Three Runs Give Kent 2nd a Win.

Wiltshire soon survived being swallowed up by Surrey "Seconds" at the Oval, and last week again carried operations into the "enemy" territory when they met Kent 2nd XI, at Broadstairs. Glorious weather prevailed on Monday when, in the Minor Counties' Championship, Surrey 2nd XI. opposed Wiltshire. The home county was as selected, with A. L. Smith being given the vacant place, while Surrey fielded a side which consisted of three amateurs and eight professionals, the latter including the Bedser twins, E. A. and A. V., who joined the Surrey staff this season and pregarded as cricketers of exceptional proare regarded as cricketers of exceptional pro-

An excellent wicket had been prepared for this match and R. Eglington, the Surrey skipper, did his side good service by winning the toss. He naturally decided to bat and Mobey and E. A. Bedser opened the Surrey innings to the bowling of Smith (W.) and J. T. Bailward. Both batsmen opened cautiously against good length bowling and rungetting was a tedious business. With 11 runs on the board Mobey was dropped in the slips on the board Mobey was dropped in the slips off Smith and, shortly afterwards, Bedser also escaped when he snicked a delivery from Bailward through the slips. Two more possible chances were missed while the score rose to 20 and the batsmen proceeded to dig themselves in, refusing to take the slightest risk against keen bowling which was backed up by smart ground fielding. Cockle and Lovell Hewitt relieved the opening Wilthire bowlers but they, too, were treated with shire bowlers but they, too, were treated with the utmost respect and the cricket became somewhat sombre on this beautiful August morning with the sun shining brilliantly.
At 12.30 the batsmen looked thoroughly set and 45 runs were on the board and, at this stage, Mobey decided to try and force the pace. He brought off a number of fine strokes through the covers and pulled one rather over-pitched ball from Lovell Hewitt to the square leg boundary. Continuing with more freedom he ran to his 50 with another delightful off-drive and soon afterwards brought up the 100 for the first wicket by a sharp single off Cockle. Bedser, who displayed very correct methods, did not have so much of the bowling as his partner and when lunch was taken the score was 111 for 0. Mobey then being 68 not out. After lunch Mobey was again eager for runs but, after making another six, he failed to get hold of a well-flighted delivery from Cockle and was caught by Wheeler, the score then being 120 for one. McMurray joined Bedser and immediately hit a boundary. He was given a "life" off Smith (W.) and the rate of scoring was increased, Bedser hitting well in front of the wicket and also showing a very pretty late cut off the fast bowlers, This partnership put on 62 runs and then McMurray was out, bowled by a delivery from Cockle which appeared to turn quickly. Bedser, now scoring freely, looked well set for his century but, at 77, and with the total 186, he tried to cut a ball from Lovell Hewitt and he tried to cut a bail from Lovell Hewitt and was well caught by A. L. Smith. Playing with confidence despite these reverses Mc-Intyre and Whittaker were very forceful, the former bringing up the 200 with a majestic six, the first of the match. He was responsible for 43 of the 78 runs produced by the partnership and was then taken in the slips by Smith (W.) off Hone. Left with one hour's batting, Wiltshire made a disastrous start, Forester being bowled by a grand ball from Surridge at three and, two runs later, W. Lovell Hewitt was snapped at the wicket off the same bowler. This brought A. E. Lloyd to partner J. A. Wheeler and he revived Wiltshire hopes by a grand drive for four off Surridge. Still 38 runs behind, Wiltshire were not yet out of the wood, but Nash again showed his worth as wood, but Nash again showed his worth as a batsman and provided an admirable foil for Hone who, with Lloyd out, began to score more rapidly. These two played with such confidence that the remainder of the arrears were knocked off before the tea interval without further loss and the prospect was that Wiltshire would avoid defeat. After tea the fast bowlers tried to remove these stumbling block to Surrey's progress and Hone, now seeing the ball well, made a mighty pull off Surridge for six and the Surrey skipper had to call on his slower bowlers. Daley, spin-ning from the off, was not easy to play and Nash had one or two anxious moments. He survived, however, and the score was 184 when he walked across to play a ball from E. A. Bedser which straightened quickly and struck Nash's pad, the general appeal being answered in favour of the bowler. Nash had made 30 invaluable runs but, with Cockle falling immediately into the same trap as Nash, Wiltshire were again in the toils. Hone played valiantly, he took three fours in an over from E. A. Bedser but, with the raising of the double century, Surrey claimed the new ball and A O. Bedser promptly took

