**MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.**

**SURREY 2nd XI. v. WILTSHIRE.**

Playing at the Oval on Saturday and Monday against Surrey Second Eleven, Wiltshire lost on the first innings by 203 runs. Batting first, Wiltshire lost their first two wickets for seven runs only. E. M. Nash (26) and J. A. Wheeler (26) took the score to 45 for the fall of the third wicket, but the next two fell at 67, the sixth and seventh at 89, the eighth at 86, and the ninth at 103, the last three players doing comparatively well. Watts bowled extremely well for Surrey, taking six wickets for 49 runs.

The opening pair, I. Mobey and McMurray, put the side in a very strong position, putting on 98 for the first wicket, at which point the latter was caught for 41. Mobey went on to make a fine century, which, together with that by W. T. Cook, was a feature of the game. The second wicket fell at 119, but the next partnership produced 117 runs, while 302 were on the board for the loss of only five wickets. The sixth fell without addition, and the remaining batsmen were able to do little against the bowling of the Smith brothers, Smith (W.) taking five wickets for 74 runs and Smith (J.) four for 75.

Wiltshire gave a much advanced display in their second innings, no player failing to score, and although E. H. F. Fuller was dismissed with the score at 88, E. M. Nash and W. Lovell-Hewitt added 126 before they were parted, while the following batsmen did so well that the complete total was 355. Watts again took most of the wickets (five for 118).

Surrey were set to get 153 runs for victory, and when time came had scored 89 without loss.

**DEVIZES PLAYER'S CENTURY.**

Playing at home on Saturday to the Swindon Central Mission, Devizes gained their first victory of the season by a comfortable margin, beating 138 runs ahead with four wickets in hand at the close of play, the outstanding feature of the game being a splendid century by W. H. Moncrieffe for Devizes. Swindon batted first and began badly, four batsmen being disposed of for only 23 runs. Later, however, there was an improvement, the ninth wicket pair making a valuable stand, and the innings closed at 111. Devizes lost four wickets for 72 when Moncrieffe joined J. E. Hopkins, which pair took the score to 237 before the next wicket fell. Hopkins then being bowled for 56, which included eight 4's. Moncrieffe continued to bat brilliantly, being caught in the last over of the day for 113, which he made in only 63 minutes without having given a chance. He hit one six and fifteen 4's.

**WILTS v. SURREY 2nd XI.**

There was a good crowd at the ground on Monday, when Wiltshire opposed Surrey 2nd XI in the Minor Counties Championship. The weather was ideal, and the wicket in perfect condition. Surrey took first knock, and Mobey and Wilson opened strongly, and, although their batting was not without blemish, they were still together with 70 on the board. Mobey was then out lbw to Smith (W.). Twelve runs later Wilson was bowled by Sydee, the young Wiltshire left-hander. With Whitfield and Cook, the Surrey skipper, together, the century was passed, but at 101 Cook was beautifully taken by Lloyd at mid-on, off Smith (W.). R. W. de K. Winlaw, the Cambridge "blue," the incoming batsman, should have been dismissed before he had scored, but he was badly missed by C. Awdry in the slips. At lunch time, Surrey had scored 111 for the loss of three wickets. In the first over after lunch Awdry atoned for his earlier mistake by taking Whitfield in the slips off Smith (J.), there being no addition to the score. The brothers Smith pegged the batsmen down, and runs came slowly. Smith (J.) was twice "no balled," and Skipper Awdry replaced him with Sydee, who met with success straight away, Fishlock paying on with the score at 122. A splendid catch by Smith (J.) off his brother's bowling got rid of Winlaw at 130, but, with Maxwell and Parker together, the rate of scoring increased, and a number of boundaries were registered. With the score at 154, Parker sustained a confident appeal when he appeared to snick one into Nash's hands, but three runs later Maxwell skied a ball from Smith (W.), and was caught by Col. Awdry. The next wicket fell at 175, smart running between the wickets having helped the score along. Parker then snicked one from Smith (J.) behind the wicket, and Nash could not hold it, but C. Awdry was on the mark and made a sure catch. Pierpoint, the new batsman, only stayed long enough to make one, Nash holding a good catch behind the wicket. Owen and Buss took the score over the 200 mark, both players having a go to good effect. Buss got his half-century in good time, and a complete change of bowling was without effect, although the story may have been different had the change come earlier. They had carried the score from 176 to 222, a stand of 96, when Owen was caught by C. E. Awdry, Buss carrying his bat for 56, having hit eleven hours. The crowd certainly enjoyed this stand.

