The first two batsmen for Tring put on 55 runs before Newell secured Price with a leg-before. Thompson played in faultless form until, overreaching one of Newell's tricky ones, he lost his balls. Elliott followed on, and after making three 2's and a one was dismissed by the same bowler. Smith's wicket fell in the same way without altering the score. Austin then went to the wicket, and soon made the telegraph attendant active, hitting hard and getting to the boundary several times. He made five 4's, two 6's (getting the ball clean out of the field), and ten 2's, being finally bowled by Langley, who had gone on in place of Foster. Ward was the companion of Austin for some time, and played excellent cricket. The lob bowling was tried with some effect by the Rev. J. Bond, who cleverly caught Ward, but the bowling proved somewhat expensive, as the remaining wickets put on several runs, Jenney hitting in his accustomed style, and Bowyer backing him up well. He was at length well caught at the wicket by Jefferies, thus terminating the innings. The wicket played well, and the game proved very enjoyable. Score:—
