

UNITED SERVICES v PENZANCE.

This two-day fixture opened at Mount Wise yesterday. Both teams were rather weak. The screws, who batted first, sent in Dr. Worthington and Major Biggs to oppose the bowling of Whiting and Daniel. Dr. Worthington opened the scoring with a single off Whiting in the third over, but in the next over he was smartly taken in the slips by Boase. Capt. Skelton, who followed, tried to trim the fine ball he received to leg, but misjudged it, placing it instead in the wicket-keeper's hands. A couple of boundaries improved matters a little. Major Finlason hit out well, but at 14 he was clean bowled by Whiting. The conditions were somewhat favourable to the bowlers. Major Haig opposed his innings with a boundary, and a productive partnership followed. Major Biggs made the biggest hit; once he drove a ball right over the stumps. At 45 he failed to get hold of one of Whiting's deliveries and skied it to Rogers at point. The game continued in a poor light (Cochrane went on for Daniel at the top end. Smart bowling was responsible for the dismissal of Major Haig at 70, a very close thing. The retiring batsman's 23 included a fine new hit. Just before the luncheon interval a sharp shower caused some discomfort.

On resuming, Captain Currie was at once dismissed, and at 91 Crichton-Maitland was out. The eighth wicket fell at 90, the two remaining batsmen being out without a hit, a safe run to the score. The Penzance bowling was very good, Whiting taking seven wickets for 33 runs, and Daniel two for 48.

The visitors made a good start, Wheeler and Roberts carrying the score to 38 before being parted. Major Finlason and Dr. Worthington, the bowlers, were replaced by Major Biggs and Paton, who met with instant success. Major Biggs secured the wickets of Wheeler and Rogers in two overs without any addition to the score, while a little later Paton dismissed both Roberts and Milton in the same over, and at 65 clean bowled Boase.

Cochrane was the only one to make a stand, and Major Finlason also more took the ball, the Penzance man being smartly caught off his bowling with the score at 84. Howe and Whiting added another fourteen runs before they were both dismissed, and with the last two men in the Services' score was passed. Four runs later the innings came to an end. Major Finlason took three wickets for 19 runs, Major Biggs three for 22, and Mr. Paton four for 14.

The Services started their second venture badly, losing three wickets for less than twenty runs, but Major Finlason and Major Haig carried the total to 63 before the last named player was beaten by Whiting, who was bowling remarkably well. A few minutes later Cochrane, the visiting wicket-keeper, had the misfortune to sprain a finger in stopping a delivery from Milton, and was compelled to leave the field, his place being taken by Boase. Lieut. Crichton-Maitland was bowled after making 3, and stumps were drawn soon after, the score being 75 for five. Score:

UNITED SERVICES v. HAMPSHIRE HOGS.

SURPRISINGLY POOR PLAY BY HOME TEAM.

A two-days' match between the United Services and Hampshire Hogs was commenced at Mount Wise yesterday. A heavy shower overnight had rendered the wicket decidedly in favour of the bowlers. Evidence of the difficulties which beset the batsmen was quickly forthcoming, for within half an hour of the start the Services had lost four of their best men for the paltry total of 24 runs. Capt. Little and Usher were the opening pair, Capt. Crossman and Kemp-Welch sharing the attack. The first over—Crossman's—was a maiden, but in the next Usher was brilliantly taken at the wicket by R. V. Morris. Capt. Little pulled Kemp-Welch nicely to leg for 4, but with only 11 on the board Dr. Causton was dismissed by Crossman. Lieut. Allenby left at 21, and 3 later Lieut. De Burgh was sent back, the latter succumbing to a magnificent catch by A. V. Morris, the visiting keeper. Capt. Little had meanwhile been defending splendidly, and he was warmly applauded on getting another 4 to leg off Crossman. Brilliantly held by the visitors' cool Lieut. Stoker his wicket after he had made 1, half the home side being out for 31 after less than an hour's cricket. Lieut. Turnbull was at the wicket ten minutes without getting a run, and then he was clean bowled by a slow, tricky ball from Crossman, which baffled the batsman completely. Forty-one runs were on the board and Capt. Little claimed 30 of this number. The Marina officer, indeed, seemed to be the only player who could do anything with the bowling, which up to this point had not been changed, and he signalled the incoming of Capt. Palmer by a glorious 6, driving Crossman hard and straight back over the sight board. In the next over, however, he was out, caught and bowled by Crossman. His valuable innings of 32 included, in addition to the 6 referred to, five 4's and a 3. Seven wickets were down for 53—a very dismal record.

Capt. Palmer and Major Haig made a valiant stand which realised 20 runs, but the innings was finished off very shortly after lunch for a total of 95. Crossman took five wickets for 34 runs, Welch ten for 21, and Curgenven, who did not go on until after the fall of the seventh wicket, two for 21.

The visitors opened at three o'clock with R. W. Bentinck and R. D. Slater, the bowlers being Capt. Little and Dr. Causton. The wicket was a good deal easier than in the morning, and under the influence of a bright sun and a drying wind, was improving all the time. Both bowlers were knocked about pretty freely at the outset. Bentinck twice getting Little to the off boundary in one over. Fifty was reached at the result of twenty-five minutes' play, and it certainly appeared likely that the Services' bowlers should be changed. Two overs later Lieut. Allenby went on for Causton, whilst Capt. Usher replaced Little immediately after. The change, however, did not check the rate of scoring. Slater reaching his 50 out of 84 in forty minutes. Then a stroke of very bad luck befell the home team, Capt. Usher splitting and dislocating the fore finger of his left hand in endeavouring to stop a hard drive from Slater, and having to retire to the pavilion. Assistant Paymaster Strickland bowled in his stead, the Services feeling one short. Lieut. De Burgh went on for Allenby at 83, the Services having already called upon six bowlers. When two were needed to equal the home team's total the first wicket fell, Lieut. De Burgh taking Slater at cover off Strickland's bowling. The outgoing batsman had subscribed 84 by vigorous and accurate cricket, getting seven 4's. Then followed a series of successes by Strickland which improved the outlook for the Services considerably. In four overs he captured the wickets of Toyne, S. M. Mackenzie, and F. D. Harding for 5 runs, four wickets being down for 119. Bentinck appeared to be stumped by Commander Olivier when he was 49, but the visiting umpire gave him not out. For a while runs again came at a good rate, and at the tea interval the score stood at 158 for five.

After the short interval Bentinck continued to bat splendidly, reaching his century after about two hours and twenty minutes. Five runs later he was caught at cover by Turnbull, after a superb innings, which included a 6 and fifteen 4's. Later batsmen also scored freely, and the innings did not close until a few minutes before 6.30, the time fixed for dressing. The Services, 217 in arrears, will have to fight hard to-day to avert an innings defeat.

DEATH OF A NOTED AUSTRALIAN.

George Palmer, whose death is announced in a Reuters' message, will be remembered as one of the finest of all the Australian bowlers. He came to England first with the 1880 team, and was here also in 1882, 1884, and 1886. Born on the 22nd February, 1861, he was in his 50th year. He revealed his full powers late in the season of 1880, when with Spofforth disabled by an injured hand, he and the late Barry Boyle had to do all the work. In the eleven-a-side matches of that tour he took 80 wickets, the programme being largely made up of fixtures against local opponents. In the great team of 1882 he took 136 wickets, and in 1884 132 wickets. In 1886 he was far more expensive than in the previous trips.
