

MINOR COUNTIES' MATCH.

Some interesting play was seen in the Minor Counties Championship match between the second elevens of Kent and Sussex, on the Nevill Ground, on Tuesday. Rain prevented play on Monday, and the match therefore devolved into a one-day affair, being decided by a single innings by each side. Sussex won by 81 runs. The wicket played very easily as is shown by the fact that during the day 525 runs were scored, including two centuries. Sussex batted first, and after losing one of their opening bats for a "duck," proceeded to put up a big score. Richards and Greenwood defied the Kent attack—none too strong with Wright and Lewis playing at Nottingham—for a long time. And when Greenwood left with 58 to his credit, Cox helped Richards to further dishearten the Kent trundlers. Richards made 102 before he was bowled by Foy, and Cox had made 49 when he put his leg in the way of a straight one from Crawford. E. G. Oldham continued the good work, and when Sussex declared at 303 for five wickets, he had scored 60, and was still going strong. Foy was Kent's most successful bowler, with three wickets for 71; Apps took one for 77; and T. A. Crawford one for 30.

Kent's first three batsmen were all dismissed just when they seemed to be getting their eye in—A. G. W. Hill for 12, Sunnucks for 24, and J. B. Guy for 15—but Tommy Spencer, the Rangers' footballer, batted with confidence, and, although getting very little support, did his utmost to save the game. It was not until A. G. S. Cobb came in to knock up 24 that Spencer could find anyone to stay with him more than a few overs, and everyone was pleased to see him reach his century just before the innings closed for 322. Going in at the fall of the second wicket, Spencer carried his bat for 104. Tuppen and Oakes (C.) were the bowlers who contributed most to Kent's downfall, the former taking three wickets for 57, and the latter four for 43.

CRICKET.

BLUE MANTLES WIN EVEN GAME.

At Brighton, on Saturday, Blue Mantles won an even game against the College by 19 runs. It was the Blue Mantles' first match, and it was noted for its smart fielding under cold and trying conditions. Brighton College, batting first, scored 156, Hobbly making 40, Holdsworth 39 and Sharp 33. Four splendid catches were made by Tawell, and Knocker not only stumped two men, but did not give a single extra away. Phillips, in 12 overs, took five wickets for 37.

Blue Mantles scored 175, Fleming and Tawell putting 94 runs on the board for the second wicket and making the best stand of the match. Fleming, in his 60, hit eight fours, while Tawell, in a breezy 47, had one six and six fours to his credit. Two fine catches by Simmonds dismissed both of these men. At cover, he held a hard drive from Fleming, and later, in the long field, he made a brilliant running catch to dismiss Tawell. Grose took three wickets for 50, and Simmonds three for seven.

A "TECHNICAL" WIN.

Linden Park visited The Saffrons on Saturday to oppose Eastbourne in a whole-day match, an even game resulting with a "technical" verdict just resting with the home club.

Winning the toss, Eastbourne batted first on a perfect Saffrons wicket. With only nine runs on the board, Richards was sent back for obstructing, but steady batting and varied attack provided entertaining cricket till lunch time. H. L. Wilson (26), C. W. Rippon (28) and T. R. White (25) laid a foundation for faster cricket, and this was provided by J. S. Dodd, who gave a splendid exhibition of powerful batting until he was bowled by Turner for 76.

The tail failed to wag, and although Eastbourne had 204 for seven wickets, they were all out for 209, Turner (five for 45) and Batchelor (three for 48) sharing the bowling honours.

Harris and Harrison commenced the Park's reply in promising style, 61 appearing on the board ere Harrison was dismissed for 23. Harris continued to bat splendidly, and was ably assisted by S. H. Rollison (24), H. G. Tucker (18), J. Tidby (18) and H. Turner (15). Harris was eventually out to a spectacular catch by Young for 79, and, with the total at 200 for 9, the match ended, H. L. Wilson and C. H. Simmons capturing the bulk of the wickets.

The Park had taken the field with only ten men, expecting an eleventh to arrive.

Apart from the fact that the gap in the field always seemed to be obtruding itself and giving away a run or two, the shortage was more obvious when the Park had to leave off within nine runs of their opponents' total, and with no 'last man' present to don pads.

SOUTHBOROUGH'S BIG SCORE.

