

## COUNTY POLICE SUCCESS

### Webber Bowl Won for Seventh Time

Cambs. County Police won the Webber Challenge Bowl for the seventh time when they defeated Essex Police by 10 wickets on Parker's Piece on Tuesday.

The Essex score of 162 was passed without the loss of a wicket, and Cambs. County took one and a half hours to get their 165. Essex took three and a half hours to amass their total.

### PRESENTATION OF TROPHY.

The trophy was presented by Mr. W. C. Jackson in the presence of the Mayor of Cambridge (Mr. E. Saville Peck), the Deputy Mayor (Mr. W. L. Briggs), Mr. W. Winter (Cambs. Chief Constable), Mr. A. R. Fordham (Chairman of the County Council), Mr. J. Crookford (Assistant Chief Constable of Essex), Supt. Hyde (Saffron Walden), Supt. A. E. Allen, Insp. Housden (Arrington).

Mr. Winter asked Mr. Jackson to present the trophy on behalf of Mr. Webber, who was away from Cambridge. Mr. Jackson said he had had the privilege of presenting the bowl and the runner-up cup many times on behalf of Mr. Webber. A telegram of best wishes had been sent to the donor of the trophies, and, in turn, one had been received from Mr. Webber expressing the wish that they would enjoy their match.

Mr. Jackson presented the bowl to Sergeant Unwin, captain of the Cambs. team, and congratulated the winning team, referring especially to the splendid effort made by P.C.s Garner and Hart. The runner-up cup was presented to Sergeant Mumford, captain of the Essex team, and Mr. Jackson congratulated him on the game his team had played and on the team's fielding.

The Mayor said he had enjoyed watching the game immensely. The Essex side had given of their best and kept up their good play right up to the finish.

Sergeant Mumford congratulated the Cambs. team, and said he had received the runner-up cup several times, and this year his team hoped to win the bowl. Sergeant Unwin replied.

Mr. Jackson explained that the match had been played 14 years, and the Cambs. side had won the bowl for seven of them.

Sergt. Sussum and P.C. Hart were the only two players who played in the first Webber Bowl match in 1925.

The teams were entertained to lunch at the Dorothy Club, Cambridge, and among those who attended were: Mr. A. H. Wood, Supt. D. Chapman (Essex Police), Mr. P. W. Wilkin, and Insp. Woolsey (County Headquarters).

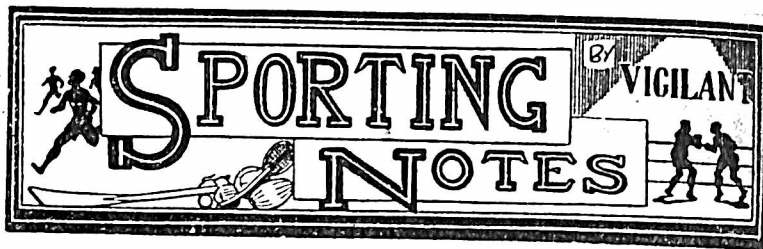

### MAJOR POINTS FOR SUFFOLK.

The high light of the Cambs. innings was a bright knock of 101 by L. A. Covill, who completed his century in just over an hour. He showed a remarkable liking for driving the ball over the heads of the bowlers to the long boundary, and because of this he was nearly caught in the outfield more than once, but the ball went either beyond or wide of the fieldsman on each occasion. Covill played forcefully, attacking the bowling rather than waiting for it to become loose, and driving and cutting it almost at will. With captain Ridgeon, who won the toss for the second time in succession, he put on 102 in a bright seventh wicket stand.

Cambs. rate of scoring, which had been on the slow side, brightened up to a degree while he was at the crease. After a steady start by Cooté and Crouch, Cambs. showed some dull patches. "I am very pleased the game has been free from any element of dirty business," added Mr. Bente, who also paid tribute

to the work done by Mr. Green, the secretary of the Association, and his assistant, Mr. Rumsey, and to Mr. Rule on the excellent pitch he had prepared. Mr. Bente also mentioned that Harston had defeated Wimpole, Melbourn, Landbeach and N.C.I. # SPORTING NOTES

## INNINGS WIN FOR CAMBS.

After a day in the field at Denes Oval, Lowestoft, on Friday, Cambs. gained full points in their game with Suffolk, winning by an innings and 49 runs. The fatal last hour on the first day, Thursday, had helped them into a favourable position. Batting first, Cambs. totalled 394, after faltering in the middle of the innings, and Suffolk, left with 45 minutes' batting at the end of a tiring day, made 34 for the loss of four valuable wickets. An interesting feature of the game was the fact that of the Cambs. batsmen only Parish, last man in, failed to reach double figures, and he was undefeated.

