Main factors in the match result were the skilful bowling of Arthur Booth, who sent down '2.1 overs, successful changes, and the superior batting of County, for whom J. S. W. Usher showed excellent form and T. A. W. White gave evidence of his likely value as a strong hitter, as well as smart fieldsman.

"South's" batting lacked the quality shown in the County's third partnership, between Usher and White, and the former, especially, delighted with wristy shots. Two of "South's" batsmen showed plenty of enterprise, but not the ability of Usher to keep the ball down. The home side had not a Booth to trouble the visitors in the way that the left-arm professional had "South" batsmen guessing—vide the three l.b.w. decisions in his favour.
