

YORKSHIRE COLTS' POOR DAY

Red Rose Rivals Secure the Lead

WEAK BATTING

WAKEFIELD, Monday

No play was possible until nearly three o'clock in the match between Yorkshire and Lancashire second elevens here to-day, but a surprisingly large attendance were fully rewarded for their vigil during the four hours which remained.

As the result of some astonishing cricket, Lancashire gained a lead of four runs over the home side, but this success cost them eight wickets, and their ultimate lead on the first innings is not likely to be a considerable one.

A good deal of rain had fallen overnight, and the wicket was very wet this morning, play being out of the question before lunch. The pitch rolled out easily enough after the interval, however, and there seemed no reason to expect the complete disaster which overtook Yorkshire on winning the toss.

As it happened the wicket—as perfect a sight as any batsman could wish to see—played quite normally, but this was more than one could say of the Yorkshire side, who were immediately reduced to impotence by some magnificent bowling by Frank Siblees and Phillipson. Siblees, now fully recovered from the strain which has kept him out of county cricket in recent weeks, made the ball swing tremendously, and Phillipson kept a splendid length, and sheer pace off the pitch beat most of his victims.

Start of the Rout

The rout began without a run on the board, Barker lifting his bat to a ball from Phillipson which was well off the wicket, and bringing it down smartly on top of the stumps. Siblees then made Harrison play at one of his out-swingers, and had him collected an adventurous 18, was beaten by a fine ball from Phillipson which came back sharply.

Kippax batted very confidently until he fell a victim of the new lbw. rule at 25, and then Turner and G. A. Wilson were dismissed with only three runs added. Robinson with only three runs added, decided that there was no virtue in defence, and he immediately fell upon the bowling with an unorthodox abandon that yielded him 14 unique runs, mostly off the edge of the bat.

Crick and Pearson put on 24 for the eighth wicket, both playing extremely well, but a double bowling change ended in the wicket-keeper's downfall, to a stentorian appeal from Briggs, the left-hander. Tea only prolonged the Yorkshire agony, and after Col. Chichester-Constable had helped Pearson to a further 23 runs, Siblees improved put on an already attractive analysis with two more quick wickets.

Pearson watched the ball very carefully, and his sound display at such a critical time was of the utmost value. Siblees thoroughly deserved his splendid figures—5 for 35—and Phillipson who was in deadly form for his first half dozen overs, also did well, with 4 for 31.

An Expensive Experiment

The Lancashire innings was rather tragic—from a Yorkshire viewpoint. Half the side were dismissed for a mere 23, and the first innings lead which had seemed so improbable at the start was now a definite possibility.

But the home team lost their grip on the game, and the introduction of G. A. Wilson, a slow left-hander from the Leeds League, into the attack with 50 scored, presaged a veritable fusillade of boundary shots by H. R. W. Butterworth, who is the last batsman to allow rank full tosses and long-hops to go unpunished. Wilson was given ample time to find a length, but the experiment was, unfortunately, a costly failure, and despite the valiant efforts of Robinson Lancashire took the lead with eight wickets down.

Hargreaves bowled extremely well at the start, and had it not been for Butterworth's timely aggression, his side would not have gained the slender advantage which they hold for to-morrow.

YORKSHIRE COLTS WELL BEATEN

Siblees Again in Deadly Form

10 FOR 58 IN MATCH

The Minor Counties match between Yorkshire and Lancashire continued its surprising course here to-day, and by four o'clock the visiting team had gained a decisive victory by eight wickets.

Lancashire led by only eight on the first innings, but Siblees was again in deadly form when Yorkshire went in a second time, and they were put out for 121.

Thanks to a valuable defensive effort by Greenhalgh, and an attractive innings of 49 not out by Nutter, the 114 runs needed were hit off for the loss of only two wickets.

Lancashire started the day with eight men out for 95, and Robinson clean bowled the last two batsmen with only four runs added. The Barnsley bowler finished with 5 for 23, though in view of some rather mediocre bowling overnight, this return was perhaps a little flattering.

Turner sent down eight overs for six runs and two wickets, and Hargreaves, who would be so much more dangerous if only he would let himself go, and concentrate on bowling the outswinger, had 2 for 25.

Yorkshire began their second innings disastrously. Bottomley playing on to Siblees with only five scored. Barker and Harrison improved matters somewhat, but both left at 29. Harrison is clearly a batsman of promise, and with more experience of Minor County bowling he should make many runs.

Robinson's "Fireworks"

Kippax, who has struck a bad patch with the Colts, did not stay long, and Turner was again leg-before to Siblees, while soon after Wilson was brilliantly stumped by Elliott off Butterworth.

The remaining 20 minutes or so before lunch were most entertaining. Robinson, as usual, made up his mind that all slow bowling should be hit hard and often. He despatched Butterworth for six, the ball sailing over the road to land in the garden of a house opposite; hit three more boundaries, and when finally he fell to a catch in the covers by Williamson, he had collected a hectic 24, to the vast enjoyment of the spectators.

Pearson was unbeaten with 34 at lunch, and he continued to play excellent cricket until Place snapped up a catch at short leg to Siblees when he was five short of his half-century.

Pearson thus enjoyed the distinction of being top scorer in both innings, and he faced a formidable attack with such refreshing confidence and skill that it seems plain that Yorkshire have another first-class batsman in the making.

Siblees' Fine Analysis

Siblees and Butterworth quickly disposed of the tail, the former bringing his figures for the match to 10 for 58. He showed most impressive form throughout, swinging the ball tremendously, and keeping a perfect length. Butterworth bowled his spinners cleverly to take 3 for 21.

From the start Lancashire rarely seemed in difficulties when they set out to get 114 runs for victory, and after Place and Greenhalgh had laid a sure foundation, Nutter batted delightfully. When he cut Kippax for a single to win the game, Nutter was only one short of his 50.

Perhaps the most interesting feature of the Lancashire second innings was the successful introduction of Kippax as a spin bowler. After a somewhat erratic start, he bowled his leg breaks with real skill, and his promise is entirely misrepresented by an unprofitable analysis.

CHALLENGES BY LOWLY CLUBS

CENTURY BY FISHER

There were a few surprises in the Huddersfield League matches, one of these being in the game between Golcar, the leaders of Section "A," and Thongsbridge, who are at the bottom of the section, and have not yet won a match this season. Although Golcar beat their opponents, dismissing them for 95 runs, and thus strengthening their position, they could only set up a total of 136 on their own ground.

Slaithwaite, the runners-up, compiled a total of 209 for the loss of seven wickets in the limited time, but failed to dismiss Bradley Mills, another lowly club, in the allotted time, the match ending in a draw. The first three positions in the section remain unaltered, as Elland gained an easy victory over Kirkburton.

In Section B Broad Oak continued their excellent record by defeating Shepley; but Marsden, who lost to Armitage Bridge, are ousted from second place by Paddock, who were much too good for Meltham Mills. Almondbury, who lost to Rastrick, still remain at third place, behind Marsden.

Individual Feats

Among the batsmen, N. Fisher, of Almondbury, came into the limelight in carrying out his bat for 120.

Commendable performances were also put up by G. Knight, of Slaithwaite, and F. Walker, of Paddock, with respective totals of 88 and 73.

Although most of the pitches were in favour of batsmen, bowlers found conditions favourable in at least two cases. H. Maffin, of Kirkheaton succeeded in capturing seven Meltham wickets for 21 runs, one wicket falling in each of the first six overs he bowled. The next best feat was that of D. Lockwood, who, playing with Armitage Bridge, took seven wickets for 24 runs, three of the wickets falling within the space of four balls.

Other bowlers who distinguished themselves were E. Riley, of Marsden (v. Armitage Bridge), with 6 for 39, and W. Dennis, of Elland (v. Kirkburton), with 6 for 82.

DURHAM OUTCLASS YORKSHIRE II.

