Sporting Declaration Against Leavesden

BAKER HITS OUT

N. R. HAWES, the High Wycombe captain, made a sporting declaration in the game against Leavesden, at a time when rain looked likely to spoil the match.

But the declaration proved too early, for the Leavesden batsmen soon saw that the bowlers were unable to get any response from the rain-soaked wicket. Taking charge of the game, they passed the High Wycombe total with only two wickets down.

High Wycombe went in first and Tibbles soon showed good form. Brand batted steadily but with the score at 20 he was out to an excellent catch low down in the slips off a late cut. Baker took his place and he and Tibbles were batting well when Watson, the Hertfordshire slow bowler, beat Tibbles with a googly.

SPORTS GOSSIP

By "ONLOOKER"

HIGH Wycombe emphasised the difference between club cricket and High Wycombe League cricket in the interesting game on the London Road ground on Saturday, between Wycombe's first eleven and the pick of Wycombe League's stars.

The League team were dismissed for 70 in their first innings and 33 in the second, after Wycombe had compiled the formidable total of 319 for 8 wickets declared.

Many League players, accustomed to the vagaries of bumpy village pitches, are ill at ease on "Laddie" Page's carefully prepared carpet.

How Would They Fare?

By the same token, I often wonder how some of the High Wycombe players would fare against League fast bowlers on some of the village pitches. Most village cricket pitches in South Bucks have been improved vastly in recent years, but there are still many whose primitive condition is calculated to test the agility of the batsman as well as the ingenuity of the bowler.

High Wycombe ought to pay Wycombe League men the compliment of sending a team to play a League side on one of the less carefully tended village pitches.

Fewer Boundaries

Boundaries, certainly, would not be so frequent. Probably thick grass in the long field would prove the most effective obstacle to the neatly-placed ground strokes that elude fieldsmen on the London Road ground.

Ted Beeson, who hit up 69 against the League team on Saturday, knows the best and the poorest of pitches. A vigorous hitter rather than a discriminating selector of strokes, Beeson has proved as much at home batting on billiards table surfaces as on the most rustic common.

Had Trial For Surrey

One of the most successful bowlers was the Wycombe veteran, S. Ricketts, who claimed 5 wickets for 25 runs in the first innings and 4 for 5 in the second.

Ricketts can spin the ball as cleverly as any bowler in Bucks. Years ago he had a trial for Surrey. If he could keep a consistently good length he would have secured his place in Buckinghamshire's team years ago.

Mason Says—

Hitherto the League team have met Wycombe's second string. It was at the request of the League officials that the match this year was with the first team.

A. E. Mason, the former Monks Risborough bowler, was among the many Wycombe League supporters who saw the game.

"The League side did not do themselves justice" was his opinion.

Eight Bowlers Tried

Although the League attack, discreetly handled by Bill Long, was consistently good, the bowlers found the wicket vastly different from those to which they are accustomed.

The wicket indeed was so good that they were unable to keep the score down. Jack Theed, who hit up 97, was always completely master of the bowling. Eight bowlers tried to dislodge the Wycombe men without success. Dobson, of Wheeler

End, bowled particularly well with little luck.

Disappointing

The League men's batting, on the other hand, was surprisingly poor. Only Reg. Blamey, promising young Deeborough Sports all rounder, played the Wycombe bowling with real confidence.

One of the highlights of their two quick innings was the first-rate wicket-keeping of Wally Pierce, who, although he is still not really fit, showed that it takes more than ill-luck to disturb his good form.

Jack Ayres, the young Blodlow Ridge stumper, also revealed exceptionally good form for the League team.

Why He Was Out

One point that has apparently caused a good deal of controversy among those who saw the game, was the manner in which Taylor was run out in the League's first innings.

I was told after the match that although Taylor had his bat over the crease when the wicket was broken it was not on the ground!

From comments heard round the ground it was obvious that the point was not appreciated by many of the spectators.

Search for Speed

In their search for a good fast bowler to succeed R. H. Rutter, Buckinghamshire have given a trial to two of the most promising young men in South Bucks club cricket—E. F. Emery, of High Wycombe, and D. Roberts, of Beaconsfield.

Emery, who played against Herts at St. Albans and against Bedfordshire at Ascott, was succeeded in the return game with Beds at Bedford by Roberts, who took one wicket in the first innings and two in the second.

Roberts played again for Bucks at Norwich on Monday and Tuesday. He bowled 14 overs, two of which were maidens, and took 3 wickets for 59 runs.

Cambridge "Blue" for Bucks

Alan Ratcliffe, the Cambridge "Blue," who has been prominent among the well-known amateurs chosen for Buckinghamshire during their holiday matches, was taught cricket at Rydall, the North Wales school which, in recent years, has produced two other Cambridge men, W. Wooller and H. R. W. Butterworth.

Ratcliffe will be remembered for his notable innings of 201 for Cambridge against Oxford in 1931.

27-Years-Old Record

His score broke a University record that had stood for 27 years, but the new record itself stood for less than 24 hours for the next day the Nawab of Pataudi—who has been seen in action on the High Wycombe ground this season—knocked up 238 not out for Oxford.

Ratcliffe has played for Surrey and, incidentally, has also played for another of the minor counties—Denbighshire.

He was able to play for Denbigh by virtue of his residential qualification while at Rydall. Ratcliffe has also played in representative games for Wales.

Theo. Wilmot, George Pithouse and Dr. E. R. Weaver Adams. The members of this team should be indebted to these gentlemen for their services readily given, and to the ladies who, yet again, did so much hard work in the matter of providing refreshments, etc., at matches.
