**WHITING'S BENEFIT.**

**MR. DAVID HOWELL'S XI. v. CORNISH CHOUGHES.**

The annual benefit match in connection with Penzance Cricket Club for Whiting, the club's popular pro, took place on Saturday, when the Cornish Choughs opposed a team selected by Mr. David Howell (President of Penzance Cricket Club).

The President's team had first knock on a very soft wicket, Dr. Nunn and Wheeler being opposed to the bowling of W. N. Bickford-Smith and Moon. The batsmen played steadily, and within the first half-hour had scored 40 between them. After another three had been obtained, however, Wassler had his middle stump removed by "W. N." Wheeler's total (21) included a couple of 4's and five 1's. F. Milton went next to the wicket, and Tresawna took over the ball from Moon. Milton faced the bowling of Tresawna in his second over, and found it difficult to negotiate the slow balls sent down, succumbing to a splendid catch in the slips by Whitworth on the last ball of the over. Two wickets were down for 46. Trevenen went out to partner Dr. Nunn, but his stay was destined to be short. After making three singles and a two, he sent "W. N." to the boundary for four, but with the next ball J. C. Bickford-Smith caught him behind the wicket (Three for 57). A few minutes later Dr. Nunn was out, being caught and bowled by "W. N." after making 19 in three-quarters of an hour. "W. N." was in capital form with the ball, and had so far taken three wickets for 25. Kelynack, the next batsman, also fell a victim to a tempting ball from "W. N.," being caught by Whitworth off his first hit. Five down for 64. Dyke and Key were now partners, and the former hit out in splendid style. Chiefly by boundaries, he in a very few minutes had to his credit over 50, included in which were a 6 (off Tresawna) and three 4's. Just on lunch-time, however, Tresawna gave Dyke a very tempting ball, which he despatched to the boundary line, where, unfortunately for him, Thomas caught him. At lunch Mr. Howell's side had made 95 runs for the loss of six wickets.

After luncheon E. Williams joined Key. (The latter, we understand, is an ex-Surrey captain, and has recently come to Penzance to reside.) The telegraph soon registered the hundred, with a splendid drive to the boundary and a single by Key, while Williams opened his account by getting a two and a three off "W. N." Williams also obtained a couple of boundaries off Tresawna, but with the latter's last ball of the over he was caught in the slips by Whitworth. Whiting followed, and the spectators and players gave him an ovation. Key, whose score before the adjournment consisted of seven singles, now hit with greater freedom, and he soon had over 30 to his credit. Moon replaced Tresawna at the top end, and Thomas-Peter came on in the place of W. N. Bickford-Smith at the pavilion end. Key brought the score up to 150 by obtaining a 4 off Moon. After rather under three-quarters of an hour's play Key had made a half-century. The next ball he received from Thomas-Peter, however, disturbed his middle stump. The partnership between Key and Whiting had produced 64—a very creditable performance. Key, though, was missed before he started scoring by Rogers at mid-off, but the ex-Surrey man did not give any more chances, his placing generally being admirable. In ideal cricket weather Penzance met Lanhydrock at Truro on Friday in the final of the Cornwall County League, this being the second season in succession that they had opposed each other. But while Penzance won the cup at the first time of asking on their entering the final, Lanhydrock had met their Waterloo on five occasions, 1910 witnessing their sixth consecutive appearance in the final. Both sides were strongly represented and there were two alterations in the Penzance team from that which defeated Camborne in the semi-final the previous Friday—Hain displacing Uren, and Dr. Lawry coming in in place of Trevenen.