Tea was then taken, after which Butler and Nash opened for the home county against the howling of Parker and Maxwell. Runs came at the rate of one a minute, and 30 were on the board in half an hour, Nash scoring well on the leg side. With the score at 45 Buss took the ball, and bowling from the bottom end got Butler with the third ball of his first over. A magnificent catch by Maxwell off his own bowling cut short a likely looking innings by C. E. Awdry, the telegraph board reading 76-2-13. Nash got his individual 50 a few seconds later, and his performance was duly recognised by the crowd. He had been batting an hour and five minutes. The hundred was signalled when Wilts had been batting just under the hour and a half. At 121 Lovell-Hewitt was caught in the slips by Owen off Parker, the partnership having produced 49 runs. With the score at 136, Nash played all round one from Parker and was clean bowled when he seemed set for a century. His invaluable 86 included twelve fours. When stumps were drawn Wilts were 122 runs behind with six wickets in hand.

When the match was resumed on Tuesday the weather was a good deal cooler. Lloyd and Wheeler, the not out batsmen, were soon parted, Wheeler being out lbw to Owen when he had scored 14. Lloyd continued to bat confidently but could find no one to stay with him until the fall of the seventh wicket, when he was joined by Smith (J.). The score then mounted steadily, and it seemed likely that the Surrey total would be passed. At 236, however, Lloyd was caught, having contributed a valuable 56. Maxwell, with his next ball, got Smith caught. The last two batsmen only added four runs, and the whole side was out for 240.

Surrey batted again with a lead of 22, and at lunch time they had 45 on the board for the loss of one wicket. Mobey was the batsman to lose his wicket when he had scored 24, but he should have been dismissed for a "duck," C. E. Awdry dropping an easy chance. After lunch, Wilson, a stylish and forceful bat, with Whitfield as his partner, went for the bowling, and the score mounted rapidly. Wilson reached his individual 50 with a fine drive for four. Despite frequent bowling changes, in eight scoring shots he registered six fours, four boundaries coming in succession. His innings came to a close when he had made 70, Wheeler taking a marvellous catch right on the boundary. He had hit 13 fours. The score then stood at 142, and two runs later Cook was caught behind the wicket by Nash before he had scored. Whitfield was joined by Winlaw and continued to bat well, scoring with good shots all round the wicket. His drives through the covers and past mid-on were beautifully executed and he tucked a number of late cuts through the "gully," despite keen fielding. The 200 was signalled after two and a quarter hours' batting and the pair were then still together. They had taken the score to 221 when Whitfield was caught and bowled by Butler. He had scored 84, including 11 fours and a number of threes. With a declaration obvious, the batsmen proceeded to hit out, and runs came quickly. The innings was declared closed when Surrey had scored 278 for the loss of four wickets. Winlaw carrying his bat bat for 60. Wiltshire were left with 301 to get to win.

Batting a second time, Wilts started disastrously, losing Butler with only five runs on

the board. With the idea of saving the game, the remaining batsmen sat on the splice, and the cricket became very dull. The game fizzled out at 6.30, with Surrey the winners on the first innings. Scores:—

**WILTS v. DORSET.**

Dorset, fresh from their victory over Cornwall on Tuesday, opposed Wiltshire in the last two-day game of the Salisbury cricket week on Wednesday and Thursday. They won the toss and decided to bat. They fared disastrously, and in an hour and a quarter's play had lost seven wickets for 54 runs. The Wilts bowlers were on top, and with the Dorset batsmen not having the best of luck there was an unexpected collapse. Busk was caught before a run had been scored, and then came a procession, Brockway, White, Tovey, Pawle, Morres and Elderton all being dismissed cheaply, with Smith (J.) and C. Awdry claiming the wickets. Tindall, the Oxford "blue," who went in at the fall of the first wicket, was the only bat to get on top of the bowling, and he and Jowett, who went in when seven wickets were down for 54, were associated in the only stand. This produced 39 runs. When 93 runs had been made, Jowett was caught, Lovell-Hewitt holding a skier off Smith's bowling. Three runs later, Tindall, in attempting a chancy run, with a view to securing the bowling, was run out. He was missed in the gully before he had scored and again at nine. He had collected an invaluable 59, and had hit one six and ten fours. Bastable, the last man in, got a lucky four to send the hundred up, but Smith (J.) bowled him with his next ball, and the innings closed at lunch time, Dorset being out for 101.