Highspot of the Cambs. innings was, of course, Ridgdon's 151, probably the turning point of the game—a magnificent innings, taking into consideration the state of the wicket. His best hits were a six and 18 fours. Of the earlier batsmen, Coots was top scorer with 41, and with half the side out for 144 it looked as if Cambs. might easily lose first innings points. Ridgdon's work, however, with assistance from the remainder of the side, changed the complexion of the score sheet completely. Actually it wasn't a chanceless innings, but it was a case of fortune favouring the brave. On the whole the Suffolk catching might have been considerably better, because at least four reasonable chances and one or two more difficult ones might have been held.

As expected, the wicket proved a great asset to the bowlers, and throughout the day the batsmen were struggling against keen bowling, which was aided by an appreciable percentage of balls doing the unexpected thing. This was exemplified by the duel between Cliff Smith and Phil Mead in the first innings. One over Smith produced three balls that found a spot and kicked, Mead hastily taking his bat away, and the next over Smith repeated the performance, but this time Mead was not quick enough in taking his bat away and Coots took a simple catch. When Suffolk were all out by lunch time, with arrears of 239, it was evident that nothing short of a miracle—or the weather—could avert defeat. The possibility of a miracle receded even further when Sangster was back in the pavilion with only one run on the board and the weather did nothing more than cause the loss of 25 minutes through showers.

## HARSTON IN ANOTHER FINAL.

Harston entered another final on Saturday, when they had an easy victory against Lode in the semi-final of the Cambs. Junior Cricket League competition. On present form they look like completing the double, having already won the Cambs. Junior Cup. In the other semi-final, which was also played on the Piece, Ickleton are in a well-nigh impregnable position. They have scored 195 and, in reply, Cottenham B.L. had knocked up only 85 runs for six wickets when time elapsed.

The Harston-Lode match was notable for some fine bowling by Ives, who was quite unplayable at times. His final figures, eight wickets for 25 runs, were the reward for some cleverly varied bowling, which had the merit of accuracy all the time. Lode lost the game in the first hour. Five wickets fell for 15 runs and only K. Wright (who went in third wicket down and was 12 not out at the close) played the bowling with any confidence. Harston were left with only 64 to get. They lost four wickets in reaching this score. N. Knight, W. Ives and E. Law all reached double figures, the last-named being 30 not out when stumps were drawn with the total at 85 for four. Golding got all four wickets with his good length deliveries.

On the adjoining pitch, Ickleton amassed a big total after a poor start. Three wickets went down for 33, but Burton and Flitton raised the score from 88 to 161 before Burton was clean bowled by Ivatt.

His 83 included eight fours, one five and one six and was obtained by hitting all round the wicket. Flitton's 36 was a more careful effort. The last five wickets fell for 30 runs, and with "Mr. Extras" contributing 25, the final total was 195. Leete and Ivatt shared the wickets. Leete had secured five for 44 runs and Ivatt five for 78.

Against the bowling of Griggs and A. Wombwell, Cottenham B.L. made a shaky start, and but for a seventh wicket stand the innings would have closed before stumps were drawn at 7.45 p.m. Wickets fell at 2, 5, 17, 22 and 27, but stonewalling by Wayman saw time out. The sixth wicket went at 40 and Wayman and Burgess played out time, being undefeated for 10 and 19 respectively. Cottenham have a long way to go to beat Ickleton's score, but they have, of course, a chance while a wicket is standing.

