

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP
Wilts v. Surrey II.

Batting first at the Oval on Tuesday, Surrey's second team put up a tremendous score of 463 for 9 wickets, thanks mainly to Wilson, who scored 193, and J. G. O'Gorman with 79. The bowling honours went to Smith (J.), of Wiltshire, who took no less than seven wickets. Wiltshire replied with 224, and had to follow on, but their score would have been very meagre but for a heroic innings by W. Lowell Hewitt, who hit hard and often for 69. Only two of the side failed to get into double figures, but the score, useful enough against a moderate side, was not good enough in comparison with Surrey's huge total. Wiltshire did much better in the second innings, for E. H. F. Fuller made a splendid not out century of 114, and was associated with A. E. Waters in a big partnership, the latter making 62. Wiltshire had scored 280 for four wickets at the close of play.

MELKSHAM v. TROWBRIDGE.

These old rivals, of over 50 years standing, met at Melksham on Saturday. The first match in which the writer of this report took part was played on the Hilperton Road ground, Trowbridge, in 1878. F. W. Stancomb played in that game and he captained the Trowbridge team on Saturday. Melksham won a remarkable victory in 1878 by 132 runs to 123. It is noteworthy that so far as is known only four of the players in that match are still alive—F. W. Stancomb, Capt. A. J. G. Stancomb, W. H. House of Melksham, and W. Robinson, who is now an estate agent in Northamptonshire.

Saturday's game was chiefly notable for some smart wicket-keeping and two fine bowling performances. W. Lovell Hewitt for Trowbridge, and R. A. C. Forrester for Melksham, whose style and pace are very similar. Each took 8 wickets, the former for 47 and the latter for 52. B. Read, Melksham's wicket-keeper, assisted the latter very considerably by making five grand catches at the wickets, and he allowed no straight ball to pass him, the only Trowbridge extras being three wides. In batting Melksham were better than Trowbridge. B. Lidbury was top scorer with 40, while R. Salter and C. W. Hurn, both bowled by Lovell Hewitt, batted skilfully. A. Salter and J. Hurn added useful contributions. For Trowbridge W. Lovell Hewitt made some fine strokes in his 63. But for him the victors would have tarred badly, as only Payne and Hullcoop, of the rest, got into double figures. A regrettable accident to G. A. Laverton deprived Trowbridge of his services about an hour after the game started. Stopping to field a ball he secured a muscle in his thigh and had to retire. The injury will probably keep him out of the field for some weeks. Both sides were guilty of dropping catches, bad light and the hard ground deceiving them in the flight of the ball, but D. Ferris made a spectacular one-handed catch to get rid of Read. Scores:—

WILTSHIRE BEATS BERKSHIRE.

TEN WICKET MARGIN.

The last match of the Wiltshire Cricket Week at Bemerton concluded on Thursday, when Wiltshire won a ten-wicket victory over Berkshire.

Weather threatened when the match opened, and Berkshire, winning the toss, went to the wickets, represented by the Hon. R. F. J. Remnant and D. W. Stokes. C. Awdry and Smith (J.) began the Wiltshire bowling. Both batsmen opened cautiously. In the first three overs only three singles were scored. Half an hour had elapsed when 20 was sent up. With four runs added, Remnant gave a sharp chance in the slips, but was missed. This did not appear to perturb him, and in the next few minutes he drove Smith to the boundary twice. The first bowling change was made with the score at 36, when Butler relieved Smith. Runs came slowly, and 50 had not been registered after an hour's play. Stokes was dismissed by C. Awdry, after scoring 11, which he had taken 65 minutes to compile, and Remnant was sent back five minutes later, with the total at 49. Fifty was hoisted after an hour and twenty minutes. With Turner and Dempsey at the wickets, play brightened considerably. The former sent his third ball from Smith for three, and in the next over put Awdry to boundary. The partnership, however, did not last. Dempsey was smartly caught by R. Awdry behind the wicket. The incoming batsman, the Rev. Sholto Douglas, after hitting a four and a couple of singles, was caught cleverly by J. Smith, who was full length on the ground. Turner, added only six runs after lunch, when he was caught by FitzGerald off C. Awdry. Human then joined Woodburn, the score standing at 108 for five wickets. With 12 runs added, Woodburn was caught, and R. Palmer, who followed, was clean bowled by the first ball from C. Awdry. The remaining batsmen were soon disposed of, the innings closing for a total of 139. C. Awdry bowled without a break throughout the innings, and took seven wickets for 62 runs.

Wiltshire responded with a fine innings, and at the end of the day's play had scored 221 for seven wickets. Colonel R. W. Awdry made 60, and at the close of play C. E. Awdry had 50 to his credit and still held the bat. When play was resumed on Thursday morning the remainder of the Wiltshire wickets were disposed of in about 20 minutes for the addition of only 40 runs. Of these, C. E. Awdry made an addition of five to his over-night score, and was still not out. Wiltshire's score was thus carried to 261, which gave them a first innings lead of 122.

Remnant and Stokes then opened Berkshire's second innings, and started with deadly earnestness. That they did not like the bowling of C. Awdry and Smith (J.) was shown by the fact that they scored only three runs in the first twenty minutes. Remnant put a ball from Awdry to the boundary, but the same bowler collared his wicket with the next delivery. Turner joined Stokes, and both showed stubborn resistance, but in this respect the Berkshire batsmen were outshone by Human, who was not out for 64, the innings producing 164. This left Wiltshire with only 42 to get to win. Sending G. S. Butler and E. H. F. Fuller to the wickets, the Moonrakers got what they wanted without the fall of a wicket, their two batsmen making 28 and 13 (not out) respectively. Scores:—

ALL-ROUND WILTSHIRE SPORTSMAN.