Butler and Nash opened for Wilts, and off Tindall's third ball Nash was dropped at mid-off before he had scored. The chance was a "dolly," and should have been held. He did not survive long, however, for, with the score at 21, he asked another ball off Harrison, and was caught by Pawle at mid-on. The bowlers kept the batsmen pegged down, and with the total at 32, Awdry played too late to a good length ball from Tindall, and was clean bowled. Runs were hard to get, and Tindall's fast deliveries were difficult to get away. Lovell-Hewitt, who joined Butler, started confidently, and the fifty was signalled after three-quarters of an hour's play. One run later Lovell-Hewitt was bowled by an "express" from Tindall. Butler and Lloyd, despite keen fielding, took the score to 91, when the former was well taken by Busk. His contribution of 48 had been commended by careful cricket, in which there were flashes of crisp, clean brilliance which one has come to expect from this forceful bat. Six runs later Lloyd ran himself out, but with skipper Awdry and Wheeler together the Dorset total was passed. Neither player stayed long, however, Wheeler falling to a catch when he had collected seven, and Col. Awdry being smartly taken at mid-off by Busk, when his total was on the thirteen mark, seven wickets being down for 116. Jim Smith went for the bowling and hit Harrison for a glorious six. Tindall continued to bowl well and dismissed A. L. Awdry and Smith (W.) off consecutive balls. When Jim Smith was joined by Sydee there began a fine last wicket stand which put on 70 runs. Smith went for the bowling and helped himself to sixes and fours, being particularly severe on Harrison and Jowett. Two successive balls from Jowett went over the rails. When he had 82 to his credit he stepped in front of a straight delivery from Jowett and was out lbw. He had collected his runs in a little over half-an-hour, and his glorious knock included six sixes and nine fours. Wilts were all out for 217.

Dorset then batted again, being 116 runs behind, and the first wicket partnership was soon broken, Busk being out with the score at 10. Tindall did not repeat his first innings success, and was out for 11. Brockway fell a victim to Smith (W.), three wickets being down for 38. Tovey was caught in the slips before he had scored, and without any addition to the total. White and Pawle carried the score over the half-century, but with 54 showing, Pawle, in attempting to turn a ball from Awdry to leg, was caught by Butler. Morres next joined White and bright cricket ensued, the new "bat" helping himself to a glorious six, a four and four twos. It appeared likely that the pair would take the score past the Wilts lead, but at 85 White was tempted out of his ground by Ambrose Awdry, and was promptly stumped. His contribution was 42. Morres and Elderton sent up the hundred. Elderton gave a chance when he had only two, but he was dropped on the boundary, but Morres was c and b just before stumps were drawn. Dorset then having 103 for the loss of 7 wickets. The Dorset innings closed after 20 minutes play yesterday (Thursday), but they saved the innings defeat, and Wilts had to bat again to score two runs to win. **SALISBURY CRICKET WEEK.**

**HOW THE COUNTY SIDE HAS FARED.**

**SMITH FLOGS THE DORSET BOWLING.**

Glorious weather has favoured the Salisbury Cricket Week which concluded at the South Wilt's Club's ground at Bemerton yesterday (Thursday). The "week" began on Friday with a two-day game between the Wilts Club and Ground and Eton Ramblers, which ended in a draw. The feature of this match was a knock of 80 by Hedley, which included five sixes and ten fours. A fine century by "Peter" Dowson, the young Wiltshire bat, and a great stand between him and the Wilts skipper, Col. Awdry, were the bright spots of the home side's batting.

