

KENT 2nd LOSE TO MIDDLESEX

By Four Wickets

AT THE GROVE.

Kent 2nd XI, lost by four wickets to Middlesex 2nd XI, at The Grove, Sittingbourne, in a Minor Counties match on Wednesday and Thursday.

Rain marred the opening day's play and Middlesex, who included three of their first team players, Hart, Nevell, and Gray, in their side, won comfortably by 4.15 on Thursday afternoon.

The feature of the match from the Kent point of view was the fine bowling of Harding, the promising young fast bowler, who took 11 wickets for 84 runs in the two innings. Cole, the local player, although he only bowled a few overs, made top score for Kent in their second innings.

As a whole, however, neither side showed very bright form with the bat and the attack were usually on top.

Kent 2nd XI, batted first on what appeared to be an easy wicket, but against the bowling of Nevell, Robertson, Gray, and Young, they were all out shortly after lunch for 98.

Sunnucks and Capt. L. T. Grove opened the Kent innings and put on 34 for the first wicket, but after their partnership was broken it was almost a regular procession back to the pavilion. Nine wickets were down when lunch time arrived, and the last four Kent wickets fell for the addition of only four runs. Sunnucks was top scorer with 24, while Carter made 21. Nevell was the most successful Middlesex bowler taking three for 21, while Robertson captured three for 27.

When Middlesex 2nd XI, batted they had a disastrous start. Harding quickly took the wickets of Hart (8), Tredwell (1), and Compton (0). Then Robertson and Abrahams settled down to score runs at a steady rate, and when rain stopped play before tea the total stood at 106 for three. Robertson had 46 not out and Abrahams was 41 not out, including seven fours.

The wicket was inspected by the umpires after tea, and although it was fit for play had the rain held up, it continued steadily and play was abandoned for the day.

On Thursday morning the Middlesex batsmen were not at all comfortable against the bowling of Harding, and after having scored 141 for the loss of nine wickets declared.

Kent fared little better in their second innings than the first, and showed little confidence against the bowling of Young, who took seven wickets very cheaply.

Middlesex set to get 70 to win, did not fare much better, and were content to take their time in knocking off the runs, and they lost six batsmen in doing so. Harding again took the bowling honours, claiming five of the six wickets. Score:—

KENT v. SURREY.

WIN FOR VISITORS.

Brilliant sunshine marked the opening of what has now become the annual minor counties' fixture between Kent and Surrey on the Sports Ground on Monday and Tuesday.

G. A. Simpson won the toss for Kent and elected to bat, sending out W. H. V. Levett and Sunnucks in the hope of giving Kent a good start, but Levett was back in the pavilion with only 14 runs on the board, having stepped in front of the stumps when a ball came in from the off. Sunnucks and Foy set about retrieving the situation and batted brightly. They put on 68 runs before Foy hit a ball into King's hands in the gully. D. Clark joined Sunnucks, but with the score at 101 the latter was caught at extra cover off Pierpoint. T. A. Crawford was next man in and for some time the batsmen played entertaining cricket. Crawford's driving was a feature of his innings, which came to an end at 34, Daley accepting a chance at extra cover off Pierpoint. Clark followed three runs later, E. A. Bedser holding a catch at mid-on off the slow bowling of King. Only two runs were scored before G. A. Simpson was bowled by Pierpoint with a ball which came across slightly from the off.

Carter and Cole were brought together against the slow bowlers Daley and King. Carter drove hard and Cole backed him up well and the bowlers showed little signs of moving them until the new ball was brought into use with the double century. Pierpoint and Bedser again took charge of the attack and at 210 Carter did not quite get under a ball from Pierpoint and gave Eglinton an easy catch at mid-off. From that point wickets fell rapidly, Evans leaving at 238 and Davis and Dovey at 248, with Cole not out for 30 runs. Pierpoint took the last two wickets with consecutive balls and at the close of the innings he had secured no less than eight wickets for 59 runs. None of the last three men showed any idea of dealing with his bowling as they should have done, for quite a lot of balls were short in length. He was fortunate in gaining some cheap wickets.

McMurray and Whitfield, two well-known Surrey batsmen, opened the Surrey innings and Whitfield was out with only nine runs scored, Levett running from the wicket to backward short-leg to hold a catch which the batsman cocked up off a short ball outside the leg stump from Cole, after he had scored one. McMurray had a lucky escape when he lifted a sharply rising ball from Dovey in the second over and Levett and Simpson missed it between them. However, McMurray made light of this "life" and together with Mobery played steady cricket and lifted the score to 22 for one when tea was taken. Simpson tried three bowlers, but with no effect and they looked thoroughly set at the interval.

