With the exception of Mark Fry for L. E. Adams, the winners played the same team as in the semi-final tie against Kinson. F. C. Weaver (the Winton captain) in this match reached a total of 900 runs, and also secured his 100th wicket. There was a good number of spectators watching the match, and at the close of play a large crowd assembled at the front of the pavilion to witness the presenting of the cup to the captain of the winning team.

Dr. J. A. Hosker, in handing the cup to Mr. Weaver, said he could assure all present that it gave him the greatest pleasure to present the cup, but at the same time they all regretted that the donor of the cup could not himself attend and make the presentation, as he felt sure Mr. Page Croft would have wished. He (the doctor) knew they would readily excuse Mr. Croft when they were informed that he was at the present time soldiering with his regiment in camp. The donor of the cup realised what his duty was, and felt it was incumbent upon everyone to be ready for every emergency. Busy man as Mr. Croft was, and with all the hundred and one calls now made on a M.P. — and also the calls made upon him in his own constituency—it was all the more reason why they should forgive him for not attending, when they realised that he was doing what he considered his duty (applause). He congratulated the winning team and their captain, amidst hearty applause, and went on to express the hope that the taking of the cup would not only be associated with their having won it, but with the pleasure of feeling that they had experienced a good year from a cricket point of view, and that not a single member of the team had any reason to upbraid himself; because all who played cricket must realise that they were not to consider themselves, but as a unit, working all together with a will. It was most important that they should realise that they must be in no way selfish; unselfishness must be the characteristic of every good cricketer, who should remember that

it was his duty to be obedient to his captain and loyal to his team (hear, hear). He wished to speak on another point, although he did not like the idea of being a critic, but he thought it was necessary on such an occasion, when looking back upon the past year, to think of the faults committed and what they might have done, and the material they had at their disposal, etc. He had seen a little of the material that afternoon, and he had heard a good deal more of the nature of that ground (hear, hear). He thought, perhaps, it was his duty to refer to it, because he could not believe it was within

everything, he believed it was through want of knowledge on the part of the Corporation that the pitch there was in such an unsatisfactory condition. He was informed that even with the two excellent bowlers on the winning side that afternoon, it was somewhat dangerous to stand at the wickets. He hoped this would be brought to the notice of the Corporation, and also hoped that that body might be asked to reconsider that question, and see whether during the coming winter something could not be done to improve the pitch, etc. (hear, hear). Every member of the Corporation must feel that if there was one sport which it was their duty, as citizens, to pay for and support, that sport was cricket. After enlarging upon the qualities of manliness, unselfishness, etc., called forth by cricket, he said it also taught them pluck, endurance and patience, and those were the three great characteristics necessary for the young Englishman, as none of them knew how soon they might be called upon to exercise them. We were living in troublous times, and he was one of those who felt that the time was not very far distant when they would be called upon to defend their country and when they would see a system of universal military service maintained in this country (some cries of dissent and applause). It behoved everyone there to realise what was likely to happen, and he considered it was the duty of the Corporation of Bournemouth to do all they could to inculcate those qualities in every young lad living in Bournemouth at the present time, and also to foster and encourage the taking up of that notable game—cricket. In congratulating Mr. Weaver on receiving the cup, the doctor said, as one who was associated with the Boscombe Club, he was bound to remind the recipient that the cup was only lent to him—(laughter)—but if next year the Winton Club won the cup—and won it as well as he was informed they had done this year—then he would, if asked, present it to them with renewed pleasure (applause).

Mr. Weaver, surrounded by the team, then accepted the cup, and in reply, asked the doctor to suitably thank Mr. Page Croft on their behalf for his kindness in presenting the cup. Apart from politics, Mr. Page Croft was the finest sportsman they had ever seen in Bournemouth (applause).

Cheers were then given both for the winning and the losing teams.

