**BERKS DEFEAT AT HERTFORD**

**D. W. STOKES'S BRIGHT CENTURY**

Berks were defeated in the Minor Counties Championship by Herts, at Hertford, yesterday, by four wickets.

Berkshire bowlers' success on Wednesday was short-lived, for while they had 3 wickets down for 24 and 4 for 58, Herts managed to raise a total of 300. In reply, Berkshire were dismissed for a lowly total of 123 and, forced to follow on in the last hour, lost 3 wickets for 56 runs.

A century by Stokes played a big part yesterday in saving Berkshire from an innings defeat, and the visiting county's second turn at the crease brought a total of 110 for 6. Scores:

**BERKSHIRE LOSE TO HERTS**

**Despite Second Day Effort**

**STOKES HITS A CENTURY**

**Fine Partnership With Wainwright**

Berkshire soon had Hertfordshire in difficulties at the start of the match at Hertford on Wednesday, but their bowling success was short-lived. Three Hertfordshire wickets were down for 24 runs, and the fourth fell at 58. Then G. V. Ledger and G. J. Cruikshank came together and added 142 runs before Tomlin knocked back Cruikshank's middle stump, with the score at exactly 200.

Ledger went on to make 97 before Salmon caught him at point. There was an unusual incident when Ledger had made 62. D. W. Stokes, the Berks wicket-keeper and captain, whipped off the balls and appealed. Ledger, who thought that he had been bowled, started to move towards the pavilion. Stokes then pulled out the off stump and the umpire appeared to give Ledger out. The Hertford batsman had nearly reached the pavilion when he was called back by Stokes. The Hertfordshire innings closed at 300, after Roberts had hit a bright 51, which included nine fours and one six.

The Berkshire batsmen were soon in trouble. With six runs on the board Lewis was caught in the slips by Wiggs. Appleyard was bowling in fine style, keeping a good length and coming off fairly fast. Berkshire were dismissed for the low total of 123, their score only reaching the century mark by a last wicket partnership between Albertini and Tomlin which produced 40 runs. Tomlin was top-scorer with 24 not out.

Grimsdell, the old Tottenham footballer, who was captaining Hertfordshire, made Berkshire follow on in the last hour. Some grand slip fielding by the young players Urry and Wiggs, disposed of Lewis and Sayles. Crisfield hit five fours and three singles before he was lbw to Wiggs, and when stumps were drawn Berkshire required 121 to avoid an innings defeat. Three wickets were down for 56.

Although Berkshire made a fine effort on the second day, they could not avoid defeat by four wickets. A fine partnership by Wainwright and Stokes was a feature of the day's play, for they added 83 for the fifth wicket before Wainwright was caught at the wicket. Stokes batted steadily all the morning, and took nearly three hours to reach his 50. Krabbé scored 33 in as many minutes, and just before one o'clock Berks avoided an innings defeat.

Stokes reached his hundred after 3½ hours, then when he had scored 102 he was stumped by Grimsdell. The Berks innings closed at 286.

Set to get 110 to win, Herts found scoring difficult against the bowling of Tomlin and Albertini. Six wickets fell before Wiggs scored the winning run.

**DEFEATED IN FIRST HOME MATCH**

**Bucks Bowlers Skittle Out Strong Berkshire Side**

**B**ERKSHIRE, playing their first home match of the season in the Minor Counties Championship at Kensington Road, Reading, on Monday and Tuesday, were defeated by Buckinghamshire by an innings and 110 runs. Except for a challenge match at High Wycombe the two counties had not met since 1921. On paper the home side looked exceptionally strong from a batting point of view, but they fared disastrously, making 86 in their first venture and 95 in their second, against the visitors' first innings total of 291. The man chiefly responsible for Berkshire's disappointing form was C. H. Boddy, of Beaconsfield, who took 7 for 22 in the first innings and 5 for 35 in the second. V. Lund also came into his own during Berkshire's second innings, for he took five wickets at a cost of nine runs apiece.

Having won the toss Buckinghamshire took first knock, Aubrey-Fletcher and Baker opening the innings, but with only four on the board Baker was caught by Timewell at fine leg in Relf's first over. Skinner followed in and this batsman with Aubrey-Fletcher laid the foundation for a very useful first innings total for the visitors. Their partnership added 81 runs, it being broken when Aubrey-Fletcher attempted to slash out at a ball from Smithson and was smartly stumped. The out-going batsman contributed 45. Only 8 runs had been added when Peters fell to a catch by Albertini off Relf's delivery. The 100 went up after 105 minutes and at lunch Bucks had made 117 for 4.

