RECORD ATTENDANCE ON BANK HOLIDAY.

Salisbury Cricket Week this year has been much more successful than those of many years past. **WILTS v. SURREY 2nd XI:**

Wiltshire opposed Surrey 2nd XI in their return Minor Counties Championship fixture on Monday and Tuesday, and were well and truly founced by an innings and 65 runs. The event, however, was a popular one and over 1,300 people paid for admission on Monday, when they were treated to a feast of runs, while for the two days over 1,000 were in attendance. The crowd came to see Surrey on the Monday, and they certainly got their money's worth, for two centuries were scored and 401 runs were put on at the rate of over

a hundred an hour. Fours, with a mixture of full-blooded sixes, provided the cricket the crowd wanted to see. Wilts batted first and failed against the bowling of Watts and Pierpoint. Ambrose Awdry was the only batsman to shape with any confidence, and his 35 was the top score. Soon after lunch Wilts were out for 118. Smart fielding on Surrey's part provided plenty of interest, Whittaker's catch which dismissed Nash being a particularly spectacular affair. Surrey opened with Mobey and McMurray, and there was a surprise in store. Mobey hit Smith for a four off the first ball, but Smith got his revenge with the next, beating Mobey with a real "fizzer." Squires joined McMurray, but he never settled to look comfortable, and at 22 Smith clean bowled him with another fine ball. Two wickets for 22 were a good start, but partnered now by his captain (W. T. Cook) McMurray kept the score mounting. At 68, Smith claimed his third victim, clean bowling Cook. Whitfield filled the vacancy and there came a second surprise. The first ball he received he turned to leg. McMurray "called" and ran, but Whitfield stood his ground and McMurray, who had made 37, was run out. This brought Whitfield and Whittaker, an eighteen-year-old colt, together, and the fun started. With Smith resting, the home county's attack lacked sting, whittaker was quick to settle down, and hitting merrily the score mounted rapidly. The stand had put on 97 when Whittaker was bowled. He had hit 66 runs whilst his partner had made 31, there being two glorious sixes and ten fours in his total. Watts, the incoming "bat," also got off quickly and the 200 mark was passed. When the innings had lasted about two hours and 20 minutes, Watts straight drove stutler for six, and then when Whitfield's total was slowing 68 he gave his first chance to Fuller at deep point, but the catch was not taken. Appreciating this chance, both men went for the tired Wilts bowling, and they were still together when 300 was hoisted. Soon afterwards, with a sharply run single, Whitfield completed his individual century, having batted approximately two hours and ten minutes. With nine added to his score, and with the total at 316, Whitfield failed to properly connect and was caught this time by Fuller at deep point off A. L. Awdry. In his total the outgoing "bat" had thirteen fours, a six and a five, and the partnership had yielded 154 runs in just over the hour. Watts, now joined by Berry, opened out, and in three consecutive balls hit Smith for a straight six and two fours. In the next over he also completed his century in the quick time of an hour and twenty-five minutes. He had only added two however when he mistimed a big hit and was caught in the deep by E. B. Lloyd for a faultless 102. Sixty-eight of his runs had come in boundaries (fourteen fours and two sixes). The total then stood at 368, and when stumps were drawn for the day Surrey had made 401 for the loss of nine wickets.

First thing on Tuesday morning the Surrey innings was declared closed, and it was a tribute to Nash, the Wilts wicket-keeper, and the team generally that in the big total there was not one extra. Wilts batting again opened with Butler and Fuller, but they were soon out, two wickets being down for 57. Witchell, who had gone in at the fall of the first wicket, played patiently and he was associated with Lovell Hewitt and Awdry in some useful stands. At the fall of the seventh wicket he was joined by A. E. Lloyd with the score standing at 164, and together they took the total over the 200 mark. Both appeared well set and Lloyd was beginning to open out, when, in attempting a hook shot to leg, he had the bad luck to hit his own wicket. Witchell fell one run later. With the score at 215 he was well beaten by a ball from Watts, but he had made an invaluable 81. For three and a half hours he had defied the Surrey attack and he hit thirteen fours, a very creditable performance. The end was not long delayed, for at 220 the last Wiltshire wicket fell. **WILTS BEAT DORSET.**

