

CRANSTON'S HUNDRED

FINE EFFORT FOR LANCASHIRE II.

Lancashire II., at Old Trafford, scored at the rate of over 82 runs per hour against Yorkshire II. In four and a half hours they compiled 364 for 9 wickets, declared their innings closed, and then in the remaining 105 minutes dismissed 6 of their opponents for 81 runs. Thus Yorkshire, with 4 wickets left, require 134 more runs to avert the follow on.

Lancashire's innings, which started with the first 2 wickets falling for 15 runs, was featured by a brilliant century by K. Cranston, the captain of Liverpool University, who scored 117 in 2 hours 20 minutes. Confident driving on both sides of the wicket produced the bulk of his runs. He hit three 6's and twelve 4's. Until he had scored 91 his effort was chanceless. He gave a further chance when 101 before being caught near the sight-creen. Cranston was associated with C. R. Davies, while 45 runs were scored for the fourth wicket. He and Garlick hit 88 for the fifth wicket in 45 minutes, and with Parkin as his partner a further 84 were scored in 45 minutes for the sixth wicket.

C. R. Davies played a stylish innings of 65, occupying 2 hours 10 minutes. D. M. Matthews hit a 6 and eight 4's, mostly pulls and drives, in his 56, scored in less than an hour, was the basis of Lancashire's recovery. Though Yorkshire employed seven bowlers there was a lack of power in their attack. Wilkinson, the right-arm medium bowler, was the most effective and took 5 wickets for 88 runs. Three Yorkshire batsmen were out before wicket. Birtwell dismissed Cawthray and Wilkinson with successive deliveries.

EDGE TAKES SEVEN FOR 48

LANCASHIRE II. WIN BY AN INNINGS

Lancashire II., at Old Trafford, defeated Yorkshire II. by an innings and 120 runs. Such a result had suggested itself on Monday, but it was scarcely expected that Yorkshire would collapse so badly on a perfectly good pitch as to lose 14 wickets for 165 runs in 3 1/2 hours.

They started the day 283 in arrears with 4 first-innings wickets to fall. Parkin, with slow, medium off-spinners, captured them at a personal cost of 16 runs. The total was increased by 67 runs, and the innings, which lasted a shade under 3 hours, closed for 148. The one partnership of note was 44 for the seventh wicket between Hamer and Dennison. Hamer defied the Lancashire bowling for 100 minutes and Dennison for 80 minutes. The more enterprising Crick hit 25 not out in half an hour.

Following on 216 behind, Yorkshire were dismissed the second time in just over 2 hours. They lost their first 5 wickets for 38 runs. Halliday and Cawthray stayed the collapse by scoring 46 for the sixth wicket, but the remainder of the side faltered before the fast bowling of Edge, who took 7 wickets—5 clean bowled—for 48 runs.

Halliday, who hit a polished 66 in 70 minutes, played an innings of distinction, using the square-cut effectively and straight driving confidently. His best strokes were four 4's. Scores:—

LANCASHIRE II. WIN IN A DAY

32 WICKETS FALL FOR 379
RUNS

In an eventful day's cricket on the ground of the Cheltenham club, 32 wickets fell for an aggregate of 379 runs, a sure indication that the pitch helped the bowlers all day long in the match between Lancashire II. and Gloucestershire II. It was not until after the tea interval that any of the batsmen seemed to be able to get the measure of the bowling, though a valuable third-wicket stand of 67 by Sewell and Yeend, two Cheltonians playing on their home ground, put a better appearance on the score board. No one else made much of a show, and by the end of the day Lancashire finished the match and won by 8 wickets.

Going in first, when the gale had not entirely abated, Gloucestershire could do nothing with Garlick's fast medium swingers, and were all dismissed in 65 minutes for a paltry total of 46, Garlick claiming 6 wickets for 25.

