SPLENDID BOWLING BY C. TYLER AGAINST MIDDLESEX

Minor Counties Match at Finchley

A splendid bowling achievement by C. Tyler marked the debut of Gloucestershire in their Minor Counties Championship match with Middlesex, at Finchley, yesterday.

Tyler's medium-paced leg breaks found the Middlesex batsman in trouble, and in roughly two and a-half hours Middlesex were out for 141, Tyler taking seven wickets for 37 runs.

Rain held up play until half-past five, and when stumps were drawn, Gloucestershire were 70 behind with four wickets outstanding.

For Middlesex, only Robertson and Leslie Compton offered stout resistance to Gloucestershire's attack. When Gloucestershire were in, Stephens had the misfortune to leave with a facial injury.

Young and Benker, the Middlesex spin bowlers, turned the ball with effect, and half the Gloucestershire side were out for 53, but Yeend and Arthurs were together at the close. Scores:—

MIDDLESEX DEFEAT GLO'SHIRE

Unfortunate Debut in Minor Counties Cricket

Gloucestershire found the wicket almost unplayable at Finchley yesterday, where Middlesex gained a comfortable victory by 179 runs.

Overnight, Gloucestershire were 71 behind with four wickets standing, but an hour's cricket saw their remaining wickets tumble down for an additional 56 runs, thus Gloucestershire could only muster 129 in their second spell.

Leslie Compton, by some forceful batting, put Middlesex well on the road to victory, collecting 70 out of 164 in roughly an hour.

Shortly before three o'clock, Middlesex declared, leaving Gloucestershire to obtain 218 runs to win, but on a wicket which sun had dried out treacherously, Robinson and Young with their spinners got to work, and Gloucestershire collapsed amazingly, Marks being the only batsman to defy the Middlesex attack. Gloucestershire's debut in Minor Counties cricket was an unfortunate one, but there is plenty of talent, and they will be seen to better advantage. Scores:—

INJURED GLOUCESTERSHIRE BATSMAN

Stephens, the Gloucestershire batsman, who was taken to hospital on Wednesday suffering from a badly cut eye, the result of an accident in the match with Middlesex 2nd XI at Finchley, was stated yesterday to be comfortable.

He did not travel back with the Gloucestershire team last night, and will see an eye specialist in London today. Stephens is at the Finchley Memorial Hospital.

How's That . . .

Next Wednesday will mark the beginning of the first Minor Counties match ever played in Gloucestershire, that between Gloucestershire and Middlesex on the Stroud ground at Farmhill. It is not until this season that Gloucestershire supporters have been directly interested in the Minor Counties competition and the following notes may, therefore, be of interest.

Before the advent of county cricket, such sides as the M.C.C., the All-England XI and the United South of England XI provided the strongest opposition. The last named played twenty-two of Stroud in 1880. By that year county cricket was in full swing, the Gloucestershire Club, for instance, having played its first match in 1868.

Fifty years ago—in 1888—the Minor Counties Competition was unofficially started. At that time the following counties were reckoned as first-class: Surrey, Kent, Yorkshire, Gloucestershire, Lancashire, Notts, Middlesex and Sussex.

Up to the present system there used to be various ways of determining the championship. The original way was to regard as champions the county team which had lost the fewest matches. Then the point system was introduced, one point being awarded for a win and half for a draw. In December, 1889, the losses were deducted from the victories and drawn games were altogether ignored. The Minor Counties Competition followed the same system as the first class.

Leicestershire were the first Minor County Champions, Warwickshire secured the honour in 1889, Somerset in 1890 (for which they were promoted to first-class status), Leicestershire in 1891, Warwickshire in 1892 and Derbyshire in 1893. In 1894 there was no competition, Derbyshire, Warwickshire, Leicestershire, Essex and Hampshire having become first-class counties.

It is from 1895 that the Minor Counties Competition of to-day dates, although it was not until 1901 that it had the official recognition of the M.C.C. and was placed on a really proper footing.

Worcestershire was soon very prominent. After finishing third in 1895, they were winners in the three following seasons and in 1899 became first-class. The system of reckoning the championship then was that "one point shall be reckoned for each win, one deducted for each loss, unfinished games shall not be reckoned. The county which during the season shall have, in unfinished matches, obtained the greatest proportionate number of points shall be reckoned Champion County."

