147) **Arthur MITCHELL** – Born 13 Sept 1902 in Baildon Green, W Yorks

Died 25 Dec 1976, Bradford, aged 74

He was a RH batsman and RA slow bowler

First-class debut – v Glam, Headingley, 1-4 July 1922 (County Championship)

Yorks career – 1922-1951

His highest test score (72) came against South Africa at Headingley on 13-16 July 1935 (3rd Test)

His highest first class score (189) came in the 1926 County Championship game against Northants at Northampton on 10-13 July 1926

His best first class bowling figures (3/49) again came against Jamaica at Sabina Park, Kingston, on 11-16 March 1936 during Yorkshire's tour in 1935/36.

He received his Yorkshire cap in 1928

He was awarded a benefit in 1937. It raised £2,227.

Died – 24 Jan 1955 in Dowgill Farm, Summerbridge, Harrogate, aged 54.

He was a RH batsman and RA fast bowler.

First-class debut – v Kent at the Mote, Maidstone, on 12-15 July 1924 (County Championship)

Yorks career – 1922-1926

His best first-class bowling figs (2/75) came in his debut match (above) as did highest score (1)

His career best score (26) came in Minor Counties Championship game against Northumberland at Jesmond on 25 & 26 June 1924

His career-best bowling figures (8/59) were achieved, also in the Minor Counties Championship, against Cheshire at Winnington Park, Northwich, on 7 & 8 June 1922

Died 3 Sept 1946 in Nottingham, aged 46.

He was a RH batsman

Yorks career – 1922-1923. He then played Minor Counties` cricket for Northumberland, playing six games from 1937 to 1939.

His highest score of 21 for Yorks came in a Minor Counties Championship against Durham at Duke`s Park, Bridlington on 10 & 11 Aug 1922. He later made 144 for Northumberland against Yorks in the same competition at Jesmond on 18 & 19 Aug 1937.
