and West Indies matches (writes "Umpire"), and this and that player's qualification to county honours discussed in the club pavilions.

Undoubtedly the county team is not a powerful one, but it cannot be strengthened in one season by a complete, or even partial change, in personnel. It will have to be a gradual substitution of young and promising players for the older ones, so that there will be a blend of experience and youth when the team has gone through its period of transition.

### YOUNG PLAYERS.

At the present time there are several young players who should be seriously considered for the future. H. C. Lee, of course, is certain to play on Race Week if his hand is quite better by then. Tyne-mouth are resting him to-day to that end, and the county authorities are hopeful that this youngster will prove a distinct "find."

Others who commend themselves are John Scott, now in good batting form again; Matthew Ducey, a useful all-rounder; J. L. Allan, whose record has been so impressive in League cricket for some seasons; Ian McLachlan, who should develop into a fine all-rounder; L. McKinnell, Benwell Hill's consistent batsman; and two of the Ashington men. Blyth have a player of some promise in Norman Graham, but the percentage of younger men to be introduced to the County side this season must necessarily be a small one.

### COACH-PROFESSIONALS.

From the professional view-point there is every reason to expect that McCreadie will prove an acquisition when qualified. The pity is that more clubs do not employ coach-professionals. Their absence is one of the reasons for Northumberland's decline.

## TYNESIDE SENIOR LEAGUE.

### County More Like a Champion Side.

There were some exceptionally interesting games on Saturday in the Tyneside Senior League. In the first place the County Club showed something like form worthy of the championship title which they hold, and were unlucky not to win at Blackhill, where Consett had already had one very narrow escape from defeat by Wallsend. As it was the North-West Durham club dropped two more points at home, only in this case the County Club earned their one point more emphatically than did South Northumberland early in the season.

Consett early lost Alfred Oliver, but Harry Foggan topped the half-century, and B. Ayton and S. Unsworth (promoted from the second team in the absence of J. H. Best) had useful scores. Galley met with considerable bowling success, yet the County were set to get 167. Pritchard and Robinson made a fine second wicket stand, but the big effort to secure victory came from Ian MacLachlan.

With 13 runs wanted, however, time robbed the County of a possible victory. Coulson's four wickets averaged a trifle over 17 runs apiece—easily his worst record so far this season.

#### G. C. TAYLOR.

Gateshead Fell were another side fortunate to save themselves from defeat, though in this case they declared with seven wickets down in order to give their hosts, Ashington, a sporting chance of winning. Gilbert Cole showed a pleasing return to form with a half-century for the Fell, and a not out 50 by G. Spitty was supplemented with other double-figure scores, the total eventually standing at 213 when W. B. Westcott applied the closure.

Ashington made no attempt to make sure of a point in the safety first way, but attacked the bowling in spirited fashion. Such a measure of success attended their efforts that only five runs were needed to win when time was up. G. C. Taylor strengthened his claims to County recognition by scoring 119 not out. He gave two difficult chances, but his batting was most attractive, and clean hitting in front of the wicket gave him a 6 and thirteen 4's. Milne got within eight of the half-century before Spitty bowled him.

Close House made a valiant effort to improve their League position at the expense of Blyth, but failed by two runs to defeat their visitors, despite a good innings by G. Henderson and A. Tulip at a critical time. Blyth's batting was very uneven, and only the sound defence of their captain, E. Gallon, enabled them to top the century by eight. #### TOO GOOD ALL ROUND.

South Northumberland, without Fred Broadbent, altered their batting order, and J. D. Thompson, who opened with George Harbottle, had the satisfaction of making the top score of the match, 58. He was, however, the only visiting batsman to reach double figures. Wood and Grundy again bowled with success on a wicket which looked good for runs, while W. A. Taylor claimed all but two of the home wickets, despite the fact that he was ill supported in the field.

#### ATKINSON'S BEST BOWLING.

Wallsend made no mistake when entertaining Greenside, who are not one of the strongest batting sides in the league. The mid-Tyne men put on 225 before declaring with seven wickets down and then dismissed Greenside for 119. Caughey and Pattison gave Wallsend a fine start and after others had contributed useful items J. Polson came in to make 52 not out. Greenside opened

Hearn, who, coming in at the fall of the sixth wicket, with only 48 on the board, made 45 out of 53 in nineteen minutes. Hearn had two 6's and seven 4's in his total. The Ryton attack was again varied enough to trouble a useful batting side.

The visitors' bowling was entrusted to Saunders, Moffat, and Hughes, and this trio dismissed Ryton for 105, F. Graydon making a valiant effort for his side with a not out 27. This veteran wicket-keeper has only been twice dismissed this season, and has an average of 23. R. Robinson again showed useful batting form.

#### HOW TYNEDALE WON.

A third wicket stand between W. H. Fenwick and Leslie Allan, which realized 61, laid the foundation of Tynedale's victory over North Durham, on the Prince Consort Road ground, the winners thus retaining their unbeaten record. Batting first on a wicket that appeared lacy with runs the home batsmen gave an inept display, Stan Dickinson alone offering any serious resistance to the Tynedale attack. The whole of the side was dismissed for 97, and but for slackness in the field at the beginning of the innings the total would have been a much smaller one.

When Tynedale went in they could not have made a more discouraging start for, with the very first ball sent down—one from Tait—Smith's balls were removed. Then after Hetherington had survived an appeal for a catch, he was out lbw with the score only six. Fenwick was then joined by Allan, and after carefully playing themselves in they collared the bowling, and were not separated until they had put on 61, the winning hit being scored when Fenwick and Newman were together for the fourth wicket. Fenwick's innings was one of the best seen on this ground for some time. ## Race Week Fare.

### COUNTY GAMES AT JESMOND AND GATESHEAD.

It is unfortunate that two County matches are to be played on Tyneside to-day and to-morrow, for the "gate" on either ground—Jesmond and Prince Consort Road—will be affected. Possibly, Northumberland will suffer worse than Durham, as obviously some proportion of their regular County attendance is from the south side of the Tyne, but it is more from the public viewpoint that the clashing of dates is to be deplored, for we get all too little representative cricket on Tyneside.

#### Looking Ahead.

It may be assumed that the Durham County Committee had no option but to arrange the North Durham game for the Monday and Tuesday of Race Week, but friction in future years could be avoided by the allotment of the Durham and Northumberland match to the Prince Consort Road ground. At any rate it would be as well to test it in 1929. County patriotism is as strong in Gateshead as in other parts of Durham County, and we are of opinion that the venture would prove a financial success.

#### Northumberland's Team.

Northumberland's team changes are expected to produce better results, and even if John Scott—thought by many to be one of the three best batsmen in the county—cannot play to-day and to-morrow it cannot be said that G. C. Taylor, the former University player and now Ashington's captain, is much inferior in point of record this season. Taylor and W. D. Wade—who twisted his knee when fielding on Saturday—are the Northumbrian debutants, for J. L. Allan has played ere this, while H. C. Lee, it will readily be recalled, created a good impression when appearing in the Minor Championship for the first time at Whitsuntide. J. C. Maconachie assumes the captaincy in the absence of C. F. Stanger-Leathes, and everyone will wish the old Newcastle Grammar School boy all good fortune. J. B. Bruce had his knee hurt on Saturday, but is expected to be quite fit to-day.

