LANCASHIRE 2nd v. CHESHIRE.

MATCH AT WARRINGTON.

HONOURS EVEN ON FIRST DAY.

For the second year in succession the venue of the match between Lancashire 2nd and Cheshire was the Arpley enclosure, Warrington, and the opening day's play was on Wednesday. The attendance was very sparse, and certainly not in keeping with Warrington's reputation as a sporting town. Last season it will be remembered that the match terminated in a draw, the first day's play being interfered with by rain, not a ball being bowled. The wicket prepared by Simpson showed signs of wear at the close of play, and on several occasions the bowlers were able to make the ball rear to a very uncomfortable height.

Cheshire had the advantage of first knock, but it could not be said that their batting was anything out of the ordinary. With the exception of H. W. Hodgson, the Cheshire skipper, the other displays were rather straggle. Altogether Hodgson occupied the wicket for two hours, and his 60 was free from blemish. He hit six 4's and the majority of his runs were made in front of the wicket, the placing through the covers being marked with accuracy. Before lunch, runs came very slowly, but after L. N. Jones, the Boughton Hall amateur, infused some life into the proceedings by laying on the wood to a merry tune. White, one of the initial batsmen, occupied 60 minutes in making 14, and Wilson the Macclesfield professional, hit hard for half an hour for his 27. Lancashire tried seven bowlers, and Latchford and Holroyd came out with the best bowling figures. A feature of the Lancashire fielding was the very fine work of Farrimond, who caught four, stumped one, and did not give away a single extra.

Lancashire's Straggle Batting.

Lancashire opened their innings with Paynter and Booth against the deliveries of Dennis and Wilson. Paynter was the hero of double century innings against Notts 2nd. It was a disastrous start, for Booth and Horridge were both back in the pavilion with the score at 16, Dennis being the destructive agent. The batsmen were never at ease, for whilst Wilson maintained an accurate length, Dennis was treated with respect, many balls on the off side being allowed to go by untouched. Malcolm Taylor was out to a fine catch by McEntyre. Paynter sorted out the right ball to hit and scored well all round the wicket, and he received valuable assistance from the Lancashire captain, Higson, who, after starting slowly, opened out his shoulders in the last quarter of an hour. He was out to the last ball of the day, Paynter being undecated with 55 to his credit. The Cheshire fielding was not of a high standard, for Paynter had three "lives." H. R. Butterworth is the Cambridge player who graduated at Rydal House.

SECOND DAY.

Lancashire Save the Match.

There was an exciting finish to the game on Thursday, for after Cheshire had appeared to have the match in their grasp, the last pair, Hodgson and Holroyd, stayed together for half an hour, and were undecated at the close. Cheshire took advantage of the extra half hour. The brightest cricket of the day was seen after lunch when L. N. Jones and J. K. Edmondson stayed together for 40 minutes, the first-named hitting seven fours in his 62. It was the most refreshing cricket of the match. Lancashire certainly owe much to the fine displays by Paynter, for he was certainly the best of both innings, and his partnership with Farrimond had much to do with foiling Cheshire, avenging their defeat at Oton in the first meeting, when Lancashire took advantage of the extra half hour to bring about a successful issue. Cheshire missed two chances in the last half hour.

ST. HELENS v. WARRINGTON.

ANOTHER DRAWN GAME.

C. BILSBORROW'S BRIGHT INNINGS.

The return match between these old South-West Lancashire rivals is usually the medium for drawing a large number of spectators to the headquarters of the St. Helens club, and on Saturday there was no exception to the rule, for there are many shady places round the ground which, in the broiling heat of Saturday, were very acceptable. It was, on the other hand, a trying experience for the men "in the open," and Warrington had the worse of matters when Millington lost the toss, for two and a half hours leather hunting under such conditions did not inspire confidence when it came the visitors' turn to wield the willow. The wicket appeared to contain a bagful of runs, but there were cases when the ball cut through in amazing fashion.

St. Helens opened with H. Foreman and Dempsey against the bowling of A. Woolley and W. Berry. The start was

very promising for the visitors, for with only eight runs on the score sheet, Woolley got Foreman caught at extra cover, making way for C. A. Hunter. The greatest respect was shown for the bowling, and no risks were taken, the fielding also being very close. At 31, Gibson took the ball from Berry, but the change was appreciated by the batsmen, for the new bowler was dispatched to the confines by Dempsey. At 44, Hunter was run out, and nine runs later Woolley met with a double success, for Crooks was caught at the wicket, the lanky League full-back not having troubled the scorers, whilst a confident appeal by Woolley against Dempsey for obstruction went against the professional. Four wickets were down for 53, which was a satisfactory position for the visitors. A. Wilson and E. Grime were now associated, and the first-named exhibiting splendid enterprise, caused the bowling changes to be again rung. Berry came back at 70, and 11 runs later got Grime caught in the slips by Woolley, this being a brilliant catch. Wilson continued to hit hard and often, and with Whittaker trying to emulate his partner, Gibson took the ball from Woolley, and with his second delivery deceived Whittaker with the flight, so that six men were out for 99.