Represented his County at Football,
Cricket, Hockey and Golf

MR. G. J. HATHAWAY.

The name of Mr. G. J. Hathaway, of Chippenham, is known throughout the town and county in connection with sport, but it may not be generally known that this popular sportsman has represented his county at four different games—football, cricket, hockey, and golf. This must be a unique record, at any rate, so far as Wiltshire is concerned, and it is interesting to note that at the present time Mr. Hathaway is serving on the ruling bodies of football, cricket, golf, athletics, and in connection with the National Playing Fields Association in the county.

Mr. Hathaway is a native of Chippenham, and was educated at the now defunct Bath College. Leaving there in December, 1888, for some time he played Rugby for the Bath Club, under the captaincy of the international, Frank Soane. He then became associated with the Chippenham Town Football Club, playing in either of the wing half positions, but chiefly on the left.

Captain of Chippenham Town.

For some time, while still a player, he acted as hon. secretary to the club, and for a number of years he captained the team. To him fell the honour of receiving the Wilts Senior Cup, when Chippenham Town won it for the first time, in the season 1899-1900. He also assisted Trowbridge, at the time when George, the goalkeeper, who afterwards earned fame with Aston Villa, captained the West Wilts side, and he also won a Wilts Cup medal when with Trowbridge.

Mr. Hathaway played on numerous occasions for the county football team at left half, captaining the side for a considerable period. His initial appearance for the Moonrakers was against Somerset, in the first match played on the present Bath City ground at Lambridge, the brothers Palafret being in the Somerset side. On occasions also he assisted the old Chippenham United Club.

Mr. Hathaway has probably been associated with the Wiltshire Football Association for a longer period than any present member, his connection with that body dating from about 1890.

At that time the association was comprised of a representative of each club, and as secretary, Mr. Hathaway became the representative of Chippenham Town. Later, for three years, he was the hon. secretary and treasurer of the association, during which time the number of affiliated clubs rose from 28 to 70.

Wilts F.A. Council.

At his suggestion during his term of office, steps were taken to form the Council of the Association, as it is at present, independent of the clubs so far as representation is concerned.

The first committee so to be formed consisted of Mr. Hathaway, Mr. J. F. King (Devizes), Mr. H. G. Pinfield (Chippenham), Mr. Horace Smith (Swindon), Mr. F. W. Stancomb (Trowbridge), Mr. Brown (Bradford), and the Rev. Welch (Warminster). Of these only Mr. Hathaway and Mr. Pinfield are still connected with the association.

On relinquishing the secretaryship Mr. Hathaway retained the treasure-ship, an office he has held ever since. For something like 39 years, therefore, he has been a member, in one capacity or another, of the county ruling body.

A keen cricketer, Mr. Hathaway captained the Chippenham Town Club for about 15 years from the time when they played in the Ivy Fields, and when Chippenham could field a strong team. His active participation in the summer game ended at about 1912. Of this club also he was secretary for a number of years, and more recently he has filled the office of chairman. For several seasons he was a member of the Wilts County cricket eleven, under A. M. Miller, being a useful bat, and a very smart field.

Golf and Hockey.

At the end of his services at cricket Mr. Hathaway joined the Chippenham Golf Club, of which he was captain for 12 or 15 years, until last year, when holding the view it would be better for the club if such honours went round, he resigned. He was then appointed as hon. secretary in succession to Mr. A. F. Cross, who had left the town. He has also represented Wiltshire at golf.

In spite of the claims of football Mr. Hathaway found time to indulge in hockey, playing left half as in football, and on one occasion he played for Wiltshire against Somerset.

In his young days his prowess as a runner was well known in the district, his favourite distance being 120 yards, and he won many prizes at local race meetings. The recent recovery of a gold watch and chain, which he won at a Frome sports meeting, with an inscribed Wilts Cup medal attached,

Chippenham Sports Club, which started from the Cricket Club, and now comprises cricket, football, hockey, tennis, bowls, and croquet. For some time he was its secretary, and is now the chairman, to which position he was appointed on his giving up cricket.

He is also the president of the Chippenham Referees' Association, and a member of the Management Committee of the Chippenham and District League and Hospital Cup competition.

It is not, therefore, surprising to find one of Mr. Hathaway's sons, although only 18 years of age, making a name for himself in sport. Mr. Michael Hathaway, thanks to the training received at Marlborough College, has already earned his place in the Wilts county hockey team, and in the past two seasons has played for the West of England in international trials. There are many who believe his international cap will not long be delayed. Very fast, his speed stands him in good stead on the extreme left wing. He can also put up a fine game at Soccer on the opposite flank, and is no mean exponent of the handling code. At cricket he plays for the Chippenham Town club, and while he is a promising batsman, he excels in the field.



after they had been stolen from his house over 30 years ago and had remained hidden in a hollow tree ever since, will be remembered.

For several years now he has been on the Council of the Wiltshire Amateur Athletic Association, being chairman last year. In his younger days, too, he attained to no small degree of proficiency at swimming and water polo.