#### The Visitors.

The Lancashire II. team is captained by Peter Higson, the University batsman, who has played for the Champion County side this season, and includes Hodgson, the Liverpool and South African inside forward, and a fast bowler of the Macdonald type; Holroyd, and other previous visitors to Jesmond in Rushton, Houseman, Paynter, and Horridge. ## TYNESIDE SENIOR LEAGUE.

### Tynedale Still Winning.

Tynedale maintained their unbeaten record in the Tyneside Senior League when, on Saturday, they defeated the County Club, the League champions, at Osborne Avenue by 32 runs, despite some fine bowling by Ian Maconachie and Philip Gardner. Batting first on a wicket that appeared to be all in favour of the batsmen, Tynedale were all sent back for 175, and but for mistakes in the County Club fielding this would have been much smaller. Tynedale made an inauspicious start, losing three wickets for 21, but Watson and George Smith added 77 for the fourth wicket. At the close the young Acomb farmer had 51 to his credit, made in bright style. The Hetherington-Allan combination was again chiefly responsible for Tynedale's victory. Hetherington bowled more overs in this game than in any other this season.

Spectators at the Plessey Road Ground were treated to some wonderful bowling by Lang, the Blyth professional taking eight wickets for only 19 runs. The deadliness of Lang's deliveries may be judged by the fact that he only sent up 8.1 overs, two of which were maidens, and he clean bowled every one of his victims, J. Moran, for the losers, also bowled with success, taking six Blyth wickets for 45. It was the second week in succession that Ryton had failed to reach the half-century mark.

### Time Saves North Durham.

Time saved North Durham from a heavy defeat at the hands of Gateshead Fell, on the Prince Consort Road ground, the draw being the first such result in the 14 meetings between the clubs. When the last North Durham pair came together with 20 minutes to play it was generally thought that the Fell would be easy winners, for the home team, in response to the Fell's total of 238 for eight (declared), up to that point had only made 90. Wade and Walton, however, defied all the efforts of the Fell attack to get them out, and when stumps were drawn they were still undefeated.

For their fine total Gateshead Fell were chiefly indebted to Legge, the former Durham County wicket-keeper, whose display was one of the best seen on this ground for some time. Going in when the Fell had lost two good wickets for only five runs, Legge saw Spitty leave for the addition of eight. With Adamson, however, Legge helped to take this total to 94 before they were separated, and then, in association with Temple, he assisted to add a further 63. Eighth to leave, Legge was at the wicket 24 hours for his 62. Throughout he battled with wonderful patience, especially at a time when a "rot" appeared likely to set in, and, except that he should have been run out when he had made 10, his display was without blemish. Laurence Handy, a son of the former captain of the Fell, had a short and merry innings of 15 minutes, in which time he hit up 29, including a 6, two 4's, and two 2's in one over. Dover, who appeared for the Fell in a new rôle, that of professional, had a good afternoon, taking five wickets for 38, whilst Alan Westcott took two wickets in the first three balls he sent down.

Benwell Hill, after declaring at 251 for the loss of seven wickets, failed to dispose of their visitors, Armstrong Whitworth, in the time left for play, and when stumps were drawn, the latter were 86 behind, with four wickets intact.

A low-scoring game at Close House ended in a draw, Greenside thus gaining their first point of the season. Isaac Purdy was chiefly instrumental in sending the whole of the home batsmen back for the moderate total of 140.

### A Happy Augury.

Tynemouth, at Morpeth, gained a smashing victory over the home side, winning by 139 runs, after making only a moderate start. Two Tynemouth wickets fell for 39, but Horace Lee and Ridley Rhind took this to 117 for the third wicket before the latter was out l.b.w. to Stan Crozier. The Morpeth batsmen fared badly against the bowling of Lee, and were all dismissed for 83, the young Tynemouth all-rounder claiming seven of the wickets for a little over 4 runs each. Lee's return to his best form is a splendid augury for to-day and to-morrow, when he will be playing for his county against Lancashire II. in the Minor Counties' Championship at Jesmond.

The feature of the game at Ashington was a fine display by the Northumberland County batsman, W. G. McKay, for Backworth, who scored 163 in two hours and ten minutes, and was unbeaten when the innings was declared with only two wickets down. McKay had three 6's and twenty-four 4's in his aggressive display, his only chance being when he had made 40. With Ord he scored 163 runs before the home side had any success, Ord playing correctly for 60. Backworth succeeded in capturing the last Ashington wicket a few minutes from time.

## A NORTHUMBRIAN RECOVERY.

### G. C. Taylor's Encouraging Debut.

The cricket week at the County Ground, Jesmond, had a disappointing opening yesterday, when only two hours and 20 minutes' play was possible in the Northumberland and Lancashire II. match.

Rain caused a stoppage at 1.10, and prevented a resumption until 2.55, while at 3.35 the players again retired. Afterwards not a ball was bowled, though the decision to abandon play for the day was not arrived at until after 5 o'clock.

#### Fifth Wicket Stand.

In the time available Northumberland made 152 for the loss of five wickets, effecting an excellent recovery after a bad start, thanks to the successful efforts of the newcomers to the side and others of the younger players. The debutant County pair, G. C. Taylor and W. D. Wade, considerably improved Northumberland's position in a fifth wicket stand which produced 68 in 70 minutes, while Wade found in I. C. Maconachie, the home skipper, another scoring partner. This pair had made 33 when play ceased, Maconachie claiming 23 as his share—including three boundaries—as a result of 40 minutes' batting.

#### Run-getting Difficult.

The attack of the present Lancashire II. side is reputed to be the strongest that has played up here for some years, and in the early part of the play the visiting bowlers certainly had Northumberland in trouble. So difficult was it to get runs—the fielding was exceptionally good—that only ten were scored in the opening half-hour, and it was not until rain began to handicap the bowlers that we saw a Northumbrian batsman scoring at all freely.

Hodgson, Liverpool's South African footballer, bowled fast, with much energy, but he was not particularly accurate, and his three wickets were secured from catches from back shots. His first bowling spell occupied an hour, in which time he sent down ten overs for 19 runs and a couple of wickets. He came on again just before play was stopped before lunch, and altogether bowled for an hour and 45 minutes. Preston was probably quicker off the pitch, but Hodgson was difficult to time and got up awkwardly at times.

#### The Scoring Rate.

The wet ground made for faster scoring, even though the outfield was heavy and stopping very good. So much so that the second 50 came in 43 minutes, as against 67 for the first half-century, and the third in 30 minutes.

Bruce was caught at slip in Hodgson's first over, and at seven Mackay, who was hit on the jaw by a rising ball, well taken behind the wicket on the leg side by Tipping. Pritchard contributed 17, with a couple of 4's and a three included, before falling to a great left-handed catch by Holroyd at backward point. Twenty runs later Lee, who had survived a confident appeal for a catch at the wicket, played on from Rushton in going back to a well-pitched ball and four wickets were down for 51. The Tynemouth youngster again showed promising form while scoring 23, and had some nice offside shots, in addition to a fine leg boundary.

#### Hard Driving.

At this stage Taylor and Wade became associated in their fifth wicket stand. The Ashington captain opened confidently and drove with refreshing vigour to make 33 in 50 minutes before lunch. He continued to drive well after the resumption, but when 49 gave a catch which the wicket-keeper accepted. Taylor made his runs out of 88, and had a 5 (four overthrows) and five 4's, all from hard driving except one square cut.