Stand of 251 Follows Deadly Bowling

HICKMAN 166 NOT OUT

SOUTH SHIELDS, Monday
When Yorkshire Second Eleven met Durham here two years ago, they had the doubtful pleasure of watching C. L. Adamson and Gibbon put on 193 for the home county's first wicket. To-day they toiled under a blazing sun while Adamson and G. Hickman scored 251 for the third wicket, after Durham had dismissed the Colts for 106 on a wicket that should have delighted the heart of any batsman. At the close Durham led by 186 runs with half their wickets intact.

The Yorkshire Colts completely failed to cope with some ordinary accurate leg-break bowling by Elsdon, who on a pitch which gave him little help, took 6 wickets for 11 runs.

Winning the toss gave Yorkshire the use of a perfect wicket, but Bottomley and Barker found the bowling of Ellis and Howell very accurate and only 10 runs were scored in the first half-hour. At 29 Bottomley tried to cut a ball from Carr only to pull it into his wicket, and the 50 had hardly gone up when Elsdon got to work. In his second over he had both Wade and Pearson leg-before, and then G. Wilson was out in a most unfortunate manner. He slipped and fell when attempting a second run, and was run out.

Following his usual custom, Robinson lived dangerously until lunch time, while Barker continued to play splendid cricket. He treated the bowling on its merits, and made several fine cuts and drives.

After lunch, the Yorkshire batting was pathetic. The remaining men, with the exception of Crick, were intimidated by some good length leg-break bowling by Elsdon, who took four more wickets in 13 balls without a run being scored off him.

Barker's splendid innings ended at 86. He had batted for two hours for his 44, showing excellent judgment against an accurate attack; and his Yorkshire Council reputation has evidently not been lightly gained.

Elsdon certainly deserved a good analysis, for he managed to turn the ball appreciably on a hard wicket and he kept a consistently good length, but his final figures were a trifle flattering.

Durham lost Gibbon and D. C. H. Townsend very early, but C. L. Adamson and Hickman made the Yorkshire bowling look very undistinguished, and scored at will.

Hickman rushed to his century in 24 hours, while Adamson completed a characteristically painstaking half-century in 2 hours 10 minutes, and continued his methodical way until, when only six short of his hundred, he flicked a ball from Nodder to leg for Barker to bring off a fine one-handed catch.

The third wicket had put on 251 in three hours, Adamson's 94 including a five and seven 4's.

Hickman remained unbeaten with a magnificent 166. So far he has hit 20 4's.

CRUSHING DEFEAT FOR COLTS

Durham Successful by an Innings and 88

BARKER'S EFFORT

SOUTH SHIELDS, Tuesday
Durham inflicted a crushing defeat on Yorkshire Second Eleven by an innings and 88 runs this afternoon.

Having declared with the lead of 186 runs gained overnight the home county found a wicket which suited their medium-fast bowlers admirably, and in less than two hours the Colts were dismissed for 98 runs, only a brave innings by Barker saving them from complete ignominy.

When Yorkshire took their first knock yesterday, they had only themselves to blame for their poor total; to-day there was some excuse for their failure, for a heavy sea mist which hung over the ground until mid-day drenched the outfield and made the wicket play queer tricks. Howell bowled superbly throughout, and finished with the splendid analysis of eight for 36.

Without the steady influence of such men as Turner, Davidson, Fisher, and W. E. Harbord, the Colts batting is woefully weak, nowadays, and from the start they never looked like making a fight of it in their second innings.

Crofts and Crick also left without making any material addition to the total, but Nodder filled the breach till lunch-time, while Barker, who had been watching the ball very carefully, continued to play the bowling with quiet confidence.

Nodder was beautifully caught at first slip by David Townsend when the eighth wicket had put on 36, and after a brief stand with his captain, Barker was beaten by a deadly ball from Howell. He had batted two hours for a most impressive 39.

After a merry skirmish by Colonel Chichester Constable the innings died a natural death at 98. Hargreaves providing Howell with his eighth victim.

DISASTROUS DAY FOR COLTS

All Out for 29 Against Northumberland!

WORST OF THE WEEK

From Our Special Representative

NEWCASTLE, Wednesday
Yorkshire Second Eleven fared badly enough against Durham at the beginning of the week, but their abject failure against Northumberland here to-day beggars adequate description.

Rain prevented play until after lunch, and when Northumberland, struggling on a difficult wicket, were dismissed in two hours for 88, it did not seem beyond the powers of the colts to gain the first innings lead.

Any hopes of such reward, however, were effectively shattered right at the start, and in just over an hour the whole side were dismissed for 29 runs.

The only consolation to a Yorkshire onlooker was that this amazing route was achieved by a Yorkshireman—Arthur Booth, the former Huddersfield League left-arm slow bowler, who last played for the colts on this ground four years ago, when he took eight Northumberland wickets.

Booth, now professional to the Northumberland County Club, swung the ball tremendously, and while he pitched it well up to the batsman, he never lost his accuracy. He finished with 7 wickets for 25 runs, and Allan, with whom he bowled unchanged, sent down 12 overs for 4 runs and 3 wickets.

Northumberland had an hour and half to bat before the close, and they lost three wickets for 90 in their second innings, H. C. Lee and J. Mutch putting on 49 for the third wicket by most attractive cricket. As a result, Northumberland resume to-morrow with a lead of 149, and seven wickets in hand.

The Great Struggle for Runs

The first innings of each side can be briefly summarised. Northumberland never looked like making many runs, for the hot sunshine after lunch soon made the pitch begin to play queer tricks. Hargreaves was right out of form, and he bowled a great number of long hops on the leg side, which, however, rarely received the punishment they deserved.

Nodder and Robinson were both accurate, and the latter turned the ball considerably and a wicket well suited to him, finishing with 3 for 21. Several good catches were held, the best being a brilliant effort by Wade in the slips to Hargreaves, while Crick kept wicket splendidly.

The ball was "popping" in a most disconcerting manner when Yorkshire went in, and from the first they seemed quite overcome by the conditions. Bottomley, Wade and Barker were all lbw by the time the score had reached 17, and the majority of the remaining batsmen gave themselves up in a pathetic manner.

A typical victim was Crofts, who held his bat out hopefully to a ball from Allan and spooned a simple catch straight into the bowler's hands without ever looking at the ball as he made his shot.

Barker alone could exact some satisfaction from this sorry innings, for he was top scorer for the third time on the tour.

BETTER FIGHT PUT UP BY COLTS

But Northumberland Win by 97 Runs

ROBINSON'S EFFORT

From Our Special Representative

NEWCASTLE, Thursday
The defeat foreshadowed by Yorkshire Second Eleven's abject failure in their first innings against Northumberland, was suffered by a margin of 97 runs here today. Northumberland, leading by 149 runs overnight, scored quietly when play was resumed, and with J. Mutch playing an admirable innings of 85, they totalled 182 runs.

Yorkshire were thus set to get 242 for victory, but to anyone who had watched their pathetic collapse of yesterday the principal question was the number of runs by which they would eventually fall. As it happened, the wicket rolled out surprisingly well for the last innings, and the Colts put up a better fight Robinson in particular refusing to be daunted by the state of the game.

Northumberland were not to be denied, however, and with Wilson and Robson bowling well, the home county dismissed the Colts for 144, this victory being their third in succession.

Wickets came almost as steadily as runs this morning, and though Mutch was eminently sound, he found no-one to stay with him for long. He completed his 50 in an hour and forty minutes, and he was last out, having hit ten boundaries in his 85.

Hargreaves More Accurate

Hargreaves was much more accurate to-day, and he maintained his pace well during a long spell of 70 minutes. He took three wickets for 45, but Robinson came out with the best analysis—five for 56.

Judging from the way in which Bottomley and Barker set about their task, one would hardly have thought that so long a total faced Yorkshire in their second innings, but unfortunately this early promise was not borne out by the rest of the side, always excepting Robinson, who gave a most refreshing exhibition of big hitting.

Bottomley had made an excellent 13 when he was leg-before to Wilson, and Barker again batted really well for his 26. A number of successful appeals for lbw put heart into the Northumberland side, however, and before the end of the innings batsmen were being given out to appeals from such surprising positions as squareleg.

Robinson scored his 47 in just over half an hour, hitting Allen for one tremendous six on to the roof of a house outside the ground, and with Wilson he put on 50 in 30 minutes. Altogether he hit eight boundaries.