Dorset, fresh from a thrilling last-over victory against Cornwall, supplied the opposition on the last two days, Wednesday and Thursday. They were without Carnegie-Brown, who was unable to get away, but they included Taylor, the old Lancashire professional, who qualified at the end of last season. Wilts, still without a victory, were keen to avenge the defeat sustained at Sherborne. They were without Butler, and brought in Sydee and King to replace Butler and E. B. Lloyd. Dorset, batting first, did not fare too well, and Elderton was sent back with only 18 on the board. Brockway and Fox improved matters, and took the score to 52, when Fox was caught. Brockway, now joined by Freeman, relative of the famous "Tich" Freeman, continued to bat steadily, but when he had made 38 and the score stood at 82, he walked into a straight one from Lovell-Hewitt and was out. Tindall, the incoming bat, only stayed to make two, and with four wickets down for 89 things were looking well for the home county. Freeman, batting patiently, and Taylor stayed the rot, and there were 124 runs telegraphed before the next wicket fell, Freeman being clean bowled by Ambrose Awdry. Taylor and White paid great respect to the bowling and runs came slowly. Taylor, who had collected 32, was then beaten by one of Awdry's leg breaks and came out. Tovey was smartly caught in the gully before he had scored, while at 171 Smith took a smart one-handed catch in the slips to send back White. Turnbull and Mortimer, two young players, were batting attractively, but when they had put on 18 Nash smartly stumped Mortimer off King. The end was not long delayed, and at 180 the last wicket fell.

Wiltshire opened with Fuller and Connor against the bowling of Tindall and Turnbull. Runs came along steadily, and Tindall, proving expensive, was taken off and replaced by Harrison. That change slowed the pace of scoring, and with the total at 47 Harrison bowled Connor for 18. Witchell came in, and two runs later he was run out. Fuller played the ball to White at cover point, and a smart return saw the wicket thrown down with Witchell just out of his ground. This brought Lovell-Hewitt in to partner Fuller, and at 56 both gave chances. White, at cover point, made a splendid effort to dismiss Lovell-Hewitt, but failed to fully cover the fast travelling ball. Fuller presented a "dolly" to Mortimer's square leg, but the chance was not accepted. The batsmen showed their appreciation of these let-offs, and after tea the rate of scoring increased considerably, and the hundred was sent up after ninety minutes batting. Lovell-Hewitt was the faster scorer of the two, and he registered his individual half century with a grand four to leg, when he had been at the crease a little over fifty minutes. Soon afterwards Fuller registered his 50 also with a boundary on the leg side. With no addition to his total he was caught and bowled by Harrison, the stand having produced 83 runs. A. L. Awdry did not stay long, for when he had made 5 he also fell a victim to Harrison, four wickets being down for 148. With the score at 177 Lovell-Hewitt hit all round one from Tindall. He had contributed an invaluable 72, his chief scoring strokes being thirteen fours. With Nash and Lloyd together the Dorset total was passed, there being then fifteen minutes to play. Nash had made a bright 28, there being only one single in the total, when he edged one from Tindall and was taken at the wicket by Elderton. As time drew near Lloyd went for the bowling and hit six consecutive fours. When play closed the total was 223 for six wickets.

When the game was resumed yesterday (Thursday) morning Lloyd and C. E. Awdry continued aggressively. Lloyd punched the ball to the boundary frequently, and when he added 28 to his over-night 26 he was caught. In his 53 there were eleven fours, the partnership having put on 66. The remaining batsmen did not cause much trouble, and when Awdry was bowled for 26 Wilts were all out with a lead of 87. Actually 53 runs were added in three-quarters of an hour.

Dorset, batting again, scored slowly, and at lunch time they had only made 58 runs in an hour and twenty minutes for the loss of two wickets. Wickets fell regularly, but Tindall and Taylor stopped the rot. They took the score to 123, but at this total Taylor was dismissed in a peculiar way. A run was started and the ball was thrown to Tindall's end. Taylor, in backing up, shouted to Tindall to go back, but as he shouted the ball shot to his end and he was run out. With the total at 141 there came a collapse, Elderton, Tindall and Mortimer all being dismissed without a

run being added. Tindall had batted well for his 54, but he was beaten all the way with the ball which got his wicket. Turnbull and Harrison made a good stand for the last wicket, but when 24 had been added Turnbull was bowled by King. Dorset were thus out for 165, and Wilts were left to get 79 to win. Wilts set about their apparently easy task with great caution, and the rate of run getting was painfully slow. When two wickets had gone for eight runs things did not look at all good, but another fine captain's innings by Lovell-Hewitt turned the tide, and Wilts eventually knocked off the runs required for the loss of four wickets. Lovell-Hewitt carried his bat for 32, but he gave two chances which, if accepted, might have prolonged the struggle. Wilts thus won by six wickets. Scores:—

CRICKET WEEK.

ATTRACTIVE MATCHES AT BEMERTON.

WILTSHIRE'S FIRST WIN.

