The annual cricket match between Yarmouth gentlemen of 20 years and upwards, inaugurated some four years ago with the object of aiding Yarmouth charities, took place on the Recreation Ground on Thursday. Perhaps one of the most interesting features of the event was the motley array of well-worn headgear that had been dug up for the occasion, from the lovely curler of his Worship's to the straight up and down stove pipe that adorned the head of Captain Papworth. The Mayor's 20,000 Shilling Fund in aid of the new children's ward at the Hospital will, with the Boys' Home, share the proceeds of the match (takings were £100) being committed through the agency of Captain Grayson and Mr. Bradshaw, who collected from the ground and adjacent residences a considerable amount. Play was, perhaps, not so interesting as of years, incident not being plentiful; whilst the incompleteness of one of the sides necessitated three lads being called from the crowd to field, and one player, the late going in to bat twice in one inning, and the other side was one over its proper complement. The Blackhats elected to go first to the wicket, and Captain Papworth laid the wicket on its side before a fairly large crowd. Mr. Arthur Fell, after sending down a few trial balls just to get the "kinks" out of his arm as it were, opened the bowling to the Rev. Pratt whose partner was Mr. Chapman. The M.P., however, was of the mark, and the cleric found his deliveries, which, if they had no other points, certainly varied in length, much to his liking, and the other realized it soon. Taylor, who was the "harrier" at the other end, was more difficult to play, but Pratt, nevertheless, scored freely, and there was much about his play that drew the experienced batsman. CRICKET.

The first-class cricket of last week possessed very considerable interest; but the struggle for the county championship does not begin in earnest until to-day, when all the 16 counties are engaged. Essex, who oppose Derbyshire at Leyton to-day, and Surrey at the Oval on Thursday, obtained a very handsome victory over Cambridge University a week ago. The Light Blues gave a very disappointing display, and the fine innings of F. A. Ferris (144), and the Rev. F. H. Gillingham (143) enabled Essex to close with seven wickets down and to win by an innings and 29 runs. The Cantabs did much better against Surrey towards the end of the week and won by two wickets, a result in large measure due to the brilliant batting of J. F. Ireland, whose not-out 197 was a fine effort. Ireland, who is well-known to cricketers in East Anglia, went in second wicket down and remained until the match had been won. Yorkshire and Lancashire have opened the season in promising fashion, but Kent shaped in disappointing style against the Oxonians.

Northants, at Birmingham; Sussex v. Derbyshire, at Launceston.

Suffolk meet Lincolnshire to-day under somewhat unpromising conditions. The utmost difficulty has been experienced in inducing cricketers to represent Suffolk, and it is to be feared that the eleven will not be of any especial representative value. It is discouraging to find that for the opening match of the county's season there should not have been greater enthusiasm, barely there must be a sufficiency of capable players in Suffolk to enable the manager to put an eleven in the field which should have a reasonable prospect of success. I am assured that the Hon. secretary (Mr. H. A. Groom) left no effort unmade to make the side representative. Cricketers ought to display somewhat more of local patriotism than appears to have been brought into play on this occasion. Then, and then only, will there be any likelihood of success. There must be plenty of cricket promise procurable in the county if trouble is only taken to discover it.

Judging from the way in which the season has commenced at Colchester, the same has lost nothing as regards support from local enthusiasts, and all that is needed for an interesting four or five months' sport is fine weather. The danger of the Garrison Club will be watched with interest, for since last season closed, several new recruits have arrived at the station, and consequently the constitution of the Garrison team will be considerably altered. The officers' pitch on the Abbey Field is fast, and in excellent condition. The cricket will gain from the introduction into the local competition of the military element, both the corporals and sergeants of the West Yorkshire Regiment having entered. The other competing clubs are the Essexians, Britanniæ, St. George's, Culpeper Street Works, Merca, and St. Stephen's. Most of the well-known local League cricketers will be found playing for the various clubs. Mr. Paul Lawrence, an enthusiastic sportsman, has again undertaken the secretarial work of the League.

