

BURY AND WEST SUFFOLK V. NORWICH WANDERERS

What had promised for the most part to be a somewhat uneventful game, when Norwich Wanderers made their annual visit to the Victory Ground, Bury, yesterday, developed in the final stages into an exciting contest. Bury and West Suffolk tied with their opponents in the last minute of the contest. The two clubs have another one-day match to-day.

The Wanderers had first knock on an easy wicket, but with only five runs on the board, J. H. Owens got his leg in front of a straight ball from R. C. Rought-Rought. Michael Falcon, the Norfolk County captain for the past 21 years, followed in, and played the chief part in carrying the score to over the hundred mark. He saw the departure of Webster and H. Theobald, each for less than 20 runs, and he was only one short of his half-century when the luncheon interval was taken with his side's total standing at 99. Soon after the match was resumed, however, Falcon's innings was unexpectedly terminated. He failed to get hold of a fast rising ball from R. C. Rought-Rought, and was caught at deep mid-on by the West Suffolk captain, B. W. Rought-Rought. He had contributed an excellent 54, which included four 4's. R. C. Rought-Rought had so far done most of the bowling, having taken three wickets for 34 runs in 15 overs, and Stevens attempted to force the rate of scoring, and with the loss of just about 150, the former put a ball from Robins into the hands of B. W. Rought-Rought, who only an over or two previously had missed him under almost the same circumstances. Gray's 37 included only four singles, and he hit that number of 4's. With three runs added Falcon's innings was clean bowled by Covill. R. P. Scragg and P. K. Newton also did not stay long, but Stevens, son of the Wanderers' captain, defied the bowling changes, and he was undefeated with 52 runs to his credit when the innings was declared at 197 for eight wickets. The Wanderers were batting three and a quarter hours. R. C. Rought-Rought's bowling analysis was—Overs 25, maidens 4, wickets 4, Robins took two wickets for 39 runs, Covill one for 48, and Tomkin one for 8.

Left with two and a half hours to get the runs, West Suffolk did not make an auspicious start, losing their opening pair—S. H. G. Waters and A. E. Hoxley—with only three runs scored. The Wanderers led a strong attack in Gray, a left-hand boxer, and Michael Falcon, and the rate of scoring continued to be slow when Capt. Beauford and B. W. Rought-Rought were together for the third wicket. There were only 25 runs on the board after about 45 minutes' play. At 33 Gray bowled Beauford for 20. With Rought-Rought and Covill together, the outlook improved altogether, and both batsmen attacked the bowling with zest and skill. They speeded up the scoring, and engaged in something of a race as to which of them would reach his half-century first. Rought-Rought won by a short head, Covill only being a run behind him. Scragg and Powell had relieved the opening bowlers, and Gray had resumed again before this excellent partnership, which produced over a hundred runs, was dissolved, Covill being caught and bowled by Powell for 84. In the same over, Powell also dismissed Rought-Rought, who was out lbw for 61. With five wickets down for 143, West Suffolk redoubled their efforts in their race against time to get the runs. It was an exciting finish, and when their last wicket fell just in the last over of the day, they had just equalled their opponents' score. Gray took four wickets for 66 runs, Falcon two for 35, and Powell two for 39.

COLCHESTER AND EAST ESSEX V. FELIXSTOWE

One of the holiday attractions at Colchester, yesterday, was this match at Castle Park, the result being a draw.

Felixstowe batted first, and in an innings which lasted 3½ hours, completed a total of 154 runs. H. Mayhew and P. Murton put on 79 for the first wicket. The breaking of this partnership marked a bad spell for Felixstowe, and, incidentally, a triumph for Gillett, whose medium fast, good-length deliveries accounted for two further wickets—those of Stevenson and Ball-Jones—without addition to the score. Wickets then fell at regular intervals, with the score mounting very slowly, and, but for a useful stand by Mayhew and Faney, in which the score was brought from 19 to 130, a bad slide would have ensued.

