**A YOUTHFUL CENTURY-MAKER.**

**Wonderful Performance by a Small Boy.**

For many years the name of Tom Smart, the Wiltshire professional, and his performances with the ball have been on the lips of cricketers in this county. Smart has several sons who all seem destined to come to the front in the cricket world. The eldest, Jack, has already played for Wiltshire, father and son turning out in the same match—a thing unequalled, it is believed, in county cricket. In the second son, Cecil, who is only 12, lies the greatest hopes of the team as a bat. For two or three years he has played for the Parochial Schools in the Trowbridge Elementary School League, and has made many useful scores, but this week he actually topped the century. The game was played in the evening against Trinity School, and in considerably less than two hours the youngster knocked up 101 out of 143, himself scoring at the rate of over a run a minute. For a lad of 12 to score a century is a wonderful feat even though it is a school match, but he followed this up by capturing several wickets. Two other younger sons of Smart also play regularly and each knows how to get the ball on to the bats.