After lunch Bucks had only added a further ten runs when Lewis at cover point caught Walker off the last ball of a maiden by Relf. The next incident of note was when Skinner secured his half-century with a boundary hit off Smithson. He had been at the wicket 2 hours 20 minutes and had certainly taken the edge off the home side's attack. Holliman, who was now with Skinner at the wicket, drove Relf for a beautiful six into the pavilion. He treated the crowd to a breezy display of hard hitting and collected 43 in 35 minutes. The fifth wicket fell at 191 and Bucks went on to hoist the 200 after 2½ hours' play. With the total at 205 Skinner was dismissed for a valuable 70, Smithson, in the slips, taking a catch from this player, the bowler again being Relf. The ex-Sussex cricketer was successful in securing the next wicket, by clean bowling Franklin after he had obtained 20, and seven wickets were down for 234. The eighth wicket put on 13 runs and the ninth only 2, but the tail pair, Lund and Edwards, in a merry knock sent up 250 in 3½ hours, and 291 was obtained before Edwards sent a ball from Relf to Bomford in the slips.

**BODDY'S BOWLING FEAT**

With the wicket playing easy, Berkshire, with every man in the side having scored a century in club cricket this season, expected to put up a strong fight, but they had reckoned without Boddy, playing his first game for the visitors, who took no fewer than seven wickets for a mere 22 runs. Lewis and Sayles opened for Berks and the former man got going quickly, but with the total at 15 Sayles, who never looked at ease, was bowled by Boddy. Five runs later Lewis made his return to the pavilion, having collected 15. He seemed to be getting nicely set, when he reached out to a delivery from Boddy and pushed a catch right into the hands of Skinner in the slips. Hubble followed in to partner Stokes, but his stay was short. He obtained two runs and then with the score at 23 "nibbled" at a similar ball to that which had dismissed Sayles, and Holliman took him smartly. Stokes and Remnant now came together, but only 10 runs had been added when the home captain was beaten by an off-break from Boddy.

Aubrey-Fletcher took over from Boddy, and with the fourth ball of his first over he had Remnant caught by Peters. 46-5-20. The 50 went up after 55 minutes and at 60, after he had made 10, Wainwright was missed when a catch was dropped in the slips. Edwards went on at the Oxford Road end in place of Lund, while Boddy returned at the other end, and Timewell, who with

Wainwright appeared to be stemming the Bucks' attack, provided yet another wicket for this bowler. Timewell had collected 13 and the total stood at 71, Berkshire having batted 80 minutes. Boddy had Timewell caught behind the wicket by Franklin with the fourth ball of his first over in his second spell, and with the sixth, Bomford was cleaned bowled without having opened his account. The eighth wicket fell at 78, Wainwright being stumped by Franklin off Edwards after making 19, and Relf, who brought new life into the play by hitting out, did not last long, being caught near the boundary by Holliman off Edwards. 86-9-9, and the innings closed without a further run being added.

Two hundred and five runs behind, Berks were forced to follow on, their first innings lasting only 1½ hours, and with 35 minutes left for play Lewis and Sayles opened the second innings. With 10 runs obtained Lund beat Lewis all the way, but Stokes and Sayles played out time, and at the close the captain had collected 16 and the latter player 11, the closing score being 37 for 1.

In their second innings Berks did little better and the match was completed within 80 minutes on Tuesday. Boddy and Lund opened the visitors' attack, and Stokes gave a chance to the former bowler when he had scored 25, and with 50 obtained Sayles was once more clean bowled by Boddy—50-2-11. Remnant followed in and out very quickly, for Boddy had his middle stump without a run being added. Two Reading players in Stokes and Timewell now came together, and there were hopes of a useful partnership being set up, but at 59 Timewell was easily caught and bowled by Lund after making five. Wainwright was only in a few minutes, playing on a ball from Boddy with the Berks total at 60 for 5. Hubble, next man in, failed to score, being caught by Peters in trying a big hit off Lund, and six wickets were down for 65.