After Loney's departure, Mayhew was beaten by a good ball from Brunwin, without addition, and the remaining four wickets fell quickly for four runs. Mayhew's contribution of 14 runs, which took 2½ hours to compile, provided a lesson in cautious, stolid batsmanship.

The home side's best bowling performance came from Brunwin who took four for 20. While Gillett captured three for 19 and Green two for 12.

Colchester and East Essex, when they went into bat, had about two and a quarter hours to get the runs. They opened poorly, Digings going when only nine runs were on the board, but for the second

wicket Brunwin and Garside brought the score to 86. A collapse followed, and six wickets were down for a further 34 runs before stumps were drawn at 6.30 p.m. For Felixstowe, Murton took four for 25 and Stevenson two for 5. Scores:—

BURY AND WEST SUFFOLK V. NORWICH WANDERERS

Rain marred the second successive one-day match between Bury and West Suffolk and Norwich Wanderers, on the Victory Ground, Bury St. Edmund's, yesterday. West Suffolk compiled 177, and, with the Wanderers having made 87 for two wickets, the weather intervened to stop play. This ended the prospect of another good finish, not so exciting perhaps as the previous day, when just as the time came for drawing stumps West Suffolk tied with their visitors' score of 197.

It was dull and cold when West Suffolk opened their innings, with their captain, R. W. Rought-Rought, and J. H. Wilson, in the bowling of Theobald and Redmayne. With less than 20 runs scored, Rought-Rought was run out for an unlucky 13, and with the total 27 Wilson, who had been joined by Covill, had his stumps spreadeagled by Redmayne for 10. Covill played enterprising cricket, and so skillfully placed his shots that he made 30 with his first ten hits. His bat gave way under this somewhat hectic strain, and he had to come into the pavilion for a replacement. Robins also hit out lustily, and helped to put on 57 for the third wicket, before Clements, a left-hand bowler who had succeeded Redmayne, bowled him for a very useful 27. R. C. Rought-Rought and H. J. Bird made only brief stays, and at the lunch interval West Suffolk had 103 for five wickets. On the resumption, wickets continued to fall steadily, only Tomkin reaching double figures, but Covill continued to off-set stoutly to the quintette of bowlers employed, in spite of the good length they maintained, and saw the score carried to 177. He was the last man out, and was only seven runs short of his century, an excellent knock, having hit eight 4's and six 3's. He gave one chance when he had scored 80. The Wanderers' two left-hand bowlers had the most success, Powell, a 16-year-old school boy, player taking four wickets for 44 runs, and Clements three for 66. Theobald took one for 25. The fact that West Suffolk's total did not include a single extra was a tribute to the wicket-keeping of Stevens.

Beginning their innings with two and a half hours left for play, the Wanderers lost their first wicket by the first ball sent down. Covill bowled Bunyon for a duck, and his successor, Owens, had little better fortune, being run out for seven with the score 17. Webster, who had opened with Bunyon and Stevens played cautiously for a spell, but, after tea, when the wicket had been damped by a renewal of light rain which had occurred earlier, they were more venturesome—so much so that at least once the result of being run out was courted. The rain developed into a persistent drizzle, which ultimately obliged the game to be abandoned, the Wanderers having scored 87 for the loss of two wickets.

R. Dalglish joined Beauford, the latter sent the second hundred up after the innings had been in progress 100 minutes. The Suffolk captain continued to monopolise the scoring, and when he was caught from a laxy drive in front of the screen at 257, he had 84 to his credit, made in forty minutes, his hits including a 6 and nine 4's.

The innings, which had lasted 2 hours and 25 minutes, was declared with the score at 305 for seven, the Foresters being left to get 275 to win in two and three-quarter hours, less the tea interval.

With only 11 on the board Dalglish sent one of W. N. Roe's stumps flying, and at 38 D. Shearer, who claimed 21 of them, was out to a skier to long off. With only four added, Covill bowled J. D.