The Colchester and East Essex Club retains most of its old members, and in addition has secured several newcomers, playing at either of two pitches. These include Colonel Clarke, Capt. A. M. Ross (West Yorkshire Regiment), Captain Larnear, the Rev. J. G. D. Webster (Army Chaplain), Messrs. W. A. Smith (Hilstead), R. E. Mingley, R. F. Clark (Layton), F. J. R. Gates, A. Frost, W. F. Sheppard, L. P. Bittler, R. C. Morgan, H. Gray, and A. Jupp. Captain A. M. Ross takes the place of Major Hugginbotham—who has left the town—as a member of the Committee to represent the Garrison. An excellent match of fixtures has been arranged. On August 16th, Upper Tooting are big visitors, and several old "Blues" are likely to appear in the team. The cricket week commences on July 24th, and the matches will be against the M.C.C., fieldsmen of Essex, Colchester Garrison, Witham, Essex Club and Ground, and Chelmsford. In addition, fixtures have been arranged with Ipswich and East Suffolk, Brentwood, the Grassmar School Masters, Framlingham College Masters, Bury and West Suffolk, Old Marlborough, Hoxley Park, Fildes School, East Anglian Ramblers, The Moccas (two days), and other well-known neighbouring clubs, together with the various regimental eleven. The professional, P. Allen and C. Bellinger, have been re-engaged, and their efforts have resulted in a good pitch, which improves with age for it is yet comparatively new. Mr. H. D. Swan will again captain the eleven. Mr. F. R. Mian is Vice-Captain, and Mr. M. G. Bunting the captain of the "A" team. The secretarial work is again in the capable hands of Messrs. F. J. Bloom and E. C. Green.

The prospects of the Ipswich School team for this season are not as bright as they have been in some former seasons. There are only three "colours" left of last season's XI—A. F. R. Evans, E. A. Ashwin, and E. C. Randa. The Club has to deplore the loss of R. C. Wylich and B. A. C. de Benneville, who were very useful last year. The batting ought to improve a bit on last year; the bowling is weak, though R. S. J. Haeds and G. P. Worn both show some promise. The wicket-keeping is in the capable hands of E. C. Randa, who is quite the best "keeper" the School has had for some time past. The match list is much the same as before. A new match is to be played against the Marquis of Offham's Eastern Park XI.

Stower, who last year played for the Conservative Club, and was chosen to play the first match of the season v. Whitstable and Cotton, the old Ipswich Town footballer, who has taken up his residence in Sudbury, will probably play. Most of the other players are available, and a good season is anticipated under the captaincy of that capital cricketer, Dr. Leeming.

Haverhill have already made a start, and have been successful in winning their opening match. The composition of the team will be about the same as last year, though the Club have lost the services of Willison, one of their best bowlers, who has left the town. The pavilion has this year been erected for the players, at a cost of over £125. The Club have to thank several gentlemen in the district for their handsome contribution to the building fund. Before a start was made on the building all the money necessary had been promised.

Melford this year, thanks to the kindness of the Rev. Sir William Hyde Parker, have been provided with a new cricket ground, which they had been in great want of. The ground is in Melford Hall Park, and a good pitch has been obtained. There is now nothing to prevent the Melford team becoming as prominent in the cricket world as their footer team is in the football world.

Sudbury Constitutional Club have also obtained a new club, thanks to the kindness of Mr. C. Whitton, and a good program of matches has been arranged with teams in the district.

Small scoring was the order of the day at Chelmsford, where Witham were the visitors, and the bowlers had a fine time. Victory rested with the home side by the run. Securing first knock, Chelmsford put together only 54. With one wicket to fall, Witham required only one run to tie, but C. J. Kortright dispelled the hopes of the visitors by literally shattering the stumps, for his delivery which sent the last man to the pavilion broke the middle wicket into two pieces. It should be said that neither side was at full strength.

Only two old choices remain at Framlingham College—M. B. Waddell, who succeeds to the captaincy, and W. Egan, wicket-keeper. Four members of last year's second eleven are still in residence—L. A. Collins, R. A. Markham, G. H. Oldham, and J. N. Bennett, and all being useful cricketers, there is every hope of a promising season. Owing to the isolated position of the College on a branch line of the G.E.R., school matches are difficult to obtain, and only two figure on the list, Colchester and Woodbridge. The Past and Present contest is on July 23rd.

St. Matthew's (Ipswich) Reserves, last year's winners of the second division of the Ipswich and District League, have a difficult task set them this season. According to the League rules, they are promoted to Division I., and as their average age is only 19 years, and they are called upon to meet clubs of the strength of Great Works, Bramham, and others, it is evident they will be severely tried. This season their captain is wicket-keeper, B. Poldard, who will have nearly all last year's team at his disposal. One or two members have left the town, or have succumbed to the fascinations of senior clubs, but it is thought that their loss will not materially weaken the side, as several promising members have been "signed on." Besides the League matches, an attractive list of friendlies has been arranged, and the club expects to have a very enjoyable season. The ground is King's Field, Park Road.

The Marquis of Bristol is again the President of Bury United Cricket Club. Mr. A. W. Day retains the captaincy, and Mr. C. C. Smith, of St. York Road, Bury St. Edmund's, is once more the honorary secretary, who has managed to arrange matches for every Saturday up to and including September 1st. A meeting of the club was held at Stowmarket, Thetford, Newmarket, Haverhill, Mildenhall, Ampton, Bougham, Ipswich, Depot Suffolk Regiment, Bury St. Edmund's, Bury M.C.C., the East Anglian School. Mr. G. H. Wheeler has left the district, but most of the other players of last season are expected to be available. There are several new members, Messrs. J. Francis, J. Cook, E. H. Goo, and A. R. Reeves have already shown good batting form. Mr. A. Bridge and Mr. C. T. Smith bowled well on Saturday. Another successful season is anticipated.

