

HAPPENINGS ON THE LOCAL PITCHES REVIEWED.

While Saturday's local club cricket had its full complement of matches, centuries were somewhat a rarity, and one achieved by H. Smith—for Loscoe Colliery against Cinderhill Colliery—is notable for the fact that it was a "not out."

F. Winter (Lewison) and W. R. Smith (Forman's Athletic) got within a couple of runs of three figures, and B. Walker (Radcliffe) was only seven short. Whilst H. Sharman (Emmanuel) and D. Burton (Cotgrave) with 85 and 80 respectively made useful contributions towards their sides' totals.

The wickets generally appear to have been in favour of bowlers, for some remarkable achievements were accomplished with the ball in all grades of club cricket. Outstanding returns are those of D. Wilson (Ruddington II.), who, playing against Alfred-street Methodists, captured ten wickets for 27 runs. A Butler (Bridgeway Hall) skittled out eight of Halifax place Mission's batsmen at the cost of seven runs, whilst F. Daft (Bingham), living up to a great name, took eight of the Christ Church club's wickets for 16.

There were many other amazing performances on the part of bowlers in the minor clubs, all of which are recorded in our Bowling Honours List.

OLD RIVALS' CLOSE GAME.

One of the most piquant matches amongst those of the local senior clubs was that between the old rivals, Notts and Forest Amateurs, which took place on the Loughborough-road Ground. Incidentally, the rival captains were amateurs who have captained the County XI—Dr. G. O. Gaud and Lionel Kirk. Neither was the top scorer of his side, but they respectively made useful totals of 25 and 23. Notts, Amateurs, won by thirty runs, the bowling of D. and W. Parly-Bland largely contributing to this success.

Radcliffe, with 205 for seven wickets (towards which H. Walker compiled 95), had a runaway victory over Thomas Adams Ltd., whose innings closed at 58.

A great fight was made by Notts, Unity to overtake Notts, Harrington's total of 112, and excitement was tense when the visitors failed by just seven runs.

Another fine sporting finish was witnessed in the clash between Carrington Robin Hood and Gedding Colliery, the former with 117 winning by nine runs.

TWO VERY SMALL TOTALS.

The day's performances were not without their amusing phases. Cotgrave vanquished their neighbours, Cropwell Bishop, by 142—the Cropwell men being dismissed for 16, six of them with "ducks." It was in this match that W. Hickling wrought havoc with the ball, taking seven wickets for six runs, his successes including the hat-trick.

Carlton Athletic fared even worse at the hands of Gunthorpe. The latter put up 105, and then despatched their opponents for 10—eight of the batsmen being out before they had scored. Their top "scorer" was "Mr. Extras" with five, while R. Amos and H. Morris each got a couple!

Percy Mills, the young Notts County full-back, apparently is a smart cricketer, for, playing for Shelton Mechanics B against Nottingham Gas Sports Club, he scored 29 runs and captured six wickets for 25 runs.

FEATURES OF SATURDAY'S CRICKET ON THE LOCAL PITCHES.

Fortunately for local club cricket and its devotees the clouds which began to gather towards late afternoon on Saturday did not disburse themselves of the threatened rain until after stumps had been drawn for the day, and a full afternoon's cricket throughout the district produced many good matches, though, once again, it was more of a bowler's day than one for the wielders of the willow.

That, at any rate, is the impression given by a dispassionate survey of the scoring. Only two batsmen succeeded in topping the century, these being W. Palmer, a Stanton player, who, in a Border League match against Cinderhill succeeded in knocking up no less than 123—a very sound and useful performance which none of his colleagues in the eleven came near, the next highest scorer getting only 42; the side knocked up 265 and then got Cinderhill, who were playing on their own ground, out for 94. The other "centurian"

was R. Ellis, who scored 107 for Sutton Congregational against Weldon and Wilkinson's.

