Durham v. Yorkshire II.

TO-DAY'S PLAY AT WESTOE.

In charming weather, and before a big attendance of spectators, play was commenced this forenoon at Westoe, in the Durham v. Yorkshire II match. After the slight rain of yesterday and careful attention from the 8 Shields groundsmen, the wicket was in fine trim. The Yorkshiremen, having won the toss, went in first, the batsmen being Robinson and Oldroyd. Morris sent down the first over from the top end, Robinson getting him nicely away to long field, where Thackeray smartly saved a boundary. At the other end Brooks took the over, sending down a slow puzzling ball, which almost brought disaster to Robinson at his first stroke, the wicket-keeper whipping off his bat just a second too late. Two maiden overs followed. Robinson then put Brooks away to leg for four, all ran. Ten went up on the board after sixteen minutes' play. In the following over Robinson was clean bowled by Morris, his score being 15, and the total 20. Bates filled the vacancy, and opened his account with a clean stroke to 8 boundary of the same bowler, and he repeated the feat at the other end at the expense of Brooks. Thirty appeared on the board but when three more runs had been sent up Oldroyd played on to his wicket a swift ball sent down by Morris. Turner, who made the century for his side at Newcastle, was the next man in. With Brooks bowling Turner took no risks and played only one out of the six balls sent down to him. Bates, of the same bowler, gave a hard chance to T. Coulson at point. The ball was driven at a terrific pace and Coulson held it, but only for a moment. The batsman's score when he was given this new lease of life was 11. He immediately opened his shoulders to the same bowler, and drove to the long field for four, all ran. Runs were scarce for a while, the half-century being registered after 30 minutes' play. Turner then hit a 1, 4, and 2 in succession off Morris and Bates pulled Brooks severely round to the leg for a boundary. A change in the bowling was required to with 65 up. Thackeray relieving Brooks. The new bowler was struck for 4 by Bates and Turner hit him to deep field for 5. Seventy was posted with the same batsmen standing and appearing to be well set. Only fifteen minutes was taken to add the 20 required to bring the total up to three figures, the game having then been in progress an hour and ten minutes. Smith, at this stage took the ball from Morris. With the double change in the bowling runs getting slackened off a good deal. Bates reached his 100 after just a shade over an hour's batting. Turner got to business again and got a 5, and a 4 off Thackeray, the latter stroke being a fine pull to leg from a short pitched ball. When 120 was signalled Turnbull relieved the Captain in Street pro, but the Yorkshiremen helped themselves to two boundaries and 5 singles over his first over. With the last stroke Turner knocked off his 50 his partnership with Bates at this stage having added 108 runs to the score. Another alteration in the bowling was made when 140 runs were posted. A. W. Gowland replacing Smith. The batsmen, however, were equal to every variety of bowling and were still together when the luncheon interval arrived.

Durham v. Yorkshire II.

AN INNINGS DEFEAT.

Play was resumed in this match at Westoe to-day in delightful weather. On the opening day the Yorkshiremen stood with a decided advantage as after having made a score of 273 they got rid of the Durham side for 87 thus compelling the Dumelmians to follow on. In forty minutes that remained at their disposal the visitors' bowlers dispensed of Morris (4), and T. A. Bradford (6), and Durham were faced with the task to-day of making 145 runs to avert an innings defeat.