Southborough were decidedly unlucky on Saturday, when they entertained old rivals, Town Malling. After putting together a score of 243 for seven wickets (declared)—an extraordinarily good effort against a club of such renown—they were deprived of victory by the barest margin. Southborough's batting was remarkably consistent and dreadfully nerve-racking for the Malling bowlers. Three of the first four batsmen scored half-centuries, and the other one was only three runs short of the fifty. S. Foster (47) and F. Waghorn (58) commenced the slaughter of the visiting bowlers, and then W. A. Jones (50) and W. Bateman (51) completed their discomfort. Malling had little chance of winning when Southborough had declared, but they just managed to save the day, for when stumps were drawn they had made 157 and had one wicket intact. R. Pentecost took seven of the nine wickets that fell at a cost of 25 runs.

GOOD BOWLING AND BATTING.

Robertsbridge had an easy victory on Saturday, when they visited Wadhurst, scoring 193 runs as against 76 by the home team. Wadhurst obtained more runs than at one period seemed possible, for seven wickets had fallen for only 16 runs, but when Hamilton and Knight were together runs came more freely, the former scoring 32 and the latter 20. Baldwin, who hit 11, was the only other player

to reach double figures. A. Newbery took six Wadhurst wickets for 28 runs, and W. Barnes three for 11. The chief scorers for Robertsbridge were A. Newbery (44), J. Hartnell (43), L. Peacock (37) and W. Barnes (18). For Wadhurst, Hamilton obtained three wickets for 17 runs.

A HOLMESDALE VICTORY.

Linden Park 2nd XI. entertained Holmesdale on Saturday, and lost by 29 runs. The visitors batted first, and put 126 runs on the board before being dismissed. Horton was undefeated with 37, while Heath made 20. The most successful bowlers for Linden Park were Bulck, who took three for 13, and Bellamy, three for 33, while Newman secured two at ten runs apiece. Linden Park were dismissed for 97, Newman being responsible for 47. Only two other players reached double figures, Tomlinson (11) and Sylvester (10). Horton took four wickets for 24, Ward four for 44, and Belcher two for seven.

BY ONE WICKET.

There was a very exciting finish to the match between Bidborough and Southborough second eleven, at Bidborough, on Saturday, and after a great struggle, the home side just managed to pull it off by one wicket. Southborough batted first and made 129, a total which was in no small way due to a splendid innings of 51 by C. Goodrich, backed up by a knock of 30 by W. Sargeant. J. Ball (20), J. Tipping (20), H. Tipping (21) and J. Tolhurst (17), four of Bidborough's first five bats, gave their side an encouraging start, but eight wickets were down for 107, and things looked none too rosy for the home-sters. However, C. Lee rose to the occasion, and an innings of 21 not out was just what was needed to defeat the men from Southborough. R. Funnell took six Bidborough wickets for 42 runs.

A BOWLING COINCIDENCE.

There was an extraordinary coincidence in the match between Eridge and Hurstwood on Saturday, for a bowler on each side both took four wickets for 18 runs. They were Watson, playing for Hurstwood, and Wickens, of Eridge. The home-sters batted first and scored 129. Capsey heading the batting with 49. Hurstwood replied with 168, Morphew scoring 60 and Watson 59. The visitors thus won by 39 runs.

SEVEN WICKETS FOR TWO RUNS!

Superb bowling by E. Pattenden was the feature of the match between Speldhurst and Rusthall, on the former's ground, on Saturday, and caused the downfall of the home side. Speldhurst batted first, but could make no progress against the bowling of Pattenden, backed up by F. Whitmore. They were all out for 35, and only one of those runs was obtained from Pattenden's deliveries while he took five wickets. Rusthall replied by knocking up 80, and they were greatly indebted to E. Child, who scored exactly half of their total. At their second venture Speldhurst made 89 for the loss of five wickets. Pattenden secured two of these wickets, and therefore had a match record of seven wickets for only two runs.

BEATEN AT HOME.

The Rusthall second eleven were beaten on their own ground on Saturday by Rotherfield, who batted first and ran up a total of 106. S. Fielding was the top scorer with an innings of 25, and useful contributions were also made by A. Johnson (19) and A. Holder (15). For Rusthall, J. Walsh took four wickets for 17, and H. Norris three for 19. The home side were given a good start in their innings by their opening pair, E. Riva and J. Harper, who made 17 and 13 respectively, but after they had been parted, only H. Norris, with an innings of 14, faced the bowling for any length of time, and Rusthall were put out for 75, thus being beaten by 31 runs.