Ideal weather favoured Salisbury's cricket week, which concluded at Bemerton yesterday (Thursday). The closing game between Wilts and Dorset in the Minor Counties Championship provided the home county with their first win of the season in the championship. W. Lovell-Hewitt, the new county captain, played a big part in making the success possible, scoring 72 and a not out 32. Wilts lost their game with Surrey 2nd XI, but it was a grand match, and the Surrey batsmen treated the Bank Holiday crowd to some free hitting and quick scoring. The friendly game between the Club and Ground and the Eton Ramblers was also lost, but here again the cricket was bright and there was a good finish, the Ramblers winning six minutes from time. Altogether 2,248 people paid for admission, which is a better figure than that recorded at least during the last three years. Once again the members of the South Wilts Club carried out the arrangements, and full credit must go to Mr. W. Vining, the groundsman, for the preparation of such excellent wickets. Music was supplied on the Saturday and the Monday by Territorial Bands, and a spectacle which many enjoyed at the close of play on the Bank Holiday was the beating of "The Retreat" by the Drums of the 4th Battalion the Wilts Regiment.

WILTS CLUB AND GROUND V. ETON RAMBLERS.

Wilts Club and Ground were far from full strength for the game with Eton Ramblers on Friday and Saturday. G. S. Butler "cried off" at the last minute, and when King failed to put in an appearance the vacancy had to be filled from Salisbury. By good fortune, Jack Rambridge, son of Mr. J. S. Rambridge, was available, and when the Club and Ground batted he was the only one to really make a stand. The Ramblers won the toss and batted first. The opening pair put on 73 runs, and for the first two hours runs came at the quick rate of a hundred an hour. Scaramanga hit 59, which included twelve fours; Lane-Fox 86, including a six and fourteen boundaries; Brocklebank 40, including six fours; Hedley 30, including a six and five fours; and Frederick 40, including eight fours. There was but little variation in the Club and Ground bowling, and a left-hand spin bowler was obviously what the side was lacking. For the loss of three wickets the Ramblers had put together 232, but then came a change, the scoring slowed and they were all out for 347. The Club and Ground, on a wicket full of runs, failed dismally. Ellerton and Fuller were out with only seven runs scored, and this brought James Wort and Jack Rambridge, two Salisbury players, together. Batting well, they took the score to 74 before Wort was out. Rambridge carried on the good work, but could get no one to stay. When he had scored 53 he hit all round a good ball from Cartwright and was bowled. He had hit nine fours. A hundred runs were on the board for the loss of seven wickets. Things looked bad when, with 30 runs added, Moloney, the last man, went in to join Llewellyn. There were one or two near things, but together they defied the bowling and played out time, the score standing at 180 when stumps were drawn, Llewellyn being not out 48.

When the game was resumed on Saturday only an extra had been added when Llewellyn was bowled, and the whole side was out for 161. Contrary to expectations, the Ramblers did not enforce the follow on but batted again, making 204 for six wickets and then declaring, leaving the Club and Ground to get 391 to win in about four and a half hours. The home side started slowly, and only ninety runs came in the first hour and a half. With Fuller and Forrester together things livened, but the brightest batting of the day came when A. L. Awdry and Forrester were associated, and they added ninety for the sixth wicket. Forrester, who had made 63, was then caught. Forty-eight of his runs had come from boundaries. Awdry continued to flog the bowling, and at one period hit fifty runs in twelve and a half minutes. In one over from Brocklebank he hit six consecutive fours. At 283 his merry knock ended, for he was caught in the deep. He had scored 83, including eighteen fours. Lochhead and Sydee were soon dismissed, and the game appeared to be as good as over, but Llewellyn and Moloney became associated in

another last wicket stand. The score mounted rapidly, and, although it did not look as though sufficient runs to win would be scored, there was a chance of a draw being forced. When there were but six minutes to play Moloney, in his eagerness, got himself run out, and the innings closed for 333, the Ramblers winning by 59 runs. Scores:—

**NOTES.**

# WILTSHIRE RECOVER FROM A BAD START.

## MERRY KNOCK BY BERT LLOYD ON G.W.R. GROUND.

### By "GOOGLY."

There was a sensational start to the Minor Counties match between Wiltshire and Berkshire, on the Great Western ground, Shrivensham-road, Swindon, to-day, Wiltshire losing their first three wickets for only nine runs as a result of half an hour's play.

This was the first time for seven years that a county match has been played in Swindon.

When play began there were about 200 spectators.

The Wiltshire side included three local players—Bert Lloyd and Jim Phillips (Swindon) and W. Lockhead (the Great Western wicket-keeper). Herod, the former Swindon Town footballer, is also in the side.

The wicket was in fine condition. H. F. Fuller and Phillips went out to open the Wiltshire innings, the attack being shared by Remnant and Evans, the Reading fast bowler.

### REMNANT'S LEG TRAP.

Remnant, bowling from the Shrivensham-road end, made the ball swing and come back quite a foot from the off. He had three men close in on the leg side. Fuller played the slow bowler with confidence at the start and turned the third ball through the leg trap for two runs. Playing forward to the last ball of the over, however, he had the misfortune to pull it on to his off stump.