The two-day minor counties championship match against Surrey 2nd XI proved an attraction for the Bank Holiday and Tuesday. At one time it seemed likely that Surrey would be out cheaply, but a fine last wicket stand came as a surprise. Buas, the last man in, collecting 56 and registering the top score. A change of bowling might have prevented this. Wilts failed to top the Surrey first innings score, and there was a dull finish, Surrey winning on the first innings.

The third game was against Dorset, also in the championship, and it was a low-scoring game. A great innings by "Jim" Smith of 82 enabled Wilts to establish a good first innings lead. Going in at the fall of the eighth wicket, he scored his runs in little over half-an-hour, hitting six-sixes and nine fours. Dorset failed badly in the second venture, and the game was over yesterday morning, Wilts winning by ten wickets.

The attendance has been disappointing. This is "Jim" Smith's last season with Wiltshire, as he has qualified for Middlesex, and after his fine innings on Wednesday a "benefit" collection was made for him, and it amounted to £5 0s. 9d.

**WILTS CLUB AND GROUND v. ETON RAMBLERS.**

Eton Ramblers, who have made many a visit to Bemerton, provided the opposition for the opening match on Friday and Saturday, when glorious weather prevailed. The Ramblers held on a strong side with Major Cartwright as "skipper," and they batted first on a sun-scorched wicket. The cricket at first was of the painstaking, ordinary type, and the Ramblers made a poor start, losing Scaramanga at two, and Hogg 43. Sheepshanks and Gosling stepped into the breach, and the hundred was registered after ninety minutes' play. The partnership was broken when C. Awdry clean bowled Gosling for 30, but Sheepshanks continued to score steadily. With his individual total at 67, and with the score board showing 150, C. Awdry claimed him as a victim. He had a five and eight fours to his credit. The bright spot of the day was seen when Hedley joined his captain, and it was a great pity there were not more people present to enjoy the glorious hitting. Hedley started cautiously but finding the bowling of Stanford and Williams to his taste he opened out in fine style, scoring 80 in next to no time. He hit ten fours and five sixes, one terrific hit almost sending the ball into Church Lane. He scored 20 off Stanford in two overs and 24 off twelve balls from Williams. When the bowling was changed Ling got him smartly caught at cover point by Forrester.

The remaining bats were soon out, and Wilts were left with a total of 341 to face. They started disastrously, two wickets being down for 32. Butler and Williams then came together, and both took the score along nicely, and a big stand seemed imminent, but at 54 Butler got his leg in front of a straight ball from Cartwright and was out. Williams carried on and played nice cricket, being particularly severe on the loose balls. He was playing "for keeps," but he was out to a real fizzer from Field-Marsham, the ball pitching well outside the off stump and swinging in to take the leg stump. A. L. Awdry and Dowson produced some bright cricket at the end of the day, Awdry hitting Scaramanga for a six. When stumps were drawn the two were still together, and Wilts had 146 on the board with six wickets in hand.

When the game was resumed on Saturday, Awdry and Dowson, the over-night "not out" batsmen, continued to bat confidently, and when the fifth wicket fell 182 runs were on the board. Awdry was the batsman to lose his wicket, Hogg taking a left-handed catch at silly leg off Cartwright. Then commenced a fine stand between Dowson and Col. R. W. Awdry, the Wilts' skipper, which added 153 runs. When the Wilts' total was only seven runs short of the Ramblers score, Dowson, who had faced the bowling for over two hours, gave his first chance and was taken by Sheepshanks off Field-Marsham. His individual total was 117, in which were 17 fours. Four runs later Col. Awdry was also dismissed, and his invaluable 75 included one six and ten fours. Stanford's advent saw the Ramblers' total passed, and at lunch time Wilts had 378 on the board with two more wickets to fall. These soon went, and Wilts were all out for 383, having secured a lead of 42.