two wickets. Bailward, the last Wiltshire batsman, hit a four and a single off Bedser but in the next over from Surridge he cocked up an easy catch and Wiltshire were out for 208, leaving Surrey about one hour in which to get the 46 runs required for victory. Hone's innings of 82 not out was a fine effort and he was unfortunate not to obtain his hundred. In the course of the innings he hit twelve 4's and one six. Mobey and E. A. Bedser opened and played the bowling of Smith (W.) and Lovell Hewitt comfortably but when Cockle went on he bowled Mobey (25) with a ball which turned sharply. McMurray came in and, shortly afterwards, a sharp single by Bedser off Cockle enabled Surrey to win by nine wickets with 25 minutes to spare, Scores :

WILTSHIRE GAIN FIRST INNINGS POINTS

Another fine day favoured the start of the wiltshire v. Dorsetshire match at Bemerton on Wednesday, and the concluding fixture of the Salisbury Cricket Week had some interesting features. The 50 was hoisted without further loss, and Wheeler began to open his shoulders, his rate of scoring being almost twice as quick as his captain's. At 73, however, Lovell-Hewitt snicked King into slips, where Fox took a smart catch. B. W. Hone was the incoming batsmen, and only one run had been added to the score when Wheeler was beaten and bowled by a fine delivery from King, which nipped sharply off the wicket. These rapid nipped sharply off the wicket. These rapid reverses discounted any advantage Wiltshire had gained by winning the toss, and both Hone and A. E. Lloyd played carefully. Their caution was justified. Dorset fielding and bowling with fine zeal. Harrison sent down some tempting slows and Hone, trying to open his scoring account, stepped in front of a straight one and was leg before. This made the total 80 for four, and E. B. Never-the less it carried the boundary and Lloyd went on, forcing the pace and, with Nash, fighting Witt-hire out of a dangerous position. All the bowling came alike to him, and there was generous applause for both batsmen when was generous applause for both batsmen when they put the second hundred on the board and, shortly afterwards, made their partnership worth 100 runs. The new ball held no terrors for either batsmen, and runs came merrily until Lloyd reached what was his second century of the week, having just helped himself to 3 fours off Harrison. It was a well-run single which gave him his hundred, and then hydrog another giv. Harrison seek. and then he drove another six. Harrison continued pegging away to try and keep the runs down, and at 253, after the partnership had realised 140 runs, Lloyd's brilliant knock, which included 2 sixes and 18 fours, was terminated by a catch at cover by Badham. D. F. Cockle was the next batsman, and both he and Nash forced the pace, Nash showing excellent form and never giving a chance. Cockle was more adventurous and might have been out quiet early. A sharp chance in slips was missed, and Busk dropped him at mid-off. Nash's 50 came almost as a matter of course, and he raced towards his 100, taking two excellent fours of Harrison with straight drives. He entered the 90's just after Cockle had been stumped for a meritorious 41, and had gone to 97 when he failed to get hold of a ball from Harrison, which ran away and he was caught by King. As a matter of fact he took all eight wickets captured by bowlers at a cost of 25 runs, the other two batsmen falling to the vigilance of the visiting fielders and being run out. The best stand of the innings was that between F. Kilford (21) and A. F. Taylor (not out 35), both of whom showed commendable courage when things were going wrong. Taylor was always confident, and had the later batsmen been able to keep their wickets intact he looked as though he might have won the game off his own bat.

THE LEAGUE