The not outs were H. Brooks (21), and Turnbull (0), who faced the attack of Harrison and Broadbent. Runs came rather briskly, the score being taken from 31 to 46 in ten minutes, when Turnbull was nicely coaxed into a slashing stroke at a full pitched ball from Harrison which clean beat him. H. Brooks was then joined by his brother Cecil. The former put Broadbent finely to the boundary for 4 which brought 50 to the board, play having lasted 55 minutes. The batsmen took no undue liberties with the bowling, and twenty minutes were occupied in sending up ten runs. H. Brooks was then bowled from the top end, in attempting a forward stroke. His contribution was a useful 38, and he had been at the wicket altogether an hour and 20 minutes. A. E. Walker was the next man in. Runs seemed desperately hard to get and excepting for a 3 by C. Brookes, were confined to single hits. With 78 up Walker at length got Broadbent to square leg for 4, but in the next over his partner was caught at the wicket by Watson, the bowler being Harrison. He had batted three-quarters of an hour for 18. Five wickets were now down for 82, when A. W. Gowland joined Walker. The last comer promptly hit the bowlers in turn for 3 each, but run-getting slackened away again to the old dreary pace. When 90 was posted the Yorkshire captain tried a change in bowling, Walker taking the ball from Broadbent. The fielders were crowded round the slips, but the batsmen refused to touch all but safe balls. With Gowland batting at the other end the score, rose slowly to the century. The appearance of the three figures total being enthusiastically greeted by the crowd. The Durham innings had now been in progress just five minutes under two hours. Gowland now commenced to nock Walker about in refreshing style, but at the other end Harrison made a successful appeal for legs which sent him back to the pavilion. His score of 23 was made in 20 minutes. Six for 112. T. Coulson followed in and after a single off Harrison he batted Walker in earnest, drove him to the outfield for 4, and again to the far screen for a boundary. A single and a three quickly followed. Walker was proving an expensive experiment and when the Durham captain had sent up the score to 130 he was taken off and replaced by Richardson, a fast bowler. Smart fielding distinguished the Yorkshiremen's attack and repeatedly boundaries were saved on the fringe of the field. Coulson remained with Walker, while 41 runs were added, of which 23 were got off his own bat. When 152 was on the board he failed, however, at an effort to get Harrison away to leg and a mistake put the ball easily into Broadbent's hands close to the wicket. J. Thackeray was the next man, but was soon out in much the same way, Robinson making an easy catch behind the wicket. Eight for 156.

Smith, who filled the vacancy, added a single before Richardson found his leg stump, the last man in being Robinson, who gave Walker a simple catch off Harrison, the innings closing for 158.

Yorkshire thus won by an innings and 18 runs. The Durham innings had lasted 2 hours and 55 minutes.

YORKSHIRE'S BOWLING TOO GOOD FOR HOME COUNTY.

Constituting an attractive Race Week fixture, the Minor Counties match between Durham and Yorkshire II., which commenced at South Shields yesterday, drew a large concourse of spectators to the Westoe cricket ground.

In view of Durham's heavy reverse on the previous day, hopes were somewhat bright that they would retrieve their fortunes at the expense of the Yorkshire men. The latter gave a remarkably good all round exhibition, and at the end of the day's play Durham appeared to be in a hopeless position.

Going first to the wicket, the Yorkshire team knocked up the respectable total of 273 after three hours and a quarter's play. The principal feature of their innings was the partnership of Bates and Turner, which was productive of no fewer than 120 runs.

The response of Durham to Yorkshire's effort was of a disappointing character, their first innings total being three short of a century. The best score was Brooks, whose score of 43 included four 4's, one 5, and five 2's. His wicket was captured by Broadbent, who sent down a fast ball which drove one of the bats, a distance of 20 yards. Altogether Brooks was batting an hour and seven minutes.

With 175 runs to wipe out, Durham followed on shortly before six o'clock, and when stumps were drawn they had made 31 runs for the loss of two wickets.

YORKSHIRE II. DO WELL AGAINST DURHAM.

HARRISON'S BOWLING THE FEATURE OF DAY'S PLAY.

The meeting between Durham and Yorkshire II. at South Shields, as usual, attracted a big crowd to the Westoe field, and an interesting match was witnessed, but Durham again made a poor show against the visitors, who at the close of the day's play had 145 runs and an innings in hand. The Durham bowling was weak, except in the case of Morris, who took seven wickets, whereas on the other side Broadbent and Harrison were irresistible.

Going in first, Yorkshire piled up the respectable total of 273, but they opened somewhat weakly, Robinson and Oldroyd being out for 20 and 33 respectively. The partnership of Bates and Turner, however, was more profitable, and lasted until ten minutes after the luncheon interval, when Bates was caught behind the wicket for 61, after batting an hour and three-quarters. The partnership had lasted an hour and 35 minutes, and had produced 138. Bates, who only gave two chances, one to Coulson at point, when his score stood at 11, and another to Bradford at 62, played a good game, hitting 6 fours, 2 threes, and 3 twos. Turner, whose play was almost faultless, was at the wickets an hour and 50 minutes, knocking up 89, which included 9 fours, 6 threes, and 4 twos.

Durham showed up poorly, only making 27 in an hour and a half, and having to fallow on. But for Brooks they would have fared very badly indeed. He was in for an hour and seven minutes, and played a sound and careful game.

YORKSHIRE SECOND ELEVEN V. DURHAM.

ANOTHER FINE INNINGS BY TURNER.