Winning the toss Penzance batted first on a rather dead wicket, Kelynaek and Wheeler being opposed by E. Hawken and Knight. The first three overs were maidens, the batsmen watching the ball carefully. Wheeler opened the scoring by placing Knight past cover for a couple, but Hawken clean bowled Kelynaek in his next over; the first wicket falling with only six runs on the board. Bennetts came next and drove Hawken hard to mid-off, where Battersby fielded the ball smartly. Runs were hard to get, Wheeler up to this point being credited with all that had come from the ball. He got Knight away for two and a single, and also cut Hawken high over cover for one. Bennetts luckily nicked Hawken to leg for one and followed this up with full-shouldered drive past the bowling screen. This player was severe on Knight, driving and cutting him for two twos and then hitting a short one among the spectators on the leg side. The ground work of the easterners was extremely good and made the bowling most effective. Wheeler walked out to Hawken and hit him for four, and in Knight's next over Bennetts hoisted 30 by cutting him hard to the boundary. Hawken's next over yielded six to Bennetts, one smashing drive reaching the boundary. With 40 on the board J. Hawken took the ball from Knight and had a turn with his underarm deliveries. The change had immediate effect, Bennetts pushing one up to Hosken at forward point. The retiring batsman's 26 included four 4's. Hain promptly dispatched the first ball he received to the deep field boundary, and Wheeler, with a four off Hawken, hoisted the half century after play had been in progress three-quarters of an hour. Hain found the slow bowling greatly to his liking and scored fairly freely off the elder Hawken. Wheeler, however, in endeavouring to emulate his forcing tactics, jumped yards out of his ground and was easily stumped. Three for 58. E. Hawken now gave way to Dempster, Hain finely driving him to the boundary. J. Hawken met with further success in his next over, Wheeler bringing off a splendid catch low down at square leg, and dismissing Dr. Lawry. Milton left two runs later through impatience to have a go at Hawken's slow. Hain also fell a victim to Hawken, cooking one up behind the wickets when attempting a hit. Boase and Port both exercised great caution and the score crept along slowly. Off Dempster, Boase scored freely, getting him crisply through the slips for two and banging him into the long field for four. The captain had rather a narrow escape when opposed by J. Hawken, the ball dropping just out of reach of square leg. Port assisted Boase to add 14 and was then lbw. Up to this point J. Hawken had taken six wickets for 20 runs—a remarkable performance. Another wicket fell in this over, Dyke placing a ball tamely into square leg's hands. E. Hawken now came on again at the lower end and in place of Dempster, who had met with no success. Boase got him round prettily to leg for four and sent the 90 up, and in the same over hit him to the deep field boundary. The century appeared without further loss. Boase again sent E. Hawken past the bowling screen; but the spectators were treated to the rather unusual spectacle of Whiting playing the most careful and correct cricket! Knight now relieved E. Hawken. Whiting at length got the slow bowler to leg for three and followed this with a terrific smash in the same direction, which went for four. This partnership was proving most productive and had so far taken the score from 80 to 120. This brought about another change in the bowling, Wilkinson displacing J. Hawken. Whiting banged him past cover for four and drove him beautifully, Battersby being responsible for a fine piece of ground work in front of the pavilion. The pro began to open out and out Battersby, who had taken the ball from Knight, hard to the boundary. The 140 soon appeared, Whiting hitting Wilkinson clean away to the leg boundary. Battersby then secured Boase's wicket. Coad snapping in behind the stumps. The captain had made 34, by clean, attractive cricket, and had put on 54 runs for the ninth wicket. He hit four fours. Williams, the last man, drove Battersby finely for four, and the same over got him past cover for two. Yet another bowling change was tried, Wheeler taking a turn at the top end. This over proved most expensive, Whiting hitting him for four fours and a one in succession, while the last ball went for four extras. The score had now jumped up to 170. Whiting reached his individual 50 by getting Battersby away for another four, and this brought J. Hawken on vice Wheeler. Williams hit him into the deep field for a single. Hosken was also given a trial at the lower end. The innings closed for 179, Whiting then getting his leg in front of a straight one from J. Hawken. The retiring batsman, who had hit with tremendous power, had nine fours and a three in his 54. J. Hawken with his slow underhand deliveries had accounted for 8 wickets at a cost of 47 runs.

E. Hawken and W. Coad began Lanhydrock's innings, being faced by Whiting and Milton. Hawken obtained two off the pro, a pretty glide through the slips, and Coad cracked Milton beautifully past point for four. Runs came steadily, Hawken getting Whiting away for a three and a four, the latter a splendid late out. The 20 soon appeared, Hawken promptly sending a half-volley from Whiting to the deep field boundary. This brought on Williams for Milton, and with his first ball the left hander dismissed Hawken. Hain distinguished himself with a magnificent piece of fielding at deep cover; indeed the work of the Pirates so far had been of the highest order. Coad sent 40 up by pulling Milton, who had relieved Whiting, round to leg for four. Further success rewarded Williams in his next over, Wilkinson being completely beaten with a ball which appeared to come across from the leg. Two for 43. Major Smith left at the same total, Williams hitting his off stump with a full toss. These three wickets had been secured by him at a cost of three runs only. With the score at 48 the teams adjourned to tea.

After the interval Port took the ball from Milton. Coad continued to play attractive cricket, his leg play in particular being very strong. Hosken scored freely off Port and hoisted the 70 with a delightful cut. Whiting came on at the top end in place of Williams, but his first three balls Coad got round to the leg boundary. The change was successful, however, the pro getting past Hosken's defence with the last ball of the over. The game was in a most interesting position, the easterners having a far better wicket average at this juncture than the Pirates had. Coad was the next to go, Milton yorking him, and this proved the turning point of the game. The retiring batsman had played splendid cricket, and while he was at the wicket Lanhydrock's prospects appeared exceedingly poor. He played all bowling with confidence, his leg shots being timed with wonderful accuracy. Altogether he hit seven fours. Five for 89 Knight and Battersby sent the century up. Five runs later Whiting removed Knight's middle stump. Wheeler offered very little opposition, Williams bowling from the lower end, getting him lbw. In his next over he bowled Battersby, and Lanhydrock's chance of saving the game vanished. C. Hawken cut him for four, but was bowled next ball, and when the last man came in 55 runs were still required. Dempster was out off the first ball of Whiting's next over, and Penzance retained the cup by 54 runs.