One game that deserves special mention was that played at Hucknall between Hucknall C.C. and Newstead Colliery. The visiting eleven went in first to bat, and with the aid of C. W. Jackson (57), M. Scrimshaw (57), F. Shepherd (50), H. Smith (44), and F. Stocks (38)—all well played innings—had put 265 on the board when they decided to declare, seven wickets then having been lost. They then dismissed Hucknall for 82, thus securing a comfortable victory.

Rivalry between Nottingham and Leicester is as keen in the realm of sport as it is in that of business and municipal matters, and there was a dour struggle at Aylestone Park between Leicester Ivanhoe and Forest Amateurs. The Notts. men opened the batting and succeeded in amassing 347 for eight wickets before declaring, the highest individual scorer being A. Baxter with 89. Marshall, one of the opening pair, would prob-

ably have considerably bettered his contribution of 32 had he not had the misfortune to be run out. There was only time for eight of the Ivanhoe men to bat before the match had to be left drawn with the Leicester score standing at 132.

Pleasley Works 212 for nine against Allen, Solly and Company, was another creditable performance.

The premier bowling feat was H. Vickers' nine wickets for six runs in a game between Ashwell's and High-street Baptists, though there were some half-a-dozen other bowlers who have eight scalps to their credit, and only two of these had more than 20 runs scored off them.

One match in which the bowlers had it all their own way was that played at Oxtou between the village eleven and The Ramblers. Oxtou, who went in first and made but 77, their highest scorer notching but 21. The Ramblers did even worse, being dismissed in their turn for 45, including extras. There were four "ducks" and two "ones."

LOCAL BOWLER TAKES NINE WICKETS FOR FIFTEEN RUNS.

Cricketers whose opportunity to indulge, to any extent, in their favourite pastime is confined very largely to Saturday afternoon, have certainly had little cause to complain of the interference of the weather with their sport this season, and the run of good luck they are enjoying was not broken last Saturday afternoon. Although there was a somewhat searching wind, the sun shone consistently.

There were some singularly meritorious bowling performances, the honours list, so far as the club cricket recorded on this page is concerned, being headed by a Boots II. player named J. Morley, who gained nine wickets at the expense of but 15 runs, an average of less than 2 runs per wicket.

On the whole it would seem to

have been a batsman's day. The wielders of the willow lashed out with a will, and two players, E. Foster, of Notts. Harrington second string, and W. H. Price, of Forest Amateurs, topped the century. Curiously enough, their scores were both equal, each player knocking up 113. Price, however, was stumped, the other player having the satisfaction of seeing the words "Not out" against his name when his side's innings came to an end.

Two matches provided intensely exciting finishes. Oxted, despite the fact that there were four "ducks" in their total, beating Thomas Adams by 130 to 129, and Annesley Park defeating Notts. Unity by 34 runs, as against the 33 scored by their opponents. This match was a bowlers' affair from the beginning to end, not

a player in either of the elevens having a higher score than 11, except one, and he was on the losing side!

Two redoubtable opponents met in Players Athletic and Boots Athletic, the game being played on the Aspley-lane ground. The home eleven batted first, and contributed a very useful 213 for 6 wickets (of which R. W. Tinson contributed 89 before being caught by Walker) before declaring, and then Boots made 168 for the loss of nine wickets, their highest scorer being A. Walker, who was caught when his total had reached 44.

Altogether 33 players made 50 or more runs in the matches summarised herewith, and 11 of these carried their bats. One bowler, as already mentioned, had 9 "scalps" to his credit; four took 8, three 7, and no less than sixteen 6 apiece.

CENTURY BY PAYNTER.

PAYNTER'S TWO HUNDREDS.

Whatever may have been the case at Trent Bridge when the Notts. senior eleven met Yorkshire, the spectators at Titchfield Park, Hucknall, yesterday, where the home county's second eleven entertained Lancashire II. under the auspices of the Minor Counties Championship, could not advance any criticism on the ground that scoring was slow.

