

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

The two days' match in the Minor Counties Championship, played on the Bishop's Stortford ground on Friday and Saturday last week, between Herts and Surrey II., was favoured with ideal weather conditions. Throughout the game was interesting and excellent batting was witnessed on both sides. On the first innings Surrey II. were at a disadvantage, but retrieving their position on the second day won easily. When Herts went in after lunch on Saturday they had 232 to make to win. The first wicket fell at 35, and the sixth at 100, but only another 24 was put on. Coleman, for Herts, in the first innings made a good stand, and mainly owing to his efforts over 80 runs were scored for the last wicket. THE N.Z. CRICKET COUNCIL.

A meeting of the New Zealand Cricket Council was held in Christchurch on April 30th, Mr. S. Whitta Thornton (president) being in the chair. The following delegates were present:—Messrs. J. H. Williams, C. Treweek, G. T. Weston, W. B. Bottrell, D. H. Thomson, G. J. Austin, J. Young, F. Labatt, E. T. Harper, H. S. Burnes, J. B. Beckett, C. R. Clark, and N. J. Hardy. In accordance with a notice of motion, Mr. Hardy moved:

"That no person who is in receipt of any payment whatsoever as a cricketer or coach shall be eligible to play in Plunket Shield matches until he has resided in the Dominion for twelve months continuously, and that the rules for the Plunket Challenge Shield be amended accordingly."

The motion was seconded by Mr. Harper. Mr. F. C. Raphael moved, as an amendment:

"That no person shall be eligible to play in any match whatever under the jurisdiction of the New Zealand Cricket Council, unless he has resided in the Dominion for four months continuously preceding the match."

The amendment was lost, and on the motion being put to the meeting it also was lost. The rules, therefore, stand unaltered.

The Marlborough Association wrote complaining that no refund was made to it in connection with the losses sustained during the tour of Lord Hawke's team. It was pointed out by several of those present that the whole trouble arose through the omission of the secretary of the Marlborough Association to send in a petition requesting such refund to be made. It was decided that the matter be referred to the Management Committee to report to the Council at its next meeting.

The Auckland Association wrote as to the advisability of limiting the number of challenges for the Plunket Shield. It was resolved that the Auckland Association should be communicated with, calling its attention to Rule 3.

A letter was received from the secretary of the Hawke's Bay Cricket Association, asking for a refund of the amount guaranteed (£75) by the Hawke's Bay Association for its match with the Australian team, which had not been played, owing to the cricket ground being flooded. It was resolved that the matter be referred to the Management Committee for their report, and to make a recommendation to the Council on the matter at its next meeting.

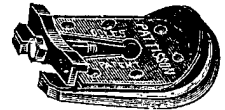
CRICKET HANDBOOKS.