Wade, who defended strongly, was missed when 16 at third man and went on to reach 25, while Maconachie hit hard in front of the wicket.

## NORTHUMBRIAN GAIN POINTS.

### First Innings Lead at Jesmond.

There was never much possibility of a win outright being registered by either Northumberland or Lancashire II. in their match at Jesmond, rain having curtailed play to two hours and 20 minutes on the opening day, and at one time yesterday some considerable doubt existed as to whether even a first innings decision could be obtained.

At ten minutes past four Lancashire had scored 202 in response to Northumberland's first innings total of 210 and their last pair were at the wicket. Actually the Lancastrians had lost only eight wickets, but Hodgson, the fast bowler, was called away in the middle of his innings—to travel to Colchester for the Essex v. Lancashire game—so that Northumberland seemed well placed for first innings points at least. However rain which had been falling for some time at this stage caused a cessation of play.

#### The 13th Ball.

The weather outlook remained unpromising until a quarter to six, when the wind drove the rain away. At six o'clock the Lancashire II. innings was resumed and within seven minutes Hetherington bowled Rushton to finish off the innings—with the 13th ball—and give Northumberland their first championship points of the season with a 23 runs first innings lead.

In the morning play was only delayed five minutes by the rain, and Northumberland managed to take their overnight total of 152 for five to 210, an addition of 88 runs in 80 minutes.

#### Fine Partnership.

Wade and Maconachie, whose unbroken sixth wicket partnership had already realized 33, altogether made 61 in 65 minutes. Maconachie was first to go to a slip catch at 180 after making 37 in rather more than our hour and hitting five 4's, including two good leg shots yesterday morning, when he batted really well.

Wade left four runs later after a stay of five minutes under two hours. If not forceful he certainly played a straight bat and watched the ball very carefully. His best hits were three 4's and two 3's, and he actually had seven 2's yesterday morning. He has the temperament for county games, and his subsequent good fielding enhanced his value.

#### The Last Wicket.

Craig had a couple of boundaries, but the third most productive stand came from the association of Allan and Milne for the last wicket, 42 runs being added in 30 minutes. Milne claimed 29 as his share, pulling, cutting and off-driving in fine style to hit four 4's and three 2's. Allan helped to add 60 runs, but he never shaped confidently. Rushton had a couple of wickets in a maiden over, but he owed them to good catches.

With the fourth ball of his first over Hetherington got Houseman caught, and Poynter was run out after a very bad misunderstanding with F. R. Smith, although the fielders almost bungled a sitter. The total was then 30, and this Smith and Beattie increased to 69 by lunch. After the interval the wicket became difficult and the bowlers were definitely on top, until Rushton and Hodgson came together.

#### Vigorous Batting.

Smith, who is associated with Darlington R.A. and holds a double qualification—Lancashire birth and Durham residence—left with the score unaltered. He had batted in vigorous style before lunch, scoring 46 out of 65 in 48 minutes and hitting eight 4's. Two of his drives were lofted in the direction of coverpoint, but otherwise his hitting was clean. Powerfully built, he was confident from the first and drove well on the offside.

Maconachie hit Beattie's off stump at 74, and Higson was caught off a skier by Pritchard, running back from coverpoint, eight runs later. Preston showed fair form before leaving to a slip catch at 117, but Horridge, who was taken at short leg four runs later, was fortunate to make 22.

#### Hodgson In a Hurry.

Hodgson, promoted from No. 10 in the batting order so that he could leave the ground at 3.45, took every risk when scoring 19, and the crowd, who had enjoyed his hitting, were probably mystified when he retired.

Rushton and Holroyd made 41 in the next partnership in 20 minutes, the little left-hander contributing 20 with four 4's and two 2's, chiefly from pulls. Rushton was last to leave, following the long interval caused by rain, having batted for 50 minutes, and made 40 out of 77. He hit a couple of 6's in addition to three 4's and two 3's, and showed stroke versatility.

Of the Northumberland bowlers Maconachie had one good spell, and Hetherington not much luck, while Lee got some work on the ball. Scores:—

**IN WINNING POSITION.**

**Northumbrians' Good All-Round Play.**

Northumberland established themselves in a strong position on the first day's play of their match with Cheshire, winding up at Jesmond last night with five wickets in hand and a lead of 81 runs.

The improved form shown against Lancashire II. on Monday and Tuesday was maintained against Cheshire, to whom they were superior in most phases of the game, and there is every likelihood of Northumberland registering their first county win of the current season to-day, especially as T. B. Woodcock may be unable to bat owing to an injured hand.

**Brilliant Ground Work.**

The bowling and fielding of Northumberland in the morning reminded one of their form in those seasons they headed the Minor Counties' table, the ground fielding being positively brilliant and catches well held. Maconachie changed his bowling frequently and with success, as the respective analysis show. The wicket was rather favourable to the bowlers, but even then the Cheshire batting did not impress. The Cestrians were batting two hours and 55 minutes for 112, and at no period of the game was there a suggestion of the bowling being subdued.

Only 18 runs came in the first 30 minutes and the first boundary in 40 minutes. H. W. Hodgson, who looked most likely to get runs, was dropped when 20 by Allan (off a Milne spinner) running over from slip to backward point, but the batsman only made nine more before being caught at the wicket in playing back to a well-pitched-up ball from Hetherington.

**Eight for 46.**

Fifty was sent up after an hour's play, and the total reached 83 before W. E. Jones was beaten by Allan's off break. Thereafter the Cheshire batsmen, if one excepts Fisk, whose long reach and good footwork enabled him to "smother" effectively, were in serious difficulties, and the last eight wickets produced but 46 runs, five falling at one period for 13.

L. N. Jones was caught at forward short leg, Woodcock at the wicket, J. P. Hodgson chopped a ball on to his wicket. McIntyre was well beaten by Lee, Wilson out to a splendid catch at fine leg by Taylor, and Stevenson brilliantly caught by Lee at mid-on from a full-blooded drive, while the Tynemouth player brought off another catch at square leg to dismiss Fisk, and Wade neatly took a dropping ball.

Maconachie returned splendid bowling figures, and Hetherington, whose first spell of bowling occupied 80 minutes, had only 19 runs scored from him in 17 overs. His final return and those of the other bowlers shows the consistency of the Northumberland attack, though the work of the fieldsmen kept the total down by some 50 runs.

**Mackay's 40.**

Northumberland made an inauspicious start, Bruce being bowled by Dennis at 7, but Mackay scored in fine style to claim 30 out of 50 in thirty-five minutes, and ultimately reach 40 in fifty-five minutes, during which time, with Pritchard, he added 67. Mackay, who gave a chance to slip when 22, scored from leg balls in his usual way, though 15 of his runs were made on the offside, including a couple of boundaries. Two other 4's came from a hook and a glance.

Pritchard continued to score at a steady rate, but Lee, after showing up well on the offside, was bowled by Dennis, and Taylor, who attacked the bowling tight-away, splendidly caught off a going-away ball by Leslie Jones.

**The Highest Score.**

Four wickets were down for 101—reached in 85 minutes, but Wade defended strongly and helped Pritchard to carry the total of 174, an addition of 73, in 63 minutes. Pritchard, who had taken two hours to make 50 out of 123, was then well caught by R. Hutchinson (subbing for Woodcock) at long-off, after scoring 75, including a 6, a 5 (4 overthrow), and nine 4's. Altogether he was at the wicket two hours and 25 minutes, and made very few streaky shots. He might, under the circumstances, have quickened his scoring rate up earlier than he did, when Northumberland had secured a good lead, but his innings was certainly an invaluable one. He scored well with shots in front of the wicket, driving particularly well.

