RETROSPECT OF SEASON 1910.

Abergavenny have been represented at times by a powerful batting side during the past season, and some good scores have been-made on their enlarged enclosure off Avenue-road that promises to be a regular county venue in the future. The bowling, however, has not been so strong as most of the seasons. They only had practically two bowlers to call upon, and Turner and James, though bowling well, have necessarily had much more than their fair share of work to get strongh. One of the hest-performances of the club was at Usk, where Abergaveny put up 204 for five wickets down and then got the homesters out for 72. —The defeat received from the strong county-eleven put in the field by Dr. Tatham was only what might be expected, while the poor shows against Newport II in the first match of the season, and against Penarth away were excusable sceing the weakness of the teams out, but the collapse of the strong batting eleven out against Penarth a homenan August 0, for 42 runs, was rather hard to explain. Dr. Tresawan heads the averages again, though run rather close by Wyndham—Lewis, who made a most satisfactory debutin county cricket on Bank Holiday last; while Capt. Partridge, Turner, and J. R. Jacob have all scored consistently during the season. In the bowling, Turner took 34 wickets at a cost of 921 runs, a fine record of the old Staffordshire county man, whose skill with the hall is known in many counties. James secured 41 wickets for 529 runs, a very good performance considering that he, like the professional, had practically no chance of a change during most of the season. Everall, a left-hand bowler, who assisted the club in the last five matches, greatly strengthened that department, as he took 14 wickets for 97 runs, and it was a pity he was not available earlier.
