NORTH OXFORD.

TALL SCORING IN ANNUAL CRICKET WEEK.

Of the purely local clubs North Oxford are the only cricket organisation to hold a "week," and this they concluded on Saturday last. The six games were played on perfect wickets and yielded 2,447 runs for the loss of 88 wickets.

The North Oxford bowlers had a heavy task in that they had to field first each day except the Monday. Great credit is due to Sansum and Bowtell for the way they stuck out the hot week, but they, as well as most others of the bowlers, must learn to keep to length when they are being attacked. It was noticeable on most days that when there was a prolonged stand the bowling fell off and a good position was quickly turned into a bad one. The catching also was very indifferent and a number of expensive "let-offs" were registered. With one or two exceptions the chief batsmen did badly and the later men repeatedly had to play their best to save the games and special mention should be made of Sansum and Robins, who, on three occasions, showed themselves fully competent to deal with a nasty "last half-hour." The cricket throughout the week was most enjoyable and stronger sides were put in the field than ever before.

Monday's and Tuesday's games were reported last week. Swindon were the visitors on Wednesday. Miller, Owens, Beck, Sansum and Robins did good service with the bat, but the bowlers generally had a thankless task.

The "big" day was, of course, Thursday, against the President's XI, and this game gave the Club their best win of the week. Facing a total of 267, they hit off the runs for the loss of only three wickets. Godfrey, Goddard, Webb and Halliday all batting in dazzling form. Hunt, the old Middlesex player, had a capital knock for the President's XI, and Basil Rogers' feat of taking five for 87 deserves mention, if only because it was the outstanding bowling performance of the week.

Both Friday and Saturday's games against the College Servants and Cowley St. John were drawn, and a feature of the latter match was a fine innings of 134 by Norman Belcher, of the Cowley St. John Club. He completed his 100 in 50 minutes, and it is said batted only 57 minutes altogether. He did not give a chance and received valuable aid from Leslie Carter. Score:—

The Oxfordshire County Cricket season concluded on Tuesday. It is too early, from a business point of view, to say whether it has been successful. The gates, I imagine, have been about of average dimensions, but with two extra matches played the expenses will be heavier. From a playing point of view the season has had its triumphs and disasters. The former more than balance the latter, and three wins outright and two on the first innings, in ten matches, is not too bad. The Club suffer in a not uncommon way. They are forced by circumstances over which they have no control, to make numerous changes every match, and sometimes they seem to have too many bowlers and, often, not enough. This sort of thing naturally makes it difficult for the captain and almost impossible to cultivate the ideal teamwork. If this can be avoided there is every prospect of even better results next year, despite the fact that neither Lieut. F. M. Hughes nor D. T. L. Bailey, both of whom are going to South Africa, will be available. The Club continues to keep in close touch with the local clubs, through the medium of Trial matches, the value of which needs to be stressed, and with the public schools XI's, and in this respect would welcome the co-operation of those who can recommend players with a local qualification. It was a matter for regret that Jack Halliday fell ill and could not play in the last few matches. He has not been at all well this summer, and neither he nor Harry Walker has, judged on figures, done as well as usual. Cricket form, however, is curiously subject to spasms of this kind. Take the case of A. P. D. Montgomery a comparatively poor season in 1936; an outstanding one this year. I would like to, congratulate H. G. Webb on getting his first century for the County, which should mean that next season he should become one of the most reliable batsmen on the side.

AND THEN CAME LARWOOD!

On Thursday 16 September, Dennis Hendren is bringing a team to Oxford to play Oxford City on the Merton College ground for the Badcliffe Infirmary and the Police-aided Association. The charge for admission will be 1s, and tickets will shortly be on sale. Already the following have promised to assist Hendren's XI: Larwood, Hardstaff and Lilley (Sotts), Arnold and Herman (Hants), O'Connor, Eastman and K. Farnes (Essex) and Timms (Northants). It is hoped, too, that R. C. M. Kimpton will find it convenient to play. This is one of the most attractive matches that has been arranged at Oxford for some time, and as the cause is most worthy local sportsmen should roll up in large numbers. Larwood alone is a big attraction and there will be a keen desire to see how the two old Oxford boys, Arnold and Herman, have developed since the days when, as youths, they figured in local cricket. Herman has had a most successful season with both bat and ball, and with Larwood at one end and the Hants player at the other, the Oxford City batsman will sample some real pace.

FOOTBALL HAS ARRIVED.

The football season opens to-morrow and with the temperature soaring into the 80's I do not suppose the average player is looking forward to his 1937-38 baptism. Of course, he has had a few trial games, but these are usually played on the soft pedal and are as different as chalk to cheese from the real thing. But hot-dry grounds and a broiling sun are quickly forgotten in the excitement of a keen game and the City players are sure to go all out to beat the Kingstonian in their first Isthmian League game at Kingston. What a splendid tonic this would be if they can only pull it off. Everyone wants to see the City doing better, as it is realised that another poor season would be a really serious matter. The trial last Saturday revealed a few new players of promise, and this is welcome news, as it does not seem likely that Guilfoyle and James will, at the start at any rate, be available very often. Guilfoyle is still having trouble with his knee, and complained of it two or three times during the cricket season. It has been said that he is not too keen on the game. This is a libel on a good fellow, who, when fit, puts his heart and soul into any game. These sort of stories are started by people who seem to delight in making trouble. When Guilfoyle gets quite fit, nothing is so certain that he will be wearing the City jersey again, playing with all his old enthusiasm. Like the members of the committee of the Club he is really concerned about the future, and he told me that it was his intention to do all he could to help the old City. I hope this will silence those who bandy rumours about without thinking of the consequences.

ON APATHY.

In connection with the apathy of the public towards the Club, Mr. T. A. T. Cox writes: "May I offer my sympathy with your endeavours to wake up the sportsmen of Oxford to their obligations to their own County Cricket Club? The game against Bedfordshire was a fitting example of their apathy towards the finances of the County. At 12.15 p.m. on Thursday there were 33 on the rails outside the ground and possibly just double inside. Where are the supposed cricket enthusiasts one sees day after day in the University Parks, faces which get familiar, obviously citizens, and who spend every available moment watching the games? Is it that cricket, not included in the first-class averages, is below their august intelligence, or is it that the tremendous amount of 6d. is charged for admission to Minor County games? Would it not surprise you and considerably embarrass the County authorities if your efforts resulted in 200 of the City's population of nearly 100,000 suddenly became conscience stricken?"