The remaining four wickets fell cheaply on his dismissal, and Robson finished with 4 for 14, while Wilson, who bowled both medium-paced swingers and slow off spinners with considerable effect, claimed 4 for 37.

PROMISE OF BREARLEY

CASTLEFORD, Wednesday

The form shown by the Yorkshire Second Eleven on their visit to Tyne-side was too bad to be repeated, and it was a relief to see them playing better cricket in every department against a useful Staffordshire side here to-day. Batting first on a perfect wicket, Staffordshire scored 220, and when stumps were drawn this evening the Colts were 41 runs behind with six wickets in hand.

Three changes were made in the Yorkshire side, J. A. Richardson, the Scarborough batsman; H. Brearley, the Leeds University captain; and F. Wilkinson, an all-rounder from Hull, coming in for Crofts, Wade, and G. A. Wilson. And on to-day's showing all these changes were more than justified, for Brearley played a beautiful innings of 32, which one hopes will continue to prosper on the morrow; Richardson, though not so sound in defence, helped Brearley to add 51 for the fourth wicket; and Wilkinson bowled his in-swingers very steadily, his material success being no true index of his ability.

Successful Bowling by Robinson

Staffordshire started well, some stylish batting by C. C. Clarke—obviously a player of real class—making the bowling look quite simple. He was splendidly caught by Crick on the leg side at 36, and after Hargreaves had performed a signal service by bowling Stanley Crump—always a dangerous batsman—we saw a good innings by A. B. Hollowood, and a perfect display in miniature by that amazing veteran Sydney Barnes.

Hollowood was at the wicket two hours for his 57, and he allowed no scoring chance to escape him, while Barnes made some lovely shots on both sides of the wicket. He made only 14, but that 14 in the making was an admirable object lesson to young cricketers. He does not see the faster ball quite so surely as of old, but he plays medium-paced deliveries of any type with delightful ease and grace.

Hollowood's valuable innings ended at 145, and the Staffordshire tall took the score on at a good pace to the 200 mark, thanks to some vigorous hitting by Parkin, son of the old Lancashire bowler. Parkin makes no mistake about dealing with a long hop or a full toss, and he took advantage of a certain inaccuracy in Robinson's bowling towards the end, being unlucky to miss his half century by two runs. Robinson, who experimented with leg breaks for the first time in this class of cricket, came out with seven wickets for 87.

Colts' First Wicket Puts on 110

Barker and Bottomley looked quite capable of staying in for the rest of the first day, and they put on 110 for the Colts' first wicket. Both played some really fine shots, and Barker, who has been so consistent in recent matches, was awarded his Second Eleven Cup when he came in after scoring a first-rate 58 in 90 minutes. His defence was sound, and he made some glorious cover drives, while Bottomley showed us several well-timed cuts in his 42.

Pearson was soon out, but Brearley and Richardson were together till the close. Brearley played with admirable judgment on his first appearance in Minor County cricket, refusing to be tempted by the wiles of Barnes, and scoring with the greatest ease off the remaining bowlers. Most of his runs came from off drives. Richardson hits the loose ball hard, and seemed likely to settle down to one of his typical Yorkshire Council innings when he was beaten by Lawton in the last ten minutes of the day.

CASTLEFORD, Thursday

Yorkshire Second Eleven came into their own again here this evening, with a glorious victory over Staffordshire by seven wickets, after the most exciting finish imaginable.

They were set to score 172 runs in their second innings and, with two and a half hours in which to accomplish the feat, they appeared to have an excellent chance of winning their first match of the season. But when the extra half-hour was claimed, with praiseworthy optimism, by Colonel R. C. Chichester-Constable, over seventy runs were still needed.

Until then Bottomley had been batting well, but he had not been scoring fast enough. Pearson had just been run out, and the new batsman was Robinson, who is blessed with a wonderful eye, and one thrilling scoring stroke—a tremendous, slashing drive to long on.

Robinson is a variable quantity as a batsman; sometimes he is bowled hitting out before he has properly settled down, but if luck is on his side there is no batsman in Yorkshire more likely to change the whole aspect of a game by twenty minutes of volcanic activity.

Punishment for Barnes

This evening he rose to the occasion magnificently, and Bottomley opened out to play the innings of his life. The fourth wicket pair instantly fell upon the bowling with relentless determination, and for the remaining thirty minutes they flogged a despairing attack to every part of the ground.

Bottomley set a grand example, making a sudden onslaught on Sydney Barnes's, off whom he hit two sixes and a 4 in one over. This, incidentally, was Barnes's 23rd over without a break and, though Homer's action in keeping him on so long was open to criticism, he was the only bowler in the early stages who looked like curbing the rate of scoring.

Barnes was taken off at this point, but the unhappy Crump met with just as hostile a reception, Robinson finding his range with a powerful straight drive over the sight screen and then timing a half-volley perfectly to make a truly colossal hit out

of the ground in the same direction in the last over but one.

With two overs to go fourteen runs were still needed, and Robinson's aggressive treatment of Crump reduced this to five by the time Lawton took the ball for the final over. Each batsman scored a couple of singles, and then amid wild applause Bottomley drove the last delivery to the off. As if to clinch the victory, the winning run was followed by an overthrow for 4.

Good Batting by Ikin

This unexpected triumph was all the more acceptable for the fact that Yorkshire believed their last chance of points to have vanished in the morning, when their batsmen collapsed badly in the first innings, the last six wickets falling for a mere 36 runs. Accurate and skillful bowling by Backhouse, the left-hander, and Crump brought about this debacle, and to their surprise Staffordshire snatched a lead of five runs on the first innings.

When they went in again Staffordshire did not fare as well as they might have done on a wicket that was wearing remarkably well. A gallant eighth wicket stand between J. T. Ikin, a 17-year-old player, and Backhouse put on 51 runs, Ikin playing beautifully correct and stylish cricket to score 43. The remainder found Hargreaves, Robinson, and the l.b.w. rule too much for them, and though Yorkshire made many mistakes in the field the total only reached 166.

The final stage began in none too promising a fashion for the Colts, for Barnes lured Barker to his doom with only 14 runs scored, and a bad call by Bottomley resulted in Brearley's dismissal just when the latter had settled down. Pearson and Bottomley were unduly cautious in putting the last half hour atoned for these early misfortunes.

SECOND DEFEAT OF CASTLEFORD

After Sending in Hull to Bat

COUNTY COLT IN FORM

The Yorkshire Council leaders, Morley, were engaged in the first round of the Heavy Woollen Cup competition, and as Castleford, who were defeated, there will be some tightening up in the struggle at the top.

It is Castleford's second defeat and was sustained at Hull. Castleford won the toss and sent in Hull to bat—a procedure which seemed justified when the first three wickets fell for nine runs. Generally, scores were exceptionally high. At Ackworth 401 runs were scored for the loss of 11 wickets. Ackworth led off with 107 for the first wicket and declared at 228 for seven, of which H. Johnson made 72. Yet this innings contained a "hat trick" by Bates, when he came on a second time. Glass Houghton were never in danger of defeat, and at drawing-time were only 32 runs short of victory and had lost only four wickets. R. Bowness, who is in great form this season, made 80 for the visitors.

In the drawn game between Brodsworth Main and Rawmarsh 431 runs were scored for the loss of only 13 wickets. The top scorer was W. Rippon, of Rawmarsh, with 82, while the best performance for Brodsworth was again by S. Butler, who opened with 63 and later took four wickets for 63.

In a heavy scoring match a first-wicket stand for Hicketon between Turner and Routledge put on 216 against Mitchells Main, Turner hitting sixteen fours and a six and Routledge eleven fours. For six and Routledge a partnership between Smith and Kilner realised 114, Smith making nine and Kilner six fours.

South Yorkshire games generally produced many runs; but none was more exciting than that in which Rossington Main defeated Monckton, who had declared at 200 for seven, apparently in a good position. But Rossington went out for the runs, and the opening pair, J. Harkin and E. Robinson, had got well past the century before the former was dismissed. Hurricane hitting was continued when W. Widdison joined Robinson for the third wicket, and sixes and fours came very frequently, and Rossington won just on time, with seven wickets in hand.