This, obviously, was not very satisfactory. For instance, Durham won the championship in 1901 with a record of: Played 8, won 3, lost 0, drawn 5. Surrey II, who finished second, had a record of: Played 14, won 8, lost 1, drawn 5. Accordingly at a meeting at Lord's on Dec. 10th, 1901, the Second Class Counties agreed to a new system, the most interesting feature of which was the awarding of a point to the side leading on the first innings in a drawn match. It is worthy of note that the First Class Counties did not adopt this system until ten years later.

One to whom credit is due for the modern system of scoring in the County Championship is Mr. A. M. Miller, of Wiltshire. Mr. Miller, who is the father of Mrs. Poore, of Miserden, is still playing for the Gloucestershire Gypsies, and

the Free Foresters. It was he who proposed the alteration of the system in 1901. This resolution was that "three points shall be scored for a win in a completed match; should the match not be completed, the side leading on the first innings shall score one point . . ."

Under the new system, Mr. Miller's own county, Wiltshire, won the championship in 1902. Northamptonshire won it in the following two seasons, for which they were promoted to first class rank. Norfolk were successful in 1905, and Staffordshire, who had the mighty Barnes bowling for them, in 1906.

Then for the next few seasons, the counties were divided into groups, the winners of each meeting in semi-final rounds and so on to the final. Glamorgan had the misfortune to appear in three consecutive finals without winning one.

In 1912 the group system was abandoned, each county having to play at least eight matches. Norfolk finished on top and Staffordshire second. According to the rules, as these two teams had not met during the season, Staffordshire were entitled to play a challenge match with Norfolk—this rule still holds good—but owing to the lateness in the season, this match could not be arranged and the championship was held in abeyance.

It has only been held in abeyance once since, in 1933. A challenge match had taken place between Norfolk (who were first) and Yorkshire II. (second), and with the latter winning, they were declared champions. However, some weeks later it was discovered that a mistake had been made in the Yorkshire figures in the table and that in reality they were third and Wiltshire second. It was Wiltshire, therefore, who should have challenged Norfolk.

It only remains to add that Middlesex II. won the championship in 1935 at their first attempt. They had an unbeaten record. In 1936 they were fifth and last summer eighth. As we said last week, they are quite capable of beating some First Class Counties.

For the second week in succession D. R. Durden has bowled well for Stroud II. Against Downend II. he captured eight wickets for three runs apiece, and on Saturday he secured six for the same average cost. A medium paced bowler, he makes the ball rise rapidly by bringing his arm over quickly. Durden, who is working at Minchinhampton Aerodrome, is also a useful batsman.

The assistants at Messrs. F. W. Woolworth and Co., of King Street, Stroud, are hoping to run a cricket team this season. A practice match was held at Stratford Road on Thursday, the top half of the store being opposed to the bottom half. The former proved victorious. It is also hoped to run a hockey team during the winter.

Garlick was swinging the ball disconcertingly late, in both directions, and his fourth ball beat and bowled Jack Sewell all ends up. This brought in R. E. Yeend.

Edge was erratic from the pavilion end, and Taylor hit Garlick nicely past cover to the boundary. However, soon afterwards Yeend played on to Edge, and P. A. C. Hayward, the little Gloucester left-hander, was clean-bowled by Garlick.

FOUR WICKETS DOWN

This meant that four wickets were down for a paltry 12 runs, and G. E. Arthurs came in to face an exceedingly awkward situation.

Edge, who has a long run, experienced difficulty with his run-up, and he was no-balled five times.

At 22, Bowes, a very tall fast-medium bowler, took over from Edge; and after Taylor had played him through the gully for four, Arthurs flicked an outswinger into the hands of Robinson behind the stumps.

Taylor's plucky innings came to an end when he played a rather vague shot at Garlick and was bowled.

The rest of the side was quickly out. Matthews fell to Garlick and Monks to Bowes. K. G. Harvey hit a no-ball from Garlick through the covers to the boundary, but later walked in front of his wickets to the same bowler; and, when Bowes knocked back Davis's off-stump, Gloucestershire's innings came to a sad close after 65 minutes' play with only 46 on the board.

