FINE WIN OVER OLD STOICS

Devastating Bowling By Tuffin

READING v. G.W.R. (LONDON)

Played at Castle Bar Park on Saturday, an evenly contested game ending in a draw. J. J. Brown and K. L. Simpson gave Reading a good start, 76 runs being on the board when the first wicket fell. Bennett (28 not out), Mower (28) and Harrison (20) also contributed useful scores. Reading declared at 180 for 4. G.W.R., with nearly two hours to bat, made little attempt to get the runs, and when stumps were drawn had scored 100 for 4. Tuffin bowled well for Reading, but without much luck.

BENNETT INJURED BY RISING BALL

Played at Church Road, Earley, on Sunday, Reading winning easily. The visitors, bailing first, found the devastating bowling of Tuffin (8 for 20) and Harrison (3 for 12), coupled with smart fielding, more than they could cope with, being all out for the low score of 62. On Reading batting, however, Maddell (60), Simpson (37), Timewell (15) and Stone (11) proved that runs could be scored, passing their opponents' score for the loss of 3 wickets, and going on to total 224 for 2 when stumps were drawn. During the game a rising ball struck K. C. Bennett over the left eye, three stitches having to be inserted.

MUCH has been written this season about the attempt to revive interest in Berkshire county cricket. The best effort so far, however, was made last Saturday, when Berkshire, set to get 212 runs in two hours, nearly accomplished that feat, despite a blank ten minutes due to rain. I am sure that all those who saw that effort—and unfortunately there were very few people there—must have been potential supporters for next season. It was a treat to watch the Berkshire batsmen going out for the runs, and so it was to see spectators helping in the race against time, many of them dashing away to retrieve the ball after it had gone for fours.

Cricket, I suppose, will always have its disappointments so long as the time for drawing stumps is rigidly adhered to. On Saturday it would only have taken one more over for a decision to have been obtained—victory for Berkshire. As neither of the two counties were concerned in the top of the table positions it would have helped a lot if that extra over had been bowled. Instead, Oxfordshire got the extra points for first innings lead, after being what is sometimes described as "morally defeated." I know there must be a line drawn somewhere about finishing but surely it would make the game much more attractive if, when only a few runs are needed or one or two wickets only to fall, the captains could agree to play the match out. All credit to the Berkshire men for putting up such a jolly good fight against time.

OPINIONS OF HARDING.

Press comment on the appearance of the young Reading cricketer, N. H. Harding, as a professional for Kent, is unanimous that he is a young player of great promise. One writer said he "was evidently born with cricket in his bones," while another described him as an ideal man for Kent, one who could bowl, field and make runs. When I saw Harding play at Reading School ground recently I thought he had improved considerably since playing in the Kent second team, keeping a good length while bowling very fast.

Next summer England's biggest need against the Australians will, probably, be fast bowling capable of disturbing Bradman and Co. Without allowing local bias in his favour to influence me at all, I consider Harding one of the most promising candidates for England honours some time next summer. He has what some of our present fast men have not got—a natural, loose action and an easy run to the crease; and already been shown, for in his debut with Kent he saw three or four catches dropped off his bowling in a short space of time, yet was in no way discouraged.