Another fine not out innings by D. F. Fletcher of 74 for Bentley Colliery to draw at home with South Kirkby. The highest scorer of the match was A. Walsh, who opened for South Kirkby, and after making 101 was third out, with the score at 158. A feature of the game was the smart fielding by both sides, and not a single extra was given on either side.

Otley Recruit's Success

A fifth wicket stand of 112 runs for Otley was a feature of the local "Derby" game between Burley-in-Wharfedale and Otley, and it was largely instrumental in Otley winning by 84 runs. The Burley captain, W. Harrison, won the toss, and to Otley's surprise, put them in to bat. His move appeared to be justified when four wickets went down for 78 runs, but R. Scarr and T. Kilmartin then carried the total to 187.

Scarr was the first to go, only eight runs short of his century. His 92 included 15 fours and a five. He was only promoted to the Otley first team this season, and this was his highest score. Kilmartin's 66 included 11 boundaries. Otley declared at 241 for eight, leaving Burley 140 minutes to bat. Burley failed by ten minutes to save the game, being all out for 157.

Steeeton declared at 227 for seven at Menston, J. Battersby making 62 and I. Shackleton 58. Menston failed to bat time out by 20 minutes, being dismissed for 122.

Pontefract gained their first "double" of the season and their first home victory very decisively at the expense of East Ardsley, who are having a lean time. The feature of Pontefract's total of 195 was a delightful display by R. Clark, a recruit from the second team, who made 53. East Ardsley lost eight wickets for 45, the ninth fell at 72, and the innings closed at this total. Burgoyne took four wickets for 12 runs.

E. Howarth scored the first century for Barnsley this season after the team had lost three wickets for 13, and E. P. Robinson, the Yorkshire County player, hit up 54, chiefly by means of nine boundaries and a six. In the time allowed them Barnsley scored 210 for the loss of seven wickets, and dismissed Rotherham for 99. Robinson took seven wickets for 40.

Excitement at Harrogate

Sheffield United appeared to have a fairly easy task when they got Harrogate out for 184 at Harrogate, but their first four batsmen made a poor show, and had it not been for a fifth wicket stand between Wall and Bentley, victory for Harrogate would have been sure. Sheffield, with one wicket to fall, needed ten runs to win, when stumps were drawn after an exciting half hour, in which three batsmen went for eight runs. For the visitors, Bentley took seven wickets for 43 runs, and he had five maidens in his 18 overs.

Wath defeated Mexborough for the second time this season. They lost four wickets for 57, but a fifth wicket stand between T. K. Hargreaves and Wilson put on 79 and gave the side renewed confidence. Then H. Hibbert, a young fast bowler from the second team, caused a collapse of the Mexborough side, taking seven wickets in nine overs for 11 runs; but it must be said that a lot of bad batting was a contributory factor to this feat.

Essex had a seven wickets victory over Swinton, mainly due to the splendid bowling of White, who took six Swinton wickets for 52 runs, and the spectacular hitting of W. Lax, (110 not out), whose century occupied 120 minutes, and included 20 boundary hits. Swinton made 195 and Essex replied with 197, with only 3 wickets down.

Fielding Errors

Ilkley, on their own ground, could only draw with Earby, but had not the fielding of the home team been unusually poor, there was a possibility that they might have forced a win. Batting first, Ilkley declared after scoring 223 for six wickets in two hours and 20 minutes. Earby were given five minutes longer than Ilkley for their innings, but, though they batted quite well, the pace was not fast enough to force a win. R. Barraclough gave an excellent display to score 82 not out. Five wickets were down for 178 when time expired.

Leeds Zingari were no test for Doncaster Town. They laboured on to 104 and Doncaster hit off the runs for the loss of three wickets in about an hour.

Less than three hours' cricket sufficed to decide the game between Allerton Bywater and Hemsworth. Hemsworth were never comfortable against Wall and White, who took five wickets each for 32 and 42 runs respectively, and they were out for 80. Allerton lost four batsmen for 64, but Gossarham and Flaher hit off the required runs without being parted.

YORKSHIRE COLTS OUTPLAYED

Another Durham Victory in Sight

From Our Special Representative

MIDDLESBROUGH, Wednesday

Durham inflicted an innings defeat on Yorkshire Second Eleven at South Shields a fortnight ago, and judging by the Colts' sorry showing in the return match which began here at Acklam Park to-day the memory of that disastrous failure is not likely to be avenged.

When T. K. Dobson won the toss one feared an enormous total would be piled up against Yorkshire, for with a sun baked wicket and glorious summer weather prevailing everything seemed to favour the batsmen, but half the side was dismissed for a mere 109 runs, and the Colts were just beginning to contemplate a substantial first innings lead with glee when that amazing batsman Jack Carr appeared on the scene. For 23 delirious minutes he slashed, drove, and hooked, and when he left, having scored 65 out of 71, quite a different aspect had been put on the game.

Durham eventually scored 315 and Yorkshire were always struggling against accurate bowling by Howell and Ellis on a wicket already beginning to crumble. Only J. A. Richardson looked confident and though he found only G. A. Wilson to stay with him for any appreciable period he completed a fine half century. The Yorkshire tail refused to imitate its Durham counterpart and the total of 145 left the Colts 170 runs behind—an unenviable legacy for to-morrow.

Durham made an unexpectedly poor start, for Gibbon ran himself out before he had scored, Hickman was soon bowled by Hargreaves, and Bates was l.b.w. to Lamb, the Ecclehill (Bradford League) all-rounder, who last appeared for the Colts against Northumberland some seven years ago. Randle and Dobson improved the situation, the former playing a sound innings of 41, while his captain for the first time this season found his real form, and cutting and driving with power he completed an attractive half century before he was bowled, playing forward to Bottomley, at 109.

Ward and Raine then played steady cricket until lunch, both reaching their thirties. Ward was out to an unworthy shot after lunch, and then came Carr and a veritable monument of runs.

Carr's Furious Innings

Boundaries came at will and the 200 went up in two and a quarter hours. Carr showed a particular liking for Hargreaves and when he had scored 47 in 19 minutes he set about the fast bowling with such furious intent that every one of the first four balls was smashed for six, the last two being hit clean out of this big ground. The fifth seemed out to show a similar fate, but it was likely for four and still lashing out, Carr's whirlwind assault ended with the last delivery which bowled him. He had taken 46 runs off two consecutive overs from Hargreaves and altogether he hit five sixes and six fours.

Latchford and Howell offered further unwelcome resistance to a dejected attack and the third century was passed in three hours before their innings closed. Crick wicket magnificently throughout and kept wicket concession was one boundary bye, his sole concession was the depressing analysis of 4 Hargreaves had the depressing analysis of 4 Hargreaves for 129 and Hutton's two wickets wickets for 64 runs.

From the start Yorkshire never looked like saving the follow on. Hutton was a victim of the new l.b.w. rule in Howell's first over and the only stand of consequence was for the sixth wicket when J. A. Richardson and G. A. Wilson put on 44 runs. Richardson combined aggression with a Richardson defence and his driving was perfectly timed and particularly powerful on the off side. Ellis, who captured four cheap wickets, was making the ball pop up disconcertingly unnecessarily by Wilkinson and accelerated unnecessarily for the batsmen. Lamb, who were both run out. The wicket promises to be very unpleasant for the batsmen to-morrow, and if Durham do not enforce the follow on Yorkshire's task in a fourth innings, is, indeed unenviable in contemplation.

GALLANT RECOVERY BY COLTS

Return Match with Durham Easily Saved

MIDDLESBROUGH, Thursday

Fortune swung round in favour of the Yorkshire Second Eleven most unexpectedly to-day, and in the end they had no difficulty in saving their return match with Durham at Acklam Park.

T. K. Dobson enforced the follow-on when play was continued this morning, but an early collapse in Yorkshire's second innings was soon arrested, and with Hutton playing a grand innings of 88, and G. A. Wilson, J. A. Richardson, Crick and Lamb all contributing in varying degrees to the Colts' gallant recovery the respectable total of 311 was amassed.