The Ramblers, starting on their second venture, lost two wickets for 49, but Sheepshanks and Gosling put a different complexion on things with a timely stand. They had carried the score to 130, when Gosling, in attempting a big hit, was clean bowled by A. L. Awdry. Hedley, who scored such a magnificent 80 on Friday, followed, but was out lbw before he had scored. Eleven runs later Sheepshanks, who had batted from the commencement, was caught, having compiled an invaluable 73. The Ramblers batted till tea was taken at five o'clock, and they then declared with 214 on

the board for the loss of seven wickets, leaving the Club and Ground 172 to get to draw and 173 to win with about 90 minutes to play. Butler and Forrester opened, and from the first went for the bowling with such good effect that 25 runs were on the board in six minutes. Forrester hit two fours in succession, and then in attempting to get the third, played all round a ball from Field-Marsham, and was bowled. C. E. Awdry and Butler carried on with good forcing cricket, and advanced the score to 55, when Awdry returned a hot one to Hogg, who held it. Disaster followed, for Williams was lbw to Hogg before he had scored, and three wickets were down for 55. At 70, A. L. Awdry mistimed a ball from Field-Marsham and was caught and bowled. Butler and Dowson took the score to 100, but Butler was dropped twice in sending the total from 93 to the century. COUNTY CRICKET

WILTS v. KENT 2nd XI

Wiltshire opposed Kent 2nd XI at the South Wilts Club's ground at Beaufort on Monday and Tuesday in the Minor Counties Championship and both counties were well represented. Wiltshire were led by Col. R. W. Awdry, and in the absence of Charles Awdry, E. B. Lloyd, the young test leader, was included. Kent were skippered by that fine sportsman, G. A. Simpson, who so loves his cricket that it is said of him that given the chance he would play in the night as well as the day. The weather was not so good on Monday, and although the wicket favoured the batsmen, strangely enough low scoring was the order. There was not a large attendance.

Wiltshire batted first but made a disastrous start, Butler and Nash, the opening pair, being dismissed with only three runs on the board. Butler was clean bowled for a single and Nash was caught before he had scored. Wheeler was the only bat to face the varied Kent attack with any confidence, and at lunch time he had 48 to his credit out of a total of 120 for the loss of six wickets. Wheeler did not add to his score after the interval, being caught at mid-off by Wright, a slow bowler of the same type as "Toby" Freeman, the renowned Kent player. Wheeler had hit five boundaries. A. L. Awdry carried his bat for a useful 30, but the "tail" failed to wag, and Wiltshire were dismissed for 111, having batted for two hours and a quarter. Ashwell, the Kent fast bowler, took five wickets for 52, each of his successes coming in a matter of over.

Visitors Fare Badly.

Kent fared little better when they went in, losing three wickets for 26 runs. Evans fell to a brilliant catch by Col. Awdry at square leg, Fagg, a first-class bat, was cleverly tempted out of his ground by A. L. Awdry and was promptly stumped. Sunnocks, the incoming batsman, only stayed to make nine before he fell a victim to Jim Smith, while E. S. Cole ran himself out off a no-ball and Ashwell was stumped off a cleverly pitched ball from A. L. Awdry. Six wickets were down by 49 but the rest was temporarily stayed by Lewis, who had gone in at the fall of the fourth wicket, and blundered. When a good stand appeared likely, Blunden mistimed one of Smith's deliveries and was caught by Lovell-Hewitt, the total then standing at 68. Lewis and Cole (C.) next became associated in a good stand which produced 38 runs and took the score over the hundred mark. At 106, however, Lewis, who had batted patiently for 30, was clean bowled by Jim Smith. Without any addition to the total Cole was bowled by Sydee, his merry knock of 17 including two fours and a three. Simpson, the Kent skipper, was forced to bat last through a strained muscle, but he went for the bowling and his first three scoring shots included three boundaries. There appeared a sporting chance that the Wiltshire total would be passed but when the partnership had added 52, Simpson skied a ball from Smith and was well caught by Lovell-Hewitt, the Kent innings closing at 129. Smith had bowled unchanged and had taken five wickets for fifty-six.

Wiltshire batted again with a lead of 22. Butler and Nash opening against the bowling of Blunden and Ashwell. With only two runs scored Butler was bowled with a real "fizzer" from Ashwell. Nash and Lovell-Hewitt took the score over the 40 mark when the first bowling change was made, E. S. Cole replacing Blunden at the bottom end and Wright taking the ball from Ashwell. Cole almost met with an early success, for in his second over Lovell-Hewitt gave a chance to Simpson at eachward point but the catch was dropped. In the next over from Wright, however, a smart piece of work behind the wicket by Fagg resulted in Hewitt being stumped, two wickets being down for 54. A. E. Lloyd, the new bat, never appeared comfortable facing Wright, who claimed him as a victim, clean bowled, when the score stood at 74. Nash and Wheeler played till stumps were drawn Wiltshire then having 88 on the board, Nash being not out 40. When play closed Wiltshire were 110 on with seven wickets in hand.