## CAMDEN WIN AT WALDEN.

Some brisk scoring by H. Barrett, who was promoted in the batting order, enabled Camden to gain a four wickets victory at Saffron Walden on Thursday. Saffron Walden were given a good start by King and Scott, who put on 50 for the opening partnership, but then Barrett and Withrington brought about a collapse, half the side being out for 62. Custerson and Potterill stopped the rot with a sixth wicket partnership of 30, and Bacon was associated with Potterill in a ninth wicket stand at 21. When the innings closed at 142 Barrett had an analysis of three wickets for 19 runs, Parfitt three for 29, Withrington two for 29 and McMullan two for 40.

Parfitt and Jackson opened steadily for Camden, their partnership realising 38, and Buttery saw the 50 passed before being caught. Withrington and Parfitt put on 45 for the third wicket, but both left at 98. Camden were behind the clock and Barrett was sent in to force the pace. He did the job well, for in barely 20 minutes he obtained 48, including two sixes and eight fours. He scored his runs out of 56 made while he was at the wicket and the Walden total was passed before he was caught. Stumps were drawn at 163 for six wickets. Bacon, with three wickets for 34, Potterill with one for 15 and Duke with one for 33 were the successful bowlers for Walden.

## ROYSTON TROUNCE CAMDEN.

Of Royston's total of 154 for seven wickets compiled against Camden on Downing College ground, Kelly and Worboys scored 121. Kelly, one of the opening pair, was the fifth batsman to take the walk back to the pavilion after having knocked up a bright 77, which included nine boundary hits. With B. A. Worboys he had a fifth wicket partnership of 76 before a ball from Warren struck his pads and he was out lbw. Warren was also instrumental in sending Worboy back, taking quite a good catch off Ayres' bowling. In the early stages of the game it did not look as though Royston were going to have a very good passage in the batting, for the first three wickets were down for 16, and another went at 52. The partnership between Kelly and Worboys pulled the game round and the Camden bowlers did not have too enjoyable a time. Of the bowlers to take wickets, Warren had two for 19, Ayres two for 21, Daisley two for 60 and Haywood one for 28.

Camden, too, had early reverses, but unlike Royston they did not recover, but went on steadily losing wickets. Three were down for 17 and the entire side was out for 83. Warren, who had played a great part in breaking up the fifth wicket partnership, scored 33, and P. C. Gray 18. The score was taken from seven runs for three wickets to 46 for four, but the other six batsmen could add only 37. For Royston, Palmer took seven wickets for 43 runs and Dicks three for 32.

Taking first knock, Ely compiled 248 for two wickets. Tannahill left with the score at seven, and then Ogily joined Covill and the pair proceeded to demonstrate the art of cricket. Despite frequent bowling changes, runs continued to flow freely from the willows, and it was not until 248 was on the board, that Covill was caught and bowled by Todd. The innings was then declared closed. Covill had despatched the ball to the boundary seven times, while Ogily had 12 boundaries to his credit. Felixstowe were dismissed for 113. #### CAMBS. DROP MORE POINTS.

Cambs followed up their defeat by Norfolk at Lakenham, Norwich, by forfeiting first innings points this week when Norfolk came to Fenner's. The visitors batted first and flogged the Cambs, bowling mercilessly, scoring 365 runs. Of these D. C. Rought-Rought hit an effortless 92 in two hours, scoring seven boundary strokes. He also figured in a partnership of 157 with Edrich (G.), brother of the Test player. Smith, who bore the brunt of the Cambs. attack, and his figures (36.4-12-80-6) were very good indeed. The second day's play brought a show of batting contrasts when Cambs. went to the wicket 323 runs behind, with nine wickets standing. Taylor and Covill tackled the bowling vigorously, and their partnership added 147 runs. Covill scored 96 and Taylor 88. The recovery in the Cambs. batting, heralded a collapse, and the last five wickets fell for the addition of only 56 runs. Thus a Cambs. innings which, early on, had promised so much, ended quite dismally.

#### TWO THOUSAND RUNS.

Maurice Crouch, the Cambs. and March Town cricketer, has, for the second time, scored over 2,000 runs. He accomplished this notable performance last season. Playing for March Town against Heacham on Saturday, he was unbeaten with 110 to his credit, thus bringing his total of runs for the season to 2,160, a very creditable achievement, which is hardly approached in local cricket.

#### LORD LIEUTENANT'S CUP.

Pettit, number seven, scored 17.