Durham were left with a possible 90 minutes in which to score 142 runs for victory. But Carr was not given a chance to repeat his hurricane assault of yesterday, and the match petered out uneventfully. The original batting order was adhered to, and Durham had lost three wickets for 58 at the close, thus finishing 84 runs behind.

During the game, the splendid wicket-keeping of Crick, and Richardson's competent batting received fitting recognition from the Colts captain, who awarded both players their second eleven caps.

Colts Lose 3 Wickets for 14

Yorkshire's second innings began with such a series of catastrophes that one hardly expected play to last till lunch time. The first three wickets fell for 14 runs, Barker being caught at the wicket, flicking at one of Ellis's swingers, Bottomley being out to a remarkable one-handed catch at long-on by Hickman, and Pearson also providing a victim for the wicket-keeper. He flourished his bat at a succession of rising balls from Howell outside the off stump, and his ultimate dismissal at 14 came as no surprise.

Durham were unlucky to lose Raine, their wicket-keeper, just before the third wicket fell. He retired with a damaged finger, and Ward took his place behind the stumps for the rest of the day.

A capital fourth-wicket stand by J. A. Richardson and Hutton, who put on 77 in an hour, did much to revive Yorkshire hopes. Richardson drove powerfully on both sides of the wicket, and when he was leg before to Latchford for an invaluable 39 his excellent example was followed by Wilkinson, who batted very nicely until lunch.

Hutton's Serene Way

Meanwhile Hutton had been going from strength to strength. Very subdued at the start, he gradually opened out, and his perfect footwork and timing made the bowling of Howell, Ellis, and Carr look singularly lacking in guile. Wilkinson left immediately after the interval, but Hutton went his serene way till Ellis beat him with a quick off-break at 183. He had batted nearly three hours for a chanceless 88 and hit 11 boundaries.

For the remainder of the afternoon we watched some admirable cricket by the Yorkshire "tail," who showed surprising confidence on a wicket which already had several ugly "spots" at each end. Wilson played an innings of real distinction. His driving through the covers had both strength and grace, and he made a number of neat leg glances and cuts. Lamb proved a steady partner, and the seventh wicket put on 71. Later, Crick made a really workmanlike 30, and when the innings was declared, Wilson was unbeaten with a capital 69.

Durham Thwarted

There seemed just a chance that Durham might get the runs if the extra half-hour was claimed, but the bowling of Lamb and Hutton was too steady for them. Hutton again flighted his leg breaks with real skill, and he dismissed both Gibbon and Bates before the match dragged to its appointed end at six o'clock.

Century Against South Africa

Last Seven Wickets Go Down for 17 Runs

NEW BRIGHTON, Wednesday

It was apparent from the start that Yorkshire Second XI. had a weak bowling side for their Minor County championship match against Cheshire here to-day, but no one could have foreseen such a dismal batting failure as that which occurred after they had dismissed Cheshire for 225. They were put out for 105 after a good start.

Two changes were made in the Yorkshire side, the places of Hutton and Wilkinson being taken by the Cambridge Blues, N. W. D. Yardley and P. A. Gibb. It was expected that the experience of first-class cricket gained by both players during the University programme this season would make them valuable recruits to the Colts, but, unfortunately, neither batsman reproduced his true form.

Cheshire had to bat under by far the more difficult conditions, for the wicket was drying out in the hot sunshine after early morning rain, and up to lunch-time the ball was popping in a most disconcerting manner.

Barker's Effort

Worthington and G. A. McEntyre gave them a good start, taking their courage into their hands and hitting bravely whenever a chance presented itself.

R. M. Dutton played a sound innings of 30, and L. N. Jones, who has been such a menace to Yorkshire bowlers in past years, gratefully accepted the invitation implied by a succession of full tosses and long hops from J. A. Richardson and others to run up a lightning 33 which included six boundaries.

Still, Cheshire were in none too strong a position with eight wickets down for 154. Unexpected resistance came from Barber, the New Brighton professional, and A. R. Crook. Barber played most attractive cricket for three-quarters of an hour, scoring freely by hooks, drives, and leg-glances, and nine fours were the principal scoring shots in his 54, the ninth wicket adding 70 runs.

First-Rate Fielding

Lamb, who took five for 81, was easily the best of the Yorkshire bowlers, but Wilson kept a comparatively good length in a long spell. The Yorkshire fielding was first rate, Yardley taking three catches—one a splendid effort close in on the leg side—and Richardson and Wilson also showed up well.

Yorkshire's sorry collapse which followed does not bear too critical an analysis. From the start they were struggling against some hostile fast-medium bowling by Bartley and Barber, who shared the wickets, and the only bright spot in the innings was the second-wicket partnership between Bottomley and Barber.

Brave Hitting

While these two were together, runs came steadily, though never easily, and the task of scoring over 300 for a useful lead did not seem out of the Colts' province. Barber watched the ball carefully, and making his usual confident off-side shots, gave an admirable display of forceful yet well-judged batting against an attack of unwavering accuracy and perpetual keenness.

Once this stand was broken the Yorkshire batsmen marched in a pitiful procession to and from the wicket. Success invigorated the two Cheshire bowlers, who were backed up by fielding even keener and more polished than the Colts had shown earlier in the day.

The last seven men were dismissed for a beggarly 17 runs, and Barber and Bartley reaped a rich harvest for their industrious and inspired assault.

COLTS BEATEN BY AN INNINGS

Cheshire Win Exciting Race Against Time

ONLY ONE STAND

NEW BRIGHTON, Thursday

Cheshire won an exciting race against the clock to beat Yorkshire Colts by an innings and five runs here this evening.

Heavy rain overnight prevented play until nearly four o'clock, but two and a half hours sufficed to dismiss the Colts for 116 in their second innings—a most creditable total in view of the fact that they had to contend with an inspired attack and brilliant fielding on a wicket which must have conformed to the general impression of a batsman's nightmare.

Barber was swinging the ball yards at the start, and he bowled Barber with a truly remarkable delivery. The ball pitched outside the off stump after swinging through the air, and finished up by knocking back the leg stump.

Bottomley and P. A. Gibb batted well for a time, and both fell to splendid catches, Dennis taking a snick from Bottomley head high on his left-hand side in the slips.

The best batting of the innings came from N. W. D. Yardley and Pearson, who put on 40 for the fourth wicket.

Yardley has obviously improved a great deal during the present season, and he played with much more restraint than he has previously shown. Watching the ball carefully, he was at the wickets for an hour, and his 23 runs were made in the main by neat cuts and glides.

Pearson was more aggressive, making several grand off-drives, but his defence was not quite so sound. He was first to go, and then Yardley immediately fell to Barber, the ball swinging across to hit the off stump.

Jones made a great catch in the slips to send back Wilson, and Lamb hit up a bright 13, only to forget the new rule, and play Jones with his pads at 102.

The last half hour was full of incident. Hargreaves sent in out of his turn, was rapped smartly on the knuckles by Barber, and caught and bowled off the next delivery. Then Richardson, who had been playing a heroic part for 40 minutes just touched one of Jones's spinners, and Barber dived to make the catch one-handed at first slip.

Fifteen minutes were left when Colonel Chichester Constable joined Crick and the score advanced by snicks, hurried singles and no-balls till Worthington, the Cheshire captain, who had been waiting on the end of the bat, made a catch at short-leg to give his side a great victory.

DURHAM IN POOR FORM

Lowest Total Against a Side Touring this Country

WICKET NOT ENTIRELY TO BLAME

SUNDERLAND, Wednesday

Durham County batsmen made a poor showing against the South Africans in the two-days match which began at Ashbrooke, here, yesterday. Durham entertain all the touring sides which visit England, and their total of 45 is the lowest they have made against any touring team. The South Africans were 181 ahead at the close with two wickets to fall.

Heavy rain during the night so affected the specially prepared wicket that the captains decided upon another wicket being used, and when T. K. Dobson won the toss and decided to bat first, his decision was open to criticism.