TEN MEN DEFEAT TECHNICAL INSTITUTE.

Visiting Tunbridge Wells Technical Institute on St. Andrew's ground, at Southborough, on Saturday, Groombridge second eleven, with only ten men, managed to defeat their opponents by 24 runs. Batting first, the Technical mustered 52, Huckstep being top scorer with 17. Harvey (14) was the only other player to

reach double figures. Brooks and Hutson each took five wickets for Groombridge, all of Brooks' victims being clean bowled. The visitors replied with 76, their chief scorers being H. Payne (34), I. Manktelow (14), F. Hutson (11) and "Mr. Extras" (10). Huckstep bowled very well for the Technical, taking six wickets for 23 runs.

BROADWATER WIN COMFORTABLY.

Broadwater were at home to Crystallate on Saturday, when they defeated their visitors by 78 runs. The home team batted first and ran up the respectable total of 131 runs, of which L. Molineux obtained 34, L. Shaw 28, A. Judge 17, G. Mitchell 15, and G. Bartram 13. For Crystallate, Barden took four wickets for 28 runs, and Pearce three for 15. Only two of the visiting batsmen offered any resistance to the keen Broadwater attack—Pearce (14) and Humphrey (11)—and the whole side was out for 53. Greenstreet took four wickets for eight runs, and Stubbs three wickets for 14.

A HEAVY DEFEAT.

Tunbridge Wells 2nd XI. were heavily defeated when they visited Oxted 2nd XI. on Saturday. They were the first to the wicket, and could only score 53. Mooney was top scorer with 12, while the only other player to reach double figures was Bennett, with 10. Their collapse was due in no small way to the fine bowling of Gregory, who took six wickets for 15 runs, and Hamilton (three for 10). Oxted retaliated with 126, Wood hitting up 29 and Powell 34. Saunders took three wickets for 24, and Mooney three for 23.

A CREDITABLE PERFORMANCE.

Visiting Malling on Saturday, Tunbridge Wells Y.M.C.A. achieved a creditable victory over the Town team by winning by 104 runs. Batting first, the visitors declared at 181 for five, Godwin being not out 59 and Brown not out 13. Wickens scored 31, and Davis 25, while no fewer than 23 extras were recorded. Town Malling were dismissed for 77, only two men making double figures, Holland (11) and Smith (18). The wickets were shared between Wickens and Miles, the former taking four for 38, and the latter six for 33.

SPOILT BY THE WEATHER.

St. Barnabas' were the visitors for Haward's first home match, and what might have been a very interesting fixture was spoilt by unfavourable weather conditions. A biting wind and occasional rain made things very unpleasant. The visitors took first knock, and were dismissed for 42 runs, Oakley being top scorer with 14, after being missed earlier on in the field. Not one of the other batsmen could stand up to the bowling, and "Mr. Extras" was the next highest scorer with 11. Macdonald took seven wickets for 17. Haward's made quite a good start, putting on 24 runs for the first wicket, putting being responsible for 18, but the remaining batsmen failed badly, and the match was dismissed for 35, leaving St. Barnabas' the victors by a narrow margin. Nur-overs, and Baker four for 24 in a similar spell of bowling.

AN INTERESTING POSITION.

It was unfortunate that the match between Tunbridge Wells and Hastings Municipals could not be completed on Saturday, for an interesting position had been reached when stumps were drawn. Batting first, the visitors scored 120, their top scorer being Glyde with 37. Edwards took five wickets for 38, and Styles three for 32. Tunbridge Wells had scored 98 for three when the game concluded. Beoney Hickman took two wickets for 14. An interesting feature was the low number of bridge Wells were in the field, and two when Hastings were fielding.

THE SECOND ELEVEN

The Kent 2nd XI played two matches this week—one against Surrey Second XI at Folkestone, and the other against Staffordshire at Ashford.

Rain delayed the start of the match at Folkestone both on Monday and Tuesday and so the match was decided on the result of one innings. Kent took points for this lead.

Kent opened their innings on Monday. Sunnucks and Hamilton found runs hard to get, treating the deliveries of McCanlis and Gamble with a marked respect. It was half-an-hour before 10 was on the board and an hour before Hamilton hit the first 4. After one and a half hours' play Hamilton brought 50 to the board by pulling McCanlis to the boundary. A few minutes later he was out, a victim of the new l.b.w. rule, after having made 41 out of 57.