Wade was unbeaten at the close with 34, made out of 92 in an hour and a quarter, and has so far hit three 4's. Maconachie adopted the right tactics in the last 12 minutes, and hit three fine drives to the boundary. Scores:—

**INNINGS VICTORY FOR NORTHUMBERLAND.**

**Some Fine Bowling Feats.**

Northumberland, in beating Cheshire at Jesmond yesterday by an innings and one run, registered their first win outright since June 21 of last year, and their most substantial success since July 9, 1925. As a rule they have found Cheshire a not too difficult proposition, and the present Cestrian side is probably one of the poorest for some time. That fact, however, does not detract from the merit of Northumberland's success nor minimizes the value of the work done by the newcomers to the side. The right blend of age and experience, with youth and enthusiasm, is now forthcoming, and a revival in the County's fortunes indicated.

**Fourteen for 96.**

Yesterday's play was made notable by the dismissal of fourteen batsmen for an aggregate of 96 runs, brought about in the first place by a changing wicket, good bowling, keen fielding, and some lack of batting enterprise. Cheshire's batting has not been so undistinguished for some years, nor have the Northumberland bowling changes been rung so frequently as in this match.

Northumberland resumed in the morning holding a lead of 81 runs with five wickets to fall, but their advantage had almost vanished into thin air by half-past eleven when the innings, which occupied three hours and ten minutes, closed for the addition of eight runs, the last four wickets actually falling at the same total—201. Dennis brought about the collapse, bowling 13 balls and claiming four wickets for three runs, as against his overnight figures of two for 36.

**Dennis's Spell.**

Off the third ball of his first over Dennis got Maconachie caught at the wicket. He had three runs scored from him in that over, but in his next he had two wickets for none, and finished off the innings with the first ball of his third over. With the new ball his swingers were always difficult to time, but he was indebted to a very fine catch by Leslie Jones at slip for his last wicket.

Wade, who was out without adding to his overnight 34, was batting 80 minutes, and hit three 4's and two 3's. Maconachie had 17 of the 22 runs made from the sixth partnership in 15 minutes.

Cheshire went in again—after a delay of 85 minutes owing to rain—facing a deficit of 80 and minus the services of Woodcock, whose hand, injured in the Durham game, was X-rayed yesterday. H. W. Hodgson was bowled by Hetherington, and the running out of W. E. Jones at 33 practically decided the issue. Jones, who had played defensive cricket on the previous two days, scored really well to make 24 in 40 minutes, chiefly with back shots.

**The Final.**

The Cheshire batting broke down completely for a time after lunch, Allan bowling L. N. Jones at 34, Maconachie disposing of Fisk in the same way, and half the side being out in 65 minutes for 35, when Allan beat McIntyre to get two wickets for none. Wilson helped J. P. Hodgson to take the score to 53, and there was a useful seventh wicket stand, but Hetherington finished off the match, just when it seemed likely that the innings defeat would be averted, by getting Dennis caught by B. R. Alderson (fielding substitute for Pritchard). The innings occupied 95 minutes.

Allan's bowling success was very pleasing, and he claimed chief honours with his clubmate, Hetherington, whose record in the match was 6 for 61. It seems unfair to criticize when such a substantial win was gained, but it was surprising that Maconachie did not give Lee an over or two at the cemetery end. Scores:—

## NORTHUMBERLAND IN STRONG POSITION.

### Yorkshire's Handicap.

Glorious weather favoured the match between Northumberland and Yorkshire II. at Jesmond, yesterday, and the breeze which came from the South-West was most acceptable.

Northumberland, whose team showed three changes from the advertised side, Ord, Baxter and Saunders being the newcomers vice Lee, Milne and Wade, batted first and made 104. Yorkshire II. were dismissed for 143 and Northumberland, going in a second time, scored 33 without loss, so that they wound up 84 ahead with all their second innings wickets in hand.

#### Mackay's Useful Innings.

Northumberland's batting was, on the whole, none too impressive. Mackay, whose 82 included a 6 and six 4's, was staky in the 40's, but his innings was a most useful one. His leg shots were particularly good. Pritchard was out to a poor shot, and Taylor did not show the same confidence as in his last match. Ord was quite the reverse, but Douglas eventually bowled him. Maconachie could not complain of being out in less than an over. His first ball might have been a catch, he missed one, and then returned a ball to Bedford.

There was no really enterprising batting until Craig joined Hetherton, and the pair of them put 43 on in very quick time, Craig exercising more patience and profiting thereby, although he was deceived by Bedford when attempting a full-blooded drive. Hetherton's was a characteristic knock, with vigorous driving much in evidence.

#### Hall's Mishap.

Yorkshire II. were rather unfortunate in having to take Hall off so early. He was limping badly when he had two wickets for 12, and, until the advent of Bedford, none of the other bowlers were so dangerous. Bedford, opening with two fairly expensive overs, eventually came out with good figures. Major Chichester-Constable strained a muscle early in the innings, and was twice handicapped in the slips by inability to jump for a catch, and when batting he had a runner.

The Northumberland skipper early showed his partiality for bowling changes, and, though bowling with success himself, gave Allan the ball at 15, put Saunders in Allan's place at 57, and gave Baxter his first chance to relieve Hetherton with the score only 63. Saunders was bowling really well at tea-time, but on resuming Maconachie and Hetherton were the bowlers, and the former disposed of the aggressive Turner almost at once.

#### The Tall End.

The tail-end of Yorkshire dragged a very weary length, and at least one link should have been snapped earlier, when Pritchard dropped a skier from Douglas. Eventually the side was out after batting two hours and twenty-five minutes.

## FINE WIN FOR NORTHUMBERLAND.

### Mackay's Match.

By exactly six o'clock last night Northumberland had beaten Yorkshire II. by 107 runs, the Yorkshiremen having been set to get 300 runs ten minutes after lunch. The early batsmen made a laudable effort to get them, but the later batsmen were chiefly concerned with defence, and eternal vigilance in the field was necessary to get them out.

It was a great match for Mackay in more ways than one. His two innings of over 80 each were winning factors in themselves, but the brilliance of the catches later were but a part of the all-round excellence of his fielding. I. O. Maconachie again showed versatility in captaincy—he changed his bowling readily and well, though Saunders might have been given more work to do on the showing he made in the three overs he bowled yesterday. That said, there is little that could be criticized.

#### Bedford the Bowler.

Yorkshire did not put on view a potential master cricketer, but in Bedford they have the promise of a more than useful bat and an able slow bowler with a ball as near googly as makes no matter to his discomfited victims. He breaks both ways without any perceptible change in action. Major Chichester-Constable again carried on gallantly with his stiff leg yesterday although he might have saved a few runs by leaving some of the work to others.

Of the new Northumberland comers Saunders made the best impression, Baxter being rather disappointing. Ord was very sound without brilliance.

Yesterday's cricket was better and, in particular, Northumberland's second innings batting was improved in every respect. Although Mackay again got such a lot of runs his innings did not overshadow the rest. It was, however, a better effort than Wednesday's, there not being one real chance. Mackay, who batted one hour and three-quarters, hit 14 fours and a three, playing Bedford better than anyone on the side, and again placing cleverly on the leg side.