H. G. Wittchell came in to partner Phillips and both batsmen were kept very subdued by some excellent length bowling. Phillips got a couple to leg off the fast bowler and very wisely ignored one or two short-pitched deliveries just outside his off stump.

Wittchell began quietly with a single to leg and then Phillips was nearly out when playing back to Remnant. The ball reared up and went flying off the corner of his bat just wide of the outstretched hands of two of the leg fielders.

Only nine runs had been scored in 25 minutes when Wiltshire lost another wicket. Phillips, who had never appeared comfortable, deflected a ball on to his stumps. He had made five on his first appearance in county cricket.

### BOWLERS ON TOP.

The Berkshire bowlers were definitely on top and they met with further success at the end of half an hour. Wittchell, who had been watching the ball very closely, stepped out to drive Evans and gave an easy catch to Lewis at cover point.

With Lovell Hewitt (captain), and A. L. Awdry together, the game gradually began to take on a much brighter complexion. Lovell Hewitt was playing the ball hard and he received an ovation when he drove Remnant to the sight screens to register the first four of the day, after the innings had been in progress 35 minutes.

Awdry, too, appeared at ease and after taking three off Evans he pulled Remnant to the square leg boundary. Lovell Hewitt had a stroke of luck when he nicked the fast bowler through the slips for four, but generally he was batting with confidence, and executing some delightful shots, particularly through the covers. Twice in succession he got Remnant away for singles through the leg trap.

The first 50 was sent up at the end of one hour's play, Lovell Hewitt's score at this stage being 28.

### FIRST BOWLING CHANGE.

Berkshire now made their first bowling change. Harding, another fast bowler with an easy action, taking over from Evans. Awdry at once drove him for three past extra cover, and then Lovell Hewitt placed him beautifully to the leg side for a couple and a four off successive balls.

Runs continued to come at a steady pace and Lovell Hewitt took four to leg and another through the covers off Harding. Awdry, who was just as attractive to watch, got Remnant away for two singles to leg.

Eighty minutes play had yielded 73 runs, when Wiltshire lost another wicket, Lovell Hewitt being splendidly caught at square leg by Lewis, off Harding. He had been at the wicket only three-quarters of an hour for his 43 runs, and, in view of the state of the game when he went in, did extremely well.

Remnant, who had now lost a lot of the "devil" which had made him so difficult to play at the beginning of the innings, gave way to Woodburn, another spin bowler, and the rate of scoring slowed down appreciably.

A. L. Awdry was all at sea with several of his spinners, and in the doctor's second over, was snapped up behind the wicket. He had made 18 out of 87.

### BERT LLOYD COMES IN.

Bert Lloyd, who batted so well against Devon yesterday, joined C. E. Awdry and signalled his appearance by getting the slow bowler through the covers for three. Woodburn, however, was making the ball do some strange tricks and he almost had Awdry in his third over, Harding just failing to take a difficult chance at first slip.

Neither Awdry nor Lloyd was able to take any risks with Woodburn bowling such an immaculate length, but Lloyd always anxious to "have a go," stepped out and sent a ball speeding away to the off. It looked a four all the way but Dowse raced back and picked the ball up on the edge of the boundary.

Wiltshire received another set back when the total was four short of the century, Awdry leaving to a catch behind the wicket. Harding was again the successful bowler. Lloyd was now joined by Herod, who opened with a streaky shot between first and second slips for a single.

Just afterwards Lloyd sent up the 100 with a single in the direction of third man.

Only eight more runs had been added when Herod, playing forward to Harding, was stumped. He had thus provided Stokes, the Reading wicket-keeper, with his third victim off the reel. "Bill" Smith, the county bowler, was promoted from No. 11 with instructions to hold the fort until lunch, but just on the stroke of time he was given out leg before to Harding. At this stage Lloyd (not out 15) was playing good cricket.

The crowd had increased to more than 500 when the game was resumed, and Lochhead opened his account with a single off Harding. Lloyd, after edging one through the slips, drove the fast bowler for three. Lloyd was batting with delightful confidence, and he twice turned Woodburn round the corner for singles.

With the state of the game as it was, Lochhead wisely contented himself with keeping his wicket intact, leaving the run getting to the Swindon captain.

### LLOYD HITS OUT.

Lloyd helped himself to another four off Harding, sending the ball speeding to the sight screens, and the next ball he cracked with tremendous power to the square leg boundary. He took yet another four off the last ball of the over.

Lloyd was showing a distinct partiality for the fast bowler, but it was Harding who eventually brought about his dismissal. Lloyd stepped forward to drive the ball, but he was caught by Sayles, fielding at extra cover. Lochhead and Sydee made a stand for the last wicket.