Sunnucks was joined by Hill who, during his short innings, never seemed at ease. He was bowled shortly before tea. Sunnucks stayed for 2 hours and 35 minutes.

After tea wickets fell quickly and in 30 minutes Gamble took 3 for 4 runs. At this time things looked bad for Kent. They had a total of 89 for 6.

Then Simpson, the captain, joined Spencer and a lively partnership saved the day for Kent. Both men hit well and when Simpson was brilliantly caught on the leg boundary they had added 71 in a little under an hour.

Foy joined Spencer and played carefully, letting his partner do the hitting. After half-an-hour he was caught without having scored.

Ten minutes before close of play Spencer was also caught, after a splendid innings of 60. Before the end of the day Apps and Cole brought the total to 209.

Surrey, starting at 3.30, on Tuesday with only 3½ hours to bat, forced the pace as much as possible. The Kent bowlers obtained little assistance from the wicket, the only successful ones being Hamilton and Crawford, who shared the wickets.

Wilson and Mobey put on 33 for the first wicket before Wilson was c. and b. McMurray made light of the bowling which was not of a very high standard and 50 went up after 45 minutes. Ten runs later McMurray was taken from a low hard catch to mid-on. Mobey was next to leave, being brilliantly caught at square leg.

Whittaker, who with Crouch, brought the score to 103, was bowled by Crawford, whose sharply breaking deliveries often puzzled the batsmen. Crouch played a steady forcing game and had made 41 before he was caught in the slips with the total at 124.

The innings closed 25 minutes later when O'Sullivan, who batted cleverly with McCanlis, stepped in front of a straight ball and was out l.b.w. The score was 153, leaving Kent a lead of 56.

STAFFORDSHIRE'S EASY VICTORY

Twenty-two years ago Kent Second XI, first met Staffordshire at Canterbury, when Freeman was assisting the Kent side and captured seven wickets. There was a lapse of twelve years after 1923 before the teams met again on Wednesday at Ashford. Considering the meagre attendances at Kent Second XI matches, it was pleasing to see over two hundred watch the play on the first day.

Kent put a sorry figure against some clever bowling by Crump and Lawton, and early on Thursday morning Staffordshire won by an innings and five runs.

The soft wicket favoured the slow, spin bowlers, and Kent sadly missed the services of Lewis, who was playing in place of Watt at Cardiff. Cole and Foy bowled well but got no assistance from the wicket.

The Kent batting lacked enterprise, and in many instances batsmen got themselves out by sheer inability to force matters.

Recent heavy rain had made the wicket very slow, and H. W. Homer, the visiting captain, winning the toss, put Kent in to bat. A. G. Hill, the Beckenham amateur, and Sunnucks found it no easy matter to get going, and in 45 minutes only scored 23 runs, Sunnucks, at this total, being smartly run out.

The wicket seemed to play easy enough, and Hill appeared well set when Guy, the Chatham House boy, unable to get out of the way of a turning ball from Backhouse, was caught at second slip: 33 for two. Hill was out under the new lbw rule two runs later, having played well.

The visiting captain's policy of putting Kent in, appeared good, for Backhouse, a left-hand spin bowler, keeping a good length and flighting the ball cleverly, wrought havoc among the Kent batsmen. With the exception of J. H. Clark, who was at Cranbrook School and is now at Lincoln College, Oxford, none of the others played with any confidence.

Clark has improved a lot since last season, and, last out, his 21 was an excellent innings; Backhouse at the period took four wickets in seven balls for no runs, and came out with the fine analysis for 7 for 39.

At one time it looked as if Staffordshire would not exceed their opponents' total of 86. This was when six wickets had fallen for 74 runs.

Homer then joined Crump, and in half-an-hour the pair, by the brightest cricket of the day, added 55 and were still together at tea-time.

The Kent bowling was hit all over the field by Homer after Crump was clean bowled. It was a real skipper's innings that delighted the crowd, one hit off Cole—a straight drive over the sightscreen—being the only six of the day. Shortly after five o'clock Cole bowled him: Cole took 5 for 71.

With a deficit of 93, Kent commenced their second innings at 5.30 and failed abjectly, eight wickets falling for 59 before the close. Lawton and Crump bowled in irresistible form.

On Thursday morning Carter fell to a clever catch at slip, and Apps joined Cole, and for half-an-hour they kept together: Apps—the newest-comer to the Nursery from West Malling—batted steadily, while Cole forced matters. Only five runs were needed to save the innings' defeat when Cole was lbw. The last wicket put on 22.