Barring the greater part of the day at South Shields yesterday, the Yorkshire Second Eleven ran up the useful score of 273 runs, and then in the last three hours play disposed of the whole Durham side for only 97 runs in their first innings, and making them follow on again, took two of their wickets for 31 runs. Thus at the conclusion of the day's play Yorkshire had fared so well that with an innings in hand they held a lead of 145 runs, while Durham had only eight wickets to fall. Nothing, therefore, but a remarkable recovery to-day can save the Durhamists from an overwhelming defeat. For most very satisfactory position the Yorkshiremen are indebted largely to the very effective bowling of Broadbent and Harrison. The success of the latter pair is all the more praiseworthy in view of the fact that they had to bowl on what was considered a good batting wicket, even though it may have been slightly impaired in the course of the Yorkshire innings. Broadbent never did bowl better. Seldom were two successive deliveries of his alike, and making the ball swing with his arm he proved most destructive with a delivery much beyond the price of a medium bowler—such as he is considered. It was, indeed, quite a fast ball which he delivered Mr. Brooks, one of the balls being pitched a distance of 29 yards from the wicket. Of the batsmen, the biggest score and the best innings was that by Turner, whose faultless display for 89, including upon his three hours innings on Monday, emphasised the fact of his starting to form. Always true in his style, he has being developed a very pronounced off stroke between a conventional and mid-off, and it was by this stroke that he did most of his scoring yesterday. Although always easy in his batting, to exercise a wise discrimination as to which balls to hit, and when he did hit he used his wrist to considerable purpose. Bates, who was his partner for nearly an hour and a half, played evasive cricket for 64, but his innings was not without merit, for he was missed at point by Mr. Coulson when he had only scored 11, and again should have been easily taken by Mr. Bradford at leg when he was 62.

A large crowd witnessed the match. In batting first, on winning the toss, Mr. Tattersall varied the usual order of his side, the opening being entrusted to Robinson and Oldroyd, who, however, had only made 20 runs when the former was clean bowled by Morris, who 13 runs later also scattered Oldroyd's wicket. Then Bates and Turner came together for the third wicket partnership, and although the attack was good, they contrived by judicious hitting to knock up the score at a good rate, 80 runs being added in 45 many minutes. Hitting powerfully all round the wicket, they had carried the score to 100 by the time the innings had been in progress an hour and ten minutes. Turner was exactly an hour in making his half-century, while Bates got his 50 in just under that period. The partnership lasted altogether an hour and 25 minutes, and yielded 128 runs for the third wicket. Bates's innings lasted an hour and three-quarters, and his hits included 6 fours and 2 threes. Yorkshire had 173 runs on for three wickets, and the remaining batsmen carried the score to 273, the innings closing after three hours and a quarter's batting. Mr. Tattersall of the later batsmen showed best form, and looked like having the innings out when he had the misfortune to play on to his wicket at 24.

Durham, in their response, did badly from the start, five wickets being down for 30 runs. None of the batsmen, with the exception of Mr. Brooks, showed any confidence in dealing with the bowling, and even he was lucky in seeing several "streaky" strokes just pass beyond the reach of the fielders. He had been batting just over an hour for 45, when Broadbent completely beat him with one of his fast deliveries. The outcome of their indifferent batting was that Durham were left in a minority on the first innings of 176 runs. Thirty-five minutes then remained for play, and being compelled to follow on, they again made a poor show against the bowling of Broadbent and Harrison. It should be added that the Yorkshire fielding throughout was exceptionally good, and at least two brilliant catches were brought off by members of the team, one by Broadbent at cover, and another by Bates, who disposed of Thackeray with a catch which he made on the boundary edge, after running about 30 yards. An hour and a half's play yesterday morning sufficed to bring about a decisive victory for the Yorkshire Second Eleven over Durham on the South Shields ground. Durham were in a hopeless position at the conclusion of the first day's play. They could only respond with a modest 27 to Yorkshire's score of 273, and being compelled to follow on they lost their first two wickets for only 31 runs.

Their batting showed some improvement yesterday morning, but when six wickets had fallen for 112 runs it was seen that the Durhamists would have difficulty in avoiding an innings defeat. There was some hope for them, however, when the seventh wicket carried the score to 153, but a change in the attack—Richardson going on for Walker—scuttled the rate of scoring, and after Mr. Coulson had been disposed of the rest of the batting side gave little trouble. The end came with only 158 runs on the board for Durham's second innings, so that Yorkshire won by six innings and 16 runs.