The Lancashire batsmen played quiet cricket, and passed their opponents' total with only 2 wickets down, and 5 were down for 58. Garlick enlivened matters with free hitting round the wicket, and it was mainly due to him and Robinson that the Northerners were able to finish the first innings with a lead of 100. Gloucestershire did better at their second attempt, but they got Lancashire only 43 to get to win. By playing extra time Lancashire easily accomplished this. Scores:—

The Durham players, with a wicket in hand, brought their total to within 23 of the Lancashire score. Olsen, for Durham, took 3 wickets for 50 runs. It was feared that a slight mishap to Husband might have robbed Lancashire of his fielding services, but after receiving attention for a cut hand, he was able to return. HALLIDAY'S HUNDRED

YORKSHIRE AND LANCASHIRE SECOND TEAM GAME

The outstanding feature of yesterday's play at Redcar in the return Minor Counties championship match between Yorkshire II. and Lancashire II. was a century by Halliday for the home county. Going in first wicket down, Halliday carried out his bat for 133. He was at the wicket for close upon 5 hours and his boundary hits numbered 7.

The batsman concentrated chiefly upon off-drives, and did not give a single chance. Halliday received good support from Cawthray, their second-wicket partnership yielding 68 runs. Cawthray, a left-hander, played a sparkling innings of 44, and like Halliday claimed seven 4's. Parkin and Roberts, the visiting slow-bowlers, caused Yorkshire considerable anxiety. D. A. Shepherd, Watson, Beaumont, and Smithwaite were dismissed cheaply, but an entirely different complexion was put upon the game when Crick joined Halliday. The batsmen put on 102 runs. Crick, who was fortunate to escape being stumped twice, was eventually caught at the wicket.

Then Johnson came along with a brisk 28 and thus the visiting county faced a somewhat unexpectedly big total.

Like their opponents, Lancashire made a bad start, for with only 7 runs on the board, Greenhalgh was bowled by Hargreaves. Parkin batted freely, but at 66 Place was bowled by Smurthwaite, who with his next ball got Cranston low. In 1½ hours Lancashire II. scored 101 for the loss of 5 wickets. LANCASHIRE II. BEATEN

VALUABLE STAND BY PARKIN AND CRANSTON

A spirited partnership by Parkin and K. Cranston, for Lancashire II., saved the side from an innings defeat, but Yorkshire won by 7 wickets at Redcar. It was their biggest win over Lancashire and the first time they have achieved the double for many years. Parkin and Cranston's combined contribution of 82 was especially meritorious because it came at a time when Lancashire's fortunes were at the lowest ebb. Parkin got most of his 74 runs by off drives and he had a 5 and seven 4's to his credit. Cranston scored freely all round the wicket. Had the batsmen who followed Cranston been able to give substantial support to Parkin the match might have ended, as most of these games do, with one side or the other having to be content with first-innings points.

They failed, however, against the bowling of Hargreaves, who came to the peak of his form at a vital stage and took 4 wickets quickly, 2 of them, Little and Husband, with successive balls. Yorkshire required 40 runs to win when they started their second innings. They met with two sharp shocks, Cawthray and Smurthwaite being dismissed with only 9 on the board. The Yorkshire captain, G. A. Wilson, however, did well. Lancashire began the day badly, Smurthwaite and Cawthray securing the last 5 wickets in their first innings cheaply and forcing Lancashire to follow on. Smurthwaite was selected to play in the Yorkshire first team against Leicestershire to-day. He is the first North Yorkshire cricketer to appear in the county's senior eleven for a number of years. NORTHUMBERLAND IN STRONG POSITION

KEEN MINOR COUNTY CRICKET AT BARROW

Finishing the day 70 runs ahead with all their second innings wickets intact, Northumberland had every reason to be pleased with their display against Lancashire II. at Barrow yesterday, and there was every prospect of a keen finish to-day.

There had been heavy rain prior to the match and it was obvious at the start that the wicket would take spin later on. Realising this the visitors attacked the bowling spiritedly at the start, made their total respectable before the bowlers took the upper hand, and then their own bowlers proceeded to drive home the advantage.

Lancashire's batting was very disappointing, for apart from Parkin, who was always at ease, and Wilson, none of the batsmen seemed likely to get runs, with the possible exception of young Burrow, who went just as he was settling down.

Burrow and Deighton, two Denstone College boys making their first appearance for the county, showed pleasing ability—the latter mixed his bowling very nicely.

Parkin, however was the batsman of the day. Runs were never easy to get while he was in, but he hit out confidently and had eight fours in his 69.

Northumberland had to bat again, an anxious quarter hour, but Mackay and Murray survived.

MINOR COUNTY CRICKET

BOLD HITTING WAS THE WINNING POLICY

LANCASHIRE RALLY FROM DESPERATE POSITION

EIGHT for three, 96 for four, 232 for seven—those figures give some conception of Lancashire second team's great recovery to defeat Northumberland in the game which ended at Barrow yesterday, but they tell nothing of the splendid batting which brought about the recovery.