The Biddston and District Club, which opened its season a fortnight ago, is looking forward to a successful season. The ground is reported to be in good condition. The hon. sec. (Mr. W. W. Kithen) informs me that the fixtures promise to be productive of some good cricket.

## IPSWICH CRICKET WEEK.

### IPSWICH AND E. SUFFOLK v. UPPER TOOTING.

For the fifth day in succession fine weather prevailed at Portman Road. Upper Tooting are touring with a very strong team, and it was rightly thought previous to the commencement that the home-ers had out hardly a strong enough team to give them a good game, but weak as it was, an interesting match ensued.

E. E. Stearn lost the wicket, and Ipswich had to go into the field. D. H. Butler and F. Hosken were the first pair. The Rev. H. F. Steel bowled the first over, and the first-batted batsman put him away four times for 15 runs. Waters bowled a maiden at the other end. For a time runs came slowly, but now and then a fine stroke was played by either batsman. Every loose ball was picked out, and more often than not sent into the country. More runs were made off Steel, and he was relieved by Peck. The batsmen cut and drove in brilliant style, and T. G. Sharp was tried with the ball. On his first over ten were made, but in the following one Butler was well caught behind the wicket by Bennett, who had to make three attempts before finally holding it—23 for 1. The outgoing batsman had made 52 by practically faultless cricket. E. F. Lewis took his place, and with the total increased by 15. Lunch was called. On resuming Steel and Waters again took the ball. The bowlers very quickly had picked up 40, the bowling seemingly making very little impression on the batsmen. At 125 Peck was put on again, but still no separation was effected and Sharp relieved Waters. F. Hosken put his third ball to square leg for 4, but was clean bowled by the next delivery, the batsman showing 140. Hosken had made 61 in a most brilliant manner, but should have been 100, before lunch. R. E. Handlands had only just played an over when Sharp took through Lewis's defence. R. N. Collyer, the new-comer, received the next delivery from Sharp, and somehow placed it in the hands of square leg, and he retired with a duck—141 for four. A. H. Parry made his appearance. Handlands opened his score by placing the ball to leg for 5. He had only just passed double figures when he was bowled by Peck. 147 for five. He was replaced by R. M. Harvey. In Peck's next over, Bishop was clean bowled, the seventh wicket falling at 178. H. G. Yates satisfied himself at first with singles, but afterwards scored much more freely. F. G. Windsor made one fine drive and a single off Waters, but in the following over was dismissed. Peck again doing the useful. At 188, Harvey was run out from a smart return. Yates was scuffing fast, and Sharp took the ball again, and in his second over Yates was dismissed at cover point, the whole side being out for 224. Sharp, who had been most successful with the ball, took five wickets for 87 runs, and Peck did marvellously well in taking four for 58.

The home team sent in E. Stearn and F. L. Titchmarsh to face the bowling of A. H. Parry and F. Hosken. Runs came very slowly. At 12, E. Stearn fell a victim to Parry, as did Titchmarsh in the following over. J. J. Lewis made a few nice hits, but only 40 were on the board when he was beaten by Parry, three wickets having gone for a mere nothing. F. G. Bennett and the Rev. H. F. Steel shaped wicket and increased the total at a faster pace, but only 15 had been added when Bennett was extremely well taken in the slips. With Sharp as partner, Steel laid on the wood. He contributed a useful 22 before Parry upset his stumps, half the wickets being down for 40. Evidently the home side could do little with the bowlers, and the match was a very poor show. Sharp and H. W. Patmore took the ball from Parry. At 71 Patmore placed the ball into square leg's hands, and Tindall answered only to return very shortly afterwards, having succumbed to Handlands in the slips. The same bowler dismissed the rest of the batsmen without much trouble, with the exception of H. C. B. Peck, who was undefeated with a well-played 22 to his credit. In the end 114 was totalled, leaving the visitors many winners by 110 runs.

## CRICKETER'S STRANGE DEATH.

Arthur Woodcock, the well-known fast bowler who formerly played for Leicestershire, returned home at Billadon, Leicestershire, on Saturday night, and asked his sister to kiss him, saying he had come home to die. Shortly afterwards he became unconscious, and expired shortly after midnight. Woodcock had dropped out of first-class cricket for seven seasons, but fifteen years ago he was one of the fastest bowlers in England. He created quite a sensation at the beginning of the season of 1885, the first year Leicestershire were admitted to the championship, taking nine wickets against Surrey, ten against Nottingham, and twelve against Essex, but lost much of his form before the summer came to an end. At one time he coached Haverford College, U.S.A. He was in his 45th year.
