FELIXSTOWE V. GRANTHAM

CENTURY BY C. W. WALSHAM

The Lincolnshire side, who were making their first appearance in Suffolk in the course of a short tour in East Anglia, had lost to Priton on Thursday, after declaring with a score of 198 for six, and are due to meet Colchester and East Essex to-day. They batted first on a wicket which, despite lack of rain, was practically plumb, and by even batting ran up a total of 215 in two and three-quarter hours, after losing their first three wickets for 82. In a bright knock, which increased his side's total by 68, C. R. Appleby, the top scorer, missed his half-century by one, his hits including eight 4's. W. J. Hall, who opened the innings, batted for an hour and a half for 21 runs. Felixstowe, who were depleted of a number of regular players owing to the Suffolk County match at the Oval, were skippered by E. H. Manby. They suffered through faulty fielding, Manby and A. W. Pritchard, who sent down nine and sixteen overs respectively, were the most successful bowlers. With ample time in which to get the runs, Felixstowe lost C. C. Bailey with only 22 on the board. J. W. Stevenson was out 13 runs later, and four wickets were down for 65. The situation was redeemed, however, by a fifth wicket partnership between C. W. Walsham and A. W. Pritchard, which produced 104 runs. Walsham, who had just previously reached his century, was the first to leave, a smart piece of stumping sending him back when the board showed 129 for five. Having seen 177 added during his stay, Walsham, who was let off early on his sixteenth 4's, five in succession, Pritchard left at the same total, but the runs were hit off for the loss of another wicket, with a bare five minutes to spare. Appleby and Hall bore the brunt of the bowling, the former securing four wickets for 69 in sixteen overs.

SIR PIERCE LACY'S XI. V. HARROW WANDERERS

DRAWN GAME AT AMPTON

On a plumb wicket, which stood two full days' strenuous cricket without any sign of deterioration, the annual match between Sir Pierce Lacy's XI. and Harrow Wanderers was played at Ampton on Saturday and Sunday. The game, as usual, brought appreciative attendances from the countryside, the ground, on Sunday afternoon, presenting an uncommon sight in Suffolk cricket.

Sir Pierce and Lady Lacy were at home each afternoon to a large number of friends.

Batting first, the Wanderers, under the leadership of the Hon. Rupert Anson, after an indifferent start, were not dismissed until they had run up a total of 282, and, going in late in the day the Ampton side fared so badly against the bowling of W. M. Welch that they were all out for less than three figures. The follow-on was not enforced, and, batting again, on Sunday, the Wanderers fared almost as badly, being dismissed for 112. Left with practically 31 hours in which to get 299 runs to win, Sir Pierce's side had 235 on the board for eight wickets when stumps were drawn.

The Wanderers made a disconcerting start on a wicket which promised any amount of runs. R. A. Luckman, who with a very short approach to the wickets got surprising pace behind the ball, got both M. Falcon and C. M. Andreae taken in the slips with no more than 16 on the telegraph. C. Hancock making a couple of smart catches.

When G. R. Jackson, the old Derbyshire skipper, was caught on the boundary and four wickets were down for 52, Sir Pierce's side had every reason to be satisfied, but the association of A. Benn and R. Anson put another complexion on matters. Both batsmen topped their individual 50's before lunch in adding 117 in seventy-five minutes, and were not separated until the total had been increased by 140. Benn had no more than four boundary strokes in his 74, but Anson, who strained a muscle, and had subsequently to have a runner, hit nine 4's, four in succession. The visitors' total was consolidated by a sparkling 58 from W. M. Welch.

For the home side, J. G. Hume, who opened the innings, hit up 23 of the first 30, and P. Lawrence, who was fifth out at 53, with only 18 to his credit after a stay of 55 minutes, were the only batsmen to remain against the bowling of Welch, the innings closing for 96 in less than two hours. Welch sent down 12 overs to secure 7 wickets for 38 runs. Whilst there was more than one lapse, the fielding all round was smart, that of Hume conspicuously so.

With a first innings lead of 186, the visitors batted again. M. Falcon and F. T. Turnbull put on 46 for the first wicket in 30 minutes, but both of them and G. R. Jackson were dismissed at the same total. Luckman securing all three wickets for 26 runs in six overs. The advent of W. M. Welch increased the rate of scoring, his first 30 including three 4's and a tremendous drive for 6 off W. Deeley, but the sixth wicket fell at 90, when Deeley clean bowled W. G. Stewart. Wickets fell quickly after lunch, the innings closing in just over an hour and a half for 112.

Left with 299 to get to win, in rather less than three and a half hours, Sir Pierce's XI. made an excellent start. G. T. C. Wood and Col. Hancock winging 82 off the arrears in an hour before Wood skied one to the bowler. Hancock left with only half-a-dozen added, and with M. Ward and Hume falling to add materially to the total, five wickets were down for 119 when M. Gosling joined G. S. Inledon-Webber with an hour and a half remaining for play. The pair remained together for an hour to take the figures to 192, when Gosling was leg-before to Welch. The second hundred went up when D. Lawrence joined Webber, but at 227 the latter, who had remained 110 minutes and seen 139 added, was splendidly caught at deep mid-on, his 72 containing nine boundary hits. Welch sent down 21 overs for five wickets and 83 runs.

F. S. BEAUFORD'S CENTURY AND DECLARATION.