Visitors to Hucknall yesterday must have enjoyed the cricket furnished by the Minor Counties fixture between Notts. II. and Lancashire II. even more than they did on Wednesday, as in the course of the seven hours over which play extended twenty wickets fell and 485 runs were scored.

On the contrary, they were regaled with a capital day's cricket, some excellent batting, good bowling, and keen fielding.

Incidentally too, there was an exciting tussle prior to lunch for the first innings points, and another struggle at the finish when the optional half-hour was utilised, in the hope of arriving at a definite result. When stumps were pulled up, and the match left drawn, the home county were credited with five points for a first innings' advantage, and with four wickets in hand required 20 to secure victory outright.

Credit for the good bowling went to Notts., who, after losing the toss, dismissed their opponents without any assistance from a plumb wicket in a trifle over three and a half hours for 266 runs. In the main, too, the batting honours were theirs, as at the close they were but 90 behind with nine wickets to fall.

The feature of the morning's play was the startling collapse of Notts., who overnight had drawn to within 90 of their opponents' total and had only one man out. Upon the resumption Shipston and Harris were continuing a partnership which had realised 137, but for the addition of four, the former still requiring six to complete his hundred, was bowled by a ball which turned in from the leg and hit the off-stump. Without making a mistake of any sort, Shipston by some fine on and off driving, and square cutting, hit twelve 4's.

The only laurels that went to the visitors were earned by Paynter, Chadwick, and Rushton, the first-named, a left hander, except for one very difficult chance, compiling a faultless 115 out of 231, and by some superb off and on-driving claiming no fewer than nineteen 4's.

Harris soon followed him, caught at mid-off for a valuable 67, which included eight boundaries, and then the attack of Holdroyd and Horridge worked so destructively that six more wickets fell for 54 runs.

When he and Parkinson led off by scoring 56 for the first wicket Lancashire doubtless felt well satisfied, but the fact that three more batsmen passed out for an additional 43 vastly altered the position, and six for 153 at the luncheon adjournment was not exactly encouraging. In the meantime, however, Paynter had found a valuable ally in Chadwick, who, when bowled by Copley, following the interval, had made 41 of the 77 put on for the seventh wicket, and obtained seven 4's.

Rushton, too, who filled the breach, provided an unpleasant surprise for the home attack, staying while Paynter reached a hundred in twenty minutes over two hours, and when the left-hander's fine innings was terminated by a catch at mid-off, hitting out with such right goodwill that the 34 to his account embraced three 6's and as many 4's. Of the others only Elliott offered serious trouble.

As an outcome, Notts. needed 10 to top Lancashire's total when Winrow, the last man, joined Wheat. By an extremely plucky stand which evoked much applause, the pair added 20 before Winrow was bowled.

Starting their reply with just under two and a half hours in which to bat, Notts. lost George Gunn, junior, at 39, bowled by a yorker, but the combination of Shipston and Harris subsequently proved invulnerable. Despite the efforts of eight different bowlers to separate them, the pair were each credited with an individual 50 at the end of ninety minutes, and at the close had put on 137 without giving a semblance of a chance. Score:—

Going in a second time the visitors lost two wickets for 4 runs, both to Bland, and four for 63, but Paynter capped his performance on Monday by scoring a second century—103 out of 212, without giving a semblance of a chance. In all he hit thirteen 4's during his stay of two and a quarter hours, and with Taylor, whose 71 not out, included four 6's and eight 4's, put on 124 for the fifth wicket before being caught behind the stumps. Lancashire declared at 212 for five.

MINOR COUNTIES CRICKET.

BENEFICIARE SCORES A CENTURY.

GOOD DISPLAY BY FLINT.

The Minor Counties championship match between Notts. II. and Leicestershire II., which opened at Trent Bridge yesterday, was set apart as a benefit for W. A. Flint, the well-known cricketer and footballer, who played for the county from 1919 until last year, scoring an aggregate of over 3,000 runs (including three centuries) and taking 220 wickets.
