The highest total scored for the club during the past season was 340 for six wickets against Penarth, towards which S. Briggs contributed 65; G. A. Young 67, and W. A. Boughton 58 not out, but a performance equally as good, if not better, taking the status of the club's opponents into consideration, was the scoring of 281 for five wickets (J. G. Clark 111, O. B. Martyn 50, and A. W. Morris 46 not out) in the first match with Newport. Gloucester was the team credited with the highest total against the Cardiffians, with 314 for nine wickets. The lowest total for which a Cardiff eleven was dismissed was 78 v. Llanelly, while Penarth had the distinction of being the easiest victims to the Cardiffians' bowling, they being dismissed for 37. S. Biggs disposing of five batsmen for nine runs. Four individual innings of over a century and ten others of 50 or upwards were played for the club as follows:—J. H. Brain, 144 v. Clifton; J. G. Clark, 111 v. Newport, and 52 (not out) v. Gloucester; R. B. Sweet-Escott, 107, v. Bridgend, 101 (not out) v. Newport, 77 v. Thornbury, 69 v. Guy's Hospital, and 58 (not out) v. Gloucester; S. Biggs, 68 v. Penarth; G. A. Young, 67 v. Penarth; K. R. Marley, 66 v. Bridgend, and 55 v. Thornbury; W. A. Boughton, 58 (not out) v. Penarth; and O. B. Martyn, 50 v. Newport; while one innings of three figures and five others over 50 were played against the club, viz.:—C. F. Belcher (Gloucester), 102, not out; E. Reid (Swansea and Guy's Hospital), 77 and 65; E. W. Jones (Swansea), 74, not out; Towle (Llanelly), 65, and S. J. Manning (Gloucester), 52. Four partnerships between Cardiff batsmen realised over 90 runs, as follows:—89 (R. B. Sweet-Escott and Street, v. Newport); 95 (R. B. Sweet-Escott and Donovan, v. Guy's Hospital); 63 (J. G. Clark and A. W. Morris, v. Newport); and 62 (R. B. Sweet-Escott and K. R. Marley, v. Thornbury), and the longest partnerships between any two opponents of the club were—91 (Dr. E. M. Grace and O. G. Radcliffe, for Thornbury) and the same number by J. Rees and J. Towle for Llanelly. The number of extras received was 205, while only 123 were given away. It will be seen from the averages given below that three players have topped 30 runs per innings—a great advance on last year, when the highest was a fraction over 29. The first batsman on the list is R. B. Sweet-Escott, and he thoroughly deserves the position he occupies, having scored most consistently all through the season. Out of twelve innings only once (in the return match with Swansea) did he fail to reach

double figures. His highest score was 107 in the last match of the year v. Bridgend; but his best was in the return match with Newport, when he scored 101 not out. J. G. Clark, who takes second place, started well, and for his first four innings had an average of over 70, but three successive failures against Newport, Guy's Hospital, and Fairwater lowered those figures very considerably. J. H. Brain, as usual, did not show to advantage when playing for Cardiff, as he only made over twenty runs on two occasions. One of these, however, was the means of saving the club from defeat at Clifton: His 144 not out was the highest individual score made in any of the club's matches. G. A. Young, Street, and K. R. Marley, three players new to the team this season, were very useful. The first-named soon worked himself into the public favour by his tremendous hitting, which afterwards astonished some of the frequenters of Lords, and on very few occasions failed to swell the total. Street, too, was of very great assistance on several occasions, but especially in the return match against Swansea, when he made 40 runs at a critical time and under far from favourable conditions, and certainly gave his side the first chance of the victory they afterwards secured. K. R. Marley's first season will be remembered by the Cardiff players for some time in connection with the return match with Thornbury at Alveston, as on that occasion he hit 28 runs from one over delivered by Dr. E. M. Grace by means of three 6's and two 4's. The bulk of the bowling was undertaken by Sidney Sweet-Escott and Selwyn Biggs with marked success. Sweet-Escott's best records were:—Six wickets for 31 runs v. Clifton, five for 21 v. Bridgend, and five for 22 v. Swansea; and Biggs's most successful efforts were five for 9 v. Penarth, six for 23 v. Penarth (return), and five for 20 v. Bridgend. These two bowlers were effective on nearly every occasion, but, as was only to be expected, they were some times punished, and with the exception of R. Jones, who did not play very frequently, the change of bowling was very untrustworthy. The less regular bowlers, however, were scarcely given as many opportunities of showing their capabilities as they should have had.

The Second Eleven of the club played nineteen matches, of which they won ten, lost six, and drew three.