Northumberland had started the day as well placed as any team could wish to be, 70 runs ahead with all their second innings wickets standing. They added 158, leaving Lancashire to make 229 for victory in four hours 20 minutes.

The highlight of Northumberland's innings was 50 in 20 minutes for the seventh wicket from J. N. Grover and T. A. W. White—"Captains Courageous"—for the former, the Oxford captain, was partnering his skipper. This pair set the fashion in sixes for Grover hit three and White two.

Lancashire had to bat for a quarter of an hour before lunch, so Duckworth and Burrow were sent in to bridge the gap, a task they safely accomplished.

After lunch Northumberland got to work and sent back the opening pair without addition to the score and Parkin, top scorer of the first innings went for a "duck" a run later.

Wilson and Place thus found themselves in a desperate situation, but the former took his courage in both hands and went for the bowling. Immediately the game swung round and Wilson went magnificently on to reach 50 in as many minutes, completing his half-century with a smashing hook. Subsequently he was twice missed, but was out at 96, making 58 out of 88 in 55 minutes, with nine fours.

Greenhalgh also treated the bowling in cavalier fashion—39 in 29 minutes coming from him—while Place went steadily on, completely at ease in an invaluable innings.

Ten was taken at 190 for five with the game apparently in hand, but Northumberland were not done. Two more wickets fell before 200 went up, but Garlick and Place survived a spirited attack with the new ball to decide the match.

Place, undefeated at the close with 78, hit a six and four fours.

Garlick is the Kirkby Lonsdale youth who made an auspicious debut in the county senior team recently. He batted quite well—competent judges who have seen him throughout the season rate him very highly—but not enough of him was seen in attack.

The same applies to J. H. Deighton, the Denstone College boy. Five bowlers were tried before he came on in the second innings—eight wickets were then down—and he immediately bowled Grover, whose activities had at that stage made a Lancashire victory seem out of the question. The ball which beat Grover was perfect, whipping in from the off to take the balls and middle wicket.

The victory leaves Lancashire well in the running for Minor County honours.

Gate receipts on the two days totalled £28—£4 more than last year. Last year's figures were then stated to be a record outside Old Trafford.

LANCASHIRE II. WIN AGAIN

FINE BOWLING BY BIRTWELL AND DEIGHTON

Lancashire II. maintained their challenge for the retention of the Minor Counties' championship title by accomplishing the double over Gloucestershire II., winning by 9 wickets at Old Trafford yesterday. Against the fast bowling of Deighton, a 17-years-old Denstone College schoolboy, and the spin-bowling of A. J. Birtwell, the Nelson Lancashire League bowler, Gloucestershire twice collapsed. Sixteen wickets fell in the course of 3½ hours for 209 runs.

Starting the day needing 91 to avoid the follow-on, Gloucestershire fell 18 short of their objective after batting 3 hours. Lancashire had to get 229 for victory—no mean task on a fourth innings, and their start was disastrous. D. H. Burrow, Duckworth and Parkin all being out with only eight runs on the board, the latter going for a "blob."

Place and Wilson then got going and 88 runs were obtained in 55 minutes, the latter taking 50 minutes over his 50. After Wilson went, Greenhalgh carried on the good work, and contributed 39 in 29 minutes, and T. Higson following him made 30, and the game was practically over.

It was left to Place and Garlick to pass the visitors' total when seven wickets were down. Place was undefeated at the close with 70, a really grand fighting innings.

Lancashire II. ended the first phase of their final Minor Counties' championship game of the season with Durham, at Old Trafford, in the commanding position of being 83 runs ahead with 3 wickets in hand. Excellent bowling by Deighton, the 17-years-old fast bowler from Denstone School, and Birtwell, the Nelson leg-spinner, was followed by an equally delightful second-wicket stand, the highest of the season, by Place and Parkin, which produced 163 runs in 2½ hours.

If it had not been for an aggressive display by Townsend, their captain, Durham would have been routed. He hit 106 of the first 155 runs in 2 hours 10 minutes with the aid of a 6 and thirteen 4's. He was missed by Bowes in the slips when 82, but that was his only flaw. With Adamson 72 runs were scored in 45 minutes for the third wicket.