### ADD COUNTY MATCH.

Berkshire, like Wiltshire, made a disastrous start. Only seven runs had been scored when Lord Remnant was bowled by Smith, the ball taking his off stump. Lewis, who had opened the innings with him, made one or two nice strokes on the off and Stokes opened his account with a four to the leg boundary off C. E. Awdry.

Lewis survived a confident appeal for leg before when opposed to Smith, but Stokes was quite at home and drove Awdry to the boundary twice in succes-

sion.

The Wiltshire fielding was exceptionally keen and Lochhead was very safe behind the stumps. Scores:

Minor Counties Cricket.

BERKSHIRE'S TASK.

150 RUNS TO BEAT WILTSHIRE.

Berkshire having gained a first innings lead over Wiltshire by the narrow margin of two runs, there was every prospect of an exciting day's cricket when the first Minor Counties match to be played in Swindon for seven years was continued on the G.W.R. ground to-day. The wicket showed signs of wear.

Fuller and Phillips gave Wiltshire an excellent start, scoring 35 in the first half hour. Fuller square-cut Remnant, the spin bowler, for three in the first over, and then took two successive fours on either side of the wicket off Evans, the speed merchant.

Phillips was very painstaking but as the game proceeded he speeded up. He collected four (all run) when mid-on failed to get down to a low drive, and then helped himself to another boundary off the same bowler. When his score was 12 he had the good fortune to be missed in the slips. It was a difficult chance, however, the ball going just wide of the fieldman's hand.

DOUBLE BOWLING CHANGE.

Berkshire made a double bowling change at 38, Dr. Woodburn taking over from Remnant, and Harding relieving Evans at the Shrivenham-road end. The change had the effect of putting a brake on the scoring, and as it happened Woodburn's third over proved fatal to Fuller, who was caught at square leg by Sayles.

Fuller had made 23 out of 44 in just under three quarters of an hour.

Phillips, on being joined by Wittchell, stepped out to drive Woodburn for two past mid-on, but immediately after he was taken at mid-off by Evans.

Subsequently the rate of scoring was kept down by some good work in the field. At 63, Wiltshire met with a further reverse, when Wittchell, who had never looked comfortable, attempted to pull to leg a ball pitched on his middle stump and was clean bowled.

Lovell-Hewitt was much more subdued than yesterday when facing the fast bowler, but he got two nice fours past extra cover off Woodburn and helped A. L. Awdry to carry the score to 91 before losing his wicket. The ball cocked up as he played forward, and he gave an easy catch to the bowler.

Without any addition to the score, C. E. Awdry was l.b.w.

Thus Wiltshire had lost their last three wickets for the addition of only 28 runs. Woodburn, with two men fielding close in on the leg side, and three others in the deep, was commanding a deal of respect, and Evans, though hardly so fast off the pitch as yesterday, was making one or two balls nip in disconcertingly.

Dowse had the misfortune to tear a ligament when fielding a ball at cover-point, and had to leave the field. In his absence Frank Holloway, of the G.W.R. club, went out as substitute.

HUNDRED GOES UP.

With Bert Lloyd, the Swindon captain, and A. L. Awdry together, the score began to mount up gradually, and Lloyd, with a perfectly-timed drive to the screen, sent up the 100 after the innings had been in progress one and three quarter hours.

A. L. Awdry gave a hard chance to backward point when 25, but this was the only blemish—if blemish it can be called—in what had been a stylish knock. Lloyd, too, gave an excellent account of himself, some of his shots through the covers being a delight to watch.

At one o'clock, when the innings had been in progress two hours, Wiltshire had 126 on the board, and at that stage Woodburn, who had been bowling extremely well, gave way to Harding. Lloyd at once showed his appreciation of the change by hitting him through covers for two, and then turning him to leg for two more, but off the last ball of the same over Berks met with a further success, Awdry being out to a catch behind the wicket.

Without any addition to the score, Lloyd was l.b.w. to Evans. Smith survived an appeal for leg before in the

same over, but in the next one, when facing Woodburn, he gave an easy catch to Remnant, fielding at mid-on. Wiltshire had now lost eight wickets for 130. Only two runs were added after lunch when Lockhead was bowled by Evans. Herod turned Evans to the leg boundary and then straight drove him for another four.

Just afterwards Sydee lifted a full toss from Woodburn to the square leg boundary. Then Herod opened his shoulders and twice got Woodburn away through the covers, much to the delight of the crowd, which had now increased to about 600. At 151 the end came, Sydee having his wickets shattered by Evans. Berkshire were thus left with 150 to win.