#### The "Wrong 'Un."

Pritchard opened well with a couple of 4's and a single before Bedford completely deceived him. A similar ball got Bruce, and Taylor fell to the "wrong 'un" which appeared in every over of the Barnsley bowler. Hetherton, in an attempt, apparently, to smother the spin of Bedford was stumped.

Meanwhile, Mackay had been steadily compiling runs and passed his first innings total with a nicely guided four through the slips. The next ball from Fisher, who had relieved a singularly ineffective Douglas, beat him, however.

Craig, when joined by Maconachie, went for the bowling in aggressive style. He was in danger in the slips twice, and also skied a ball which should have been caught, but, on the whole, his driving was more reminiscent of his old County form.

#### Spirited Batting.

Maconachie, who had dropped himself in the batting in favour of Hetherton and Craig, joined with the wicket-keeper in one of the best partnerships of the match, putting on 67 in 35 minutes, with plenty hard hitting and not a few thrills, especially when the two batsmen found themselves at one end and the fielders all at sea. Having survived that episode they hit very freely and both were well caught.

Allan had an extraordinary hit from Fisher's first ball. It was a hit past square leg, which looked a boundary, but it slowed up, and before square leg had arrived Allan and Maconachie had run a five! Allan and Saunders lasted till lunch, but after that the end soon came, Bedford getting his sixth wicket when Saunders skied one for Shackleton to hold. The innings lasted just on the three hours, and was never dull.

Bedford's bowling was a feature of the match, and with his 11 wickets for 105 he came out exceedingly well.

#### Four Catches.

In the Yorkshire II. second innings Mackay brought off four fine catches at short leg, but probably the best catch in the match was that made at slip with the left-hand low down by Ord, who got rid of McReynolds in this way. Maconachie, in his last spell, had four wickets for 12 runs. Scores:—

**Varying Fortunes at Old Trafford.**

Northumberland, after a day of varying fortunes at Old Trafford, Manchester, yesterday, finished up in quite a good position. They totalled 158, and dismissed six Lancashire II. batsmen for 82.

On an easy paced wicket, Northumberland opened with Bruce and Mackay, and scored 25 in half an hour, when Preston, who had commenced the attack, gave way for Holroyd. Bruce hit his first boundary to leg from the new bowler's third ball, and when Chadwick relieved Booth at the other end, Mackay sent the first ball over cover's head for four, and in the next over hit Holroyd to the leg boundary. Just after putting on 50 in 45 minutes, however, the pair were separated, Mackay being snapped at the wicket for 26.

**Bruce's Sound Innings.**

With the total at 73 Horridge came on and got Bruce out with his fifth ball via a beautiful catch on the leg boundary. Bruce, apart from two shots behind the wicket, batted well for 63 minutes, and hit three 4's.

Pritchard, never comfortable, was bowled next ball, and Lee, after a nice on drive for 4, was out at 91. Wade was taken by point, fielding very close in, at 94, and Allan dismissed leg before at 97. The 100 went up after 105 minutes, but Hetherington was bowled with the total unchanged.

The slow bowlers were turning the ball now, and the fielding was keen. Stanger-Leathes and Craig were together at lunch, when the score was 102 for seven.

**Craig in Luck.**

Craig hit a boundary past cover soon after resuming and the score was carefully taken to 122. Two runs later Craig was missed by mid-off from a hard drive and had two lives in the first over of Latchford, who had come on at 141. Craig was out next over for an invaluable, if lucky, innings of an hour's duration. Rain stopped play with the total at 157 for nine, but the innings closed for another run after occupying three hours and ten minutes.

Stanger-Leathes batted for 100 minutes and gave no chance. The total was disappointing after the good start, but when the effect of the heavy roller wore off the bowlers found conditions to their liking.

**Allan's Victims.**

With the Lancashire II. total at 9 Craig caught Beattie smartly at the wicket off the fifth ball of Allan's third over, and then Booth, who had taken nine off Hetherington in an over, was bowled by Allan's 19th delivery, the total being 18. Paynter, who was not out at the close, might have been caught at slip in Allan's fifth over.

Hetherington bowled Taylor at 29 and at 40 Latchford cut a ball from Allan hard and high for Bruce to make a great over-head catch. Three balls later Lee caught Higson brilliantly with one hand low down at slip.

**Lee's Wicket.**

Allan, who had now taken four for 21 in eight overs, gave way to Lee, two overs later. Bruce made another smart catch, from Lee's first ball, to send Chadwick back with the total 50.

Milne relieved Hetherington at 65 and Saunders took over from Lee at 69, but Allan returned vice the Benwell Hill player two overs later (78). He missed Horridge first ball from an easy return.

**LANCASTRIANS WIN BY SIX WICKETS.**

**Northumberland Fail at Old Trafford.**

Lancashire II., by 6.30, had gained a six wickets win over Northumberland at Old Trafford, Manchester, yesterday, the visitors thus meeting with their first defeat since May and second in all out of five games. It was a rather surprising result, having regard to the state of the game overnight, but when the Lancastrians went in a second time there was no sun, and the wicket rolled out remarkably well for a fourth innings. Still, Northumberland's bowlers could not take advantage when the wicket began to show some effects of damage received from rain.

**Fine Fielding.**

The ground fielding was remarkably good, the young players saving many runs by hard running and anticipation, while Lee's catches were particularly good.

There had been some rain overnight, and the wicket was soft. Allan led off with three maidens and Hetherington two. At 5.2 Milne came on for Hetherington, Allan having then had five maidens out of eight. Lee displaced Milne at 110, and he missed Horridge off a caught and bowled chance second ball, but he got him l.b.w. immediately afterwards. The partnership added 61 runs for the seventh wicket.

Milne now took over from Allan, and in his fourth over Lee caught Farrimond at slip with the total at 136.

Allan came on for Milne again at 149, and from his fifth ball Paynter played on. The total stood at 157, and with the last man in two runs were required to gain first innings lead. Preston played four balls from Hetherington and then skied the fifth to mid-off, where Stanger-Leathes brought off a good catch close in.

**Brisk Opening.**

Mackay and Bruce opened the Northumberland second innings in brisk style, 12 runs coming in the first two overs. The slow bowlers were soon brought on and with the total at 39 Bruce was out l.b.w. The next ball bowled Pritchard around his legs and Lee had two escapes before being well caught for 4, with the total at 44.

Stanger-Leathes, who then came in, soon lost Mackay, out l.b.w. at 46 after batting for 50 minutes.

The wicket was now queer and Wade had a very uncomfortable over before lunch (47 for 4).

After lunch Stanger-Leathes kept scoring singles and getting the bowling, while the fielders were crowding around Wade whenever he took the bowling. He scored his first runs, a three, after 19 minutes at the wicket. Despite good bowling and keen fielding the score mounted slowly, the Northumbrian skipper hitting anything loose. The fielders amused the spectators by closing right in whenever Wade took the bowling.

With the total at 81, Holroyd changed ends, and his third ball got up sharply and off the shoulder of the bat, for Wade to give an easy catch after defending stoutly for 50 minutes. Craig, next in, was 15 minutes in opening his account with a single, and then Stanger-Leathes was out at 91, after batting for 78 minutes without giving a real chance.