FIRST INNINGS WIN FOR KENT

Rain Holds Up Match With Surrey

RAIN marred the Minor Counties Championship match between the Kent and Surrey second elevens which was played at the Cheriton Road ground on Monday and Tuesday.

Over five hours' play was lost and extra time was played on Tuesday evening in order to obtain a result—on the first innings only!

Kent, who batted first, just managed to force a decision on Tuesday—thanks to some fine bowling by C. P. Hamilton and T. A. Crawford. As a result of their victory on the first innings the county second XI takes three points, whilst the losers take one.

Last year's match between the two teams, which was favoured with beautiful weather, produced altogether 587 runs for 25 wickets and Surrey claimed major points for a first inning's lead.

DESERVING OF BETTER SUPPORT

Once again the attendance was very poor. The standard of play in these Minor Counties games is certainly worthier of larger "gates." Playing in last year's match were Fagg, whose consistently good and steady batting for Kent this season makes him a possible candidate for an England cap as an opening batsman; McMurray (well-known to Folkestone football crowds as Guildford City's clever outside-right), who was commended for his brilliant fielding as a substitute in the last Test against the Australians at the Oval last year; W. H. V. Levett (Kent), probably the best amateur wicket keeper in the country; Lewis and Wright, two young Kent slow bowlers who are meeting with great success in the first team, and Fishlock and Whitfield, both of Surrey, who are doing very well with the bat in their County's first team.

FINE ALL-ROUND GAME

There were certainly some highly-talented players on view this year as well. C. P. Hamilton, one of the best bats the Army possesses, played a really fine all-round game. Opening the Kent innings he made a fine knock of 41 and followed this performance by taking five Surrey wickets for only 42 runs.

Spencer and Sunnucks are two other Kent batsmen who should soon be seen in the first team. H. R. Crouch (Surrey) is a steady bat and should prove to be a very useful member of his county club.

Gamble met with great success with the ball, taking 6 wickets for 58 runs. It was he who brought about a Kent collapse just after tea on Monday by taking three wickets at a cost of only four runs.

T. A. Crawford (Kent), who did not bowl at all in last year's game, rose to the occasion on Tuesday, taking five wickets for 47 runs.

START DELAYED

Owing to heavy rain on Monday the start of the game was delayed until shortly before 2 o'clock. Kent's opening pair, C. P. Hamilton and Sunnucks, played the bowling of Gamble and McCanlis with a good deal of cautiousness.

Sunnucks took 25 minutes to score his first run. Five minutes later, with the total at 10, Parker relieved McCanlis. When Berry came on for Gamble after 40 minutes there were signs of play brightening. Hamilton scored more freely than his partner and scored 21 of the 27 on the board after the first hour's play.

W. T. Cook, the Surrey captain, introduced another change a few minutes later, replacing Parker, who had kept an excellent length, by O'Sullivan. The next over from Berry saw the first 4—by Hamilton.

VICTIM OF NEW L.B.W. RULE

The 50 was recorded after an hour and 25 minutes play. Seven minutes later Hamilton became a victim of the new lbw rule when he stepped across his wicket to play a ball from McCanlis. 57—1—41.

The ball rose nastily on several occasions and it was unfortunate that A. G. W. Hill, the newcomer, was hit on the head by a "bumper" from Parker, who came on at the Pavilion end at 62. The amateur did not stay long, Parker claiming his wicket at 65.

Just before tea a short return from

cover-point ran out Guy, 77—3—0.

Spencer came out with Sunnucks after tea and Gamble took up the attack for Surrey. At 85 he dismissed Sunnucks and Hewetson with consecutive balls.

T. A. Crawford did not seem at all comfortable and at 89 he had his middle stump uprooted by Gamble. The Surrey medium-paced bowler was in fine form and kept a perfect length.

THE BRIGHTEST CRICKET OF THE DAY

G. A. Simpson, the captain, joined Spencer and the brightest cricket of the day followed. The 100 was put up after play had been in progress for nearly three hours. Forty minutes later the 150 was registered. At 160, after the pair had added 71 in 50 minutes, Simpson was brilliantly caught on the boundary by McMurray. Spencer reached his 50 after being at the wickets for 1 hour and 48 minutes. The Kent innings closed for 209.

Resumption on Wednesday was delayed until 3.30—the wicket again being badly affected by the earlier rain.