Stokes seemed unable to get anyone to remain long with him and with the total at 66, of which he had contributed 40, the captain was clean bowled by Boddy. Stokes's innings, which lasted 90 minutes and included seven fours, was a nice one, but he had never shown any real confidence against Boddy. Stokes's departure brought Bomford and Smithson together, but at 79 the latter batsman was out, caught by Peters off Lund for eight. Boddy came back into the picture when he caught and bowled Bomford—93-9-14—Relf and Albertini now being left, and the only point of interest left was whether this pair could send up the 100. This they failed to do, Albertini being caught far out by Sales with the total at 95, Lund being the successful bowler.

**AN INNINGS DEFEAT**

**Berkshire's Batting Fails**

**STOKES' PLUCKY EFFORT**

**Excellent Bowling Of Boddy For Bucks**

Berkshire commenced their "home" fixtures in the Minor Counties championship on Monday and Tuesday, when Bucks were the visitors to the Kensington Road ground, Reading. The last time Berkshire included Bucks in their fixtures was in 1921, although they had met once since then in a challenge match at High Wycombe, when rain prevented a definite decision. On this occasion Bucks gained what might be described as an overwhelming victory over Berks, who were defeated by an innings and 110 runs. The Berkshire team failed dismally in their batting, despite the fact that on paper it was a strong batting team, every member having at some time this season scored a century.

Winning the toss, Bucks went in first, and on a batsman's wicket ran up the somewhat formidable score of 291. This was despite Berkshire's early success, for Baker was brilliantly caught at fine leg by Timewell when only four were on the board. Aubrey-Fletcher and Skinner carried the score to 85 before the former was stumped, and Skinner went on to hit up the highest score of the match, a rather painstaking 70, scored in two hours and three-quarters. In marked contrast was a merry knock by Holliman, whose 43 was scored in 35 minutes, and included a six when he hit Relf into the pavilion. Some idea of the fast scoring of some of the Bucks batsmen can be gained from the fact that 100 went up in 105 minutes and 200 in two hours and three-quarters, curiously enough, leg byes off Albertini sending up both figures. The Bucks team were all out for 291, which they had taken four hours to compile. Relf was Berkshire's most consistent bowler.

**A Procession**

Berkshire were left with two and a half hours in which to bat before close of play, and in that time they were not only skittled out, but lost 1 wicket in their second innings. It might almost have been described as a procession to and from the wicket. Sayles was clean bowled with the score at 15, and although Lewis opened with three fours, he was easily taken in the slips off a ball which he should have left alone. Hubble was similarly taken after being at the wicket for less than five minutes. Stokes followed, and it was not until Remnant and Wainwright came together that anything like a stand was made. Remnant's 20 turned out to be the highest score of the innings, whilst Wainwright scored only one run short of that. The former was caught at deep cover in attempting a big hit. Wainwright and Timewell carried the score to 71, the 50 having taken Berkshire 55 minutes to get. ## BUCKS DO IT AGAIN

### INNINGS DEFEAT OF BERKSHIRE

When Bucks defeated Berkshire by an innings and three runs at High Wycombe they set up a new Minor Counties cricket record, for it was their third successive victory by a complete innings. 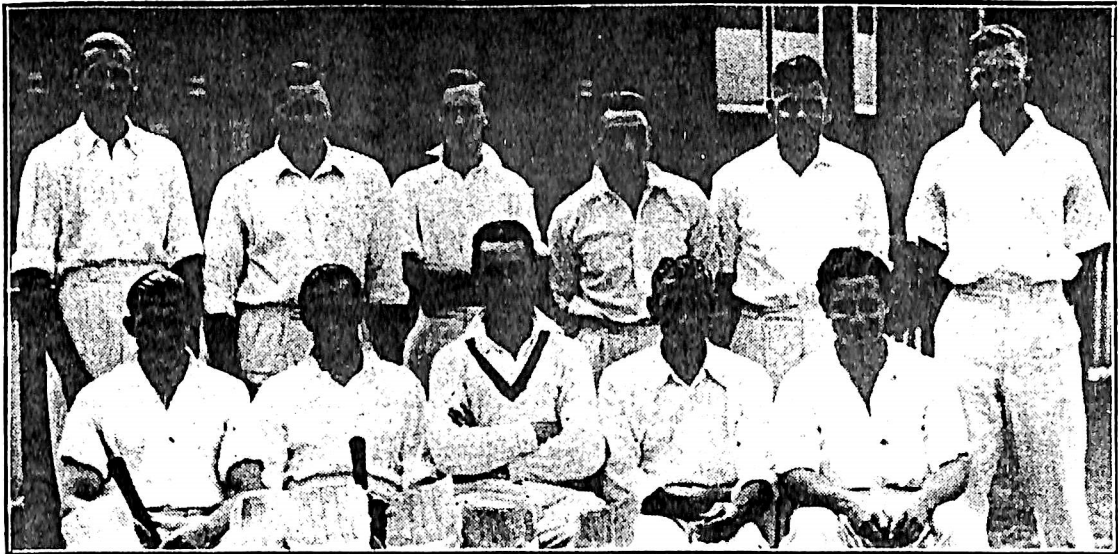

