Sittingbourne batted first, and had the best of the wicket, and the best of the game, scoring 192, which was a larger total than had been anticipated. J. Whibley led the way with a nicely played 48, and A. Wharton, a young cricketer, hit very hard for a good 21. Milton Regis had some fine bats, but their chief asset, L. S. Watson, was handicapped by being short of practice. W. Bowes, with a good 39, topped the score. The Captain of the Milton Fire Brigade quite enjoyed his fielding. The Milton total reached 135. The latter part of the game was spoiled by rain.

It turned out a wet evening, and the entertainment had to be abandoned. The entertainment took place in Trinity Hall, where, in spite of the rain, a numerous audience enjoyed the excellent programme that was provided. The artistes were Miss Nellie Webster (soprano), Mr. Fred T. Daniels (humorous entertainer), and Mr. H. Hewson Brown (Lark non-sensu entertainer). Mr. F. Stagg's orchestra provided tuneful music.

Rain in the early morning delayed the start on Thursday of the match, Gore Court v. Mr. Tynlden's XI, which was continued yesterday (Friday). The match to-day (Saturday), Gore Court v. United Services (Sheerness) will bring an eventful week to a close.

Gore Court visited the R.N. and R.M.L.I., at Chatham, on Saturday, in the return fixture. The home team had got a strong team together, while Gore Court were not strongly represented. The Gore Court men defeated the Navy and Marines when they were at Sittingbourne earlier in the season, but on Saturday poor Gore Court (who have won only this solitary match this season) came a cropper, losing by 132 runs. The R.N. and R.M.L.I. made 286, and Gore Court responded with 154. Lieut. Leach (80) and Major Godfrey (53) scored heavily for the winners. For Gore Court W. Bowes went in first wicket and carried out his bat for 59, which represented some excellent cricket. It is gratifying to find that this well-known Milton cricketer has not lost his form. Hickmott played well for 38, but he failed in the bowling department. Jordan did well, however, taking five wickets for 57 runs. If these two Miltonians could get into their true form it would make a lot of difference to Gore Court.
