On Wednesday morning the pitch was "dead" and the bowlers had to use sawdust frequently.

J. H. Amory won the toss for Devon and decided to take first knock. F. A. Fulcher and J. F. Shelley opened the batting for Devon to the bowling of Blunden at the southern end and Fairservice at the north end.

F. A. Fulcher turned Blunden's third ball to leg for four, and quickly settled down. Shelley had a "life" when his score stood at eight, two fieldsmen missing an easy catch. His batting became steadier after this and later he hit a boundary off Blunden, who was keeping a good length. Sawdust was applied frequently.

Runs came mostly by boundary hits at the rate of one boundary an over.

Shelley hit two successive 4's off Blunden to put the 50 up in 45 minutes for no wicket. At this stage Lewis relieved Fairservice at the north end to allow the latter to take over from Blunden.

F. A. Fulcher was caught at the wicket by H. V. Livett off the last ball of Fairservice's first over at that end. The first wicket thus fell at 53, of which Fulcher obtained a steady 19 in 50 minutes, hitting three boundaries.

Falding, who replaced Fulcher, was returned to the pavilion five minutes later without scoring. Brown took a catch beautifully at mid-off, off Fairservice, the score standing at 57.

A new ball was brought into use two overs later, there being no increase in the score. W. W. Hoare replaced Falding and lunch was taken at 57.

Play was resumed at 2.25. Shelley had added 9 to his lunch total in 15 minutes (two fours and a single), when he was caught at mid-off by Watson off Fairservice. He contributed a good 46 to the total of 66 and hit nine 4's.

C. D. McCarthy came in in Shelley's place and scoring slackened. McCarthy was missed at point soon after his arrival when he skied a ball from Lewis. He atoned for his mistake in the next over by pulling two successive balls from Fairservice to square leg and fine leg to the ropes. In Fairservice's next over he on-drove his fifth ball to the boundary and pulled his last ball to square leg.

Rain stopped play at this stage, the score being 99.

Play was resumed, but when nine runs were added stumps were drawn owing to the rain.

A heavy mist which first covered the top of the hills behind the ground, on Thursday morning, gradually rolled down the face of the hills, covered the golf links and finally settled over the cricket ground like a damp shroud.

Cricket was out of the question until after lunch, when the mist receded to the hills.

Fine rain fell after lunch, however, and after inspecting the wicket at 2.45, the umpires decided that the match should be abandoned.

KENT'S SECOND STRING AT HYTHE.

Match With Surrey 2nd XI.

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

On Monday Surrey 2nd XI visited Hythe to meet Kent 2nd XI in the Minor Counties Championship, and, winning the toss, elected, to bat first on an easy-paced wicket.

The Hop County were not at full strength, Bull and McVittie being at Dover, playing for the senior eleven, whose ranks had been depleted through Woolley, Ames and Freeman being engaged in the Test.

Surrey opened with W. T. Cook and Daily to the bowling of Watt and Beslee. Watt's first and third deliveries were "wides."

Cook, invariably a forcing batsman, several times drove Watt past the latter to the far screen, but Daily was much less enterprising, and indulged in rather a lot of pad play. Twice Beslee appealed unsuccessfully for lbw.

At 34 Cook returned a terrific drive to Watt, who brilliantly held it low down with his right hand. Cook had registered 25 of the total, and looked like making a big score. A few minutes later Mobey was run out.

At 46 Fairservice came on for Beslee, but only for the latter to change ends in place of Watt. Off Fairservice's first ball, Wilson hoisted the 50. Daily partially enlivened a rather drab stay by hitting Fairservice for 3 and Beslee for 4 off successive balls, but for a quarter of an hour there was little to arouse the few spectators' enthusiasm. It must be admitted, however, that both bowlers were keeping an excellent length, with Fairservice exploiting a pronounced break.

Seventy was sent up in about as many minutes, and at 74 Wilson's innings came to an end, Weigall making a fine one-handed catch high up at mid-on.

DAILY OUT.

Off the first ball of the next over Daily's patient innings came to an end, being clean bowled by Fairservice for 30 compiled in 80 minutes. E. G. Stroud, although obviously uncomfortable, survived the remainder of the over, and at the same time a unanimous appeal for obstruction.

Baldwin hit Beslee for 3 to open his account, and then punched a full-toss from Fairservice through cover for 4. After bowling excellently, but without much luck, for exactly 100 minutes Beslee was relieved by Brown.

Stroud sent up the 100, and lunch was taken with the score at 108 for 4, Baldwin being 19 and Stroud 12.

Beslee and Watt resumed bowling after lunch, and with the fifth ball of his first over the former bowled Baldwin with a ball the latter never attempted to play. H. M. Garland-Wells and Stroud quickly took the score to 148 when a very smart piece of fielding by Watson ran out Stroud. Seven runs later Beslee got Geary for obstruction, and 7 men were out for 150.

Garland-Wells continued to force the pace, and Hubble came on for Fairser-

vice. The new-comer's slows tempted Garland-Wells, who, after lifting a full-toss to the leg boundary, drove a hard one into Beslee's hands at 170. The Surrey amateur's 43 represented the highest batting of the innings, until Beslee was severely punished by Lock. The latter, at 193, attempted an extremely foolish run, and was run out while turning to get back from mid-wicket. With a full-blooded drive off Hubble Sheffield sent up the 200. Tyler caught Lywood at 206 to conclude the innings.

AMATEURS' LIVELY HITTING.