Cawston sent him away over the covers for a six, and we settled down expecting a useful stand to be made, but at 38, with his score at 19, Cawston had his middle stump driven back by Smith. Stokes came in to partner Timewell, and the Reading C.C. pair sent the 50 up after an hour's play. Timewell was almost stumped in going out to Milford, and then Wiltshire tried a further bowling change. Brown coming on for Smith, who had bowled 15 overs, off which 19 runs had been scored.

After 3.30 on Monday afternoon there was no further play, and the match was eventually abandoned at 2.40 p.m. on Tuesday. D. W. Stokes, the home captain, was prepared to bat on Monday evening, but E. H. Fuller, the visiting skipper, was not in favour of playing, and the umpres (Brown and Cutler), who were called upon to make a decision, decided that the pitch was unplayable.

#### WASHED OUT

Having dealt with football, darts and boxing, let me turn to cricket, which has been pushed out of the limelight this week by the great winter game and the deluges of rain. Buckinghamshire accomplished the "double" over Berkshire in the Minor Counties championship at High Wycombe, on Saturday, by once more winning by an innings. On Monday and Tuesday Berks were due to meet Wiltshire at Kensington Road, but rain only allowed two hours' play, during which Berkshire obtained 89 runs for the loss of one wicket. Strangely enough, although the wicket favoured the bowlers, this was easily Berkshire's best opening of the season and it is to be regretted that the weather caused an abandonment of the match.

The spectators were not at all pleased that there was no cricket following a shower at 3.30 p.m. on Monday. Stokes, the Berkshire captain, however, was prepared for his side to go on batting, but the Wilts captain was not of the same mind, and so the final decision was left in the hands of the umpres, who declared the pitch unplayable, for although one end dried, patches of mud and water remained at the other end. I sympathise with the spectators who wanted more cricket for the money they had paid, but no blame can be attached to the home club. Personally, I should have liked to have seen the players had a "go," for I feel that "doctored" wickets and all this great care now taken over making sure the pitch is in perfect condition after the smallest shower, before a ball is bowled, is killing rather than creating interest in the old game. I know there might have been a number of strange dismissals, but the spectators would have had their share of thrills, and after all a cricket crowd is never worried over the result of the match and for good sportsmanship is without equal.

#### ANOTHER BERKS DEFEAT

Berkshire's Poor Display  
Against Hertfordshire

In the hour before the tea interval, Herts put up 100 for the loss of only four wickets. Kingsley went for the bowling, and in one over from Jewell, hit two consecutive sixes, whilst in the next over he hit a six off Bomford. Before stumps were drawn 9 wickets fell for 145 runs.

Hertfordshire take the full six points as, under Minor Counties' Championship rules, where the play is confined to one day, a lead on the first innings counts as a win.

Moss and Crisfield also quickly fell victims to O'Shea, and the score-board read 11 for four. Timewell, meanwhile, had stayed there, taking no chances. Joined by Krabbé, these two saved the situation by adding 38 runs. It was when Bomford came in, however, that the tide took a real turn. He was not afraid to attack the bowling and runs came quickly. At the close of play he had 25 to his credit, and was partnered by England, the young wicket-keeper. Bomford was soon out on the Saturday, but a fine innings by England and steady batting by Relf and Jewell took the total to 173, giving Berkshire a lead of 70 on the first innings.

In a good position, Berkshire needed some quick wickets if they were to force a win, and to the rescue came the veteran, Relf. Oxfordshire started well, and Berkshire saw their hopes dwindling. At 111 for four, however, things changed. Three wickets fell for eighteen runs, and keeping their grip on the game they dismissed Oxfordshire for 149, Relf claiming six victims.

It was now almost a certain win for Berkshire, for the wicket was playing steadily, but such a big win as ten wickets was not anticipated.