Allan, next in, was missed when one, and then hit a four to leg, but he was given out l.b.w. with the total at 107. Hetherington only survived three balls, but Milne took nine from Horridge in an over. The left-hander, however, was caught with the total at 130, and Craig, hitting out, was caught next over for another lucky but valuable innings. He batted 63 minutes.

**Lancashire's Task.**

Lancashire had two hours and a half in which to get 142 to win. Beattie gave a good chance to slip (Allan) from Hetherington's fifth ball, but in Allan's second over Booth was out at 44. Paynter came in and then Milne relieved Allan, to be punished for eight from his first over.

Paynter scored well on the leg side, and fifty went up in fifty-five minutes. A smart catch got rid of the batsman at 62, and then Beattie gave a hard chance at the same total.

Allan took over from Milne at 73, and in his second over Lee made a brilliant slip catch to dispose of Beattie. The total was then 83, made in 100 minutes.

**SENSATIONAL PLAY AT BOUGHTON HALL.**

**18 Wickets Fall for 149 Runs**

**LESLIE JONES'S GREAT BOWLING.**

BOUGHTON HALL, Wednesday. Although the wet wicket and bad light rendered play to-day possible only between 2.5 and 5.30, at Boughton Hall, near Chester, in the opening day of the return match between Cheshire and Northumberland, 18 wickets actually fell for 149 runs in 175 minutes. **NORTHUMBERLAND AGAIN DEFEATED.**

**Fortunes Fluctuate in Cheshire Game.**

Pritchard, who was watching the ball very carefully, sent the 50 up in 55 minutes with a three off Cook and a four from a drive off W. E. Jones, Stanger-Leathes also drove to the boundary, and this brought about a double bowling change.

The Northumberland skipper played on the second ball from Dennis at 67, but with Wade in the score advanced to 89 by lunch.

**Pritchard Out.** After sending the 100 up in 105 minutes, Pritchard gave an easy return to Leslie Jones. He made his 46 runs out of 79 in 85 minutes, and, hitting hard at anything loose, had three 4's, three 3's, and seven 2's.

At 110 Craig was run out—from a direct hit—after making the call, and Wade was also run out through a bad misunderstanding with Allan one run later. The innings closed at three o'clock after occupying 160 minutes.

**Fisk in Luck.** Cheshire were left with plenty of time in which to get the runs, but the wicket was still difficult. Seven runs came off the first over and Milne came on at Hetherington's end, the Tynedale professional changing over vice Allan. The latter missed Fisk badly at mid-off in Milne's

second over with the total at 27. The 50 went up in 40 minutes, Fisk, who was lucky at times, having 36 of the runs. Lee came on for Hetherington at 64 and Pritchard took a good running catch to send Fisk back in the Tynemouth bowler's second over. Eight runs later Jefferson was caught behind the wicket, but the 100 went up in 85 minutes. At 109 Leslie Jones skied a ball and was caught by Mackay, while McIntyre, Midgeley and Walker were out for the addition of a score of runs.

**The Stumbling Block.** W. E. Jones, who had opened the innings was still batting very carefully, but at length Hetherington, who had actually had seven successive maiden overs, bowled the Cheshire captain at 132. Jones had batted two hours and five minutes for 45 out of that total, and undoubtedly won the match for his side, though it was Dutton and Crooke who actually knocked off the runs without further loss.

In an innings which lasted three hours Milne bowled extremely well, and Hetherington was very good after tea, but the life which was given to Fisk proved very costly. Scores:—

**Fifty-four Extras.**

The next six balls were nearer the wicket, but immediately afterwards eight boundary byes were allowed, and without a run being scored from the bat after 75 had been signalled, Staffordshire were given the lead by the aid of 49 more extras. The end came with the scores: Leicestershire II., 124; Staffordshire, 131 for four.

Sidney Barnes was the highest scorer for Staffordshire with 23 not out, and the extras totalled 54.

## DURHAM'S GREAT BATTING.

Dobson Scores His Fifth Century of Season.

## GIBBON'S FINE FORCING INNINGS.

Durham completely outplayed Northumberland at Jesmond in the opening day of the return Minor Counties' Championship match, and unless rain intervenes to-day they should win with an innings to spare. Their fast bowlers, Howell and Sadler, wrought such destruction that Northumberland were dismissed in 140 minutes for 138. Then Durham's first four batsmen treated the home attack so cavalierly that they actually put on 364 in 203 minutes, and the visitors wound up 226 ahead with seven wickets to fall.

### Durham's Batting "Stars."

With the exception of Mackay, who opened in confident style, all the good batting came from the Dunelmians, of whom T. K. Dobson showed himself to be the most accomplished batsman in the North-East; Gibbon, a vastly improved player compared with last May's form; Oliver, a stylist, who can also get runs; Maurice Nichol, though rather subdued later in his not out innings because of a damaged right-hand finger, has the finished style of the good class batsman, and probably we would have seen his off-side shots more powerfully executed but for his handicap.

### About Ord.

Except for the occasions when Northumberland have played against touring teams their bowlers have never been so well punished as was the case yesterday afternoon and evening. All seemed to come alike to the Durham batsmen, though Allan, Briggs, Milne and Ord kept the scoring rate down at times. Possibly if Ord had been tried earlier on Northumberland would have benefited. At any rate it was hardly fair to bring on the young Backworth left-hander when the total stood at 323, nor could he have fared worse than the others earlier on. Some of the home ground work was distinctly good, Briggs and Pritchard saving many runs on the boundaries, but there were others who were remiss.

### Gibbon's Best Innings.

The edge was taken off the Northumberland attack from the very start, Gibbon hitting with such power as to make 11 out of the first 75 in 40 minutes. When his, the first, wicket fell at 48, he had scored 68 of the runs in 72 minutes, with ten boundaries to his credit. Gibbon played well against the Yorkshire seniors, but he had never been seen to such advantage as in the first half hour of Durham's innings yesterday afternoon, nor has he used such stroke variety, for his 4's (eight of which were included in his first 18 scoring strokes) came from drives on either side of the wicket, leg glances, and one fine hook. He was dropped at square leg by Stanger-Leathes, off Milne, when 65, but Milne bowled him soon afterwards, Gibbon playing late at a ball that kept low.

Nichol in company with Oliver, continued where Gibbon had left off, and 16 came from the second partnership in 85 minutes. Oliver, bowled in playing back to Hetherton five minutes after the tea interval, was at the wicket for 110 minutes, scoring his 61 out of the 164 runs added in that time. Five of his seven 4's came from off drives—he pulled and cut for the other two—while he placed the ball neatly on the leg side in a chanceless innings.

### Dobson's Thousand.

There was no rest for the Northumberland bowlers and fielders for Nichol and Dobson soon settled down to a fine third wicket partnership, the most productive in the match as a matter of fact. In the course of 83 minutes these two added no fewer than 178 runs, Dobson claiming 106 of them in that time.

Scoring his fifth century this season, his previous four being one each against the West Indies and Yorkshire II. and two in Durham Senior League games, Dobson now possesses the highest aggregate of any North-East batsman, his figures to date being:

### 76 in Boundaries.

In his innings of yesterday Dobson overhauled Nichol during the third wicket partnership, and driving with rare power and pulling to the boundary anything short pitched completed his first 50 in 43 minutes out of 90, and added other 66 runs out of 88 in 40 minutes, with 19 4's for his chief scoring strokes. He took 14 from one over of Maconachie's, pulling three times to the boundary, and was finally caught by that player at slip off Ord. So far as could be seen he did not give a chance, and his batting was the best of its kind from a left-handed batsman.

