## Eton Relying on Spin **Bowlers**

Twenty-nine years have passed since Harrow last won at Lord's, and Harrovians are wondering whether this long spell will be broken in the match which begins to-day.

Of the 107 games between the two schools, Eton lead with 42 victories; Harrow have won 35; and the remaining 30 have been drawn. The last time that a definite result was reached was in 1931, when Eton gained an overwhelming triumph by an innings and 16 runs.

A. Halliday is a dangerous forcing batsman who has already made a century against Charterhouse and 75 v. Mariborough, while W. S. P. Lithgow got 110 not out in the Winchester match.

# Lancashire League Appointment

Appointment

George Macaulay, the former Yorkshire player, will take part in Lancashire League cricket next season. He has signed for Todmorden, succeding Fred Root, the old Worcestershire player, who has signed a contract with Lowerhouse, another Lancashire League club. Macaulay, who is at present in South Wales playing for Ebbw Vale, will be 40 in December. He played for Yorkshire from 1920 to 1935. He took 24 wickets in his first season and 101 in his second. Macaulay's best season was 1925, when he took 211 wickets for 15 runs each. In the 15 seasons he took 1,773 wickets for Yorkshire for 30,292 runs, at an average of 17.08, and scored 5.789 runs in 318 completed innings, his average being slightly over 18.

Macaulay played for England against Australia at Leeds in 1926 when with Geary he shared in a century partnership, and he was capped five times ngainst South Africa, taking part in the 1922-3 tour and playing in one Test against them in 1924.

His benefit season was 1931, when a sum of £1,633 was raised, and in recognition of his services the Yorkshire Committee last year made Macaulay a grant of £250.