When the game was resumed on Wednesday, Nash, who had 40 to his credit, did not stay long, and was caught off Ashwell when he had only added eight. Things proceeded to go badly for the home county, seven wickets being down for 121. E. B. Lloyd and Col. Awdry then became associated in an eighth wicket stand, which yielded 54 runs. The remaining batsmen offered little resistance, the whole side being out for 186. Ashwell again came out with a good analysis, having taken five wickets for 45.

A Good Finish.

Kent, batting again, needed 209 to win. Anson was missed behind the stumps with only two runs scored, but Nash atoned in the next over, catching Evans with no addition to the score. At lunch the score-board read 3-1-1. After lunch, Jim Smith and A. L. Awdry shared the attack, and, with only twelve runs showing, Kent lost Fagg, Nash taking a catch behind the wicket off Smith. With Anson and Sunnocks together the prospect was a little brighter, but at 42 a further disaster befell the visitors, Anson being clean bowled by Smith, having contributed a useful 26. Sunnocks and Lewis faced the bowling confidently, and, with the total at 73, Jim Smith, who had bowled unchanged, was replaced by his brother. Runs came slowly, and both batsmen treated the bowlers with the greatest respect. Sunnocks sustained a confident appeal when the score stood at 75, but Smith (W.) put the

issue beyond doubt with his next ball. Sunnocks played back to a fast ball, and his middle stump was uprooted. The outgoing bat, who is aged only seventeen, had played good defensive cricket for 23. With only four more runs added, Lewis was caught in the slips off Awdry, half the side being out for 79. Ashwell was caught before he had scored. E. S. Cole and Blunden took the score over the hundred mark, and at 107 there was a doubt as to bowling change, Smith (J.) taking the ball again at the bottom end and Sydee replacing Awdry. The change proved successful, for at 109 Blunden skied one from Smith and was caught at mid-off. With E. S. Cole and Cole (C.) together, their ensues some lively cricket, and Smith (W.) was hit for 22 runs in two overs. The game had taken a decided change, and it was quite on the cards that Kent would gain an unexpected victory. The score mounted rapidly, and the total had been raised to 154 when the partnership, which had produced 45 runs, was broken. Cole (C.), in attempting a big hit, was smartly taken behind the stumps for a plucky 22, his partner being 41 not out. Wright, the new batsman, was out before he had scored, being dismissed via the Smith-Nash route. When Simpson, the last man, joined Cole, 55 were still wanted for victory. Cole was smartly caught, however, when he had made 45, and the Kent innings closed for 163. Wiltshire had thus won by 45 runs. **WILTSHIRE v. BERKSHIRE.**

The only county fixture allotted to Trowbridge during the season took place at the picturesque County Ground on Monday and Tuesday. The result was of great importance to Wiltshire, who by gaining points for a first innings lead, practically assured themselves of second place in the League table, a distinction which entitles them under the rules of the competition to issue a challenge to the champions, who at the time of writing look like being Norfolk. Early last week Berkshire were holding a strong position in the race for honours, but Wiltshire, having inflicted defeat upon them at Reading during the week-end, and gained their objective in this week's return engagement, have definitely placed them out of the running.

Wiltshire have had a very successful season, and have completed their programme with an unbeaten record. Three victories in succession have been gained in recent weeks, against Dorset, Kent 2nd and Berkshire. The "Moonrakers" won the Minor Counties championship in 1902 and 1909.

Monday was dull and rainy, and the start was delayed until 12.15, when Dr. Woodburn, winning the toss, decided to send his team to the wickets. The few spectators were provided with early thrills, Nash effecting a smart catch to dismiss C. W. Mole with the score at 7, the bowler being Jim Smith, who bowled at a great pace. Seven runs later this bowler met with further success, and with only six more runs added he took his third wicket (3 for 20). At lunch the score was 61 for 4, D. W. Stokes and P. S. Whitcombe finding the fast bowling less troublesome. Rain caused another adjournment, but the resumption saw further successes for the Wiltshire bowlers, W. Smith finding a way through Whitcombe's guard with a real snorter.