Nichol, who has so far been batting for two hours and ten minutes—he reached 51 out of 143 in 50 minutes—was nine short of his century when stumps were drawn. But for his hand injury he would undoubtedly have reached the hundred before the close, for he could not drive in his customary style. His hitting, therefore, was not so clean as usual, though he glanced in finished style. So far he has hit 11 4's and if Durham decide to continue their innings this morning should top the century. He gave a chance of stumping at 84, off Ord's bowling.

### Howell and Sadler.

Howell and Sadler were generally on top in the morning when bowling, though Mackay made 19 (including 4 4's) in such facile fashion that he looked to be in for a big score until he mistimed a face-changed ball from Howell and spooned one up to square leg. Pritchard also showed useful form before Sadler made a spectacular catch from his own bowling, and Stanger-Leathes and Craig made 37 between them, but there was no holding the fast bowlers.

Sadler had eight scored from this last over by Milne, but the second boundary, a high cut over slip's head, was a hard chance. Even then Sadler's five wickets cost only seven runs apiece, his best performance for Durham County so far. Howell has yet to have a bad match against Northumberland. There were a lot of extras, but Howgate was in no wise to blame; in fact, he "kept" exceedingly well. Scores:—

## DURHAM FAIL TO GET FULL POINTS.

Exciting Finish to Jesmond Game.

### OVER THREE HOURS LOST THROUGH RAIN.

Contrary to expectation, there was a very exciting finish to the match at Jesmond last night, where Northumberland gained a lucky draw after rain had prevented a resumption of play until three o'clock, and Durham had declared at their overnight score and set the home side to get 225 in three hours and 40 minutes' possible play to avert an innings defeat.

It was a pity that Durham could not claim the full points after outplaying their opponents so decisively on Monday, for their inability to force a victory seriously jeopardizes their chances of figuring in the Minor Counties Championship challenge match this season. They have only won two games outright this season, taking first innings points in other four fixtures, and their percentage is 73.33, as against 80.00 if they had won yesterday.

#### To Play for a Draw.

Plainly enough, Northumberland could only play for a draw, and naturally there was, in the circumstances, an absence of sparkling batting such as we saw on Monday. The dead outfield, too, did not tend to improve the scoring rate, but the wet state of the pitch, of course, handicapped the bowlers.

Yet it was touch and go at one time whether Northumberland would not be dismissed with half an hour to spare, while victory seemed to be in Durham's grasp when 36 minutes remained for play with two home wickets to fall. But it was not to be, and Leslie Allan revealed unsuspected defensive qualities at a critical time, while Hetherington certainly did not lack for courage when it came to the pinch. In fact, the Tynedale pair's ninth wicket partnership was the means of robbing Durham of their deserts.

When Northumberland opened their second innings Brooks started with the fast bowlers who had done such damage on Monday, but they could not separate the first wicket pair, Bruce and Mackay. Nor did frequent changes in the attack bring about the desired result until the partnership had produced 79 in two hours—evidence of the careful way in which the batsmen played.

#### Escapes.

Bruce was almost run out in Howell's opening over through backing up slowly for a second run when Mackay had a shot misfielded at point, while when 20 he should have been caught at slip by Carr, rather better placed than Sadler, though both were culpable. Then Mackay almost broke his wicket when playing back to a leg ball from Howell.

Apart from these escapes, however, the opening pair, while rarely scoring with any freedom, gave very little away, and at tea had put on 55 in 90 minutes. After the interval the scoring was accelerated so that 24 runs were added in half an hour before Mackay, who had previously mis-hit an off ball, skied a full toss over point's head for Brooks to make a really good running catch. Mackay's 34 included three 4's, and he scored more than usual on the offside, though both he and Bruce were partial at times to Howell's leg balls.

Bruce soon followed Mackay to the pavilion, being caught at the wicket after making 41 runs out of 83 in two hours and five minutes, with five 4's from cuts and two successive leg shots to the rails.

#### Home Stock Slumps.

Following his departure there came a decided slump in Northumberland's stock, Ord being caught low down at slip by Sadler at 99, Pritchard caught at the wicket from a ball which got up quickly, and half the side being out at 112 with the dismissal of Briggs, who straight drove Carr for four and then mis-hit the next two balls.

When Stanger-Leathes and Maconachie came together 63 minutes remained for play, and the sixth-wicket pair advanced the score by 24 in quarter of an hour before Sadler bowled Maconachie. At the same total (136) Stanger-Leathes was rather unluckily stumped after slipping. He scored 23 runs in 38 minutes, and hit five 4's all of them but one the result of good driving.

When Craig played on with his pad from Brooks at 140, with 45 minutes left for play, Northumberland looked to be beaten, but Hetherington stayed with Allan until only six minutes remained for play, while Allan and Milne managed to save the game in the last partnership. Hetherington, who had three boundary hits, was not comfortable, but he looked like playing out time with Allan until Cook deceived him with the pace of a ball which the batsman cocked up to short leg.

#### Sadler's Nine Wickets.

The Durham bowlers, of whom Sadler had 9 wickets for 73 in the match, were perhaps unfortunate to be so foiled, but for once in a while Howell could not get through the batsmen's defence, while Cook might with advantage have been brought on again earlier than the last four overs or so. There were 35 maiden overs in the innings out of 89 bowled, as against 11 in the Durham innings of 83.

Nichol's overnight 91 runs were made in two hours and ten minutes out of 266, and included 11 4's. Scores:—

## NORTHUMBERLAND OUT OF LUCK.

### Yorkshire Colts in Good Position.

(From Our Own Representative.)

BRIDLINGTON, Monday.

Northumberland experienced a most unfortunate time in the opening day of their match with Yorkshire II. They were dismissed for 111, and Yorkshire II, in response, made 170 for five, thus winding up 59 in front with half their side still to be dismissed.

To start with, Horace Lee—who was injured on Saturday in a club game—was hit when batting with a rising ball from Fisher, and had to be taken off in pain. He returned after lunch, but was obviously nervous, which was not to be wondered at. Lee could not bowl, however, and to make matters infinitely worse Walter Hetherington, who was very lame from a blow on the knee received on Saturday, bowled one over and then gave way to Tom Atkinson. He came on again later in the day, and was only hit for six runs in six overs.

#### Changing Wicket.

Everybody thought the wicket would be easy in the morning, when Northumberland won the toss and elected to bat, but it turned out nasty, the ball coming off at different angles and getting up high.

Fisher's third ball clean bowled Bruce for none, and then from the first ball of his third over Mackay was caught at slip (7). Lee had scored one when he retired hurt, and Stanger-Leathes joined Ord. With the total at 11 Ord unluckily played on, the ball going in front of him and then behind his legs. Broadbelt played confidently, but with the total at 24 was out to a fine slip catch, while McKinnell left at 32.

Craig was uncomfortable at first, but he and Stanger-Leathes, who was batting well, gradually took the score on. They twice ran 4's, but at 88 Craig was out for a plucky 20 made in 40 minutes.