# MR. W. W. WAKEFIELD PLAYS CRICKET FOR SWINDON.

## FIGHTING INNINGS THAT STOPPED A ROT AT OXFORD.

### FEATURES OF LOCAL MATCHES.

A FIGHTING innings by Mr. W. W. Wakefield, prospective National Conservative candidate for Swindon at a time when the fast bowlers appeared likely to "run through the side," was the outstanding feature of Swindon's match against Oxford City on the Merton College Ground, Oxford, on Saturday.

With Wakefield and King together, however, the game gradually took on a much brighter complexion. Both batsmen attacked the bowling without taking undue risks and were still together when the hundred went up after the innings had been in progress an hour.

Wakefield had just completed his half-century—his first for the Swindon club—when he lost his wicket, and only two runs had been added when King, who needed but four runs for his 50, was clean bowled by Florey.

King had batted extremely well, sending the ball to the boundary nine times, and had not given the semblance of a chance.

After this Arthur Neville made 33 in his usual breezy style, hitting one gorgeous six off Howell, and a valuable contribution of 15 was made by Reg. Stone, the fast bowler, who had been promoted in the batting order following his fine innings of 50 for his side in the G.W.R. "Kelynack" Cup competition earlier in the week.

Buckingham and Cole gave the City an excellent start, but after they had been parted the bowlers gained the upper hand, Florey alone reaching double figures.

Litten varied his attacks exceedingly well. King and Warfield both made the ball do some queer things, and Silto surprised his colleagues by blossoming out as a fast bowler!

**WILTSHIRE DRAW WITH KENT II XI.**

**HIGH SCORING AT BEMERTON.**

After gaining a lead of 206 on the first innings, Wiltshire were unable to force a win against Kent II XI in their match at Bemerton on Monday and Tuesday. With the score at 70 Grimshaw came on in place of Cole, and with his first ball he got Phillips caught at the wicket. Wittchell did not stay long, but Fuller completed his 50 after 65 minutes. The Kent total was passed with only two wickets down and Fuller was again missed when he had scored 75. Lovell-Hewitt was stumped after scoring a quick 19, and Awdry left after scoring one. Nash then joined Fuller and the brightest batting of the match was seen. Nash's first ten scoring strokes included nine fours and a three, and altogether in his 94 (scored in an hour and five minutes) he hit one six and twenty fours, being eventually caught in the slips. Fuller, with his score at 121, which included fourteen 4's, was bowled by Hill. The remaining batsmen were soon dismissed, and the Wiltshire innings closed for 308.

Kent went out to bat on Tuesday morning, needing 206 runs to avoid an innings defeat, and Sunnucks was out with the score at 20. Stansfeld, a left-handed batsman, treated the bowling with little respect and the score mounted quickly. Shortly after lunch, however, he was caught behind the wicket off Smith, and three wickets were down for 116. Then followed the biggest stand of the match, and six bowlers were tried but were unable to break the partnership. Spencer drove Awdry to the on boundary for six, but was dropped by King with his score at 76. When the stand had produced exactly 150 runs, Day drove a ball from Smith into the hands of Phillips at mid-off, and his innings of 66 included eleven fours. **KNOCK-OUT CUP FINAL,

**PRESENTATION OF CUP AND MEDALS.**

Winterslow and Harnham met in the Knock-out Cup Final of the Salisbury and District League on the Chafyn Grove School ground, London Road, on Saturday, in ideal weather before a large number of spectators. The ground was lent by Mr. H. L. Whytehead, who had had a splendid wicket prepared, and with both teams at their full strength it was anticipated that many runs would be made. Unfortunately several batsmen on each side, apparently from over-anxiousness to do well, failed to produce the form they have been showing in recent games.

Pearce joined Horner and was fortunate to be dropped in the slips. At 10 Pearce was lbw to Dredge. Wilbur partnered Horner and hit Dredge for two boundaries. Both batsmen scored freely. After putting on 29 Wilbur was out to a good catch, having scored 12. Rogers then went in and at 43 was caught by Dredge. J. Thorne signalled his arrival by hitting Dredge to the boundary, but at 47 was out lbw without any addition to the score. Horner was out lbw, having batted 53 minutes for 22 runs. After this matters slowed up considerably, and at 54 Russell came on to bowl when the score was 61, and he bowled Pearce at 67 for 8 wickets, and successive batsmen took the score to 75. Plummer, who bowled throughout, had 14 overs of which 6 were maidens, and he took 5 for 32 runs. Dredge had 12 overs, 3 being maidens, and took 3 wickets, and Siggery in 3 overs took 2 wickets.