The afternoon's play proved brief but interesting, but Wiltshire clearly lost their early advantage by indifferent fielding. It is difficult to recollect a match on this ground where so many catches were missed in the slips, Jim Smith being very unlucky with his bowling in this respect. In one over three chances—all hard cuts—were missed, Butler, Sydee and Wheeler being the fieldmen. At 4 o'clock rain drove the players in, and it was two hours later before a start could be made. The adjournment had not broken Wiltshire's spell of poor fielding, and several more chances were not accepted. It should be mentioned, however, that the light was exceptionally poor, and the high wind played tricks with the ball. Berkshire continued to make merry, A. H. Lewis and "Skipper" Woodburn, especially, and when further rain at 6.15 caused stumps to be drawn for the day, the score was 133 for 8 wickets, a much larger score than at one time appeared likely.

Tuesday was cloudy but fine, Lewis and Woodburn facing the two Smiths. Lewis completed his 50—an invaluable innings considering the position of his side—but eventually fell to a good catch by F. B. Lloyd. The innings closed at 180, Woodburn being not out with 28.

Wiltshire commenced their innings at 11.50, G. S. Butler and E. M. Nash facing Relf (the old Sussex "pro.") and Peach, a one-time prominent player in Surrey's ranks. Scoring was slow, though neither batsmen appeared to be unduly troubled. Nash, who usually plays his part much lower in the innings, when the edge of the bowling has been taken off, was very quiet, but Butler was batting with his customary freedom and scoring with a variety of strokes. With the score at 24, however, Nash played a ball from Peach rather half-heartedly, nicked it, and Human held the ball cleverly in the slips. Butler left at 40, lbw to Relf, and Fuller, after scoring 11, was clean bowled by Peach—3 for 56. Wheeler left without addition to the score, and then A. E. Lloyd (the Wiltshire footballer) and "Skipper" Awdry became associated. From now the tide turned again in Wiltshire's favour, "R.W." throwing tumidity to the winds by showing the bowling could be punished.

Play brightened considerably during the captain's stay at the wickets, and all were sorry when he was clean bowled by Mole when he had scored 38, including two 4's. The partnership had added 76 runs.

At this stage the position gradually changed round in favour of Berkshire, whose fielding was splendid. Jim Smith "punched" the ball with great power several times, but before he could get his eye in Relf got him caught at short leg by E. A. Lewis—7 for 175. Six runs were now required for a first innings lead, and Bert Lloyd (over the 50 mark) still supreme. E. B. Lloyd was partnering his brother, and his left-handed swipes looked like producing some useful runs, but Woodburn brought himself on to bowl at Peach's end, and the change proved successful, E. B. Lloyd being clean bowled. Two runs later A. E. Lloyd (seven 4's) was caught at the wicket off Relf, and A. I.

Awdry and W. Smith, the ninth-wicket pair, became associated with only four runs required for the lead. Peach came back at Woodburn's end, but neither batsman yielded to Peach's tempting off-balls. Awdry got a single, and then amidst tense excitement W. Smith hit the ball for two to make a tie. Eventually the winning run was obtained, and W. Smith, relieved of his responsibility, jumped out at a ball from Peach, missed it, and got well out of his crease. Buckley fumbled the ball, but Smith generously allowed him to recover it and calmly knock the balls off without making any attempt to recover his ground. Sydee and Awdry remained together until the score reached 100.

Berkshire's second innings produced 81 runs for the loss of 8 wickets, but some of the later batsmen played rather more carefree than they would have done had there been the prospect of attaining a definite finish to the match. Stumps were drawn at 6 o'clock, just as rain commenced again. During this innings Jim Smith captured his fiftieth wicket for the season, and seemingly in celebration of the performance he hit two of the stumps clean out of the ground. Scores:—

WARMINSTER v. MELKSHAM.