With the first ball in the last over before lunch Stanger-Leathes was bowled, the total being 100. It was probably the worst ball of the innings—a longhop. Rightly enough he tried for a six, but the ball kept low and unluckily ended a grand innings of 90 minutes' duration. The Northumbrian skipper hit five 4's.

The innings soon closed after lunch, the 111 runs having been made in 134 minutes.

#### Atkinson's Wickets.

Allan opened with a maiden over when Yorkshire II commenced their innings and Atkinson came on at the other end when Hetherington was lame. The Walls-end bowler got Whitehead well caught by Allan at slip at 15 and then at 23 Craig, standing well back to Atkinson, took a catch to dismiss Turner.

At 43 Ord came on for Allan, and at 58 a rain shower eased the wicket, so that 20 runs were added in ten minutes. Another shower did not help the Northumbrian attack, greatly weakened with Hetherington and Lee off, but Atkinson yorkeed Harboard at 78. He had kept an end going in fine style, and in 17 overs had taken three wickets for 38.

## A WIN FOR NORTHUMBERLAND.

### Splendid Recovery Against Yorkshire II.

BRIDLINGTON, Tuesday.

Northumberland gained a sensational win here to-day by 11 runs over Yorkshire II.—whom they beat at Jesmond earlier in the season. A win made all the more acceptable and enjoyable to their supporters by reason of its unexpectedness.

To start with, Yorkshire II. had fine weather after overnight rain in which to resume their first innings with the total at 170 for five, and a lead of 59 runs already in hand. Northumberland's "crocks" were rather better, although four players were either feeling effects of injury or indisposition, and Allan opened in fine bowling style.

#### Allan's Wickets.

The fifth ball sent down by the Tyndale amateur in his second over got rid of Shackleton. Ord taking a brilliant one-hand catch at short leg. The total was then 172, and Shackleton had made 63 runs in good style.

Hetherington came on for Atkinson at 177 and had a maiden over; and then Allan bowled the other overnight not out, Lamb. He got Constable caught in his next over with the total unchanged, while at 183 Craig caught Hall at the wicket off the same bowler. Seventeen runs (via J. N. Smith) came from Hetherington's bowling before Allan finished off the innings by scattering Smith's stumps.

Atkinson, too, created a fine impression, while the fielding was generally good.

Northumberland, in arrears of 103, opened their second innings with Mackay and Bruce and this pair sent up the fifty in 25 minutes, a fine piece of batting considering how the Yorkshiremen had collapsed. Shackleton and Hall came on to make a double bowling change and at 60 Bruce was out to a great slip catch off the second named bowler. He was only in 35 minutes and hit three 4's.

#### Mackay's Innings.

Ord helped Mackay to take the total to 77 when the latter was caught on the leg boundary after playing a fine innings of 55 minutes' duration and hitting seven 4's. At 85 Ord was stumped in jumping out to Shackleton and then one run later Lee made a half-hearted attempt to hit Shackleton, and gave a catch to mid-off.

The wicket was bumping badly when Broadbelt joined Stanger-Leathes, and at 93 the latter got a severe blow on the elbow and could not continue. The Northumbrian skipper was able to resume after lunch, but could not use his left forearm much, and at 105 he was bowled after having put his side in front with a nice boundary past point.

#### McKinnell's Score.

McKinnell came in and, with Broadbelt, gradually sent the score up by good, plucky batting. They had to take hard knocks, but defended stoutly. A double bowling change, however, at 150, when Shackleton (slow) and Horbury (medium) came on, soon worked, Broadbelt being caught on the leg boundary after a fine innings of 31, made in 62 minutes and including five 4's. The total was 151 when Craig joined McKinnell, who was batting well though lame. He lost Craig at 165 and was himself bowled at 183 for a splendid 47, compiled in 57 minutes and including eight 4's.

#### Another Casualty.

A ball that got up nastily severely damaged the hand of the Yorkshire wicket-keeper, Smith, and Lamb had to take his place when he retired. Allan quickly made 16, and the innings eventually closed at 206, made in 170 minutes.

It transpired that Smith had broken a finger, and would be unable to bat, so that Yorkshire were handicapped when they set out to get 104 to win. They lost Harboard at 12, and Turner, out to a short leg catch, at 31, while Whitehead was out the second ball after ten. The fielding was very keen and bowling good, but runs mounted steadily.

#### Atkinson's Trio.

With the score at 76 for three, however, Atkinson got two wickets in an over, to give Northumberland a fighting chance, while McKinnell took a neat catch from the first ball of Atkinson's second over to give the Walls-end man three wickets for four runs.

The batsmen successfully appealed against the light at 76 for 6, but after a very short delay resumed. Atkinson took a smart slip catch to get rid of Horbury; Hetherington dropped one, also at slip, and then Lee held a ball off Cooper's bat at 91. With another fine one-handed catch at short leg Ord dismissed Hall to finish off the match 30 minutes from time.

#### Keyed Up.

Yorkshire were unlucky to lose Smith, but Northumberland had their troubles. Their victory is the best they have gained since the successful earlier post-war days, and the players were keyed up to the highest pitch.

**MINOR COUNTY TOPICS.**

**Durham's First Defeat Since 1925.**

(By "UMPIRE.")

Luck, almost as much as skill, is a championship requisite, and Durham, for lack of it have pretty much lost an excellent chance of heading the Minor Counties' Championship competition or, alternatively, of challenging for the title. They came as near as possible to winning the match at Jesmond without actually doing so, and were just as unfortunate at Blackpool this week, when Durham's unbeaten Minor Counties' record of three years' standing was broken by a team which must be acknowledged one of the best in the tourney and the equal of some first-class teams. Incidentally, Lancashire II were Durham's previous victors at Manchester in 1925.

**Happy Augury.**

One could not visualize Durham being dismissed for such small scores as was the case on tour, and it is significant that Maurice Nichol returned the best aggregate for the four innings, a tribute to his skill and a happy augury for the first class career upon which he is to enter next year. C. L. Adamson, the next most successful batsman, has probably the soundest defence of any young player up here. If sometimes he is thought unattractive in style that is because he is an unobtrusive type of batsman who diverts the ball rather than hits it.

**T. K. Dobson.**

T. K. Dobson did not continue in his scoring vein, but he demonstrated his all-round ability by taking 16 wickets for 130 runs in the four innings, and with Cook and Carr made the most of wickets which did not favour the fast bowlers. It is a pity T. K. cannot take part in first class cricket—Durham may be participating some day, of course—for the Whitburn amateur would have made a name for himself. How nice it would be if a North-East amateur could be chosen for a representative Gentlemen's side, and how easily the responsible authorities could do it if they desired. The amateur cricketer outside the first class circle does not receive much recognition unless he has been to the University.

**Allan's Distinction.**

The advent of Atkinson into County cricket met with such success at Bridlington as to suggest that the Wallsend man will be a first choice next season. With Milne not in the side and Hetherton lame there was ample opportunity for Allan and Atkinson to show their worth, and right well did they bowl. Allan is at the very least the best amateur bowler in the county, and it is just about time he was given his due as such. From our League averages it will be noticed that Allan displaces Coulson at the head of the bowling list. Allan has reached that position by consistent bowling and not with occasional turns. He has not bowled so many overs as many others in the list, but it has not been necessary in the case of Tynedale!

**Northumbria Improving.**

It is still a long way off the hundred per cent. of 1925—an achievement which seems to become more amazing as time goes on—but progress is certainly being made.