The sky clouded over after the resumption and conditions were far from pleasant. Dovey opened from the north end with slow leg breaks, and Cole was at the south end. In Dovey's second over McMurray spooned a ball outside the off stump to Sunnucks at cover with his score at 35.

Wickets fell quickly in the last hour and Surrey were left to face a bad situation. At 80 Mobery left, caught by Carter, and one run later E. A. Bedser was cleaned bowled by Cole. The procession had started with a vengeance and at 118 Whittaker left. McIntyre and R. Eglinton tried hard to save the collapse, McIntyre lifting a ball from Dovey to Davis. King was bowled at 135 and A. V. Bedser stepped in front of a straight one from Dovey five runs later. Eglinton, the Surrey captain,

and Daley were left and they had raised the total to 153 for the loss of eight wickets when stumps were drawn.

When the game was resumed on Tuesday Surrey's last two wickets held up for half an hour. Carter secured the wicket of Eglinton, who was responsible for quite a fine knock of 33 runs. Dovey bowled Daley for 24, and the innings closed for 185.

W. H. V. Levett and Sunnucks set out to get runs from the start when they opened Kent's second innings, both players reaching the boundary several times. The first wicket fell at 61, Sunnucks being snapped up by Daley at short leg off Pierpoint. Foy came in and played very quietly, leaving his partner to get the runs, but he managed to collect 17 before Mobery caught him at the wicket off Daley. D. Clark played very steadily and 16 runs after the falling of Foy's wicket, Levett failed to properly get hold of a well pitched ball from E. A. Bedser, with the usual fatal result. At the moment he was bowled the score stood at 117. Lunch was taken with the score at 128 for 3 wickets. Cole not out 10 and Clark not out 9. Cole had batted twenty minutes for his runs.

After the resumption Cole decided to go for runs and hit out in all directions although his chief strokes were off drives and huge pulls. Swiftly the score mounted until Cole reached his fifty, forty of which it had taken him only 35 minutes to score. Cole continued until he reached 72, when off Pierpoint's first delivery with the new ball he was caught at cover by McIntyre. The partnership had added 91, and the total stood at 208. T. A. Crawford joined Clarke and remained until the latter hit a ball from A. V. Bedser into McIntyre's hands at second

slip. Kent declared at the fall of this wicket with the total showing 220 for 5 wickets, Clark having made an invaluable 30.

McMurray and Whitfield opened the Surrey second innings at ten minutes past three, needing 284 to win in two hours and twenty minutes, a not impossible task. Whitfield offered an exceptionally difficult chance to Sunnucks at cover which he could not hold. The same player started very brightly reaching the boundary five times in his first 22 runs. McMurray was more subdued but they rushed the score along at a good pace and at tea after an hour and five minutes batting, the scoreboard showed 95 runs, with McMurray 61 and Whitfield 42. Only 12 runs were added after tea before Whitfield flicked a ball from Carter and Levett held the catch with his score at 45. The lack of change bowlers had been very evident for when the score was 52, Dovey and Carter had the task of bowling placed upon them and continued until quite a time after the tea interval. Cole eventually took over the ball from Carter.

McMurray and Mobery carried on playing bright and attractive cricket and raised the total to 176 before McMurray in playing to leg was beaten by a ball from Dovey, it turning sharply, with his score at 76, a really fine innings. Mobery and Whittaker were brought together and the latter lashed out with striking success and splendidly backed up by Mobery, increased the total with great rapidity. Carter again relieved Dovey with the new ball at 204 and Surrey required 80 in just about an hour. Another disaster befell Surrey at 231, Mobery being caught at second slip by Foy, off a ball which lifted sharply from Cole. The pitch was beginning to bite and Cole made the ball fly a little. Mobery had bad luck in being out two short of his half century.

McIntyre joined Whittaker in the exciting fight for runs and right from the start the pair set out to belabour the tiring bowlers. Whittaker went on to complete a breezy 50 in 35 minutes, mainly through hard drives and leg shots. At six o'clock Surrey required 20 runs in 34 minutes and the result was

assured. Whittaker and McIntyre did not slacken and never hesitated to punish the poor bowling of the Kent side and the winning run was scored by Whittaker through the slip at a quarter past six, well within the limit. The interest of the poor attendance was held until the last ball was bowled and such efforts as were seen on the ground on Monday and Tuesday were worthy of far better support.

Surrey Beat The Clock and Kent

Bright Cricket In Minor Counties Game

It was a real pity that so few people thought it worth while turning out to see the Minor Counties Championship match between Kent 2nd XI and Surrey 2nd XI on the Folkestone Cricket Ground on Monday and Tuesday.

Not only was the cricket good throughout, but the finish on Tuesday evening was as thrilling as anyone could wish. Set 284 runs to win, with under three hours to get the runs, Surrey made a valiant effort and won with seven wickets to spare.