Kent opened with G. S. Watson and F. W. Tyler, Lywood and Lock being in charge of the attack. Tyler quickly put up double figures by hitting Lywood for two 4's, and then Lock for another boundary, the 20 quickly following. Lock missed a difficult return to his left hand from Tyler, and the two amateurs' continued to advance the score at a merry pace.

At 35 Sheffield relieved Lock, and Stroud came on for Lywood, but these changes had no effect on the batsmen's rate of scoring. However, at 49 Watson was finely caught low down by Lywood, and Hubble was bowled first ball.

Tyler and E. H. Moss carried the score to 72, when the former, who had contributed 42 of the total, was Sheffield's third victim. Garland-Wells came on for Stroud, and, with the last ball before the tea interval, got Moss caught behind the wicket. At this stage four men were out for 76.

After tea, with only one run added, T. A. Crawford was out lbw without scoring. Brown joined G. J. V. Weigall, and played a very straight bat. Two from an overthrow and a four over Sheffield's head sent up the 80, all these being registered by Brown.

The fieldsmen crowded in close on Weigall, but the Kent skipper advanced the score by cutting Garland-Wells for 3 and turning Sheffield to leg for 2. He then cut Sheffield for a perfect 4.

By slow degrees the 100 was put up, keen fielding limiting the scoring strokes to singles Weigall, in attempting a quick run, collided with a fieldsmen, and came down rather heavily, the game being held up for a minute while he recovered. Two runs were required to save the follow-on when Brown returned the easiest of catches to Garland-Wells, after scoring 14 which was worth many a 50 scored under different circumstances.

SLOW SCORING.

Fairservice turned Garland-Wells to leg for 4, and then followed ten minutes of sheer stone-walling, relieved by Fairservice getting a two through the ring of fieldsmen off the Surrey amateur. A similar two by the same batsman followed, but at this stage play was very monotonous. When Weigall eventually scored a single off Sheffield there was a ripple of applause—sounding suspiciously like modest "barracking."

Weigall (3) and Fairservice (2) helped the score along, and Geary came on for Sheffield, who had had an exceptionally long spell, and then Garland-Wells got Fairservice lbw, with the score reading 123-7-11.

Hart, who was suffering from an injury, came out with a runner, but, after receiving only one ball, was sent back to the pavilion by Weigall, and Watt filled the vacancy. Kent's young professionals appeared to possess an excellent idea of batting, but lacked actual scoring strokes.

Watt hit a lofty one to the leg

boundary off Garland-Wells, and seemed likely to get runs. At 130 Weigall's extremely patient innings was terminated by a neat catch by Daily at mid-off.

Watts and Beslee advanced the score to 143, the latter being then bowled, and stumps were drawn for the day.

When play opened on Tuesday, Surrey enjoyed a useful first innings lead of 65. From the very start it was obvious that Surrey's policy was to force the pace, quite the correct one under the circumstances.

Kent met with an early success, Daily leaving at 32, but Cook and Mobey added another 60 before the former, who had just reached his 50, was well caught by Fairservice. Then followed another useful partnership between Mobey and Wilson, the pair advancing the score to 176 before the latter left. Wilson's share of the 84 added was only 25, but runs had been coming at a very quick pace, Mobey being particularly severe on all the bowlers, all of whom had suffered heavy punishment.

Hubble had had bad luck several times with deliveries but must have literally shaved the wickets, and Tyler appeared to miss one clear chance of stumping off his bowling.

MOBEY'S BAD LUCK.

At 221 Mobey's innings came to an end, when he skied a ball to Watson. His had been a merry and enterprising knock, and he had wretched luck in not reaching his century, for he needed only one more run when he was dismissed. At lunch the score was 230 for 4.

Wickets fell quickly upon the resumption, the batsmen taking every risk. Lock did not stay long, and Baldwin left at 242. Garland-Wells, who had been hitting with great power, sent up 250, and then reached his individual half-century, only to fall immediately to a brilliant running catch on the boundary by Brown. At 273 for 8 Cook declared, leaving Kent to get 398 to win.

Watson and Tyler again opened for the hop county, with Sheffield and Geary the bowlers. Runs did not come very quickly against some accurate trundling, but with successive hits for 2 and 4 off Geary, Watson sent up the 20 in as many minutes. Tyler cut Sheffield for 4, but Watson skied one to the square-leg boundary, where Stroud made a nice catch.

Baldwin came on for Sheffield, but, with Tyler batting freely, a very creditable rate of scoring was maintained, and 50 went up in about 40 minutes. Both batsmen punished the new bowler, but off the last ball of the over Tyler just touched one into Mobey's hands, and two good men were out for 57.

HUBBLE'S PLUCKY STAND.

Hubble atoned for his first innings failure with a succession of boundary shots to leg. Garland-Wells had relieved Geary, and the scoring pace slackened.

Sheffield returned at the northern end, and Cook also brought on Lywood for Garland-Wells in an attempt to effect a separation, but Hubble, in particular was batting confidently, and the 100 was sent up in 85 minutes.

At 102, however, Hubble was out to a clear case of obstruction for 47—an innings full of real merit. Shortly afterwards the tea interval was taken. This proved disastrous for Crawford, who was caught at the wicket immediate-

ly upon the resumption. Weigall joined Moss, and 110 was put on the board, but runs came slowly, and Weigall left at 118.

THE END IN LIGHT.

The following batsmen played stubbornly, Brown contributing a valuable 26, while Watt and Beslee put on 25 for the last wicket, but, with Hart still absent, the innings closed for 181 just after 6 o'clock, Beslee providing Mobey with his third victim of the innings, and Surrey had won by 154 runs.