Whatever the difficulties of the pitch, Durham's batting was pitifully weak. Perhaps the mistakes of the early batsmen upset the rest of the side. They started by Gibbon, forgetting the new lbw rule applying in this match, deliberately lifting his bat and using his pads. That was off the fifth ball of the match, and before another run had been scored D. C. H. Townsend, the Oxford Blue, who has had more experience of first-class cricket than any other member of the County side, was rather foolishly run out. C. L. Adamson played a ball to mid-on, started to run, and then turned back when Townsend was well on his way to the same end.

Adamson and T. K. Dobson made a stand for half an hour before Adamson fell to the new lbw rule, but after that the Durham batting was merely a succession of failures, and the whole side were out in an hour and 25 minutes. The bowling of Langton and Vincent was steady, but its danger was obviously magnified by the Durham batsmen.

Unenterprising Batting

Under the influence of a drying wind, the wicket was improving all the time, so that when the South Africans went in the pitch was fairly easy, but the visitors were surprisingly unenterprising and they took ten minutes longer to reach Durham's total than the home county had done. In that period they lost the wickets of Rowan and Mitchell.

Rowan fell to a fine ball from Howell which took his off-stump, and Mitchell never appeared comfortable facing Howell and Ellis.

Viljoen played rather stodgy cricket for two hours and ten minutes in obtaining his 85, and had only seven 4's to his credit. Nourse showed real class in hitting 34, and R. T. Williams had a crisp knock of 39. Then he was run out by the only piece of Durham fielding which caused any danger to the visitors in this respect. Carter returned the ball quickly for Wilson to break the wickets while the batsmen were attempting a second run.

DURHAM BATSMEN FAIL AGAIN

Innings Win for South Africans

The Durham batsmen again failed badly against the South African attack here to-day, and the Minor Counties side was beaten by an innings and 45 runs.

Apart from the fact that the South Africans had the best bowling that has been seen from any of the touring sides at Ashbrooke in recent years, Durham's failure may be partly due to the fact that so many of its players, mindful of the collapse in the first innings, adopted a restraint which is entirely foreign to their natural style of play.

The last two South African wickets carried the score to 231, thus giving the South Africans a lead of 186 on the first innings.

There seemed a reasonable prospect of Durham making a good show when D. C. H. Townsend, the Oxford "blue," and George Hickman carried the score to 77 for the loss of two wickets, but Dobson and Latchford again failed, and with seven of the wickets down for 105 at lunch it was only by Ellis hitting out at everything later that the score was reasonably advanced.

Townsend gave a very fine display of on and off-driving before the new rule claimed him as a victim. He showed a particular aptitude for the square drive to the leg boundary, and no fewer than four of his five 4's were obtained by this method.

The little bit of grease on the top of the wicket gave Langton a lot of assistance, and his seven wickets in Durham's second innings only cost him 38 runs. Thus, in the match, he had 11 wickets for 52 runs.

Hawkwood was the unluckiest, for after Jacques had struck him a severe blow on the thigh in his second over, the batsman pulled another rising ball on to his face, and was compelled to retire. He has a badly bruised cheek-bone, and he was unable to resume his innings in the afternoon.

Lancashire eventually totalled 282, and had not P. A. Gibb come to the rescue with another admirable innings, Yorkshire would have fared disastrously in the closing stages of the day. As it is, they finished up 127 runs behind with five of their best men out.

Adventurous Nutter

The home county had every reason to be satisfied with their work before lunch. Greenhalgh played stylish cricket, and it was a great relief to Yorkshire when he was leg-before to Robinson at 57. But no bowling change could curb the adventurous Nutter, who used his feet well, and timed his shots beautifully on the leg-side. He had scored 32 at the interval, and after lunch he punished an inaccurate attack unmercifully.

T. A. Higson and J. Heaton, the England Rucker international, looked acutely uncomfortable against Jacques, and neither stayed very long, but Nutter fell upon the short-pitched deliveries of Wilson and Robinson with great enthusiasm. Wilson sent down a wearisome succession of long hops on the leg-side, and the fact that his ten overs cost him 48 runs without any reward gives some idea of the disappointing form he showed.

Nutter rounded off his innings with an aggression that was quite startling, hitting several 4's to the pavilion, and 6 which scattered county members in all directions. Altogether he had 14 boundaries and a 6 in his 84, scored in just under two hours.

Assisted by an unpretentious 44 from Parkinson, the "tall" wagged satisfactorily, and Robinson, with 4 for 68, was the bowler to suffer least when the final reckoning was made.

Gibb in Fine Form

Yorkshire had roughly two and a quarter hours to bat, and Barker and Gibb gave them a sound start, putting on 48 runs. Gibb was missed in the slips early on, but he deserved his good fortune. His footwork was faultless, and he hooked the fast bowling with masterly precision. He never appeared in any difficulty, and he made his 70 runs in one and three-quarter hours. Harrison and Brearley lending unobtrusive but valuable support.

YORKSHIRE COLTS HARD PRESSED

Seventh-Wicket Stand Foils Lancashire

REMARKABLE BOWLING BY YARDLEY

From Our Special Representative
OLD TRAFFORD, Tuesday

Lancashire Second Eleven took the major points for their first innings lead of 38 over Yorkshire here to-day, the return match between the two sides ending in a draw.

The closing stages of the game were not so lacking in incident as one expected when Yorkshire, left to score 225 for victory in two and a quarter hours, began their second innings, for an inspired spell by the Australian spin bowler, Bennett, caused a sudden collapse, which was only stemmed by a determined stand for the seventh wicket.

Yorkshire had only themselves to blame for the formidable proportions of the task confronting them when H. R. W. Butterworth declared, for had they held their catches, and not thrown away countless valuable runs by fielding of the most slovenly nature, they might well have gained revenge for the heavy Whitsuntide defeat at Wakefield.

Attractive Batting

G. A. Wilson and Pearson batted very nicely when the Yorkshire first innings was continued this morning, and Pearson made an attractive 38 before he played tentatively at a ball wide of his off stump—an old failing—and was caught at the wicket.

Robinson, who is never deterred by the state of the game, gave his customary exhibition of forceful cricket, starting with two fours off Butterworth, and smiting the same bowler for a grand 6 into the pavilion enclosure soon afterwards. He scored 23 in ten minutes before an appalling cross shot to the wrong ball from Greenhalgh put an end to his adventures, and Wilson, by way of a contrast, was leg before to Greenhalgh for the same score—after a stay of an hour and 20 minutes.

Unexpected resistance from the tall, Lamb hitting bravely and with excellent judgment, took the total to respectable dimensions, the innings closing for 244.

Brilliant Greenhalgh

Everything in the Lancashire second innings was overshadowed by the batting of Greenhalgh, who drove strongly, and hit hard on the leg side during a stay of 2½ hours.

Admittedly the Yorkshire bowling had little sting about it, and it was further weakened by the absence of Robinson for an hour after lunch, owing to a slight touch of sunstroke, but Greenhalgh's neat footwork and varied stroke play, combined with a praiseworthy inclination for attacking the bowling at the slightest opportunity made a distinct impression.

Wilson bowled better than he has done for a long time, and he was desperately unlucky not to get Higson's wicket, for the latter was dropped twice, the second chance being the easiest of catches to extra cover. Higson snickered and sliced with rare enthusiasm, but his fortune was too good to last, and after an adventurous hour, he was well caught in the slips.

The bowler was Yardley, brought on as a last resort, and he met with such startling success that his role as third change will clearly have to be revised.

Deadly Bowling

Bowling at rather faster than medium pace, with a lively action, he sends down a really deadly in-swing, and J. Heaton, the Rucker international, was hopelessly beaten, the first ball he received coming back sharply, and at a surprising pace off the pitch.

Yardley continued his triumphant way by dismissing Bennett in the next over, and at this stage he had claimed three victims in seven balls without a run being scored off him. Greenhalgh and Parkinson prevented a debacle, and just before tea Butterworth declared with a lead of 224.

