The "hat-trick" (four wickets in seven balls altogether) of Jones brings this fast bowler to the front again. He is a trier all the time, and with this pace howler and Albert Howell, Birtley should be well served. Both are capable of longish spells.

DURHAM BACK TO BUILDING

Northumberland, though not quite so well off as at the corresponding time last year in regard to championship, points, are again unbeaten in three matches, from which they have secured 13 points, giving them a percentage of 86.66. Their next two county games are away-Yorkshire II. and Staffordshire returns, July 13-26. at Ilkley and Stoke-and the opposition will be stiff.

Considering the strength of the team Staffordshire sent on tour this time, and the fact that they beat Durham so handsomely, it was no mean feat on Northumberland's part to get first innings points. A bit of disappointment was felt that the fine wins over Durham and Yorkshire II. could not be tully followed up, but I consider it a big thing to top a 256 total, as Northumberland did, against useful attack.

Not so many years ago one would have taken it for granted that Northumberland would be beaten on the first innings, at any rate, if set to face such a score, and it is obvious that the county's batting is stronger (when all the players are avail-

able) than in many post-war years.

Northumberland have a net batting average of nearly 24 per wicket. The newcomer, I. Murray, has greatly helped by aggregating 223, scoring more than a quarter of the total runs.

More important—and of information to those who may only look at Murray's own batting times-538 runs have been scored while he has been in for a total period of 435 minutes

It has been suggested that he could be utilized as opening batsman. If Northumberland can hit upon a satisfactory No. 1 and No. 2, and I imagine W. G. Mackay may revert to No. 1 again, it is best to have Murray where he is, for in the past there has been a weakness in the very important middle part of the innings.

Mackay's return to his best batting form on Wednesday night was pleasing. He has the next best aggregate, 140, with a 28 average. H. C. Lee's 69 for once out shows the value of this player, who, batting better than at any time now, is well on the way to his league 500 runs so early as mid-June.

ROBSON MOST WICKETS

Harry Robson has most wickets-20 at 10.5 apiece—and the average cost per wicket to the team is 16.8. They have put their opponents all out five times, and got eight wickets down in the other innings.

The mishap to Leslie Allan handicapped Northumberland in attack on Thursday (when W. H. Ellerker, of Wallsend, fielded sub. against his old county) and made it a difficult job for the captain to do any switching such as met with happy results at Chester-le-Street, and against Yorkshire II. to some extent. Allan bowled extraordinarily well on Tuesday, but had a lot to do on Wednesday.



Jack Carr's Fourth Tour Match

WHEN DURHAM HAD "GATE" £2,250

When the Australians were at Sunderland in 1926 they drew a first day crowd of 22,000, officially, but it was more like 25,000 actually, and the Tourists have never forgotten it, nor the £2,250 receipts, hence their willingness to keep up the Durham match, their only fixture with a minor county.

Invariable they are well satisfied with the financial return from the Ashbrooke game-more than they get from some of the first-class counties, and even though Monday and Tuesday are not ideal days a

Monday and Tuesday are not ideal days a bumper gate is expected next week when the unbeaten Australians are on Wearside.

This match makes such general appeal in the North-East, where opportunities of seeing first-class cricket, let alone Touring teams, are restricted, that hundreds who do not regularly support cricket will be at Ashbrooke, where there is seating accommodation for 11,000 (including 700 in the enclosure) and plenty of room on the grass slopes. the grass slopes.

Naturally, everybody wants to know whether Bradman will be playing.
The Durham cricket authorities are no better informed than the general public on this point, for the simple reason that the Australians go not select their teams until match morning—Test or anything else.

But it is significant that Stanley McCabe is leading the side in Scotland, so it is hoped that Bradman, as skipper, will make his first appearance at Sunderland in the course of his three visits to this country. Of the 1934 Australian XI. playing at Ashbrooke, Brown, Chipperfield, Fleetwood-Smith, and Barnett are available again. Further back, that is 1930, when not a ball could be bowled, McCabe is the only present Tourist of that selected XI.

On the Durham side Jack Carr has a distinction given to few in any class of cricket, for this will be the fourth time he has played (or been chosen) against the Australians.

In 1926, then scoring so freely in league cricket that he had 503 runs on by mid-July, Carr made 35 in the Durham second innings in 16 minutes, hitting Grimmett for 6, 6, 4, 1 off successive balls and having two other 4's. He was selected for the ill-fated 1930 fixture, and then in 1934 took 22 off an over by Bromley after, as in 1926, failing to score first innings.

Carr's complete record of runs, wickets, and catches in all types of matches would be well worth reproducing. I know of no more likeable (or modest) are cicketer, nor any more useful.