T. A. Higson, the Lancashire captain and Old Cheltonian, went in with Place to open the Lancashire innings, facing Matthews (from the pavilion end) and Davis.

At 18, Monks relieved Davis, and almost immediately took the valuable wicket of Place, leg-before. D. M. Matthews, another left-hander, came in.

This was the signal for Arthurs to put on Tyler to attack the left-handers with his off-spinners. But the wicket was none too responsive, Higson and Matthews progressing quietly till lunch time, when the score stood at 36 for one wicket.

After lunch Monks soon swung a ball in to Matthews to bowl him with the score at 44. He was moving the ball sharply, having three slips and a gully, and at 50 he bowled Higson. A. E. Husband joined K. Cranston, but he was palpably uncomfortable against Monks. He soon had a slash at a ball moving away from him and was taken by Harvey behind the wicket.

Davis then produced a "snorter" which pegged back Cranston's leg stump, and

Lancashire had lost five wickets for 58. At 61 a misunderstanding led to W. Parkin being run out.

Tyler took over from Monks at 104 and quickly bowled Bowes. Garlick's excellent innings came to a close when he was caught behind the wicket off Cranfield.

LANCS II.'S ATTACK TOO GOOD FOR GLO'SHIRE

FINE BOWLING FEATS IN MINOR COUNTIES MATCH AT CHELTENHAM

Gloucestershire II. were yesterday decisively beaten by Lancashire II. in a Minor Counties match, which only lasted one day, on the Victoria Ground, the visitors winning by eight wickets. It is consoling to reflect that F. J. Sewell and R. E. Yeend, the Cheltenham cricketers, made the two highest individual scores of the match.

It was a remarkable match in that the bowling was always on top on a perfectly well-mannered wicket. True, two of the Lancashire speed bowlers made the ball rear up occasionally, but Edge accomplished this by sheer pace, and Bowes by means of his unusual height.

Gloucestershire batted first, and their innings realised only 46 runs, and lasted approximately 65 minutes. Lancashire have an extremely strong attack, headed by three quick bowlers. Edge, a strongly-built, red-headed man with a beautiful run up and action, really does bang them down at a great pace; Garlick, fast-medium, has a splendid length and a dangerous late swing both ways; Bowes, of Garlick's pace, comes down from a great height, moves the ball sharply away, and gathers pace off the pitch.

Only Taylor made any sort of show in Gloucestershire's first innings, and only five men scored at all. Edge was erratic and had trouble with his run up. It was Garlick who did the damage, having the remarkable figures of 6 for 25. Bowes had 3 for 10.

T. A. Higson, the Lancashire captain and Old Cheltonian, Place and D. M. Matthews gave the Minor Counties champions a steady start, but Monks, bowling medium-paced out-swingers, got among the wickets, and with six wickets down for 61, things looked more hopeful for Gloucestershire. But Garlick came in to bat very nicely, the tail wagged usefully, and Lancashire eventually totalled 146—exactly 100 on. Monks' five wickets cost him just over eight runs apiece.

ANOTHER BAD START

Gloucestershire's second innings started badly, for Monks was well taken off a bumper from Edge, and when Taylor was caught things looked black.

But Jack Sewell and Ronnie Yeend came to the side's rescue and added 68, saving a possible innings defeat. They both batted resolutely, driving nicely, and the partnership came to an end when Bowes clean-bowled Sewell.

P. A. C. Hayward, the diminutive Gloucester left-hander, had the misfortune to stumble on his wicket. Yeend's admirable innings had been rather tentative since tea, and he had been hanging his hat out at Bowes. When 35 he flicked one to the wicket-keeper and was out.

Bowes ran through the remainder of the side, only G. E. Arthurs standing up to him, and the innings closed at 142, Bowes having 6 for 35.

Lancashire only needed 43 to win, and had 31 of these for the loss of two wickets at seven o'clock. After a consultation extra time was allowed, and the necessary 12 runs were got without further loss.

Cranfield, E. D. C. Eagar and Taylor also played important parts in this win.