The final phase of the match was not a little disturbing to Yorkshire minds, for Barker showed an unsuspected dislike to fast bowling, and Gibb played a lawn tennis shot at a bumper from Edge, to be most unluckily dismissed by a catch at first leg. Then Bennett, brought on for the first time, bowled his "googlies" with devastating effect, beating Barker, Pearson, and Yardley in quick succession.

Subsequently he became less accurate, and Wilson treated him with cavalier disdain, scoring 39 in faultless style by well-timed hooks and drives before stumps were drawn ten minutes from the end of the extra half-hour.

COLTS IN SCORING MOOD

Two Centuries Against Cheshire

BRILLIANT GIBB

Visitors Facing Their First Defeat

By Our Special Correspondent

HALIFAX, Wednesday

Cheshire came to Yorkshire to-day with an unbeaten record in the Minor Counties Championship, but their bowlers tolled vainly while the Colts gave their finest batting display of the season, and it seems highly improbable that the visiting county will evade the follow-on. When stumps were drawn this evening they still needed 127, and six of their best men were out.

P. A. Gibb has shown us already this week that his glorious innings against Notts was but a taste of further triumphs to come, and to-day he followed up his 70 against Lancashire II, with a brilliant century.

Though he scored slowly before lunch, he was never in difficulties with an accurate fast-medium attack, and after the interval he opened out delightfully, hooking, cutting, and driving with the certainty and ease of a master batsman.

Bottomley played another valuable innings, completing his second century for the Colts in just over 2½ hours.

Bottomley Forces the Pace

It would not be fair to make comparisons in this instance, for Bottomley was always forcing the pace, and when runs are being scored fast to enable a fitting declaration, one can overlook minor blemishes which might not have been evident in more leisurely circumstances. Sufficient to say that Bottomley hit the loose ball very hard on both sides of the wicket, and his late cutting was beautifully timed.

Pearson, the Scarborough batsman, returned to form with an admirable half-century, and H. Brearley confirmed the promise he showed in his first game, at Castleford, with a sound 33, made at a time when Bartley, Barber and Dutton were bowling really well.

The Colts lost Barker with only eight scored, after half an hour of excessively cautious batting, but Gibb and Brearley settled down to put on 70 for the second wicket. Brearley was rather unlucky in the manner of his dismissal, just before lunch, for a ball from Dennis shot straight into the air off the shoulder of his bat, and Worthington, the wicket-keeper, ran forward to make the catch.

Change Bowlers Punished

The Cheshire bowling was gradually tamed after lunch, and Dutton, the left-hander, who had been bowling with plenty of life and quite accurately, lost his length, Bottomley hitting him for a grand six to the scoreboard.

The regular bowlers failing to make any impression, Worthington gambled with several of his reserves, and Gibb thoroughly enjoyed himself, reaching his maiden century for the Colts with a six and a 4 off tury for the Colts with a six and a 4 off successive balls from A. L. MacEntyre.

He had then batted just over three hours and, casting care to the winds, he began to lash at everything. He was almost stumped off one of Dennis's leg breaks, but, undeterred, he continued to tempt the fates until he was bowled in the same over.

His had been an innings of the highest class, marked by perfectly timed stroke play all round the wicket, and he hit one 6 and no fewer than 13 4's.

Disjointed Attack

Best Work of Season Against Cheshire

LAMB BOWLS WELL

HALIFAX, Thursday

Yorkshire Second Eleven avenged their defeat at New Brighton last month with a sweeping victory over Cheshire by an innings and 34 runs here this afternoon.

Cheshire had not previously lost a match this season, but on this showing they were a vastly inferior side to their opponents. Yorkshire showed easily their best form of the season in every department, and the accurate bowling of Lamb, who took 5 for 36, had much to do with their success in Cheshire's second innings.

Brearley's Fine Catch

The last four wickets added 46 runs when Cheshire continued their first innings this morning. As soon as R. M. Dutton left to a brilliant catch at short leg by Brearley, it was seen that they had little chance of averting the follow-on, and a brave but unavailing innings by J. A. McEntyre only served to defer their fate.

Dutton was top scorer with a hard hit 39, which included seven 4's, but his preference for hitting across the line of the ball did not inspire confidence, and the rest of the Cheshire tall—J. A. McEntyre excepted—did not err with so much success. Jacques came out with 4 for 70, and Robinson took 2 for 27, while Yardley, who opened the bowling this morning, sent down six very accurate overs to confirm his early promise.

Improvement of Dennis

Cheshire began again with a substantial overdraft, and before lunch they lost four valuable wickets for 112.

Jacques struck a shrewd blow by dismissing J. D. Worthington, and soon after G. A. McEntyre was—to his own amazement and Yorkshire's satisfaction—leg batted to Lamb under the new rule. His brother, J. A. McEntyre, was not given a chance to repeat his stubborn resistance of the first innings, and Jacques took a good catch off his own bowling to send back Canevell.

Dennis—a vastly improved cricketer since his Yorkshire days—watched the ball with great care. He reached his 50 out of 71 in an hour, but the lunch interval proved his undoing. Immediately afterwards, he fell to a catch at mid-off in trying to pull Jacques. He had a daring 6—a pull off his middle stump to square leg—and 8 fours in his 60.

The last four wickets only added 21, Lamb tying the Cheshire tall into knots with his off-spinners, and thereby earning a most satisfactory analysis.

In recognition of his maiden century for the side yesterday, P. A. Gibb was awarded his Second Eleven cap by Col. R. C. Chichester-Constable.

But Bowling Weakness Likely to be Felt

BRUMFITT IMPRESSES

REDCAR, Wednesday

When Yorkshire Second XI, met Northumberland at Jesmond earlier in the season, they were dismissed for 29 runs. The chief anxiety of Yorkshire here to-day was not so much that they would fall ingloriously again as batsmen, but that they would never be able to get their opponents out.

At the last minute Jacques was unable to play, and instead of filling his place with another fast bowler the invitation went to Crofts, who bowls precisely the same type of ball as three other members of the side.

The Colts thus took the field this evening with an attack which would have been considered weak even in club cricket, their bowling being entirely lacking in variety. In the circumstances, they did well to capture three wickets before stumps were drawn, and Northumberland will continue their innings 151 behind on the morrow.

Fortune Smiles

Fortune smiled on Yorkshire this morning, and they batted first on a perfect wicket. Their innings could be summarised in three stages—complete mastery of the bowing by P. A. Gibb and Barker, who put on 102 for the first wicket; more admirable batting for the fourth wicket by Pearson and J. Brumfitt, who made a first appearance of high promise, and unexpected failure by the remaining members of what looked on paper to be an extremely strong batting side.

Gibb and Barker were quite unperturbed by the constant bowling changes of the Northumberland captain, and in less than an hour and a half they sent up the 100. Barker returned to form with an eminently sound 69, hitting very hard on the leg side, while Gibb played a typically polished innings of 43, watching the ball carefully, and scoring with great ease all round the wicket.

Gibb's Downfall

Over-anxiety to reach his 50 before Shields found a length led to his downfall at 102, and Barker followed soon afterwards—a victim of the new rule to Wilson. He was at the wicket one and three-quarter hours, and hit eight boundaries.

Bottomley failed, but Pearson found a steady partner in Brumfitt, who soon showed himself to have an excellent defence, and some very nice shots on the off-side. The pair put on 79 before Brumfitt, unsettled, perhaps, by a stoppage for rain, gave Booth a catch in the silps.

Northumberland then gained the upper hand, and Wilson, a fast-medium bowler with a decided nip off the pitch, ran through the tall, finishing with five wickets for 60 runs.

Pearson Unbeaten

Colonel Chichester-Constable declared with nine wickets down for 250, Pearson being unbeaten for 70, and for the next hour he had the chagrin of watching the Colts' pathetically uninspired attack being dealt with with contemptuous ease by Mackey and Shields.

Robinson bowled much too short, and Lamb and Bottomley did little but bowl their opponents in.

Mackey scored an excellent 48 in an hour, and then belated success came to Yorkshire, and then Shields being bowled in playing the patient Crofts, who soon afterwards took forward to Crofts, who soon afterwards took a brilliant catch close in at square-leg to dismiss Horace Lee.