Siggery and Elliott opened for Harnham, Wilbur and Willis being the bowlers. In Willis' first over Siggery hit him into the pavilion. Both batsmen appeared well set, but disaster overtook them at 10, Elliott being lbw, and with no addition Siggery was bowled by Wilbur. The bowling appeared to puzzle the batsmen, and Dewey came out at 11. Wilbur and Willis were bowling excellently. The brothers Cooke then came together, but the partnership was short-lived, J. Cooke losing his wicket to a good catch by Rogers. Four good men were thus out for only 13 runs. Smith joined H. Cooke and found it difficult to score. At 22 H. Pearce relieved Willis, and after two maiden overs bowled Smith in his third over with the score 26 for 5. At 28 H. Cooke was run out. Seviour and Dredge went for the bowling, but what looked like being a good stand was abruptly ended by Seviour being caught behind the wicket, and 7 wickets were down for 37 runs. Dredge was run out and, later, Plummer also was run out, and all were dismissed for 48, of which 10 were extras. The bowling of Winterslow was excellent.

Wilbur took 3 wickets for 12 in 10 overs, Willis 2 for 6 in 7 overs, of which 5 were maidens, and H. Pearce 2 for 4 in 5 overs. A feature of the game was the admirable fielding of Winterslow. Harnham's fielding as a whole was good, although the bowlers were not quite so successful as their opponents, but when batting they lacked confidence and there was little understanding between them, consequently some good wickets were thrown away.

With one hour and 20 minutes to play, Winterslow took a second knock. Losing Russell at 5, Horner and Pearce put on 28 for the second wicket, of which Pearce scored 17. Horner (15), Rogers (17) and R. Dear (10) took the score along until eventually the side were dismissed for a total of 90 runs. G. Siggery took 4 for 12 in 5.2 overs, and Dredge 3 for 22 in 7 overs.

NOTES.

The surprises of the week-end were the defeats of West Dean at Bemerton and the R.A.F. (Old Sarum) by Porton Sports. Previous to Saturday, West Dean were the only undefeated club in the league. The R.A.F.'s defeat took place at Old Sarum, and the Airmen had a strong side on duty. Both Bemerton and Porton Sports Club played well and deserved their victories. The positions they have been occupying of late have not been a true reflex of their abilities.

The tables in both sections are now in a most interesting stage. In Section I, West Dean have one more game to play. At home to-morrow (Saturday) they meet Harnham, and should Dean win they will become champions. On the other hand, should Harnham win this game and their remaining game with Bemerton, they will be the champions.

In Section II, Winterslow have one other game with St. Mark's on August 24th, and should they win they will secure the leadership. St. Mark's still have a good chance of becoming leaders. To-morrow they visit the R.A.F., and if they win and then defeat Winterslow, they and Winterslow will be level on points and a deciding game will have to be played. Should the Airmen defeat St. Mark's they will then have to await the result of the Winterslow v. St. Mark's match the following week.

St. Mark's visited Amesbury on Saturday, and for the second time this season won easily. When the teams met on July 6th St. Mark's made 141 runs and Amesbury 57, but on this occasion the Saints notched 194, which is the highest single innings score since Mottisfont made 237 against Porton Sports on May 30th, 1934.

No fewer than nine of the side ran into double figures, on Saturday, Jack Mortelman (30), W. Heather (29), and C. Dymond (26) being the chief. W. Heather, in his score, had three sixes. Porton Sports were fortunate in having first knock, but with only 15 runs scored Scutt was dismissed. Annetts and Sparey took the total to 29, when the latter was bowled by Matthieson, who made his first appearance for the Airmen. Bailey then joined Annetts and runs came at a good pace. This pair added 35 before Annetts was out to a good catch at mid-off. Annetts played a fine innings, being at the wicket 50 minutes. H. Miles and W. Miles did not stay long, but H. G. Keevil made another stand with Bailey, and they were still together at tea-time, when the score read 91 for 5.

Keevil was soon out, giving an easy catch to point, and six were down for 92. Stanford soon got going, but at 103 Bailey was run out through a smart piece of fielding by cover-point. Bailey looked set for a big score, not having offered a chance. Hobbs and Judd failed to stay, the latter being badly run out. M. Keevil and Stanford added 15 for the last wicket, but Porton were all out for 119, the innings lasting for 1 hour and 40 minutes. "Extras" helped with a big score of 32.

The R.A.F. made a bad start, Sergt. Makepeace being clean bowled with the third ball of the innings. This was good tonic for

Porton, as Makepeace is a very forceful bat and has made some big scores this season. The next wicket fell at 16, F.-O. ## SPORTS NOTES.

### Wiltshire's Exciting Match With Berkshire.

#### Trowbridge Captain Injured.

Wiltshire have not had a very memorable campaign in the Minor Counties League this season, but there is one match which although ending in defeat for the "Moon-rakers," will not soon be forgotten. That was against Berkshire, on the Swindon G.W.R. sports ground, which the neighbouring county won by one wicket after one of the most exciting matches one could ever hope to see. Just read how the match progressed on the last day, let your imagination function, and you can easily recapture some of the thrills enjoyed by the excellent crowd at Swindon on Saturday.