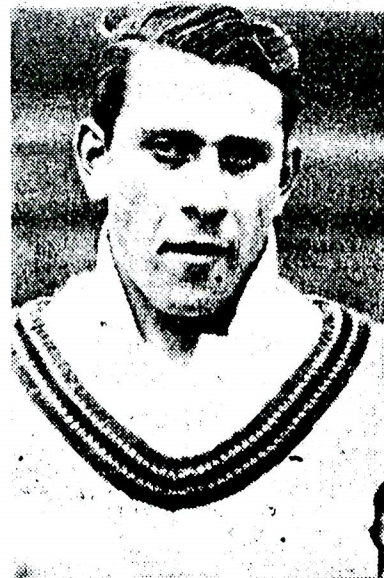

G. Hunt and J. Priddy were practically unplayable, securing five wickets for 17 runs and four for 17 respectively.

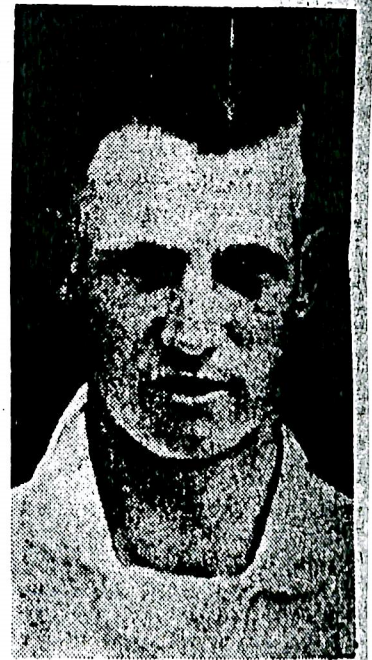
Weston-super-Mare received a shock at the start, losing J. Rigby before he had scored, but they made the necessary runs without further loss, J. Priddy making 66.

BOWLERS TAKE UPPER HAND

Low Scoring In Local Cricket Matches —
Stapleton Skittle Out Long
Ashton — Clifton Fail

ANOTHER SUCCESS FOR BOHEMIANS

GENERALLY speaking bowlers held the upper hand in cricket matches in Bristol and district on Saturday, and after the morning rain followed by wind and sun, the pitches were on the tricky side.

Only 117 runs were scored in the match between Stapleton and Long Ashton on the latter's ground. The Stapleton team were dismissed for 77 runs, the top scorer being L. Chapman with 22 not out.

Long Ashton, who naturally rather expected to be able to get the necessary runs needed for victory, soon found that the wicket was tricky and runs very difficult to get against the bowling of A. E. Williams, who took seven wickets for 11 runs and L. Chapman, who obtained the other three for 22 runs. The result was that Long Ashton were dismissed for 40 runs and not one of the batsmen reached double figures.

Brislington on their own ground made a good start in the local Derby game with Knowle, but then F. Richards took some cheap wickets and with D. Craig polished off the innings by taking the last three wickets for one run, Brislington being dismissed for 88 runs. Richards obtained four wickets for 22 runs.

Brislington looked certain to win this game, for Knowle lost six wickets for 27 runs, but then came a fine seventh wicket stand between H. Gare and L. Pritchard, the captain, for the match, and these two laid the foundation of victory.

This bowler secured his first success after his seventh over, and then went on to take the remaining eight wickets. That gave him nine wickets for 25 runs—one of his best performances. Six times he hit the stumps, and he made one catch off his own bowling.

Ford's final analysis read: 16.5 overs, 5 maidens, 25 runs, 9 wickets. Bridgwater were dismissed for 74 runs and were beaten by 84 runs.

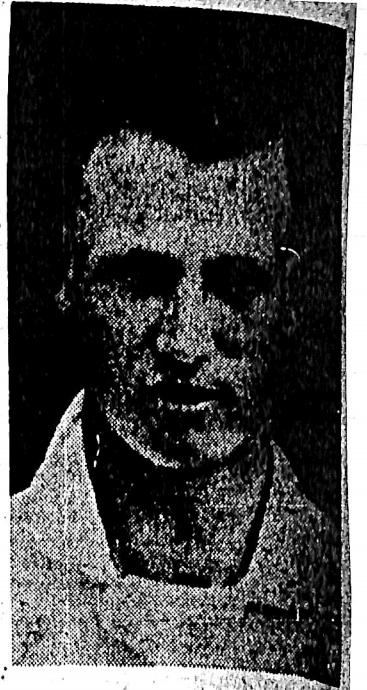