Mobey, the Surrey wicket-keeper, opened Surrey's innings with Wilson. Runs came quickly and Cole, Apps and Foy were all tried before Hamilton dismissed Wilson at 36 by holding a hard return off his own bowling.

McMurray joined Mobey and the 50 was recorded after only 45 minutes' play. Crawford came on for Foy at 64 and with his fourth ball had McMurray caught by Foy at silly mid-on. H. R. Crouch came in and the score was carried to 78—2 when tea was taken.

QUICK FALL OF WICKETS

The chance of a decision at that interval seemed to be very remote and congratulations must go to Hamilton and Crawford for capturing the remaining 8 wickets for only 75 runs in a little over one-and-a-quarter hours.

A fine catch by Guy 10 minutes after tea dismissed Mobey, 93—3—27. Whittaker left Crouch, after only a short stay at the wickets, when a ball from Crawford broke his wicket. 103—4—5. With two reverses at 119—Kent securing the wickets of W. T. Cook and Parker—Surrey stood little chance of avoiding defeat. Berry left at 124 and Crouch, who had batted well for an hour and a half, left when only five more runs were on the board. Sunnucks made a good catch to dismiss Gamble at 134 and, despite a last wicket stand which lasted for nearly 25 minutes, Surrey were dismissed for 153.

When no result was reached at 6 p.m. the captains agreed to another half hour's play and it was at 6.15 that the innings closed.

KENT SECONDS BEATEN

NORFOLK'S FINE BATTING AT TONBRIDGE

Norfolk scored a fine win over the Kent second eleven when they met at Tonbridge on Monday and Tuesday. They have to thank R. C. and D. C. Rought Rought for this decisive success, for, in a ninth wicket stand during the Norfolk second innings, they put on 114 runs.

At the end of the first day the game could have gone any way. Norfolk found runs difficult to get and were all out for 159. It was only a valuable partnership between D. F. Walker and Edrich and stubborn resistance by Falcon and Gunliffe that saved them from complete failure. The first-named pair put on 55 for the second wicket, but Edrich was missed behind the wicket when he had scored only two. Barton was next to get at 77, and Walker's plucky fight came to an end a run later. Gladden was clean bowled by Wright and R. C. Rought Rought was out to Lewis with the total at 87. Lewis was bowling extremely well, and at this point had taken four for twelve.

In the slow bowler's first over after lunch, however, Falcon hit him for three fours. Gunliffe was not in much longer, going out to a splendidly held catch at square leg by Anson. The stand had put on 41 runs. The remaining two wickets went to Lewis who, in an unbroken spell of 22 overs took six wickets for 61 runs. Kent's first attempt was a dismal story until Carter and Cole came together in a last wicket stand. The first six wickets put on only 68 runs, and nine men were out with the score at 83. Cole and Carter played confidently, in fact, they gave the best display of forceful batting of the day. They carried the total to 134 before Carter, who hit five fours, was out.

D. F. Walker and Thistleton Smith opened for Norfolk again, and were still unbeaten with 56 runs scored at the end of the first day's play. They opened confidently again in the morning and before they were parted had given Norfolk a commanding lead with a first wicket contribution of 103. For a time Lewis and Wright held the upper hand, and four men were out in quick time, all of them l.b.w. D. C. Rought Rought batted patiently, but it was not until he was joined by his brother, R. C. Rought Rought, that the fireworks commenced, and Norfolk gained a winning position.

R. C. Rought Rought's hitting was glorious to watch. He did not cause the Kent fieldsmen to exert any undue physical effort. He attacked the bowling persistently, and soon after he came to the crease he hit no fewer than 20 off Wright, driving him for a six, three fours and a two. D. C. Rought Rought was rather quieter, though he blended a steady defensive display with that right amount of aggression to make it most attractive. Cole's fast bowling they treated with the same scant respect, and in four overs collected 44 runs off him. When R. C. Rought Rought was out, Kedward holding a high catch in the den, he had hit one six and ten fours, and D. C. Rought Rought five fours. The innings was declared closed, leaving Kent with 336 to get.

Kent's chances seemed very remote after their batting failure of the day before. R. C. Rought Rought was in good form with the ball, and the only three batsmen to face the bowling with any confidence were Wright, who was promoted in the batting order, Kedward and Foy. Kent were all out at half-past five, and Norfolk thus won by 157 runs.