The very youthful Kent side contained some wonderful talent, especially in the batting line. Clark, a young amateur, displayed an almost impregnable defence, a good style and scoring shots all round the wicket. Carter, small and slightly built, hit a glorious six and scored a brilliant 31 in the first innings. Evans has a square cut of which many first rank batsmen would be proud, and Cole played two bright innings, scoring 102 for once out. He also drove a huge six.

KENT'S THREE BOWLERS

But their bowling lacked strength. While Surrey employed six bowlers, Kent had only three. Carter was exceptionally fast, with a smooth action, but he was erratic and so at times expensive. Cole was able to make the ball pop up at times, but he was not very effective. Dovey, a slow spun bowler, was most dangerous.

In a cold sea mist on Monday morning, no more than 30 spectators saw the commencement of Kent's innings. Levett soon went, but Sunnucks settled down and played the slow bowlers comfortably. He was plainly uneasy, however, against Pierpoint, who kept a good length and was very fast. After scoring 50 in 90 minutes, including several boundaries, he cocked up Pierpoint's first ball after the latter had been brought on again and was caught by extra cover.

While Clark played carefully, Foy took the score along briskly, and when his wicket fell. Crawford followed his example and hit out. Simpson did not last long but Carter, his successor, during his brief stay was completely contemptuous of the bowling. Three mighty straight drives for four put the 200 up after 3 hours' play, and the next ball, a short one, Carter hooked for six. In the next over he mishit and was caught at mid-wicket.

CAREFREE INNINGS

Cole played a carefree and most unorthodox innings. He hit hard, and once struck the sight-screen with a straight drive. Evans, quick on his feet, square cut three times to the boundary before flicking the ball into the slips. He showed a tendency to flick at all rising off-balls, but he also showed great possibilities as a batsman of class.

Cole and Carter opened the attack for Kent, and one of Cole's jumpers was soon the downfall of Whitfield.

Protecting himself with his bat he cocked the ball up and Levett made an acrobatic dive to catch the ball inches off the ground. McMurray and Mobey, however, who have both served often in the Surrey first team, hit freely, and the 50 went up after 45 minutes.

After tea Dovey had a run of success. He had McMurray caught at point and caused Mobey to sky a ball into the safe hands of Carter. Cole knocked back Bedser's (A. E.) off-stump, and Dovey had Whittaker lbw.

Surrey looked in a bad way. McIntyre momentarily brightened their gloom by cracking five quick boundaries, but with his dismissal Kent's chances of making Surrey follow on looked good. Eglington played a captain's innings, however, and with Daley hit off enough runs to avoid the follow on.

At the close of play on Monday Surrey were 95 runs behind with two wickets to fall.

TUESDAY'S PLAY

Spectators were again few on Tuesday, when, save for scattered showers which did not interfere with the play, the weather was brighter and warmer. Eglington and Daley having added 27 to their overnight score, the Surrey innings soon closed, leaving them 63 runs in arrears.

Sunnucks and Levett opened brightly for Kent, both reaching the boundary frequently. Both tried to force the game, and Levett, who was particularly adventurous, was dropped twice by Eglington. With these two out, the rate of scoring slackened. Clark seemed to make little effort to get runs quickly, but Cole, who was sent in early to get runs, nobly carried out his task and attacked the bowling ferociously, sending the ball to all parts of the field. He dealt in boundaries only, while Clark concentrated on singles. After smiting a mighty six, he unfortunately mis-hit the ball and was caught at cover after making a breezy 72.

With Crawford as his partner Clark at last made an effort to score quickly, reaching the leg boundary twice. When he cut a ball into McIntyre's hands at point, however, Simpson called the players in, leaving Surrey with about three hours in which to score the necessary 284 runs to win.

Then began the brightest cricket of the match. McMurray and Whitfield set about the bowling with a will, and in 85 minutes they sent the 100 up. McMurray reached 50, but when 45, Whitfield, who played brilliant cricket, was unlucky to be caught at the wicket for the second time in the match. Carter was bowling at a tremendous pace, but Mobey was quick to take toll of his many short balls.

RAN ON ANYTHING

The batsmen ran on anything and the match developed almost into a "tip-and-run" game. At 173 McMurray followed a ball from Dovey round to leg, and was bowled, but Whittaker, who took his place, even increased the rate of scoring by hitting at almost anything.

Mobey was followed by McIntyre, who emulated his first innings feat and cracked boundary after boundary. With 15 minutes to go Surrey drew level with Kent, and two balls later Whittaker nicked one through the slips to win the match for Surrey.

In the Surrey team were the Bedser twins, recently engaged by Surrey. They are exactly alike, and the only way to distinguish them on the field

is to watch their bowling. One takes a longer run and bowls a fastish ball, while the other is a spin bowler.
