



"However, I found a cricket match in progress and decided to stay for an 'over' or two. "When I read of the squabble between Surrey and Middlesex at Lord's, I thought again of the two gallant teams who cared not whether the ball was new or old so long as they could 'have a go' or take a wicket. Whilst such men live cricket cannot die. Thank you, Cambridge, and your village lads, you have restored an old man's faith in a well loved game."