Mr. G. O. Walker moved hearty thanks to Dr. Hosker for presenting the cup. They all congratulated the winners and sympathised with the losers. The losing team had now been in the final three times; they should not lose heart; but think of Newcastle United, who were in the Cup final three times, and on the fourth occasion they won it (hear, hear).

Mr. E. A. Hockey (the Secretary of the League) seconded.

In reply, Dr. Hosker assured them of his support and his willing efforts to in any way promote the interests of their national sport. Partly owing to the fact that they did not really know which team would win—(laughter)—and to the glorious uncertainties of cricket, the medals could not be presented that day, but would be presented to the members of the winning team later on—possibly at an enjoyable dinner (applause).

FIRST-CLASS CRICKET.

Advice from the Wiltshire Captain.

An interesting article appears in "Fry's Magazine" for September by Mr. A. M. Miller, the captain of the Wiltshire County Cricket Club, entitled "Advice to the First-class Counties." Mr. Miller expresses the opinion that the new system of scoring points in the competition of the first-class counties is not much of an improvement on the old way, and says that in the minor counties' competitions they have a system which has been running for nine years, differing from either the old one or the new one in the competition of the first-class counties. The minor counties' system is:—Five points for a win, three points for a match decided on the first innings, drawn matches (i.e., matches in which no result on the first innings is attained) ignored. Mr. Miller asks the first-class counties seriously to consider this system, with a view to its adoption in the first-class competition.

He claims for the system that it will ensure increased interest right through the game; that it will tend to increased punctuality; and that it will cause the utmost endeavour to be made on each side to lead on the first innings as well as at the end of the game. On the subject of punctuality he says: "I don't say that time is not closely observed at most grounds, but there are exceptions, and the captain of the side that is behind on the first innings is sure to see that his side is given the right amount of time to get back the advantage it has lost. We minor counties have our hours of play fixed—11.30 to 6.30 first day; 11 to 6.30 second day; and I think it should not be left to the inclination of the captain, and have the short hours of play that are usually in vogue at Bath, although I will admit the light is not as good there after six as it is at some grounds."

Mr. Miller observes that the chief objection usually taking to scoring points for a win on the first innings is that it rather increases the premium put on winning the toss, as given rain on the first day (or previous to it) the fourth innings may be played under the most favourable conditions to batting of any of the four. And there only being two innings played, the side winning the toss has a decided advantage. It might also be urged that sides like Yorkshire and Nottingham, that went through a season without being defeated, would have been penalised in

this way in some of their matches, and not have had a clean sheet like they did. In answer to these supposed objections, Mr. Miller says: "I should like to ask the players who took part in those respective county elevens in their unbeaten years if they were their most enjoyable seasons. I feel sure that they will say that the anxiety and strain took a great deal of the pleasure away. There is a local club in Bath, which, during the last ten years, has had one or two undefeated seasons, and I was talking to one of their keenest players this Whitsuntide when I was captaining the side against them, and said I was afraid our side would not give them much of a game. To my surprise he said: 'I am sorry, as I want our side to be beaten soon; but it must be by a good side.' I don't want any more of those unbeaten seasons; the cricket is never so enjoyable or as sporting when you have got to worry all the time about not being beaten. Doesn't that apply as much to first-class as to club cricket?"

Boscombe and Kinson both won their games in Division I. of the Bournemouth and District League Competition on Saturday; Winton also won; the Estate Agents and Poole Municipal Offices drew. Pokesdown were not playing. The positions of the clubs remain unchanged from last week and the three top clubs are still rivals for the Championship. Kinson have the best prospects, as from the same number of matches they have secured three points more than their rivals, but they have strong opponents in Boscombe on Saturday next, and a loss for them then would mean that Boscombe and Pokesdown both have the chance of finishing on level terms, which would leave the League Executive with the interesting task of fixing up three extra games—after September 10th. But Boscombe and Pokesdown must win their remaining games to finish level, and Kinson can still finish in front if they win one and draw one. The clubs' remaining games are as under:—