The Tail Wags.

Warrington's prospects again rose when B. Brooks was bowled by an extra fast one from Percy Tipping at 106, but when F. Briggs joined Wilson another useful stand was made. Runs came more freely at this juncture than at any previous period, and it was not until Gibson returned to the attack that a separation was effected, Woolley again bringing off a capital catch in the slips to dispose of Briggs for a useful 19. Millington, who tried his hand for the first time at 135, got Pearson playing forward, and afforded Bilsborrow an opportunity to develop his skill behind the wicket. It was generally thought that the end was now very near, but J. Somerfit did not belie his name, for he was very fit on such a broiling hot day, and during half an hour's stay helped Wilson to put

on 60 runs. Wilson completed his half-century, and boundary strokes continuing to be the order. Woolley came back at 180, and 16 runs later bowled the whipper-in. Wilson had occupied the wicket an hour and a half, and his 70 included 11 fours. Somerfit hit five fours.

Good Opening—Three Disasters.

Warrington started their task at 62 with A. E. Trevarthen and T. C. Lunt, against the bowling of H. Pearson and B. Brooks. It was a sensational start, for in thirteen minutes Trevarthen made 26, hitting five brilliant fours when he was out to a fine catch at point by Brooks. Lunt had meanwhile left at 23, being leg before to Pearson, whilst Trevarthen left at 32. Simpson and T. C. Knowles left at 35 and 38 respectively, so that the visitors appeared to be in a parlous state. However, with C. Bilsborrow and A. Woolley together, the pair stayed together twenty minutes before Hunter, who had relieved Brooks, accepted a return from Woolley, five wickets being down for 69. The home side appeared now to have an outside chance, but on J. Duckworth joining the Warrington stumper all ideas of victory vanished into thin air, for the batsmen played sound cricket, and it was always obvious that a drawn game would accrue. Bilsborrow, in particular, was very sound, and only sorted the correct ball to take liberties with. Bowling changes were made frequently, but the batsmen continued the even tenor of their way, this partnership lasting forty minutes before Bilsborrow was bowled by a shooter from Pearson. P. Tipping also defended well for twenty minutes, and helped Duckworth to take the score to 115 before Pearson broke through his defence. W. Gibson came next, and his resolute battling was quite a feature. In nineteen minutes he made 26, and his 50 forus, helping Duckworth to take the aggregate to 156 without further loss, stumps being drawn at 7.45. Duckworth's innings cannot be too highly commended. GREAT DAY FOR C. FORD.

Fine Batting and Bowling Performances.

C. Ford, who captained the Warrington team at Arpley on Saturday, in the return engagement, with always look back upon the match as one of his best achievements, for he was the main factor in bringing about a satisfactory issue in the two chief departments, batting and bowling. In the first match this season the Warringtonians were beaten by a narrow margin, so that Saturday's victory was very meritorious. The visitors batted first, and on the apparently good wicket they made a very poor start against the deliveries of T. Hazlehurst and Ford two wickets being down with only a single on the score sheet, whilst at 10 and 13 the first and fourth batsmen were both in the pavilion, each bowler having divided the wickets. Then came a short stand by A. Platt and A. Burrows. The bowling continued to be of a high standard, whilst the fielding was very close, with the result that the rate of scoring was slow. At 31 a smart piece of stumping by young Duckworth got rid of Platt. Pleasants tried forcing tactics until his career was cut short by Ford at 44. It was Burrows who showed mastery over the attack, though the majority of the runs were made by the aid of singles. Twenty runs were added

for the sixth wicket, and H. Fryer helped Burrows to carry the total to 109, when the innings closed. Bolton, who had relieved Hazlehurst, getting Fryer leg before, leaving Burrows to carry out his bat for 31. Ford had seven wickets for 50.

Good Start, Collapse and Rally.

R. Baker and F. N. White gave the home side a good send-off when they put on 42 for the first wicket. Both batsmen made

good shots all round the wicket. White was the first to leave at 42 but, following his dismissal, matters did not go at all well for the Arpley men, and two wickets fell at 61, and the fourth and fifth at 61 and 62. With C. Ford and J. Duckworth as partners, the attack was mastered, and the St. Helens aggregate was speedily overhauled. The young batsman Duckworth emulated his captain in making many fine strokes and they had the satisfaction of hitting off the runs. Both played enterprising cricket. At the close, Warrington
