CRICKET NOTES.

(By "WANDERER.")

In quite startling contrast to the weary succession of rain-soaked games which constituted the greater part of the Tyneside Senior League programme the previous week, Saturday's play in the local tourney was replete with instances of lively batting. In fact, centuries were at a discount, and not only was the Backworth professional, Montgomery, able to obtain one of the highest individual scores ever obtained in local club cricket—an innings of 186 against Close House—but Norbury (County Club v. Wallsend), W. G. Brown (Benwell Hill v. Tynedale), and Ord Richardson (Close House v. Backworth) all played three-figure innings. The two games without the distinction of centuries were still in the fashion, W. Milne (Benwell v. North Durham), T. Thynne (North Durham v. Benwell), and W. R. Davies (Tynemouth v. St. George's) getting into the "eighties." Surely, a succession of remarkable performances, especially when one considers the limitation of Saturday afternoon cricket—"the get runs or get out" spirit, which is usually absent in County cricket, is the sporting spice of the game so far as League clubs are concerned.

That a century is neither a sure forerunner of success nor yet an effective means of preventing defeat was demonstrated in a remarkable way on Saturday. Wallsend, who were indebted to Stan. Anderson (80), G. A. Gray (62), and the extraordinary number of 42 extras—fast bowling has its obvious disadvantages and difficulties for the man with the gloves and pads—aggregated 237 against the County Club at Jesmond. Responding to a by no means unapproachable total, the Club batsmen, with the exception of Norbury, played moderate cricket, and though the stalwart ex-Hampshire cricketer hit three 6's and fourteen 4's in an innings of 116, even such a fine effort was unable to save the game. It was Norbury's second successive

century in club cricket, for only the previous week he had scored a sparkling 136 against Benwell Hill. Wallsend, by the way, have improved out of all knowledge to the indifferent side who last season found the path of progress a tortuous and difficult one.

Montgomery's gigantic innings against Close House, which helped to swell Backworth's aggregate to no fewer than 337, was followed by another century by Ord Richardson for Close House, who, with 265 scored for a couple of wickets, could hardly be said to have had the worst of the draw. H. Arkle, 75, and W. Harrison, 65 not out, were useful partners to Richardson while he compiled his 103. It must be on very rare occasions that close on 600 runs are scored in a Saturday game, and though one appreciates something sparkling and out of the ordinary, the prospect of finding presentable analyses for bowlers on a basis of 592 runs for twelve wickets would be enough to drive the statistician to distraction.

Moral victories count for very little, and that barometer of collective ability, the League table, disregards possibilities and shapes itself on actualities. Yet Tynemouth are to be congratulated as their excellent showing against the leaders; St. George's; at Preston Avenue, North Shields, on Saturday, and the fact that so redoubtable a team of batsmen as the Jesmond eleven should escape by a stolid defence of their last wicket is in itself an effective commentary on the game. Tynemouth are reaping the reward of the attention they have devoted to the new blood, and the failure of that usually powerful bowling combine, C. M. Skinner and Wingham, was perhaps the outstanding feature, indicating as it did the exceptional ability with which the senders wielded the bat. Engineer-Lieut. Moore 34, W. R. Davies 37, and G. F. Robson 31 were the chief contributors to Tynemouth's 237, and although C. F. Stanger-Leathes 52, and N. R. E. Wilkinson 31, batted in encouraging style, St. George's had 155 and their last wicket in hand when the game was drawn. Benwell, for whom "Billy" Milne played a characteristic innings, comfortably defeated North Durham, for whom T. Thynne's 80 was an excellent display.

Chester-le-Street retain pride of place in Durham Senior circles, but their victory at Burnmoor on Saturday was rather a bloodless affair. Burnmoor failed on a comparatively easy wicket for 45, and the Cestrians proceeded to smite Burnmoor's bowlers hip and thigh, scoring 196 for the loss of six wickets. The champions, Sunderland, found the Boldon bowling a matter of no difficulty, and scored 248 for four wickets. H. Brooks, the Durham County all-rounder, being responsible for 103. Even to Sunderland's smart attack, however, the Boldon batting was a stubborn thing, and when Alfred Morris had disposed of Boldon's last two batsmen, there were only five short minutes to spare.

Philadelphia kept space in the championship battle with a four-wicket win at Wearmouth, and Whitburn had the satisfaction of besting Seaham Harbour by 18 runs. Run-getting honours of the day went to Durham City, who swamped Hendon's 63 with a lordly aggregate of 214. C. Adamson, in his crisp wicketings of 102, hit two 6's and a dozen boundaries, and A. P. Ashley, his partner, had a 5 and nineteen 4's in his 89, a score which the successful batsmen intent on a century is apt to regard with mixed feelings. In one Hendon over the pair obtained 22 runs, and two other overs cost Hendon 17 runs each.
