

## HUGE SCORE BY TRURO 2nd XI.

A remarkable scoring feat was accomplished by Truro 2nd XI., playing at home against Falmouth Docks, on Saturday, when they amassed a huge score of 315 runs for the loss of six wickets before declaring. K. Smith and D. Anstis put on 70 for the first wicket, the former obtaining 35 and the latter 36. The second wicket dropped at 93, and then F. S. Fox and E. T. May participated in a third wicket stand which yielded 115 runs. The batsmen flogged the bowlers, runs coming at a lively pace, and when May just passed his half-century, he was sent back. K. Hambly added a single, and then R. Nicholls partnered Fox in another stand, which produced 94 runs before Nicholls was defeated for 46. Fox appeared to be well set for his century, but when he reached 85 he was bowled. With the total standing at 315 for six wickets, compiled in less than 2½ hours, Truro declared. Seldom is such a gilt-edged chance presented to a team by their closest rivals for a county trophy as that given last Saturday by Camborne to Falmouth.

On June 26th, Falmouth had only to draw their match with Camborne to make reasonably sure of again heading the western division of the Cornish League, tantamount to a 90 per cent. grip on retention of the cup won by them for the first time last year. Flouting Dame Fortune's smile at the coin-spinning ceremony, Falmouth were well beaten and, to make matters worse, lost again the following week to Penzance, bad fielding being responsible. Camborne then were "sitting pretty," but they slipped a cog against Helston, and again, last week, at Truro, so that now it only remains for Falmouth to beat Troon—league wooden-spoonists—to ensure the porters finishing at least one point ahead of the ninth team.