Wiltshire scored 161 in their first venture; Berkshire replied with 103. Second time Wiltshire were out for 151, leaving their opponents 150 to get for victory. It looked comparatively easy, easier still, in fact, when the score-board showed 01 for one wicket. Then Berkshire's wheel of good fortune began to reverse; Wiltshire's never-say-die bowlers and fielders gradually got on top. Thrills galore for Wiltshire, and shocks for Berkshire, followed with remarkable swiftness. Wickets 4, 5 and 6 fell at the same total, 131. One run was added and down toppled three more wickets for no runs. Nine wickets down and 15 runs still needed if Berkshire were to win the match.

Wiltshire's fielders were on their toes, but Berkshire crept slowly towards the winning post. Time came; Berkshire claims the extra half-hour. Play proceeded amidst growing excitement. Dr. Woodburn was batting, and seven minutes after the extra time had commenced he made the winning hit. The stilled atmosphere was broken with the appreciative applause of the spectators, and so delighted were the Berkshire players that they carried the Doctor shoulder-high to the pavilion. That's the sort of cricket—worth going a long way to see, and worth paying for when you get there. The match at Swindon, which was the first county game to be played on the G.W.R. sports arena, proved a great success, and it is more than likely that two matches will be played there next year.

Wiltshire will not finish at the bottom of the Minor Counties table this season, but they will be very near. Having beaten Dorset and drawn with Kent 2nd, they have an opportunity of collecting a few more points in their return match with Berkshire, which would lift them up a few places in the chart. What a difference to a couple of seasons ago when they nearly won the championship.

The under 19 match between Wiltshire and Hampshire Hoggets, at Bomerton, also produced plenty of thrills. Hampshire's opening batsmen did remarkably well, and then came a collapse, six wickets falling for one run. Turnbull captured 5 for 0 in his last four overs. Later, he gave a display of hard hitting when his side wanted the runs, his contribution of 34 containing seven 4's. Wiltshire won by six wickets.

Had not W. Hooper, acting captain, strained a thigh muscle when bowling, Trowbridge might have won their match against South Wilts last Saturday. At the time of the mishap Hooper had taken two wickets for 2 runs, and after his retirement the batsmen got completely on top for a while. Trowbridge lost seven wickets for 113, but Batley and Hurley added 60 in thumping style, the score reaching 183 for 8 in 2 hours 5 mins., Hooper then declaring. Earlier in the innings Ling had hit a brilliant 73. As stated, Trowbridge's chances were hampered badly by Hooper's injury, but the game ended in a very interesting position, South Wilts having scored 167 for 8 at this stage. Alec Batley bowled splendidly. Despite several missed catches, he finished with the excellent analysis of 200. 3m. 73r. 5w.

Congratulations to W. P. Hill, of Warminster 2nd, and G. Kelson, of Stockton, who scored 100 and 104 respectively on Saturday. Hill is the first Warminster player to score a century this season, and his side rattled up 202 in 1 hour 20 mins.

Westbury United F.C.'s new ground has been selected by the Wiltshire F.A. as the venue of the Wiltshire v. Dorsetshire Southern Counties Amateur Championship match on November 30th next. This is the first representative match to be played in the ancient town, and needless to say the club appreciated the honour. The other county matches are against Devon, at Torquay on February 8th, and Somerset (ground in Somerset to be arranged).

Charlie Wippler, the young left-winger who joined Bristol Rovers from McCall's (Trowbridge), and was transferred to Heart of Midlothian, made a splendid debut with his new club last Saturday. His side won 2-0, and Wippler scored one goal and gave the pass which culminated in the other goal. Just before the match Charlie, who has won the nickname of "the young greyhound" from his Scottish supporters, received a telegram of good wishes from Fred Tulk, who played for McCall's when Wippler was with the club.

We hear that L. R. Rose, the Trowbridge and Wiltshire player, who went to Bristol Rovers last season, has been signed by Bath City.

Frank Phillipson, who was one of the finest forwards Trowbridge have had since the War, was among the English athletes who travelled to Germany by air last Sunday to compete in the International competitions. Phillipson, who is attached to Salford Harriers, competed in the pole vault event, finishing fourth. Whilst in Trowbridge—he was a clerk at the County Council Office—he gave pole jumping displays at sports meetings, but he is best remembered for his dashing exploits on the football field for Trowbridge and Wiltshire.

L. Tompkins, of Coate Swimming Club, Swindon, won the men's diving championship of Wiltshire at Lechlade on Monday. There were seven entries. All the first three places were secured by members of the Coate Club.