Neither side was at full strength for the return match at Warminster on Saturday, Melksham being without the brothers Hurn, Sydes and D. Brown. Warminster won the toss and took first knock on what appeared to be a good wicket, but during the whole of the afternoon the batsmen, with the possible exception of F. Lovett, failed entirely to make any appreciable efforts to score runs. Andrews, the opening batsman, crawled along painfully for two hours and ten minutes for 20 runs. Lovett, who went in No. 8, was top scorer with 47, and the total eventually reached 143, the result of two hours and fifty minutes batting. A. E. Sawyer was the most successful bowler for Melksham, with five wickets for 40 runs. E. Deverall claiming 3 for 44, but these figures would have been much better if chances in the field had been taken.

Melksham commenced their innings at 5.55 p.m., with only one hour and twenty minutes in which to make the necessary runs, and opening with A. E. Sawyer and I. Day, the first wicket fell for no runs. Sawyer being bowled by the first ball of the innings. B. Coles followed, and the total was taken to 53 when he was out for a well-hit 29. G. Burchell came next, and after surviving a moment's appeal for a catch at the wicket off the first ball he received was out to the second l.b.w. K. Muggleworth was the next batsman and runs continued to come in spite of keen fielding, and the fourth wicket fell at 97, when Muggleworth was caught after scoring 20, which included a 6 and three 4's. Day all this time had been steadily increasing his score, and being joined by Deverall they made a great effort to make the necessary runs for victory, but at the call of time the score stood at 130 for four wickets, Day being 45 not out and Deverall 24 not out, the match thus ending in a draw. TROWBRIDGE v. LANSDOWN.

Trowbridge had another very fine match last Saturday at Lansdown. The most fanatical disciple of brighter cricket could have found little fault with a game that consisted of 417 runs, scored in three and three-quarters hours with the aid of 71 boundaries. Added to this were the varying fortunes of the game, which at times were entirely reversed within the space of half-an-hour.

Trowbridge started the ball rolling, or more correctly, flying, by scoring 125 runs for the loss of two wickets in the first hour's play. Keates batted very well for his 32, and he ably kept the score moving while Lovell Hewitt played himself in. After that the visiting captain was very severe on anything not of perfect length, and hit 82 runs in 55 minutes with 15 boundaries. Things looked bad for Lansdown then, but the Trowbridge batsmen did not press home their advantage. In the 25 minutes after Lovell Hewitt left only 25 runs were scored, but this was somewhat amended by Blair, who hit freely, and Batley, who scored 12 from the four balls he received. The innings was declared closed with 202 for 6, made in five minutes under two hours, leaving Lansdown a quarter of an hour longer than this to bat.

Lansdown started badly, and although Wales by hard hitting kept them nearly level with the clock, four wickets fell for 51. Vale and Dann pulled the game round a little, but when the former left the score board read 100 for 5, and with an hour to play Trowbridge had every reason to feel satisfied. At 123 John was bowled, and Dann set about retrieving a desperate situation in the only way that can meet with success in half-day cricket. Hitting the ball in all directions, he remained in for a further half-hour. During that time 78 runs were added, and he had scored 60 of them himself. He gave no chance, and if his strokes were unorthodox, he scored eighteen 4's and brought his side to within two runs of victory. Even so, a sharp change in the slips should have fetched the last batsman to the wicket, and given Trowbridge a chance to snatch a victory. But it was not to be, and the home side passed the Trowbridge total with two wickets to fall, which then added 13 more runs.

Whether the same seven Trowbridge bowlers were less manning than on the previous Saturday, when they dismissed South Wills on an easier wicket for 127, is a matter of doubt. Rather was the game an example of what a stout heart and a heavy bat can do when things are going badly. The ground fielding was good, but a little extra quickness of the mark might surely have intercepted just four of the forty boundaries, and so won the match. For in these close finishes a player may not score and he may not bowl, but the fate of his side may lie in his hands if they are skilfully imbedded in the grass at the critical moment. Meanwhile, as at Westbury-on-Trym, the teams took leave of each other, expressing their determination to sharpen up their weapons for the games to come in 1934. Nay as it is possible to imagine keener, more sporting, or more thrilling contests than these have been. Scores:—

I am strongly in favour of trying to prevent ineligible men playing, but I trust the League Committee will reconsider their decision to inflict penalties on a team and to state the matter fairly, would have been commended instead of being condemned for what was really good sportsmanship.

In conclusion I unreservedly apologise to the League, Rode and the three substitutes for the trouble my foolish mistake has made.
