

KENT II v. WILTSHIRE

This match at St. Lawrence, Canterbury, resulted in a draw. Wiltshire made a first innings lead. There was no play on the first day (Tuesday). Wiltshire, who had won the toss, elected to bat first on Wednesday on a slow wicket which was drying fast. Fuller and Nash opened against the two fast bowlers, Blunden and Ashwell, and in the latter's first over Nash was smartly caught by Lovett, the score being 2. A few overs later Blunden was successful in getting Lovell-Hewitt at 27. Bateman, who had replaced Ashwell at the pavilion end, dismissed Fuller, who gave an easy catch to mid-off, his innings of 29 having lasted 70 minutes.