J. N. Grover and J. B. Bruce then played out time, and their survival gives Northumberland a fighting chance of first-innings lead to-morrow.

COLTS IN ANOTHER DRAW

Northumberland Refuse to Accept Challenge

INJURY TO GIBB

From Our Special Representative

REDCAR, Thursday

After a day of fluctuating fortunes, Yorkshire Second eleven drew with Northumberland here this evening. The latter side took first innings points for their lead of three runs, but if they had accepted Yorkshire's declaration with the right spirit of enterprise they should have won a great game, and thus enhanced their chances of qualifying for the Minor Counties Challenge Match.

When Col. Chichester-Constable declared the Yorkshire second innings closed, Northumberland were left with 133 runs to score for victory in an hour and a half—a task seemingly well within their capabilities against such an unimpressive attack as the Colts had in this match.

Bowling Flattered

They lost their first two men for 19, but a splendid forcing innings of 31 by Wilson put them in front of the clock. Wilson hit 6 off Robinson out of the ground and over the road towards the sea, and he made his runs in a quarter of an hour. But on his dismissal H. C. Lee, an excellent batsman who scored two half-centuries against the South Africans last month, showed a most disappointing lack of initiative. He refused to make any attempt to force the pace, and at one period neither he nor his partner scored for nearly fifteen minutes.

Robinson and Lamb were bowling quite well, but such caution as *vis a vita* a period was unjustified, and it was not until J. N. Grover came in that Northumberland once again were given a fighting chance.

After a slow start, Grover began to hit with great freedom, driving Wilson for a fine straight 6, and when he was caught on the square leg boundary by Pearson, his side needed 16 to win in twelve minutes.

For some inexplicable reason, however, Baker and Robson decided to play for safety instead of hitting out at every opportunity, and though there were still four wickets to fall, they chose to play out time, Northumberland finishing up 13 runs behind.

Mishap to Gibb

The opening phase of the day was marred by a most unfortunate accident to the Yorkshire wicket-keeper and first wicket batsman, P. A. Gibb. Play had hardly been resumed when he was struck between the eyes by a fast rising ball from N. W. D. Yardley, which Bruce, the Northumberland batsman, had unsuccessfully endeavoured to cut. He was assisted off the field with a deep gash on his forehead which was bleeding profusely, and three stitches were put into the wound on his arrival at a nearby hospital.

He returned before lunch with his head bandaged, but he was unable to take any further part in the match. He will, however, be fit for Yorkshire's match against Surrey at the Oval on Saturday.

J. Brumfitt, the young Ilkley player, kept wicket in his place, and proved a most efficient deputy, while M. Bainbridge, the Redcar batsman, acted as twelfth man.

Saved from Collapse

Northumberland were saved from collapse in their first innings by a brave seventh wicket stand by J. A. Paterson and Robson, who put on 86 runs, and their partnership was instrumental in giving their side the lead, which had seemed so unlikely when they had six men out for 129. Paterson, who completed his innings with a runner following an injury to his knee when 56, was unbeaten with a most courageous 62, while Robson made an invaluable 26.

Declaring five minutes after lunch, Northumberland were denied the quick wickets for which they obviously hoped, Bottomley and Barker batting extremely well on a wicket which was beginning to crumble. They put on 65 before Bottomley was beautifully caught by Mackay at short leg, but a complete collapse occurred shortly afterwards, five wickets falling for three runs—most of them as the result of first-class fielding.

The finest catch of all was that by Bainbridge, who ran fully thirty yards to hold a drive by Robinson one-handed while still moving at top speed, the ball being taken a foot from the ground. Wilson and Crofts prevented a debacle, however, and the innings was declared at 135 for 7.

YORKSHIRE COLTS' SEASON

Disappointing Match Record

WEAKNESS IN BOWLING

By Our Special Representative

In reviewing the progress of Yorkshire Second Eleven at the end of last season, it was not possible to point to a successful match record, but, at the same time, one could not regard the performances of the side as disappointing in view of the high promise shown by several young players.

Now, at the close of another Minor County season, however, there is no such consolation for a poor playing record, and the failure of a number of Colts to come up to expectations engendered by their form in 1934 must inevitably cause the Committee some anxiety.

Rain caused the first fixture, against Staffordshire at Porthill, to be abandoned without a ball being bowled, and Yorkshire won only two of the remaining nine matches. Their victories were gained over Staffordshire by seven wickets, and Cheshire, by 111 runs and 82 runs, both these games being played in Yorkshire, but to be set against this is the melancholy record of four defeats outright and three more on the first innings.

The form of the Colts in the first half of the season was almost too bad to be true, but in view of the inexperienced sides sent out these repeated failures could not occasion any surprise. The desire of the County Committee to use the Second Eleven as a training ground for young players is fully appreciated, but at the same time it is surely a mistaken policy to discard the aid of one or two senior professionals who have done so much in the past to weld the side together, and by their own methods have afforded valuable object lessons in tactics and cricket technique to the rest of the eleven.

Loss of Experienced Players

In previous years this work has been admirably done by Turner, and, to a lesser degree, by such players as Hall, Fisher, Halstead and Douglas. But this season Col. Chichester-Constable was left with the unenviable task of leading sides composed entirely of colts with comparatively little experience, and any unexpected failure early in the innings appeared to demoralise them, with the result that the batting went to pieces, and the bowling—deplorably weak throughout the season—lost its length, and with that its only virtue.

Above all, the Second Eleven lacked a good fast bowler and a leg break bowler, for Hargreaves proved a great disappointment, and Heaton, whose leg-spinners inspired so much hope two seasons ago, has now dropped out of Yorkshire cricket, leaving no successor.

At the end of last Summer it really seemed that a fast bowler of outstanding merit had been discovered in Hargreaves, but for some obscure reason he reverted to his old failing of delivering the ball square-chested to the batsman, and instead of deriving his pace from a full follow-through, he tried to compensate for this by dragging the ball down. Consequently he bowled far too much on the leg-side, and his inability to produce the out-swinger denied him a host of wickets.

Robinson's Bowling Disappoints

An effort was certainly made to increase the stability of the side by bringing back Jacques for two games, but in the final match, at Redcar last week, an admirable chance for experimenting with a new fast bowler was disregarded, and the penchant for off-spin bowling was pursued to a ridiculous extent by the inclusion of four bowlers of this type against one of the strongest teams in the Minor Counties Championship.

Another player who has, unfortunately, failed to live up to his promising all-round form of previous seasons is Robinson, whose off-break bowling has become defensive rather than aggressive through his habit of pitching consistently short of a length.

True, he has taken 40 wickets, but he has had twice as much opportunity as any other bowler on the side, and it must be admitted that good fielding has often earned for him success which often was hardly deserved on the merits of the delivery.

Personally, one is convinced that Robinson could make a useful batsman, for he scores many runs in Council cricket, but at present the innate desire to hit at everything sent down to him curbs his progress in this direction.

The introduction of P. A. Gibb greatly strengthened the batting in the closing matches of the season, and Barker played many useful innings, though he is not sound against fast bowling. Pearson again did well, though his tendency to "feel" for the out-swing still proves his undoing, while two other batsmen of promise are H. Brerley and G. A. Wilson.

Value of Bottomley

After a disappointing start, Bottomley found his form against Staffordshire, and afterwards he was one of the mainstays of the eleven. He has the happy facility for getting runs quickly when they are badly wanted, and because of his disregard for his personal average, and his keenness in the field, he was always an asset to the team. N. W. D. Yardley failed completely as a batsman—an inexplicable occurrence for one who has done well in first-class cricket, and is so fully equipped with strokes—but he showed unexpected ability as a fast-medium bowler, his form at Redcar greatly impressing the Northumberland side.

Lamb, a useful all-rounder from the Bradford League, worked hard for his sixteen wickets, but the left arm spin bowling of Wilson proved expensive, and one feels that he would be wise to concentrate on his batting in future seasons.

Colonel Chichester-Constable had a thankless task, for with so many team changes the side never really settled down, but he led the eleven with his usual keenness and ability, and his sympathetic handling of his players enabled him to get the very best out of them, often under difficult conditions.
